under conditions set forth in "Receipt for Restitution to United Nation National of Wrongfully Transferred Property in Japan", and under the following conditions:

a. A general and a final report by the Japanese Government on the management of the property from 7 December 1941 to the date of restoration, said report to include statement of all financial transactions, will be attached to each copy of the receipt;

b. If the property has been leased subsequent to seizure, the Japanese Government will afford the restoree the option either to allow the lease to continue in force or to terminate it at the time of the restoration of the property to him. Should the restoree decide to terminate such lease, the Japanese Government will take the action necessary to provide him vacant possession;

c. All inventories included in the receipt will contain a statement as to the condition of the property at the time of restoration;

d. Transfer of title will be made at the District Court having jurisdiction.

4. Four copies of accomplished receipt for the property with documentary evidence of the transfer of title will be submitted to General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers within ten (10) days of completion of delivery. Receipts and evidence of transfer of title will be submitted in both English and Japanese text with the Japanese translation certified as correct.

5. Copy of this memorandum will be attached to each copy of the receipt.

The Swedish Diplomatic Mission in Japan presents its compliments to the Imperial Japanese Ministry for Foreign Affairs and, with reference to the former's note verbale No. BB-28/47, dated 16th January, 1947, has the honour to transmit herewith five copies of a list, received from the Swedish Vice Consulate at Honolulu, Territory of Hawaii, containing the names of those Japanese prisoners of war who embarked at the port of Honolulu, Hawaii, on 13th December, 1946, for repatriation, with Uraga, Japan, as the port of debarkation.

The contingent numbered 1711 of whom 1342 were classified as Japanese and 369 as Okinawans. All but 19 were in good health. Of those in the "sick bay", 16 were ambulatory and only 3 were brought aboard on litters.

Regarding this shipment, as in the previous ones, the Vice Consul paid a visit to the ship before its departure in order to convince himself that adequate accommodation, provisions, medicaments, etcetera, were available aboard for the Japanese passengers.

This was the last contingent of Prisoners of War held in the Territory of Hawaii and completes the evacuation of all Japanese citizens confined in this territory either as Prisoners of War or civilian internees. As far as is known to the Vice Consulate there are no Japanese nationals being detained within the jurisdiction of the said Consulate at the Present time.

This concludes the activities of the Swedish Vice Consulate at Honolulu in connection with the care of Prisoners of War and interned Japanese nationals.

The Swedish Diplomatic Mission in Japan presents its compliments to the Imperial Japanese Ministry for Foreign Affairs and has the honour to transmit herewith two copies of a list, received from the Swedish Vice-Consulate at Honolulu, Territory of Hawaii, containing the names of those Japanese Prisoners of War who died during detention in that territory. The list covers all deaths of Japanese from the beginning of the detention of Prisoners of War in camps in the Territory of Hawaii. The ashes of the Japanese, who were cremated, were returned to Japan with the last despatch of Prisoners of War on s/s James King, which departed from Honolulu on 13th December, 1946.

The Swedish Vice-Consulate has also transmitted copies of two letters exchanged between that Authority and the Prisoners of War Base Camp Command which might be of sufficient interest to warrant their filing and are, therefore, hereby forwarded to the Imperial Ministry.

Dear Colonel Muller:

Receipt is acknowledged with thanks of six (6) copies of the list of POW who were repatriated on December 13. A slight disability which necessitated a week's treatment in the hospital is the reason I have not acknowledged these lists earlier. I thank you for your courtesy in furnishing them.

I was informed by Major Harris that with this last contingent of POW would be sent the ashes of all POW who have died while confined in prison camps or hospitals in the Territory of Hawaii. I asked Major Harris if I could be furnished a list of names of all such deceased POW and Major Harris very kindly promised to send me such a list. I shall be very grateful if this can be done at an early date.

Are there at the present time any nationals of Japan being detained on these Islands either as Prisoners of War or as civilian internees? If so may I have their names and the reasons for their detention. If there are none, I shall be most happy to receive your statement to that effect.

I wish to express to you, Colonel Muller, and to Major Harris and other members of your staff with whom I have had contact my sincere appreciation of your courtesies and cooperation in the difficult matters you have had to handle. I feel that great credit is due you and your command on the manner in which the POW camps have been conducted.

May the New Year be a happy one for you and your staff.

I wish to acknowledge receipt of your letter of 31 December 1946 relating to certain items of unfinished business of the Prisoner of War Base Camp, APO 950, which organization was terminated on that date.

I am pleased to transmit herewith (See Inclosure #1) a list of names of deceased prisoners of war whose ashes were forwarded to Japan in the custody of ship's master, Steamship: James King, on final outbound voyage of repatriates, 13 December 1946.

No nationals of Japan are being detained on these islands as prisoners of war, or as civilian internees, all POW's having been repatriated and POW camps entirely liquidated as of 31 December 1946.

I wish to acknowledge receipt of the dock pass which you kindly returned.

