SUBJECT: Restitution of Books Removed from Malaya to  
the British Government

1. The Japanese Government is directed to restore to the British Government the following collections of books which have been reported as removed from Malaya during the Japanese occupation and which are at present in the custody of the Imperial Library, Ueno Park, Tokyo:

- a. 254 books and 40 pamphlets and periodicals belonging to the Library Survey Department, F.M.S. and S.S., Malaya;
- b. 21 books belonging to the Raffles Library;
- c. 67 books belonging to the Raffles College Library;
- d. 46 volumes removed from Malaya, source unknown.

2. The above collections are to be packed separately for shipment as freight under South Sea climatic conditions and delivered to Kure, Japan, on 1 September 1947.

3. The property is to be delivered to the Naval Officer-in-Charge at Kure and placed alongside a pier or in a warehouse as he will direct. The Naval Officer-in-Charge, Kure, has been designated as authorized representative of the British Government to receive and give receipt for said property.

4. The Japanese Government will designate an authorized representative to execute the receipt forms in its behalf and will notify General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, of his appointment.

5. The inclosed receipt forms, consisting of one original and five copies, are to be signed by the authorized representatives of the British Government and the Japanese Government. Receipt forms are to be distributed as follows:

a. Original and one copy to be returned to General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, by the Japanese Government representative;

The Swedish Diplomatic Mission in Japan presents its compliments to the Japanese Ministry for Foreign Affairs and with reference to the former's note verbale BB-221/47, dated 23rd July, 1947, has the honour to forward herewith, from the Swedish Vice-Consulate at Honolulu, Hawaii, in two separate parcels, the third lot of Petitions and Powers of Attorney executed by Japanese nationals living in the Territory of Hawaii, who own farmland in Japan and wish to retain title to same because they plan to return to possess it and use it as owner-farmers.

The one parcel contains 264 separate envelopes, containing a total of 429 individual petitions to local Japanese Agricultural Land Commissions.

The other parcel contains 384 separate Powers of Attorney intended for the person in Japan whom the non-resident land owner has appointed to act for him.

Each envelope is fully addressed and ready to be sealed and mailed after the examination of the contents that the proper Authorities may desire to undertake.

1. Paragraph 1b of Memorandum for the Japanese Government from General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, AG 095 (13 Aug 47) ESS/AC (SCAPIN 4332-A), dated 13 August 1947, subject: Action Taken on Central Liaison Office Memoranda, is amended to read as follows:

a. Reference is Central Liaison Office Memorandum No. 4303 (LO 1511/1764) of Japan Pulp Industry Company, Ltd, for permission to borrow ¥20,000,000. from the Hypothec Bank of Japan, Ltd, and to expend from its own funds ¥9,060,000. to purchase pulp wood and standing timber. 1. The Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, mindful of the difficulties which the lack of foreign credits makes for the Japanese Government in fulfillment of its obligation under the Potsdam Declaration to remove all obstacles to the revival and strengthening of democratic tendencies among its people, has arranged to provide books and periodicals from the democracies for the Japanese people.

2. The initial collection of these publications, housed in the "CIE Information Library" in Tokyo and made more useful by being under the direction of trained librarians, now attracts more readers daily than the largest public library in Japan.

3. Because of its demonstrated usefulness, it is proposed to establish as rapidly as possible branches of this library in other centers of population in order to make more accessible to the Japanese people what they want and need to know about the democracies, their peoples, institutions and ways of doing things.

4. In view of the benefits of this project to the public, it is taken for granted that the Japanese Government will desire to further it in every way possible.

5. It is requested, therefore, that the Japanese Government, at its own expense, immediately make available, equip adequately and maintain properly as libraries the following two buildings:

a. The two-story non-reinforced concrete building owned by the Japan Life Insurance Company at Nakakyoku Shijo-dori, Higashitoin, Higashi-iri, Kyoto City, Kyoto Prefecture, now known as the CIE-Kreuger Library, containing 13,275 square feet of floor space.

b. The two-story building at 21 Maikaichiba-cho 1-chome, Naka-ku, Nagoya City, Aichi Prefecture, constructed recently by Mr. Shiko Fukuda, Otsubashi-kado, Naka-ku, Nagoya, in anticipation of its use for a library, containing approximately 5,016 square feet of floor space.

