

control (Hollandia, Biak, Morotai) no mishaps have occurred and no officers have been repatriated. In fact in December 1946 a Japanese officer in Soerabaja has been dismissed from his campcommand, because he looked very badly after his men, and tolerated the camp to be dirty and the food to be bad, notwithstanding the fact that he received the same ingredients as in other camps, where there were no complaints about the food.

(2) Necessity of acceleration of repatriation.

To use the circumstances as an argument for speedy repatriation is turning matters upside down, the reason for their retention being rehabilitation of the Netherlands East Indies. Nevertheless the Lt. Governor General has decided to speed up the repatriation as much as possible. A repatriation program has been made up, and has been approved by the Repatriation Sect on (Col. Howell), according to which the last ship will leave the Netherlands East Indies before May 1st 1947.

The Japanese Government professes Hollandia, Biak and Morotai to be pestilential places, which I must strongly deny, as a report from Hollandia states that on December 23rd 1946 on a camp strength of 802 there were only 50 sick in lines and 8 in hospital. Reports from all camps in Netherlands East Indies are coming in regularly and are communicated to HQ 16th Army in Batavia, where the reports are recorded.

The Japanese Surrendered Personnel have indeed felt uneasy about their transfer to the Dutch authorities. How they feel about it now may appear from a report by Major General Mabuchi, formerly acting Commander in Chief of the 16th Army, and commander of all J.S.P. in N.E.I., stating that a little more than one month and a half has passed since the Japanese were handed over to the Netherlands administration, that no friction of any sort during this time occurred, that the transfer occurred very calmly. That the Dutch authorities are making sincere efforts to stimulate the repatriation of the remaining Japanese and that for this the Japanese are grateful from the bottom of their hearts.

(3) Better treatment.

(a) Question of the status of Japanese P.O.W. in South East Asia.

Regarding the treatment as Japanese Surrendered Personnel instead of as Prisoners of War it has been definitely stated in the regulations issued by Netherlands authorities regarding the treatment of J.S.P., that although they have not the status of P.O.W., the Geneva Convention forms the basis to work on. As for the non-payment of wages the Dutch authorities have continued the policy, laid down by SEAC, as it is estimated preferable to work along the same lines in the whole area of the former South East Asia Command.

(b) Food situation.

It is stated, that at the time of the inspection of Mr. C.A. Helbling (before October 29) Camp no. 2 at Tandjong Priok Harbor was under British control. The ration scales have been established by SEAC and are in force for the whole of the 104,500 J.S.P. retained in South East Asia. After the withdrawal of the British forces from the Netherlands East Indies, an improved ration scale has been issued by the Royal Netherlands

Indies Army for J.S.P. which enables the heavy duty workers to receive a caloria value of 2850 a day.

As stated above the general policy in the Netherlands East Indies is in accordance with the policy in SEAC. Policy in U.S.A. controlled areas is unknown to Netherlands East Indies authorities.

It is true, that quite a number of old and unfit J.S.P. have been handed over to the Netherlands East Indies Government by the British, especially in Sourabaya. These people will be repatriated first of all, and have been shipped by ss. "Wolvevreden", which is due to leave Sourabaya on January 18th 1947.

The cigarette situation is fairly good in all areas, except Sourabaya. / If the Japanese Government is willing to send supply of cigarettes to the Netherlands East Indies by one of the repatriation ships on its returntrip, this will be welcomed.

(c) Clothing situation.

During inspections through several J.S.P. camps I had a check on the clothing situation in these camps, This check disclosed that every man I inspected had at least two pairs of shoes and three to seven complete sets of clothing. Before the British left Netherlands East Indies they issued two complete sets of clothing to every J.S.P., so that the statement of the Japanese Government regarding the clothing situation is completely mistaken.

The disposal of corpses has (at the time under British control) indeed been ordered to J.S.P., as the murder of so many white and coloured people during and immediately after the Japanese occupation has directly or indirectly been a Japanese responsibility. Consequently I cannot see why their employment for this kind of work - which by the way has been finished a long time ago-should be unjustified.

Other kind of dangerous work is not done by J.S.P..

(d) Condition of medical treatment and sanitation.

For improvements in food supply see above.

