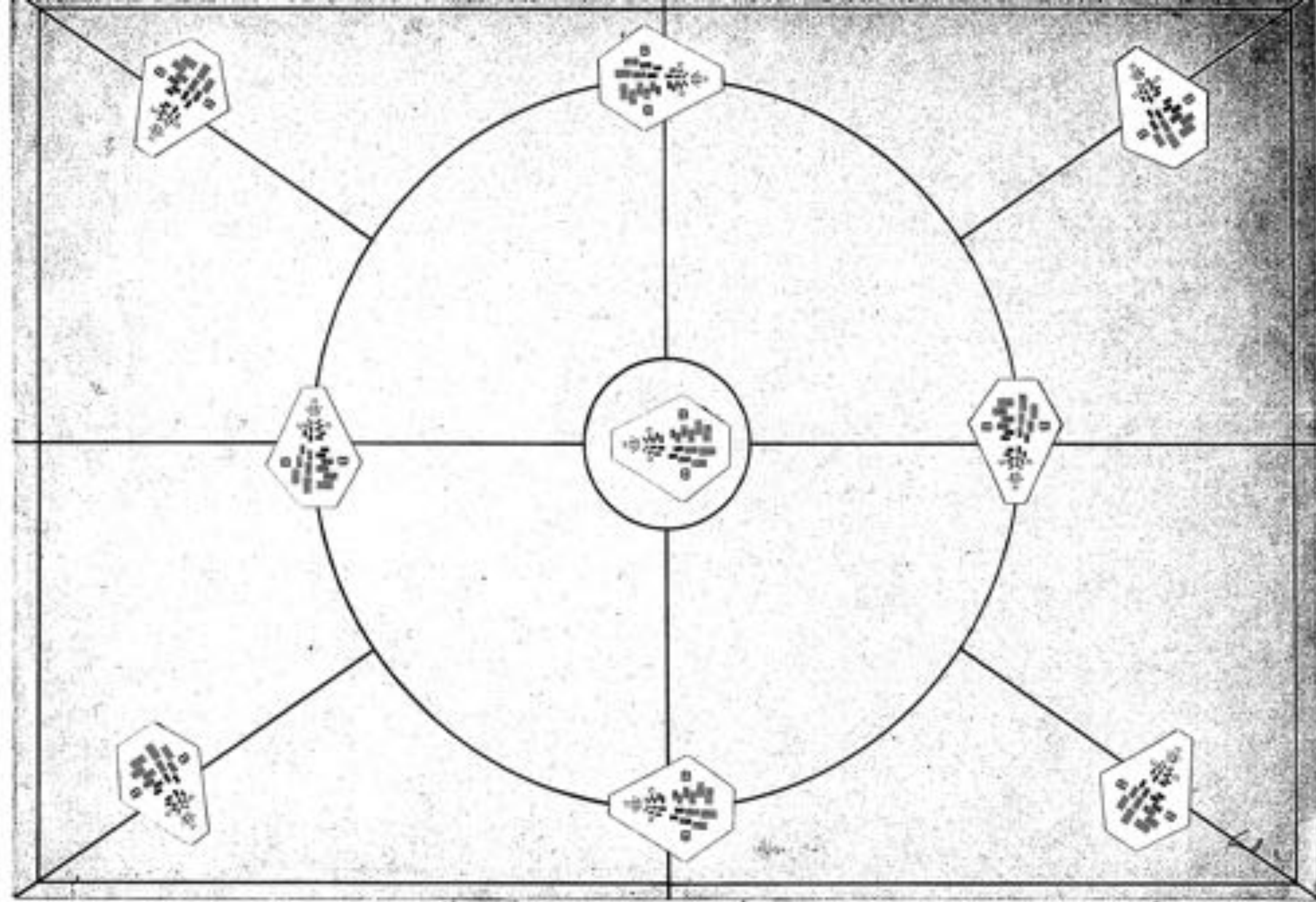

1. It is the responsibility of the Japanese Government to properly pack, ship, and safeguard all locked property which has been placed in the custody of the Japanese Government.
2. Between 16 and 19 February 1947, two sewing machines numbered 2245041 and 3479007 were stolen from the Shinjuku Freight Station while in transit from Tama Station, Gunma Prefecture, to the Hitachi Warehouse, Maebashi-aka, Tokyo. The Japanese police were notified and an investigation was instituted, but to date there has been no trace of the stolen machines.
3. The Central Liaison Office is directed to investigate and report upon the location and condition of the subject machines. The required report will be made to the Civil Property Custodian by 20 September 1947 and will include information regarding action taken to apprehend the thief and the punishment imposed.

 - b. "As far as the Mission's knowledge goes, ICHIKI has been a personal friend of KANG Ching-wei, but he was not actually a member of the 'New' organ.
 - c. "The Mission understands that ICHIKI was a so-called 'advocate of complete peace' with China."

