1. The Japanese Government is directed to release from the stocks of Keoki Eidan the items necessary to fulfill validated Procurement Demand, number JPMR 0009, issued by the Procurement Division, Military Government Section, Eighth Army.

2. Subject items will be delivered as directed in the above-mentioned Procurement Demand to the Receiving Officer, British Commonwealth Occupation Force, Headquarters, Sase.

3. The Japanese Government is further directed to submit to General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, within thirty (30) days from the completion of delivery of subject items, a report showing the warehouses from which subject items were removed, and a copy of receipt signed by the receiving officer to whom delivery is made.

4. The provisions of this directive will not be construed as authority to release looted property.

3. The Japanese Government will:

a. Place sufficient warm clothing aboard the ship designated as stated, paragraph 2.

b. Insure that above-mentioned clothing is baled or packaged.

c. Furnish a report to the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers when above-mentioned clothing has been shipped.

SUBJECT: Machinery Removed from the Northwest Industrial Corporation, Shanai Province, China

1. Reference is made to the following:

2. The report submitted with reference to above indicated the disposition and/or location of only 174 of the total of 3667 machines reported to have been looted from the Northwest Industrial Corporation, Shanai Province, China. The list inclosed with reference to above indicated that the machinery was removed to the Tokyo and Osaka Arsenal as well as to the Hsueh Arsenal.

3. A search will be made of the Tokyo and Osaka Arsenal, as well as all other places where the machinery might be located, and a complete report will be submitted listing the location and/or disposition of each of the remaining 3493 looted machines.

4. The required report will be submitted to the Civil Property Custodian by 5 January 1948.

1. The Central Liaison Office is directed to investigate and report on the location, condition, and/or disposition of the sugar mill machinery listed in the inclosure.

1. Reference is made to memorandum from the Japanese Government C.L.O. No. 0028(20) of 17 November 1947, subject as above.

2. The contents of memorandum under reference were transmitted to the United Kingdom Liaison Mission in Japan, which has requested that the Japanese Government be informed as follows:

"First, the form of certificate which is enclosed as annex 2 to the Japanese Government memorandum was an emergency form, the discontinuance of which has been ordered by the Foreign Office. Secondly, under Foreign Service regulations, British subjects resident in foreign countries are expected to register at British Consulates; and the only form of certificate of registration whose issue is authorized is an endorsement on the passport of the holder. Passports may not, however, be issued for purposes of residence to dual nationals residing in the country of their second nationality. This ruling is in conformity with the general principle that dual nationals are not entitled to British protection in the country of their second nationality. It follows that no form of document can be issued to Anglo-Japanese dual nationals resident in Japan to show that their British nationality is recognized by His Majesty's Government. As a consequence, it is regretted that it is impossible to comply with the request of the Japanese Government."

4. The Japanese Government shall submit to the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers in triplicate the following:

a. Within ninety (90) days from the date of this memorandum, a progress report on the status of construction, reconstruction or rehabilitation authorized by this memorandum. The report shall show the following:

- (1) Complete accounting of the funds authorized for the project, including amounts paid and incurred, and an estimate of further expenditures required to complete the project.
- (2) Percent of project completed.
- (3) If not complete, estimated date when project will be completed.

b. Upon completion of the project, or upon request at any time prior to completion, a report on complete accounting of funds stating that the materials and equipment used in the construction, reconstruction or rehabilitation were purchased at or below official prices.

1. Reference is made to the following:
  - a. CMC No. 2336, 7 October 1946, subject, "Foreign Ships in Japanese Hands";
  - b. CMC No. 144(51), 9 June 1947, subject, "Foreign Flag Vessels in Japanese Possession (over 500 G/T)."
2. The Japanese Government is directed to make an investigation concerning the SS "Churruac", a Philippine vessel, and to submit a report to the Civil Property Custodian by 15 January 1948, giving the following information:
  - a. Present location and condition;
  - b. Type of vessel and specifications;
  - c. Flag the vessel was flying when acquired;
  - d. Circumstances surrounding the acquisition of the vessel.
3. In the event the vessel is sunk the following additional information is to be furnished:
  - a. Exact location of the sunken vessel (latitude and longitude, as well as geographical location);
  - b. Sea depth at the point of sinking;
  - c. Extent of damage to the vessel, if known;
  - d. A statement as to the salvability of the vessel, listing all factors and marine conditions considered in the statement.
4. Lloyd's Register for 1942-43 lists the following ships named SS "Churruac":