The figures stated in the report (48 out of 183 sick) are unknown to me. Why does the Japanese Government not state the name of that "certain unit" to enable the N.E.I. authorities to investigate the matter?

On the other hand it must be made quite clear, that according to reports from several campcommanders malaria exclusively exists among those J.S.P. who during the Japanese occupation has lived in the Outer Islands. New cases of malaria are very few. Every Japanese has got his mosquito-net. But it is a well known fact, that Japanese like to wear very little clothing, so that infections are likely to occur, as long as they have not gone to bed.

/ Measures have been taken to send sufficient cigarettes to Sourabaya

All Japanese camps are under control of Netherlands medical officers, while the Japanese medical officers take care of their own men, and are supplied with medicine if necessary.

(e) Labor condition.

The regulations regarding treatment of J.S.P., issued by the R.N.I.A., state, that the working hours are 8 hours a day, with one off day (Sunday) every week.

The regulations also state, that J.S.P., must be employed on rehabilitation work, and may not be used for services of a personnel character. No wages are being paid, as stated above, in accordance with SACSEA directives.

(f) Correspondence.

Not receiving correspondence from their families at home is not due to lack of cooperation on the Netherlands side. Mail received is sent through as soon as possible. A complete list of all J.S.P. in the Netherlands East Indies (except Palembang, which will follow) has been handed to the Repatriation Section (Col. Howell). All mail for J.S.P. in the Netherlands East Indies has to be sent to Batavia.

Mail from the Netherlands East Indies to Japan has been sent mid December by air, and by Tjibadak, arriving end of January. Future mail will, if possible, be sent by air. All camps have been provided with Red Cross forms to enable J.S.P. to write home once a month.

(4) As the J.S.P. are only working in Netherlands controlled areas there is no danger for incidents in connection with the Indonesian Independence Movement.

Regarding the covering letter of the Japanese Government it should be stated, that before October 29 no J.S.P. from Netherlands controlled areas have been evacuated, so that I cannot see how the Governmental report could be based on reports from such individuals. On the other hand the Red Cross reports known to me (about Hollandia, Pandoeng and Batavia) are not at all unfavourable. Actually these reports state that circumstances are fairly good. The only objections made in the Hollandia report were against the official position of Japanese surrendered personnel instead of Prisoners of War, as mentioned above this is a matter of policy in accordance with I.C.R.A.C. instructions.

The covering letter holds the Netherlands authorities responsible for 13,500 J.S.P. in October 29, whereas at that date only 11,500 were under direct Netherlands control.

2. The Imperial Japanese Government is directed to take possession of all property covered by the attached list and to assemble all movable property at a safe storage area by 14 April 1947, preparatory to restoring the property to Elizabeth H. Geerts who owned the property on 7 December 1941.

3. It is further directed that the Imperial Japanese Government return all property on the attached list, and any additional movables which may be located and identified, to Elizabeth H. Geerts at 166 Azaitari, Sengokuhara-mura, Ashigara, Shimo-gun, Kanagawa-ken on 14 April 1947 at 1000 hours, under conditions set forth in "Receipt for Restitution to United Nation National of Wrongfully Transferred Property in Japan", and under the following conditions:

a. A general and a final report by the Japanese Government on the management of the property from 7 December 1941 to the date of restoration, said report to include statement of all financial transactions, will be attached to each copy of the receipt;

b. If the property has been leased subsequent to seizure, the Japanese Government will afford the restoree the option either to allow the lease to continue in force or to terminate it at the time of the restoration of the property to her. Should the restoree decide to terminate such lease, the Japanese Government will take the action necessary to provide her vacant possession;

c. All inventories included in the receipt will contain a statement as to the condition of the property at the time of restoration;

d. Transfer of title will be made at the District Court having jurisdiction.

4. Four copies of accomplished receipt for the property with documentary evidence of the transfer of title will be submitted to General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers within ten (10) days of completion of delivery. Receipts and evidence, of transfer of title will be submitted in both English and Japanese text with the Japanese translation certified as correct.

