 - d. Furnish a report to the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers by 27 March 1947 of compliance with provisions of paragraph 4 b above.

1. Reference is GLO letter Number 1189(EE), dated 24 February 1947, subject: Application for Approval of Distribution Plan of Imported Shoes.
2. The Imperial Japanese Government is authorized to distribute the 173,561 pairs of imported rebuilt and used shoes according to the plan outlined in the GLO letter referred to in paragraph 1 above.
3. These shoes will be exempt from import duty and commodity tax. Retail selling prices will be not less than ¥100 nor more than ¥200 per pair, as fixed by the Price Board of the Imperial Japanese Government.
4. The authorized ration is one pair of imported shoes to each person per year, which will be deducted from the number of pairs of Japanese manufactured shoes authorized.
5. Prefectural authorities will be required to keep accurate records of all imported shoes received and distributed according to rationing procedures established by the Imperial Japanese Government. Accurate accounting reports on the distribution of these shoes will be submitted by the Imperial Japanese Government to the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers before 10 July 1947.

Drums for this purpose are to be supplied by the Japanese Government. The vessel will again be fueled from British Sources at Shanghai enroute to Hong Kong.

4. 1. The appraisal and evaluation will be in accordance with the standards and procedures established by the Enterprise Reconstruction and Reorganization Law, 11 October 1946, as promulgated by Imperial Ordinance No. 500, 30 October 1946. Instructions contained in this sub-paragraph will not delay the assumption of operations as provided in the preceding sub-paragraph.

b. If the property has been leased subsequent to seizure, the Japanese Government will afford the restoree the option either to allow the lease to continue in force or to terminate it at the time of the restoration of the property to him. Should the restoree decide to terminate such lease, the Japanese Government will take the action necessary to provide him vacant possession;

c. All inventories included in the receipt will contain a statement as to the condition of the property at the time of restoration;

d. Transfer of title will be made at the District Court having jurisdiction.

4. Four copies of accomplished receipt for the property with documentary evidence of the transfer of title will be submitted to General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers within ten (10) days of completion of delivery. Receipts and evidence of transfer of title will be submitted in both English and Japanese text with the Japanese translation certified as correct.

1. Reference is made to Ministry of Finance memorandum, L.O. 517
(SF/FP), 5 March 1947 with attached application from the
below-named German firm for withdrawals of funds for payment of salaries
and other office expenses.

2. The Imperial Japanese Government is directed to release from the
terms of the Ordinance of the Ministry of Finance on the preservation of
the property of the Specified Powers, 20 September 1945, such funds of
this German firm which are applied for under the above-mentioned memoran-
dum as are required to pay all the expenses listed, providing there is no
deviation from the procedures set forth in the memorandum for the Imperial
Japanese Government, file AG 386.7(23 Sep 46)CPC/FP, SCAPIN 2241-A, 23 Sep-
tember 1946, subject: Request for Use of Yen Bank Accounts by German Con-
cerns for the Purpose of paying Salaries and Incidental Expenses, from
General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers.

No. 2 restricted bank account, ONLY AFTER NO. 1 RESTRICTED BANK ACCOUNT
HAS BEEN COMPLETELY EXHAUSTED.

1. Reference is Central Liaison Office Memorandum No. 6885 (LO 2419/1805), dated 14 December 1946, subject: Application of Toa Metallurgy Co., Ltd. for Permission to Negotiate a Loan and to Withdraw Its Own Bank Deposit to Construct a Workshop, forwarding application of Toa Metallurgy Company, Ltd, for permission to obtain a loan of ¥360,000. from Teikoku Bank, Ltd, and to withdraw ¥109,800. from free yen deposits to construct a workshop at 2028 Katayama-mura, Kitaadachi-gun, Saitama-ken.

2. No objection is offered to the above application. This memorandum shall not be construed as approval for priority of raw materials, equipment or facilities to carry out the plans for which this loan and release of funds are made. The established regulations, policies, procedures and priorities instituted by the Imperial Japanese Government shall prevail.

3. The Imperial Japanese Government shall submit to the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, in quintuplicate, typed in English on 8" x 11" paper, within ninety (90) days from the date of this memorandum, a progress report on the status of construction work, authorized by this memorandum. The progress report shall show the following:

a. Complete accounting of the funds authorized for the project, including amounts paid and incurred, and an estimate of further expenditures required to complete the project.

b. Percent of project completed.

c. If not complete, estimated date when project will be completed.

Mayer, representative of the Zai Nihon Congregational Senkyoshi Shadan (American Board of Commissioners for Foreign Missions) at the addresses shown on the attached list of properties commencing delivery on 30 June 1947 at 1000 hours, under conditions set forth in "Receipt for Restitution to United Nation National of Wrongfully Transferred Property in Japan", and under the following conditions:

a. A general and a final report by the Japanese Government on the management of the property from 7 December 1941 to the date of restoration, said report to include statement of all financial transactions, will be attached to each copy of the receipt;

b. If the property has been leased subsequent to seizure, the Japanese Government will afford the restoree the option either to allow the lease to continue in force or to terminate it at the time of the restoration of the property to him. Should the restoree decide to terminate such lease, the Japanese Government will take the action necessary to provide him vacant possession;

c. All inventories included in the receipt will contain a statement as to the condition of the property at the time of restoration;

d. Transfer of title will be made at the District Courts having jurisdiction.

4. Four copies of accomplished receipt for the property with documentary evidence of the transfer of title will be submitted to General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers within ten (10) days of completion of delivery. Receipts and evidence of transfer of title will be submitted in both English and Japanese text with the Japanese translation certified as correct.

5. Copy of this memorandum will be attached to each copy of the receipt.

Available information indicates that these personal effects, consisting of manuscripts, a picture album, a Norwegian Bible, etc., were taken by two police officers, one of whom was a Mr. Kekko who was stationed at the Nagano police station in Nagano-ken. The name of the doctor in charge of the sanatorium at the time was Kazeya.

SUBJECT: Instructions Concerning the Surrender of Arms by the Civilian Population of Japan

1. Reference is made to memorandum from the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, file AG 388.3 (23 Oct 45) CIS, (SCAPIN - 181), dated 23 October 1945, subject as above.

2. Paragraph 1.a. of the memorandum referred to in paragraph 1, above, is rescinded and the following will be substituted therefor:

"1. The following instructions supplement those issued by this headquarters in a Radiogram to the Imperial Japanese Government, above subject, dated 24 September 1945:

a. The Imperial Japanese Government shall surrender all firearms, swords, bayonets, daggers and other weapons, ammunition, explosives and components thereof collected from the civilian population to U. S. Army representatives in accordance with instructions issued by the Commanding General, Eighth Army, and the Commander, Naval Forces, Far East.

(1) The following exceptions will be allowed:

- (a) Firearms and knives required for hunting purposes, and swords considered objects of art.
- (b) Explosives required by legitimate business of industrial organizations.
- (c) Firearms of the match-lock type considered antiques and objects of art.

- (2) Individual licenses and permits covering the above exceptions will be issued by the Imperial Japanese Government and reported monthly, by list, to this headquarters, the Commanding General, Eighth Army, the Commander, Naval Forces, Far East, or other appropriate Occupation Force Commanders.
- (3) Individuals and organizations duly licensed to retain and use firearms and explosives, or components thereof, shall comply with such instructions as may be issued by the appropriate Occupation Force Commander in the area."
