The Swedish Diplomatic Mission in Japan presents its compliments to the Japanese Ministry for Foreign Affairs and has the honour to indicate that, according to information from the Swedish Foreign Ministry, the Correspondent at Stockholm, Sweden, of the Tokyo "Sodari" newspaper, Mr HIROSHI KITAHARA, as well as his wife and their two children, who are all four of them Japanese citizens, were expected to leave Gothenburg, Sweden, on 24th December, 1947, by ship for London, Great Britain, whence they will proceed on 26th December, 1947, by airplane via CALCUTTA, India, for SAKU, Japan, where they are scheduled to arrive on 31st December, 1947.

b. ¥47,216.805 due the deceased Allied prisoners of war and civilian internees regarding which letters of notification of transmittal of the funds had been received by the Japanese Prisoners of War Information Bureau, from Japanese Prisoners of War Camps.

3. It is further directed that a report of the transfer be submitted to General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, within thirty (30) days of the date of this memorandum.

1. Reference is made to the following memoranda to the Japanese Govern-

2. Captain Yoshida, war offender, was sentenced and stayed by a
British War Crimes Tribunal in Singapore. His assets, properties, and monies
were ordered confiscated in accordance with the sentence of the court.

3. The Japanese Government is hereby directed to liquidate subject prop-
erty and deposit the proceeds to same liquidation to the credit of the Compen-
sation Expense Account.

4. A report of the above transaction will be submitted to General Head-
quarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, including the following
information:

- a. Description of properties sold
- b. Names of sale or sales
- c. Total amount deposited in the compensation expense account.

5. An interim report will be submitted within sixty (60) days in the
event the above transaction has not been completed at that time.

1. Reference is made to CIO 9670 (70), 28 December 1947, subject: "Transfer of War: Concerning Disposal of Commodities Returned by GHI, SCAP to Japanese Government from Home Ministry to Construction Board in Connection with Dissolution of Home Ministry".

2. In view of the impending dissolution of the Home Ministry, the Construction Board (KENGOKU-IN) is designated as the successor agency of the Japanese Government to receive and account for supplies, materials, and equipment of the former Japanese armed forces that have been or will be returned to the control of the Japanese Government. The transfer of responsibility from the Home Ministry to the Construction Board will be accomplished without interruption.

3. All records which have been maintained by the Home Ministry in connection with the receipt and disposition of the supplies, materials, and equipment so returned will be transferred intact to the custody of the Construction Board which shall henceforth be charged with the responsibility for their maintenance.

4. All directives which have been issued by General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers treating with the return of surrendered supplies, materials, and equipment to the Japanese Government wherein the Home Ministry was referred to as the responsible agency thereof, shall now be construed to refer to the Construction Board with equal force and effect.

SUBJECT: Library Buildings.

1. Reference is made to the memorandum for the Japanese Government AS 431 (23 Aug 47) CIL (SCAFIN 4421-4), dated 23 August 1947, subject, "Library Buildings", from the General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers.

2. It is desired that the space indicated in the buildings listed below be added to that listed in paragraph 5, reference 1, to be made available immediately and that the Japanese Government, at its own expense, establish and maintain "Information Libraries" therein, subject to the supervision directed by the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers:

- a. The main floor of the Butekosen, East Park, Fukuoka.
- b. The first floor of the main Saito Kaohai Building, 3 Daimoji Owanoden, Sendai.
- c. The main floor of the Nishi 1-chome, Nissai 2-jo, Sapporo.
- d. The building at 60 Setotagaya-machi, Takamatsu, owned by Mr. Nobuyuki Hase, 302 Nipponkai-cho, Takamatsu, and occupied by the Nissai Insurance Company.
- e. The San Jo Kinen Kan, Fukurowaschi, Hiroshima.

3. The above buildings will be rehabilitated and provided with furnishings to make them suitable for the desired purpose, and will be staffed with Japanese assistants subordinate to the librarians assigned by General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers.

4. The Supreme Commander desires that appropriate economy be exercised and that only minimum necessary equipment and construction or rehabilitation be provided. No attempt will be made to equip or rehabilitate library buildings or grounds to the standard of the G.I.A.F. library in Tokyo, for example. The entire library program will be subject to current budgetary restrictions, as provided for in the rehabilitation of all public buildings by the Japanese Government.