560 ( 19 DEC 1947 ) JPC/TP

- a. A vessel of 1847 gross tons, built in 1911, owned by MacIndress and Company, Ltd., length 264' 8", breadth 41' 2", depth 18' 8", registered in London, flag British;
- b. A vessel of 788 gross tons, built in 1935, owned by the Manila Steamship Company, Inc., length 190', breadth 28' 2", depth 16', registered in Manila, flag United States;
- c. A vessel of 711 gross tons, built in 1938, owned by Felipe Garcia, length 205' 5", breadth 29' 1", depth 16' 5", registered in Callao, flag Peruvian.
5. In the list of ships sunk outside Japanese waters included with reference 1a it was reported that the SS "Churruac" (Japanese name "Yasuda Maru"), a cargo vessel of 711 gross tons, flying the flag of Peru, was captured on 23 February 1944 and was sunk in the South China Sea on 14 August 1944. In reference 1b, however, it was reported that the SS "Churruac" (Japanese name "Hakuo Maru"), a semi-cargo vessel of 1847 gross tons, flag British, was salvaged at Hong Kong on 31 August 1943 and was sunk at Hainan Island on 14 August 1944.

6. It seems most improbable that both the British ship "Churruac" and the Peruvian ship of the same name were sunk in the same locality on the same date. In view of the apparent confusion as to the identity, there is a possibility that the sunken vessel is neither the British nor the Peruvian SS "Churruac", but instead the 788-gross ton Philippine vessel of that name.

7. The Central Liaison Office is directed to make further investigation in order to correctly identify the vessel named SS "Churruac", which was sunk in the South China Sea (or at Hainan Island) on 14 August 1944, and to report to the Civil Property Custodian by 15 January 1948.

Reference 1b also stated that the vessel was flying the British flag when seized by the Japanese.
- Lloyd's Register for 1942-43 lists the SS "Argus" as a vessel of 1025 gross tons, owned by Matrigal and Company, registered in the port of Manila, and flying the flag of the United States.
- The Central Liaison Office is directed to investigate further to determine the accuracy of the report that this vessel was flying the British flag when seized. The report is to be submitted to the Civil Property Custodian by 15 January 1948.

TOPIC: Shortage of Japanese Laborers

1. It has come to the attention of General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, that a shortage of Japanese labor exists for certain construction being performed for the Occupation Forces. This shortage is most acute in the Tokyo area, and the project suffering the greatest labor shortage is the Coast Heights project. This labor shortage is attributable to inefficient distribution of food and clothing rations, lack of transportation, and financial difficulties of contractors due to delay in payments by the Japanese Government.

2. To correct this situation, it is directed that the Japanese Government initiate remedial measures immediately to include but not to be limited to the following:

a. Payments due on contracts will be kept current to *the* sufficient amount to enable contractors to pay their employees promptly. Supervisors will be such as to insure that employees will be so paid.

b. Positive supervision and control will be exercised to insure an equitable and proper distribution of prescribed food and clothing rations to the laborers.

c. Maximum transportation will be made available to or provided for the laborers.

3. An initial report of progress made in the execution of the foregoing directive will be required to General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, not later than 30 December 1947.

In addition to the interrogations directed in reference 1d above, the Central Liaison Office will question the responsible Japanese ex-army personnel who would have received the 50-HP bulldozer which was transferred to the Japanese Army in October 1945, and the responsible Japanese ex-army personnel who would have received the 100-HP bulldozer transferred to the Japanese Army in June 1946.

a. A general and a final report by the Japanese Government on the management of the property from 7 December 1941 to the date of restoration, said report to include statement of all financial transactions, will be attached to each copy of the receipt;

b. If the property has been leased subsequent to seizure, the Japanese Government will afford the restoree the option either to allow the lease to continue in force or to terminate it at the time of the restoration of the property.

