SUBJECT: Substitution of Osaka-Colombo Circuit for Osaka-London Radiotelegraph Circuit for Service Between Japan and all Points in the British Commonwealth.

1. Reference is made to Memoranda for the Imperial Japanese Government, as follows:

a. File AG 311.23 (11 Jan 46) CCS (SCAPIN-578), dated 11 January 1946, subject: Establishment of Sender Composition Message Service and Press Service Between Great Britain and the Tokyo Area.

b. File AG 311.23 (17 Sept 46) CCS (SCAPIN-1206), dated 17 September 1946, subject: Establishment of Expeditionary Force and Sender Composition Message Service Between Japan and all Points in the British Commonwealth over the Osaka-London Radiotelegraph Circuit.

2. Effective at 0001 hours, 10 May 1947, direct radiotelegraph communications will be established between Osaka and Colombo, Ceylon.

3. Coincidental with the establishment of the Osaka-Colombo radiotelegraph circuit the direct radiotelegraph circuit between Osaka and London will be discontinued.

4. The provisions contained in reference Memoranda a and b will apply in all respects to the Osaka-Colombo circuit.

5. Direct communications between the Civil Communications Section, General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, and the Ministry of Communications, regarding operating procedures within the scope of this memorandum, are authorized.

SUBJECT: Restitution to Florence Wells of Property Wrongfully Transferred

1. Reference is made to:

a. Memorandum for the Imperial Japanese Government, file AG 386.3 (6 May 46)CPC, SCAPIN 926, 6 May 1946, subject, "Procedure for Returning Property in Japan to Nationals of the United Nations", from General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers;

b. Memorandum for the Imperial Japanese Government, file AG 386.3 (22 Nov 46)CPC/FP, SCAPIN 1354, 22 November 1946, subject, "Restitution of United Nations Nationals' Property Wrongfully Transferred", from General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers;

c. Memorandum to the Ministry of Finance, file 095 (31 Jan 47) CPC/FP, 31 January 1947, subject, "Property in Japan Owned on 7 December 1941 by Florence Wells, American", from General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, Civil Property Custodian;

d. LO 1044 (SF/FP), 12 April 1947, subject, "Report on property of Miss Florence Wells, American", from the Ministry of Finance.

2. The Imperial Japanese Government is directed to take possession of all property covered by the attached list and to assemble all movable property at a safe storage area, by 28 May 1947, preparatory to restoring the property to Florence Wells who owned the property on 7 December 1941.

3. It is further directed that the Imperial Japanese Government return all property on the attached list, and any additional movables which may be located and identified, to Florence Wells at 1235 and 1236 Karuizawa, Shinshu on 28 May 1947 at 1000 hours, under conditions set forth in "Receipt for Restitution to United Nation National of Wrongfully Transferred Property in Japan", and under the following conditions:

a. A general and a final report by the Japanese Government on the management of the property from 7 December 1941 to the date of

restoration, said report to include statement of all financial transactions, will be attached to each copy of the receipt;

b. If the property has been leased subsequent to seizure, the Japanese Government will afford the restoree the option either to allow the lease to continue in force or to terminate it at the time of the restoration of the property to her. Should the restoree decide to terminate such lease, the Japanese Government will take the action necessary to provide her vacant possession;

c. All inventories included in the receipt will contain a statement as to the condition of the property at the time of restoration;

d. Title to the property shall be restored to its status prior to wrongful transfer, confiscation or transfer under duress, and the property will be restituted free of all legal encumbrances placed on it subsequently. Transfer of title will be made at the District Court having jurisdiction.

4. Four copies of accomplished receipt for the property with documentary evidence of the transfer of title will be submitted to General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers within ten (10) days of completion of delivery. Receipts and evidence of transfer of title will be submitted in both English and Japanese text with the Japanese translation certified as correct.

5. Copy of this memorandum will be attached to each copy of the receipt.





1. The following area has been approved for use as an antiaircraft artillery firing range by elements of the Eighth United States Army, effective 10 May 1947:

Choshi Area: That sector with a radius of 31,000 yards with its center at 35° 42' 12" North Latitude, 140° 41' 41" East Longitude and limited by points at 35° 31' 31" North Latitude, 140° 28' 21" East Longitude and 35° 35' 2" North Latitude, 140° 58' 8" East Longitude.

2. Firing in this area will be directed seaward from gun positions about thirteen (13) kilometers west of Choshi. Conduct of practice involves firing at aircraft-towed targets and pilotless aircraft. Safety observers will be present.

3. The United States Army units using this range will submit notices of scheduled firings to the Japanese and English presses serving the area forty-eight hours prior to firing.

4. You will notify all appropriate agencies, other than Occupation Forces, concerning the establishment of the Choshi firing range and will prohibit the entrance of all craft into the area during the periods of scheduled firing.



1. Reference is Memorandum for the Imperial Japanese Government from General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, AG 260 (24 Nov 45) ESS/PI, dated 24 November 1945, SCAPIN 338, subject: Pensions and Benefits.

2. Investigation indicates that certain provisions of the above memorandum have been violated by the First and Second Bureaus of the Demobilization Board.

3. The Imperial Japanese Government is hereby directed to audit immediately all accounts of the First and Second Demobilization Bureaus from 15 August 1945 to 31 March 1947 and, in each case where violations of the referred memorandum have occurred, to remove the official or officials responsible and initiate legal proceedings against them in accordance with Imperial Ordinance #311 of 1946. Weekly Reports will be furnished General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, showing the progress of any prosecutions instituted pursuant to this memorandum and will be continued until such action has been completed.

4. It is further directed that a report of the results of the audit shall be submitted to General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers not later than 30 June 1947. This report shall be divided into two sections, one covering the period 15 August 1945 to 31 January 1946, and the other from 1 February 1946 to 31 March 1947, and will indicate:

a. The source of all revenues placed at the disposal of the Demobilization Bureaus;

b. The specific purpose of all expenditures (e.g., salaries to government officials, relief payments to discharged personnel, payments on war contracts, etc.);

c. That portion expended directly by the central offices, as well as that allocated to the local agencies; and





SUBJECT: Release for Use of Yen Bank Accounts by German Concerns  
for the Purpose of Paying Salaries and Incidental Expenses

1. Reference is made to memorandum for the Imperial Japanese Government, file AG 386.7 (23 Sep 46)CPC/FP, SCAFIN 2241-A, 23 September 1946, subject, "Release for Use of Yen Bank Accounts by German Concerns for the Purpose of Paying Salaries and Incidental Expenses", from General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers.

2. Reference memorandum is rescinded, effective 1 June 1947, and the following substituted therefor:

a. The Imperial Japanese Government is directed that all applications requesting the use of yen bank accounts by German firms for the purpose of paying salaries and incidental expenses will be subject to the following restrictions:

- (1) All payments will be made in accordance with existing provisions of applicable regulations and ordinances of the Imperial Japanese Government and no remuneration will be paid which exceeds the amounts authorized by such laws and ordinances as are in effect at the time the payments become due except when specific approval is given by General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers.
- (2) No charge incurred prior to 1 September 1945 will be paid.

3. It is further directed that neither the Central Liaison Office nor the Ministry of Finance of the Imperial Japanese Government will forward more than three (3) applications for release of funds to German firms with each letter of transmittal.

4. Detailed reports as to exact amounts paid under any approved application shall be submitted to General Headquarters, Supreme Commander

5. This memorandum shall not be construed to release funds from the blocking provisions of any other memorandum issued by General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, or any other Ordinance promulgated by the Imperial Japanese Government.