1. Reference is made to Memorandum for the Japanese Government, file AG 311.23 (20 Aug 47) OCS, (SCAFIN-1730), dated 30 August 1947, subject: Expansion of Radiotelegraph Service via the United States.
2. Upon receipt of this memorandum, the Japanese Government is directed to expand the radiotelegraph service between Japan and the United States to include private, press and government messages between Japan and the points listed in Inclosure 1.
3. Messages originating in Japan addressed to any of the points listed in Inclosure 1 will be routed via the Japan-United States circuits in conformity with existing traffic distribution regulations and practices. Incoming transit messages destined to points beyond Japan will not be accepted.
4. Message classifications authorized, division of revenue and the rates applicable thereto, are as shown in Inclosure 1.
5. Messages filed by United States military and accredited civilian personnel between Japan and the points listed in Inclosure 1, in the classifications specified in this memorandum, are authorized.
6. All press messages, and government messages for other than the United States Government, will be sent "collect" from Japan to the points listed in Inclosure 1 and arrangements for collection of charges must be made prior to the acceptance of such messages. All such messages from these points to Japan will be prepaid.
7. United States Government messages between Japan and the points listed in Inclosure 1 will be handled in the same manner as United States Government messages between Japan and the United States. Rates for government messages, other than United States Government messages, will be the same as for Full Rate, CEM, LC and MIF messages as provided for in this memorandum.
8. Private messages may be sent from Japan by any organization or person authorized to possess and use United States Military Payment Certificates and

10. Private messages with prepaid reply (RP) from the points listed in Inclosure 1, addressed to non-accredited organizations or persons in Japan, including Japanese nationals, are authorized. Prepaid reply (RP) amounts will, in all cases, be quoted in United States Dollars.
11. Private messages with prepaid reply (RP) between Japan and the points listed in Inclosure 1, are not authorized for accredited organizations or persons, nor for military personnel.
12. All existing rules and regulations pertaining to private messages with prepaid reply (RP) exchanged between Japan and the United States or Hawaii, will apply equally to private messages with prepaid reply (RP) exchanged between Japan and the points listed in Inclosure 1.
13. Private messages between the points listed in Inclosure 1 and Japan will be subject to all applicable necessary rules and regulations. Exceptions will be specifically provided for by General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers.
14. Payment of Japanese Ministry of Communications' share of revenue and the American carriers' share, including their outpayment to connecting carriers, will be handled through the Transfer Agent for Telephone and Telegraph Message Funds in the same manner in which payments are made to the Japanese Ministry of Communications and the American carriers for message traffic exchanged between Japan and the United States.
15. Direct communications between the Civil Communications Section, General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, and the Ministry of Communications, regarding operating and accounting procedures within the scope of this memorandum, are authorized.

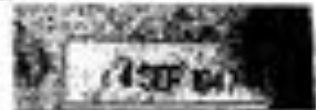

c. Report to Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers by 5 October 1947 the action taken in compliance with paragraphs 2 a and b above.

3. Upon accomplishment of the provisions of this directive, the barrack ships presently assigned to Hakodate Reception Center will be withdrawn by the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers.

restoration of the property. Should the restorer decide to terminate
such lease, the Japanese Government will take the action necessary to
provide vacant possession;

c. All inventories included in the receipt will contain a
statement as to the condition of the property at the time of restoration;

d. Title to the property shall be restored to its status prior
to wrongful transfer, confiscation or transfer under duress, and the
property will be restituted free of all legal encumbrances placed on it
subsequently. Transfer of title will be made at the judicial bureau, or
the branch offices, having jurisdiction;

e. All funds subject to restitution will be restored to a free
yen account status. Funds formerly on deposit in United Nations banking
institutions and now on deposit in the Special Property Administration
Account in the Bank of Japan are not subject to restitution to individual
depositors.

3. Four copies of accomplished receipt for the property with down-
sized evidence of the transfer of title will be submitted to General
Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers within ten (10)
days of completion of delivery. Receipts and evidence of transfer of
title will be submitted in both English and Japanese text with the Japa-
nese translation certified as correct.

1. The Japanese Government is directed to restore the Buick 1941-512 sedan, engine No. 54522155, now in protective custody at the Looting Property Warehouse, College of Agriculture, Setagaya, Tokyo, to the Government of the Republic of China.
2. The subject vehicle will be restored on 16 September 1947, at the office of the Civil Property Custodian, General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers. Dr. Faorong Wu has been designated by the Government of the Republic of China as the authorized representative to receive and give receipt for subject property.
3. The Japanese Government will designate by name an authorized representative to execute the receipt forms in its behalf and will notify General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, of his appointment. This representative will report for instructions to the Civil Property Custodian on or before 11 September 1947.
4. The necessary copies of the receipt forms will be available for signature by the authorized representatives of the Governments concerned at the time and place of restitution.