5. Copy of this memorandum will be attached to each copy of the receipt.

1. Reference is made to the following memoranda from General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, to the Imperial Japanese Government:

a. AG 004.03 (7 Feb 47) ESS/ED (SCAFIN 1512) dated 7 February 1947, subject, "Cotton Textile Capacity".

b. AG 004.01 (30 Dec 46) ESS/AG, (SCAFIN 1427) dated 30 December 1946, subject: "Financial Plan for Rehabilitation of Cotton Industry in Japan".

2. It is directed that the purchase, ownership, investment in, rehabilitation, installation, and operation, as well as the contracting for the purchase, ownership, investment in, rehabilitation, installation, and operation of cotton spinning spindles by the so-called "Big Ten" cotton spinning companies be limited to the number of spindles reported as owned by them on 31 January 1947, and listed in paragraph 4 below, plus complementary equipment necessary for the operation of those inventoried spindles, as listed in paragraph 4 below.

3. All outstanding orders and contracts placed by the companies listed in paragraph 4 below for new spinning machinery shall be cancelled as of the date of this directive. Future production of spinning machinery shall be available only to independent cotton spinning companies which are not listed on, or affiliated with or controlled by the companies listed on the schedule of restricted concerns, as published by General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers.

Nothing in this directive shall be construed as prohibiting the spinning companies listed in paragraph 4 above, from the purchase and use of spare parts and replacement units necessary for the operation of their capacity, as listed in paragraph 4 above, when such purchase and use of spare parts and replacement units have become necessary in the normal course of business operations. Stock piling and the excessive accumulation of spare parts and replacement units are expressly forbidden.

6. Within ten days after the date of this memorandum, the appropriate agency of the Imperial Japanese Government will submit a report to the General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, Attention: Economic and Scientific Section, Textile Division, stating the measures that have been taken to implement the provisions of this memorandum. Direct communication is authorized between General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, Economic and Scientific Section, Textile Division, and the appropriate agencies of the Imperial Japanese Government, to implement the provisions of this memorandum.

b. Memorandum for the Imperial Japanese Government, file AG 311.2 (8 Aug 46) CCS, (SCAPIN-1114), dated 8 August 1946, subject: Revised Procedure for the Handling of Official United States Government Messages Filed at Tokyo Destined to the United States, its Territories and Possessions.

2. The directive contained in the memorandum referred to in paragraph 1a, above, is hereby rescinded.

3. Official government messages of any foreign government agency or representative, other than the United States Government, filed in Japan for transmission to a respective government agency or representative at any address in a country to which radiotelegraph service is available, may be accepted by the Ministry of Communications at any of its public offices authorized to accept SCM messages, and will be sent collect to destination.

4. Such messages may be sent or received in any language, code or cipher, and are not subjected to censorship. When filed in Japan, they must be identified by a marking to show that they are official government messages, and this indication will be transmitted to show that the message is "(name of country) GOVT COLLECT".

5. Incoming official government messages for agencies or representatives of a foreign government will be prepaid in the country of origin.

Such messages will be delivered to the office of the addressee in Japan, as shown on record with the Ministry of Communications. Foreign government agencies and representatives are authorized to keep the Ministry of Communications informed as to delivery instructions for their incoming messages, by filing a record thereof with the Central Telegraph Office in Tokyo.

6. The provisions of this directive in no way modify those in force which apply to the handling of United States Government messages, and which are contained in the memorandum referred to in paragraph 1b, above.

7. The provisions of this directive do not apply to any messages of the Imperial Japanese Government which are authorized only by special directives issued by this Headquarters.

8. Operational interpretations of the above instructions not involving changes in policy may be made from time to time by the Civil Communications Section, General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, and transmitted to the Ministry of Communications of the Imperial Japanese Government through the Japanese Liaison Representative attached to the Civil Communications Section. Direct communications between the Civil Communications Section and the Ministry of Communications regarding operational procedures within the scope of this memorandum is authorized.

2. The plan for rationing of petroleum products as submitted with reference 1b above is disapproved for the following reasons:

a. Paragraph 8 of the submitted plan states, "In executing and working out the foregoing principles, concrete regulations shall be established on the part of each prefecture." The plan as submitted is broad in principle and provides none of the details required for a proper rationing plan. Those "concrete regulations" as indicated in paragraph 8 of the proposed plan must be prepared by the Imperial Japanese Government. Only such details as are required to implement the plan will be left to the prefectural officials.

b. No accounting system is proposed to provide adequate control between consumer and prefectural government, and between prefectural government and the Imperial Japanese Government.

c. No proper identification system for authorized consumers has been proposed.

