

BASIC: Memo to IJG (SCAPIN 1612)

5. Private messages may be sent by any organization or person in the United States or Hawaii to any organization or person in Japan, but only by the organization or person in Japan specifically named in a reply paid voucher to any organization or person in the United States or Hawaii.

6. Private messages between Japan and the United States, and between Japan and Hawaii, will consist of:

a. Messages pertaining to personal and family affairs.

b. Business, financial and commercial messages of a non-transactional nature limited to the ascertainment of facts and exchange of information.

7. Henceforth messages as described in paragraph 6b above, exchanged between representatives of private companies in Japan and their offices in the United States or Hawaii, charges for which are paid in the United States or Hawaii on a specifically authorized "transferred account" basis, will be considered private messages instead of SCM.

8. Private messages will include the classifications FULL RATE, CODE (ODE), DEFERRED (LC), and NIGHT LETTER (NLT). ODE private messages may be sent from Japan to the United States or Hawaii only by those individuals and private company representatives specifically authorized by General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers. Rates for private message classifications will be the same as for similar classifications in the SCM group.

9. Private messages between the United States and Japan, or between Hawaii and Japan, will be subject to all applicable censorship rules and regulations. Exceptions will be specifically provided for by General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers.

10. Portuguese language is authorized in addition to those languages already permitted between the United States or Hawaii, and Japan.

11. All private messages originating in Japan for transmission to the United States or Hawaii, payments for which are provided for in reply paid vouchers, will contain in the preamble the indicator ANSTORP (answer to reply paid message), which will be written in by the accepting office.

12. The handling of private messages containing reply paid indicator (RP\$) in the address, including issuance of vouchers and use or refund of vouchers, will be accomplished in accordance with the provisions of the International Telegraph Regulations (Cairo 1938), Article 56, Paragraph 465, except that:

a. The number of words in any such message filed from Japan to the United States or Hawaii must be limited to prevent the charge from exceeding the amount contained in the reply paid voucher.

b. No refund of an unused portion of any such prepayment will be made unless such portion amounts to at least \$0.50.

13. The procedure to be employed in refunding unused amounts of reply paid vouchers, or the payment of the United States carriers' shares of the used amounts of reply paid vouchers, will be as follows: The Ministry of Communications will deduct such amounts from its proportion of Military Payment Certificate dollars derived from prepaid messages destined to the United States or Hawaii during the period in which the refund or apportionment is made, and include such amounts in the sum deposited with the Transfer Agent for Telephone and Telegraph Message Funds, to the credit of the United States carrier concerned, for the same period. The final monthly traffic accounting statements will include identification of all ANSTORP messages sent over the circuit during the period concerned, and appropriate entries in these reports will indicate amounts which have been refunded to the American carriers in accordance with requests therefor, with sufficient data to identify the messages concerned.

14. Direct correspondence between the Civil Communications Section, General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, and the Ministry of Communications, regarding operating and accounting procedures within the scope of this memorandum, is authorized.

1. Reference is made to the following:

2. The Imperial Japanese Government is directed to place all the property listed in "List 2(A)", reference 1c above, in warehouses or custody in accordance with the directions contained in reference 1b above.

3. The Imperial Japanese Government is directed to evaluate all the property listed in "List 2(A)", reference 1c above, in terms of yen prices existing in Japan for similar articles on 7 December 1941, and to submit to General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, a list showing such valuations.

4. The Imperial Japanese Government is directed to impound the property listed in "List 2(B)", reference 1d above, only to the extent of requiring the present custodians of the property not to dispose of such property but to retain possession and custody of the property pending further instructions. The present custodians of the property may make

- According to Nos. 424 and 425, reference lb above, two pieces of I.B.M. equipment, a classifying machine and a calculating machine, now in the custody of the Tokyo Financial Affairs Bureau, Kaniyaki, Sagamihamachi, Kazo-gun, Kanagawa-ken, were transferred to their present location from the Osaka Army Arsenal during 1945. Reference list gives the country of origin of these machines as "unknown".
- The Central Liaison Office is directed to re-investigate the origin of the two machines mentioned in paragraph 3 above with a view to determining whether they were a part of the group of business machines removed from Java.

The Swedish Diplomatic Mission in Japan presents its compliments to the Imperial Ministry for Foreign Affairs and has the honour to inform the latter as follows.

In practice as of late, a considerable part of the correspondence between those Swedish Authorities concerned with the protection of Japanese interests in 24 countries and territories on the one hand, and the Imperial Ministry on the other hand, passes through the intermediary of this Mission. It has, therefore, been found appropriate that the Imperial Government share the administrative expenses of the Protecting Power Section of this Mission proportionately with the other Governments whose affairs are handled by the said Section.

Effective from 1st January, 1947, the Swedish Foreign Ministry will, therefore, add the above share of the expenses of this Mission to the expenses of the other Swedish Authorities in charge of Japanese interests abroad.