1. Reference is made to memorandum for the Japanese Government, file AG 130 (22 Sep 45)ESS, SCAPIN 45, 22 September 1945, subject, "Control of Financial Transactions", from General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers.

2. Effective upon the receipt of this memorandum, the following procedure will govern the release of precious metals:

a. All requests for release of precious metals for a period of three months will be consolidated in a paper to be called the "Quarterly Allocation of Precious Metals". The Quarterly Allocation will be submitted to General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, Civil Property Custodian, at least two months prior to the first day of the three month period during which their release is desired. Thus the Quarterly Allocation for the first quarter of 1948 must be submitted to General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, Civil Property Custodian, not later than 1 November 1947, and the allocation for the second quarter of 1948 not later than 1 February 1948.

b. The Quarterly Request will be presented in such form as may be prescribed by General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers. Specifically, it is directed that names of all Companies be given in Romaji-Hepburn and that all requests be submitted on eight (8) inch by eleven (11) inch paper. Requests not properly submitted will not be favorably considered.

c. Each Ministry will be responsible for approving, reviewing and screening all requests falling within its jurisdiction, particularly with regard to the form in which presented, the end use for which the metals are desired, and the quantities requested. It is the duty of each Ministry

to disapprove all requests which do not conform to policies established by General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, or which are not of a nature essential to the Japanese economy, and to determine that the quantities requested are not excessive for the intended use. 3. Upon approval of allocations of precious metals, the Ministry of Finance will make the releases exactly as directed by Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, and will take appropriate action to insure that released metals are used only for approved purposes.

4. Supplemental or interim requests will be considered for the following purposes only:

a. Releases to permit manufacture of goods for export when approved or directed by General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers.

b. Repair of essential tools and other manufactured articles.

5. Emergency requests approved by General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers; interim requests will be numbered consecutively First or Second Supplemental Request for the \_\_\_\_\_ Quarter of \_\_\_\_\_. No interim request will be considered except after prior consultation with and approval by General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, Civil Property Custodian.

6. As the Third Quarter Allocation, along with numerous supplemental requests, was submitted very late the Third Quarter Allocation will be designated the Fourth Quarter Allocation.

2. Effective Date. Effective 28 August 1947 International Postal Service between Japan and all other countries will operate in accordance with instructions embodied herein.
3. Letters and Postal Cards. Letters and Postal Cards containing personal and family messages; and business, financial, commercial, and transactional correspondence are mailable to and from Japan, subject to the following prohibitions:
  - a. Messages which transfer currency, checks, drafts, payment orders, or other credit or financial instruments.
  - b. Messages which relate to the conversion, transfer, or disguising of any Japanese external assets by powers of attorney, proxies, instructions, or other means intended to defeat SCAP regulations regarding foreign exchange or the conversion of external assets.
  - c. Messages which grant or transfer translation, reproduction, performance or other rights concerning books, articles, plays, music, motion pictures, or other media of information and expression, and messages relating in any way to patents or copyrights except for description and explanation of the authorized channels and procedures for handling such matters and except for acknowledgment of rights arranged through the authorized channels.

4. Commercial Papers. Commercial Papers as defined by the Universal Postal Union Standards and Limitations are mailable to and from Japan, with the following exceptions:

  - e. Patterns - (To and from Japan)
  - f. Catalogues - (To and from Japan)
  - g. Scientific and professional publications as may be approved by the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers - (From Japan only)
6. Samples and Small Packets. These classifications of mail matter, as defined by the Universal Postal Union Convention, are mailable to and from Japan.
7. Air Mail.
  - a. Letters and postal cards within weight limits prescribed by Universal Postal Union Regulations and Limitations, but subject to all restrictions set out herein covering ordinary mail, are mailable to and from Japan.
  - b. Transportation of International air mail both to and from Japan will be by Commercial Carriers only. Air mail destined to Japan will be dispatched in pouches labeled to Tokyo only.
8. Parcel Post.
  - a. Parcel Post Service will be to Japan only. Parcels will be limited to twenty-two pounds in weight, and contents will be restricted to relief items such as non-perishable foods, mailable medicines in non-commercial quantities, soap, clothing and other relief items, in quantities which reasonably can be used by the addressee and/or his immediate family. The following specific limitations apply to each parcel:

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BASIC: Memo to JG (SCAPIN - 1768 ).