✓ d. The establishment of eligibility of consumers is not adequate.

3. Mr. Kiriya has stated informally that the final plan to be published by the Imperial Japanese Government will be in a much more elaborate and specific form. This plan in its elaborate and specific detail will be submitted to the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers for approval by 14 March 1947.

The Swedish Diplomatic Mission in Japan presents its compliments to the Imperial Japanese Ministry for Foreign Affairs and - with reference to the former's note verbale of 31st December, 1946, No. BB-395/46, regarding Japanese Prisoners of War in British India - has the honour to inform the Imperial Ministry as follows.

The information communicated to the Imperial Ministry by the note verbale of 9th September, 1946, No. BB-299/46, that the last Japanese internees remaining in British India - except seven hospital cases who subsequently succumbed there - left the said country for Japan on 26th July, 1946, only covered internees, as stated above, and not Prisoners of War.

As regards the question raised in the note verbale of the Imperial Ministry of 7th December, 1946, No. 44/LJS, about the repatriation of Japanese Prisoners of War from British India, the Swedish Consulate General at Bombay has communicated that, having made an inquiry with the Department of External Affairs at New Delhi according to the wishes of the Imperial Ministry, it was learnt from the said Department, at the beginning

of the current month, that all Japanese Prisoners of War, who had remained in British India after the departure of the above Internees, had, by then, been despatched from British India to Japan and that the Prisoners of War camps in India had already been closed down.

It seems likely to this Mission that the above Prisoners of War having been sent from British India not later than at least one month ago, the competent Japanese Authorities may already have received warning from other quarters regarding repatriation schedules, etcetera, and that further inquiries in these respects in India therefore may now serve no practical purpose. Should this assumption be wrong, the Swedish Mission is ready, upon further request of the Imperial Ministry, to try to pursue that matter through the proper Swedish authorities.

Items of no value will be so indicated on receipt. Values will be computed by General Officer Commanding, British Commonwealth Occupation Forces.

3. All wearing apparel, certain subsistence containers, and other items when deemed necessary by General Officer Commanding, British Commonwealth Occupation Forces, will be clearly marked or altered to be distinguishable from military property.

4. All items will be used for civilian relief or in the civilian economy. Items of subsistence and consumer goods will be distributed in accordance with the policy of equitable rationing at official prices.

The residence of Atami Kobayashi, located at 24 Nakano-cho, Azabu-ku, referred to by inclosure number 3 to Memorandum referenced in paragraph 1 above, was requisitioned on a partial occupancy basis. Recently Mr. Kobayashi vacated his residence and Mr. T. Ooka moved into that portion of the house previously allowed as living quarters for Mr. Kobayashi and his family.

3. Partial occupancy by the Japanese owners or original occupants of residences requisitioned for use by the Occupation Forces is permitted to avoid displacing such occupants entirely from their residences. However, this privilege applies solely to the occupants, or a suitable proportion thereof, who resided in the house at the time of its survey for use by the Occupation Forces. The voluntary removal of the original occupants to another habitat indicates that the partial occupancy status of the residence is no longer desired or considered necessary by such occupants.

4. It is directed that the Imperial Japanese Government furnish information to General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers as to the reasons for Mr. Kobayashi's removal from his residence, his present habitat, and the reason for Mr. Ooka's assumption of the partial occupancy area of the Kobayashi residence. It is further directed that the Imperial Japanese Government inform all owners of residences requisitioned on a partial occupancy basis that such partial occupancy applies only to the original occupants or a suitable proportion thereof as determined by General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers.





3. When approval of a request for admittance to the Shosoin or Higashiyama Obunko is given, the Imperial Japanese Government will be notified by written memorandum forwarded through the Central Liaison Office.
4. The Imperial Japanese Government is directed to notify the Prefectural authorities that any Allied personnel who have been given permission to enter the Shosoin or the Higashiyama Obunko will bear written authorization from the General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers.
