SUBJECT: Revised Plan for Receiving Payments Due American Carriers for Messages and Radiotelephone Calls Filed by United States Military and Accredited Civilian Personnel for Transmission to and Through the United States, its Territories and Possessions, Prepaid in Japan.

1. Reference is made to memorandum from the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers (SCAPIN-1228) file AG 311.3 (24 Sept 46) CCS, dated 24 September 1946, subject, same as above, and to memorandum from the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers (SCAPIN-1228/1) file AG 311.3 (17 Jan 47) CCS, dated 17 January 1947, subject, same as above.

2. The following directive confirms verbal instructions given to the Ministry of Communications during 10 and 11 March 1947.

3. Effective 10 March 1947, at 1000 hours, Military Payment Certificates, Series No. 461, will no longer be accepted as prepayment for telephone and telegraph messages filed by United States military and accredited civilian personnel. Each telephone and telegraph office presently authorized to handle telephone and telegraph messages over the United States-Japan communications circuits will be immediately advised to this effect.

4. All Military Payment Certificates, Series No. 461, which are in the custody of the public offices of the Ministry of Communications will be gathered in by the Ministry of Communications by or before 30 March 1947. Such amounts of Military Payment Certificates, Series No. 461, as are on hand at the close of each day, in the Treasury of the Ministry of Communications, will be delivered on the following day to the Office of the Finance Officer, United States Army, in the Bank of Chosen Building, Tokyo, for conversion to Military Payment Certificates, Series No. 471. The last day during which conversion of Military Payment Certificates, Series No. 461, to Military Payment Certificates, Series No. 471, will be made is Monday, 31 March 1947. The first delivery of Military Payment Certificates, Series No. 461, to the Finance Officer by the Ministry of Communications for conversion to Military Payment Certificates No. 471 will be 14 March 1947. Each delivery of Military Payment Certificates,

BASIC: Memo to IJG (SCAPIN - 1228/2)

Series No. 461, will be accompanied with three approved copies of the certificate shown as Inclosure No. 1 hereto.

5. Each telephone and telegraph office which is presently authorized to accept messages for handling over the United States-Japan communications circuits will be instructed to:

a. Forward immediately to the Ministry of Communications, Tokyo, all Military Payment Certificates, Series No. 461, which were on hand at the time instruction was received to discontinue acceptance of messages prepaid in that type of currency.

b. Immediately upon the forwarding of all Military Payment Certificates No. 461, on hand to the Ministry of Communications as called for in sub-paragraph a. above, resume acceptance of prepaid messages from United States accredited personnel, and accept prepayment only in the new Military Payment Certificates, Series No. 471.

c. Accumulate an equal amount of Military Payment Certificates, Series No. 471, for change-making purposes as was heretofore authorized for each public office where prepayment of messages was made in Military Payment Certificates, Series No. 461, and where necessary require senders of messages to supply the exact amount of the message charge when change-making funds are not available.

6. All rules and regulations which were applicable to the handling of messages, their payment in, and handling of, Military Payment Certificates, Series No. 461, are equally applicable to the handling of messages, their payment in and the handling of Military Payment Certificates, Series No. 471, unless specific provision for exceptions, or temporary deviation of such rules and regulations is made herein.

7. Operational interpretations of the above instructions not involving changes in policy may be made from time to time by the Civil Communications Section, General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, and transmitted directly to the Ministry of Communications of the Imperial Japanese Government. Direct correspondence between the Civil Communications Section, General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, and the Ministry of Communications, regarding conversion of currency within the scope of this memorandum, is authorized.

SUBJECT: Restitution of Books and Museum Specimens to the Government of the Republic of the Philippines.