I also wish to take advantage of this opportunity to thank you, Mr. Olson, for your extreme consideration, courtesy and cooperation extended to my command during our period of association. At times our points of view were necessarily opposite because of opposing official viewpoint or interests. However we have, in this difficult situation, seen eye to eye, in virtually all cases, through a policy of justice, fair play, and cooperation.

I was very much concerned to learn that you recently suffered a disability, but relieved to hear that you have now recovered.

Kindly accept the expression of my highest esteem and my best wishes for a happy and successful New Year to both yourself and the consulate personnel.

1. The following information received from the United Kingdom Liaison Mission in Japan is forwarded for appropriate action:

- a. Premises at 10 Grosvenor Square, London, W. 1., were leased by Messrs. Boodle, Hatfield and Company, London, to the Japanese Charge d'Affaires, Mr. Shinichi Kanimura, acting on behalf of the Japanese Government. The lease is on a yearly basis and has not yet been terminated.
- b. Responsibility for the protection of the interests of the Japanese Government, undertaken by the Swiss Government during the war, was assumed by the Government of the United Kingdom in March 1946. The latter is anxious to be relieved of responsibility for the above-mentioned property and to release it to the Swiss Government, which desires to take over the lease. However, the terms binding the Grosvenor estate to give six months' notice of termination of lease can be obviated only by obtaining the Japanese Government's agreement to termination without such notice at this time.
- c. Therefore, the Government of the United Kingdom desires a written statement addressed to Messrs. Boodle, Hatfield and Company, the Grosvenor Office, 53 Davies Street, London, W.1., to the effect that the Japanese Government agrees to the termination of the lease as of 25 December 1946.

2. This Headquarters has no objection to a statement such as that mentioned in paragraph 1 (c) above, and is prepared to forward it to the Government of the United Kingdom.

1. The Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers contemplates authorizing the travel of selected Japanese nationals to destinations outside the limits of Japan. It is desired that the Imperial Japanese Government, upon specific direction, issue travel documents in the nature of a passport to individuals whom it finds to be Japanese subjects.
2. In addition to procedures normally followed in the issuance of a passport, these documents shall be issued in conformance with the following instructions:
 - a. Travel documents shall be issued only to individuals specifically designated by the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers.
 - b. Each document shall bear a statement to the effect that it is issued by the authority and under the instructions of the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, and shall contain a reference to this directive and to the directive specifically authorizing its issuance to the individual concerned.
 - c. Each document shall contain a statement of the purpose and period for which the travel has been approved as indicated in the directive authorizing the issuance of a travel document.
 - d. Wording shall not be used in these documents which directly, or indirectly, constitutes an address by the Imperial Japanese Government to foreign authorities.

SUBJECT: Shell Collections Removed from the Philippines.

1. The Central Liaison Office is directed to investigate and report on the present location of two collections of shell specimens, consisting of 150 and 500 pieces respectively, which were removed from the Natural History Museum, Manila.

2. The first collection, consisting of 150 specimens, mostly cones, was removed from the museum during the latter part of 1942, on orders from ex-General Hayashi, former Director General of Japanese Military Administration in Manila, who directed that duplicates of this shell collection be delivered to him. Said Hayashi is also reputed to have removed shells belonging to a Mrs. Franco in Cebu.

3. The second collection consisting of 500 specimens, was removed from the museum by Professor T. Kuroda, of Kyoto Imperial University, during the period from July to September 1942. It is believed this collection was turned over to the Zoological Institute of the University. Professor Kuroda is at present employed by Natural Resources Section, General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers.

4. Specimens of both collections were marked with tags of the Philippine Natural History Museum, showing the scientific name, locality and collector's name.

5. The required report on the subject property is to be submitted to Civil Property Custodian by 15 May 1947.

b. File AG 676.3 (1 Dec 45)CCS, (SCAPIN-379), dated 1 December 1945, subject: Establishment of Sender Composition Message Service Between the United States and the Tokyo Area.

c. File AG 311.23 (13 May 46)CCS, (SCAPIN-969), dated 13 May 1946, subject: Sender Composition Message Service for Approved Private Companies.

d. File AG 311.22 (8 Jun 46)CCS, (SCAPIN-1009), dated 8 June 1946, subject: Inauguration of EMI, SCM, Private, Government and Press Message Service Between Japan and the Hawaiian Islands.

2. The establishment of private message service between the United States and Japan by the Imperial Japanese Government is authorized, effective 16 April 1947.

3. Private messages with prepaid reply (RP) from the United States or Hawaii addressed to non-accredited organizations or persons in Japan, including Japanese nationals, and private messages filed by non-accredited organizations or persons in Japan, including Japanese nationals, utilizing reply paid vouchers in payment of the charges for such messages to the United States and Hawaii, are authorized effective 16 April 1947.

4. Private messages with prepaid reply (RP) between Japan and the United States, and between Japan and Hawaii are not authorized for accredited organizations or persons.