- (1) Only one of the following tobacco items can be included in a single parcel: Cigarettes - not more than 200 pieces; cigars - not more than 50 pieces; pipe tobacco - not more than one-half pound.
- (2) Not more than 200 saccharine tablets in a single parcel.

b. Gift articles, as distinguished from relief items, such as watches, fountain pens, etc., will not be permitted entry.

c. Only one relief parcel per week may be mailed by any single sender to any one addressee.

d. Relief parcels which are undeliverable will not be returned to senders but will be turned over to designated relief agencies for disposition.

e. Excessive quantities of permitted items; that is, quantities in excess of the reasonable needs of the addressee and/or his immediate family, will be extracted by the Japanese Customs Service and delivered to the appropriate agency of the Eighth Army for distribution to recognized relief agencies.

9. Censorship or Customs Inspection. Incoming and outgoing International mails will be made available for censorship or customs inspection in accordance with instructions issued by the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers.

10. Governing Regulations. a. The regular-mail service, embracing letters, postal cards, commercial papers, prints, samples and small packets, as authorized, will be governed by the provisions of the Universal Postal Union Convention.

b. Parcel post service, as authorized, will be operated by the Japanese Government under the terms of the Universal Postal Union Parcel Post Agreement, or bilateral or other agreements in effect between Japan and the respective countries at the time service was suspended.

c. The maintenance of records under the conditions of the Universal Postal Union Convention and the terms of the various bilateral parcel post agreements, and the preparation of the necessary accounts for settlement, will be the responsibility of the Japanese Government.

d. Amounts due Japan from other countries in the operation of the International Postal Service will be deposited in the United States Treasury Trust Fund Account, "Deposits, Proceeds of Remittances to and Exports from Occupied Areas," Symbol 218905.1 Japan. Payments due from Japan on International postal service operation will be made from that

trust fund account upon recommendation of the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers.

e. Statements of accounts showing amounts due Japan will be prepared under the direction of the Ministry of Communications and certified to the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers.

f. International surface mail will be dispatched from Japan on vessels of Japanese or any other registration except German.

g. Articles of International mail addressed in Japanese, Korean, or Chinese characters must have an interlined address written in Roman characters if such articles are addressed for delivery in countries other than Korea, China, and the Ryukyu Islands.

11. Operational Correspondence. a. Form notices, bulletins of verification, inquiries, quarterly statements of terminal credits, and all other correspondence necessary in the operation of the International postal service as required by the Universal Postal Union Convention and bilateral parcel post agreements will be prepared by the Japanese Ministry of Communications and delivered unsealed to the Civil Communications Section, General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers for examination, proper indorsement, and transmission. Indorsements on such communications will read "Authorized by SCAP for transmission through International mail channels."

b. Direct communication between the Civil Communications Section and other staff sections of General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers and the Ministry of Communications is authorized concerning all matters within the scope of this memorandum.

4. A full report regarding the actions directed in paragraphs 2 and 3 above is to be furnished to General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, by 1 October 1947.

SUBJECT: Property Belonging to Mr. J. Drenth, Removed from the Netherlands East Indies

1. The Central Liaison Office is directed to investigate and report on present location or disposition of the property belonging to Mr. J. Drenth, which was removed from the Netherlands East Indies during the Japanese occupation.
2. The subject property, which included a 152 piece set of table silverware marked "Dube", was removed from Mr. Drenth's home in Kota Tjane, Sumatra, by the Japanese commanding officer of Kota Tjane, Lawe Sigala 2, a major whose name is unknown. Said major returned to Japan in August 1942 and took the subject property with him.
3. The above-mentioned major was under the command of Colonel Kytayama whose headquarters were at Brastagi, Sumatra. A Captain Nakadjono, who was stationed in Brastagi, should also be able to identify the major.
4. The required report is to be submitted to the Civil Property Custodian by 20 October 1947.