1. The Imperial Japanese Government is directed to restore to the Government of the Republic of the Philippines the following collections of books and scientific specimens which have been reported as removed from the Philippine Islands during the Japanese occupation:
 - a. 30 books and 40 pamphlets and periodicals belonging to the Davao City Branch Library, in the custody of the Imperial Library, Ueno Park, Tokyo;
 - b. 10 books belonging to the Davao Club Library in the custody of the Imperial Library, Ueno Park, Tokyo;
 - c. 46 books now in the custody of the Osaka University of Commerce;
 - d. 102 leaf specimens, 100 bird specimens, 273 shell specimens, and 22 items of anthropological research material, now in the custody of the Imperial Household.
2. The above collections are to be packed for shipment as freight under South Sea climatic conditions and delivered to Kobe, Japan, on 1 April 1947.
3. The property is to be delivered to the Purser of SS "Studding Sail" at Kobe on a pier as he may direct. The Purser of the SS "Studding Sail" has been designated as the authorized representative of the Government of the Republic of the Philippines to receive and receipt for said property at Kobe.
4. The Imperial Japanese Government will designate an authorized representative to execute the receipt forms in its behalf and notify General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, of his appointment.
5. The inclosed receipt forms consisting of one original and five copies are to be signed by the authorized representatives of the two governments, the Government of the Republic of the Philippines and the Imperial Japanese Government. Receipt forms are to be distributed as follows:

It is hereby certified that the Military Payment Certificates, Series No. 461, herewith delivered in the amount of \$ _____ were received by the Ministry of Communications at its telephone and telegraph offices as payment of EFM and SCM messages or radiotelephone calls transmitted prepaid from Japan in accordance with authorizations under SCAPIN 1228, dated 24 September 1946.

1. It is directed that a direct radiotelegraph circuit be established
and operated between Japan and the Netherlands East Indies, beginning
1 April 1947, in accordance with the provisions herein set forth.

2. The radio terminal in Japan for this circuit will be Tokyo. The
circuit will be operated for handling traffic from 0600 to 0630 GMT daily
except Sunday. Any traffic on hand that has not been cleared by 0630 GMT
in any day, will be held over for clearance during the next schedule.
Pending formal authorization by General Headquarters, Supreme Commander
for the Allied Powers, the Ministry of Communications will use the call
letters and frequencies JAK 18005 KC and JAK-2 24050 KC in the operation
of this circuit. The radio terminal of the Netherlands Indies Government
Telegraph Service will be operated from Batavia, Netherlands East Indies,
with station FLD on 20200 KC.

3. Only government messages of the Netherlands or Netherlands Indies
will be handled on this circuit, in either direction. All such messages
will be sent collect from Japan to the Netherlands East Indies, and will
be sent prepaid from the Netherlands East Indies to Japan.

4. Word rates and division of revenue, which will apply on traffic
sent in either direction on this circuit, will be as follows:

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5. The Ministry of Communications will keep full and complete re-
cords of all telegrams sent and received on this circuit, in the same

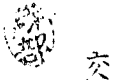

2. Future minimum monthly shipments of Mining Timbers, Railway Sleepers and Telephone Poles to China during 1947 will be as follows:
 - a. Mining Timbers - 60,000 Koku monthly, to total a minimum of 600,000 Koku through December 31, 1947.
 - b. Railway Sleepers and Point Ties - 19,200 Koku monthly, to total 192,000 Koku through December 31, 1947.
 - c. Telephone Poles - 17,500 Koku monthly, to total 175,000 Koku through December 31, 1947.

The above are minimum monthly allotments and will not be considered a limiting factor for monthly shipments. Vessels to transport the above quantities will be assigned in a manner to provide necessary tonnage space each month.

3. Schedules will be prepared by the Civilian Merchant Marine Committee and approved by the U. S. Shipping Control Authority for Japan Merchant Marine.

4. All shipments of Mining Timbers will be consigned to the Central Trust of China for delivery at the port of Chingwangtao. A representative of the Imperial Japanese Government will maintain close liaison with the Foreign Trade Division, Economic and Scientific Section, General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers in order to ascertain the destination of Railway Sleepers and Telephone Poles.