5. Additional buildings will be required in the following cities during the first six months of 1948 to provide for the development of the library program:

It is desired that the Japanese Government make preliminary selection of buildings which can be made available for this purpose in the indicated cities, obtaining the approval of the Civil Information and Education Section, General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, before final selection and prior to initiation of any rehabilitation or construction work at each location.

6. By separate memoranda being issued this date, existing procurement demands for the rehabilitation and operation of the main "CIEE Information Library" in Tokyo, located in Yuraku-cho 1-chome, Chiyoda-ku, are being revealed, and this building will be given the same status as the facilities listed in paragraph 2 above.

7. Direct communication between the Japanese Government and the Civil Information and Education Section, General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, regarding details within the scope of this memorandum, including the designation of buildings of cities listed in paragraph 5, is authorized.

2. The subject property was looted from the Sun-Sing No. 4 Cotton Spinning and Weaving Company, Hankow, China (漢口中所中興織染公司), during the Japanese occupation of Hankow.

3. The subject machinery was first removed to the Japanese "Shi-An" Cotton Mill (日中興紗廠) in 1941 by order of Okamura, who was then Japanese Commander of the Japanese Headquarters (駐漢陽軍司令部), the 550th Japanese Battalion (三五〇大隊), and Otaubo (大田), Chief of the Japanese Spinning and Weaving Industry, were responsible for the removal of the subject property.

4. In November 1943, the subject machinery was removed from the "Shi-An" Cotton Mill by a Japanese named Katsuzuki (加藤), and shipped aboard the SS "Shan Laru" (漢陽丸) and the SS "Kuang-Pa Laru" (光復丸). The shipping had been contracted to the Teo Ocean Transportation Company (太古洋行), and the Central China Navigation Company (中興航運公司).

5. The required report is to be submitted to the Civil Property Custodian by 30 January 1948.

SUBJECT: Accommodations for Semi-Permanent Commercial
Representatives and Licenses.

1. The Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers has authorized the entrance into Japan of commercial representatives and has licensed certain firms and individuals to do business in Japan. The Japanese Government is now operating hotels in Tokyo, Osaka, Kyoto and Nagoya; however, it will be necessary in the future to provide offices and housing for authorized individuals on a semi-permanent basis.

2. The Japanese Government will designate an agency to assist the individuals described in paragraph 1 above to arrange for necessary accommodations, rehabilitation and upkeep. In cases where the individuals desire to make payment in acceptable foreign exchange, this agency will arrange to reimburse the owners in Japanese yen and to accept foreign exchange from the payer. Such arrangements will be subject to approval of the Foreign Trade Division of General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, Economic and Scientific Section. Funds collected will be deposited in accordance with instructions governing disposition of proceeds of international trade.

3. From time to time the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers will return to the Japanese Government facilities which have been procured for the Occupation Forces. The Japanese Government may make arrangements to utilize such property for rental to commercial representatives and authorized licensees. In such cases, payment of rental will be made in acceptable foreign exchange as indicated in paragraph 2 above.

4. The plan is based on

(1) The need for a well-planned, well-organized, and well-
executed public health education program for the people of Japan.

(2) The necessity for close coordination and cooperation of
the various public health education programs being conducted by various
Districts of the Japanese Government.

5. Subject mentioned Part II refers to a portion of the public
Health Education Program.

6. General order of the program includes

A. Planning at the District Level

(1) Establishment of advisory committees

(a) Committee of the District Government for Public

(c) General Community Promoting Committee (Anti-
Typhoid Association, Youth and Men's Association, Ladies and Child
Committee, etc.)

(a) Publicity and Information Committee

activities of the Press, Radio, and Motion Pictures relating to health
education.

(d) Preparation of health educational materials.

(e) Organization of Public Health Committees in the six
larger cities of Japan.

(f) Constitution of the Public Health Training Unit.

(g) Addition of health education personnel to staff of
Ministry of Welfare.

B. Planning at Prefectural Level

(1) Addition of health education personnel to staff of
prefectural health offices.

(2) Improvement in the methods for the dissemination of
health education.

(3) Dissemination of information concerning health and
welfare.

(4) Cooperation in the work of public health teams.

(5) Organization of lecture courses for health officials
and others engaged in health work.

(6) Establishment of a health education team at each Health
Center.

7. This is a long range program. Directives will be issued to
prefectural governments by the Ministry of Welfare when specific portions
of the plan are to be effected.

8. Command instructions will follow through command channels pertaining
to the execution of surveillance. The following procedure is suggested:

A. Maintain periodic surveillance to be certain that all existing