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Should the restorer decide to transfer to such loss, the Japanese Government will take the action necessary to provide vacant possession;

c. All inventories included in the receipt will contain a statement as to the condition of the property at the time of restoration;

d. Title to the property shall be restored to its status prior to wrongful transfer, confiscation or transfer under duress, and the property will be restituted free of all legal encumbrances placed on it subsequently. Transfer of title will be made at the Judicial Office, or its branch offices, having jurisdiction. Wherein property is being used by the Occupation Forces, title to the property will be transferred but the Occupation Forces will continue to use the property until it is convenient to vacate;

e. All funds subject to restitution will be restored to a free yen account status. Funds formerly on deposit in United Nations banking institutions and now on deposit in the Special Property Administration Account in the Bank of Japan are not subject to restitution to individual depositors.

3. Four copies of accomplished receipt for the property with documentary evidence of the transfer of title will be submitted to General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers within ten (10) days of completion of delivery. Receipts and evidence of transfer of title will be submitted in both English and Japanese text with the Japanese translation certified as correct.

2. Paragraph 1 of the reference, paragraph 1 a above, is amended by addition of the following:

Sub-paragraph f. Limit the baggage of Korean illegal immigrants being returned to Korea south of 38° north latitude to such baggage as is necessary for their personal use to prevent subject illegal immigrants from becoming public charges upon their return to Korea south of 38° north latitude. Such baggage will be limited to the amount each such Korean can carry at one time.

Sub-paragraph g. Take such steps as are deemed appropriate to ensure that no Korean illegal immigrants have in their possession upon their return to Korea south of 38° north latitude, either alien registration cards and ration cards of the type issued by the Japanese Government or any falsified official papers and credentials, such as falsified travel orders, which might facilitate illegal entry of Koreans into Japan.

1. Reference is made to CLO letter number 9674(EF), dated 18 December 1947, subject: Request for Release of Sugar as Rice Substitute for Distribution in December, 1947.

2. The Japanese Government is authorized to issue a certificate of ownership of the Eastman-Kodak Company films, listed in inclosure, to the D. Nagase & Company, Osaka.

2. No objection is offered to the distribution of 14,135 metric tons of imported sugar in accordance with the plan outlined in reference CLO letter. The imported sugar is to be distributed in substitution for the normal staple food ration at the rate of 1.1 part staple food to 1 part sugar, the equivalent caloric value of the two commodities. Three hundred grams per capita, a one day ration, will be distributed through normal staple food ration channels.

It is directed that the Japanese Government return all property on the attached list, and any additional movables which may be located and identified, to Standard Vacuum Oil Company at the addresses shown on the attached list, on 28 January 1948 at 1000 hours, and under conditions set forth in "Receipt for Restitution to United Nation National of Wrongfully Transferred Property in Japan," and under the following conditions:

a. A general and a final report by the Japanese Government on the management of the property from 7 December 1941 to the date of restoration, said report to include statement of all financial transactions, will be attached to each copy of the receipt;

b. If the property has been leased subsequent to seizure, the Japanese Government will afford the restoree the option either to allow the lease to continue in force or to terminate it at the time of the restoration of the property.

Should the restoree decide to terminate such lease, the Japanese Government will take the action necessary to provide vacant possession:

c. All inventories included in the receipt will contain a statement as to the condition of the property at the time of restoration;

d. Title to the property shall be restored to its status prior to wrongful transfer, confiscation or transfer under duress, and the property will be restituted free of all legal encumbrances placed on it subsequently. Transfer of title will be made at the Judicial Bureau, or its branch offices, having jurisdiction;

e. All funds subject to restitution will be restored to a free yen account status. Funds formerly on deposit in United Nations banking institutions and now on deposit in the Special Property Administration Account in the Bank of Japan are not subject to restitution to individual depositors.

3. Four copies of accomplished receipt for the property with documentary evidence of the transfer of title will be submitted to General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers within ten (10) days of completion of delivery. Receipts and evidence of transfer of title will be submitted in both English and Japan-as text with the Japanese translation certified as correct.
