Title to the property shall be restored to its status prior to wrongful transfer, confiscation or transfer under duress, and the property will be restituted free of all legal encumbrances placed on it subsequently. Transfer of title will be made at the Judicial Bureau, or its branch offices, having jurisdiction;

e. All funds subject to restitution will be restored to a free yen account status. Funds formerly on deposit in United Nations banking institutions and now on deposit in the Special Property Administration Account in the Bank of Japan are not subject to restitution to individual depositors.

3. 300,000 linear yards of cloth (grey or bleached) for sewing attire;

600,000 linear yards of cloth for underwear;

200,000 linear yards of cloth (grey or bleached) for quilts;

50,000 pieces of towel or tanget (includes bath towels).

3. The Japanese Government is further directed to submit to General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, within thirty (30) days from the date of this memorandum, a report showing the quantities, grades, look and purchase prices of the items released, and the location of the warehouses from which subject items are removed. A further report will be submitted upon completion of distribution of subject textiles, which will include the associations to which subject textiles have been allotted and the amounts allocated to each.

4. The provisions of this directive will not be construed as authority to release looted property.

The list of looted vehicles submitted with reference 1b above, which was forwarded to the prefectural offices where vehicles are registered, as directed in reference 1a above, represents but a small portion of those looted vehicles which the Japanese Government has investigated to date and reported as not being in Japan.

3. Inclosed is a complete list of looted vehicles which the Japanese Government has been directed to investigate and has reported as not found in Japan. These vehicles were reputedly looted from occupied areas by the Japanese forces during the war, and sent to Japan.

4. The inclosed list will be forwarded to each prefectural office where vehicles are registered and will be checked against all present vehicle registrations. If any vehicles on this list are found, they will be impounded immediately and a report forwarded to General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, Civil Property Custodian.

5. Whenever an investigation for a looted vehicle is directed by the Civil Property Custodian and such vehicle cannot be located among those registered at the prefectural offices, that vehicle will be added to the list described in paragraph 3 above.

6. Whenever a foreign made vehicle is registered in Japan, it will be checked against this "watch list" which will be maintained at each prefectural office. If the newly registered vehicle is found on this list, it will be impounded immediately and a report forwarded to General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, Civil Property Custodian.

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RAPPRESENTANZA D'ITALIA IN GIAPPONE

NOTE VERBALE

The Italian Diplomatic Mission presents its compliments to the Diplomatic Section of General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, and has the honor to request the kind assistance of the Section as the following matters:

The "COMITATO ITALIANO DEI PRIGIONIERI DI GUERRA" in Rome has applied for a list and details of all Italians who died in Japan while in the service of the Italian Army or Navy, and is particularly interested in knowing where are their remains and if they can be recovered.

18 cases containing the ashes of Italian seamen, former prisoners of war, who died in Japan were sent to Italy on board of the Italian s/s "Destriere", April 24th, 1947.

The Mission is now anxious to secure some information as to the final disposition of the bodies of the following men:

- 1) MENOCCI Erenegildo, a fireman of s/s "Ada", who died October 23rd, 1944 in the Marine Hospital at Tokyo. According to information given, at that time, by the former German firm "O. Illies" of Kobe, it appears that a box, containing presumably Menotti's ashes, had arrived in Osaka, sometime in January 1945.
- 2) ALICCO Elia, a former fireman on s/s "Ada", who died December 21st, 1942, while a prisoner of war in the concentration camp at Hirohata-Himeji (Osaka). From reports by other prisoners of war, it would appear that Lt. Haasegawa, then commander of said camp, had stated that a box containing Alicco's ashes, was removed to Osaka. No further reports are available.
- 3) MARTINI Oscar, former chief machinist on s/s "Ada", who died February 16th, 1945, at Hirohata, Himeji (Osaka) in P.O.W. camp. The box containing Martini's ashes, removed to Osaka.
- 4) FERRARA Giacomo, electrician, formerly on board of the Italian ship "Carignano", who died as P.O.W. at the already mentioned Hirohata camp. The ashes were removed to Osaka, according to a statement made at that time by said camp commander Lt. Haasegawa. No further reports.
- 5) MEDICINA Serafino, fireman, on s/s "Carignano", who died August 24th, 1942, in the University Hospital at Osaka. No information whatever as to place of burial.
- 6) CARIGNANO Antonio, fireman, on s/s "Carignano", who died February 12th, 1945 in Kobe; no information as to place of burial.
- 7) FERRARO Michele, machine greaser, on s/s Carignano, who died October 11th, 1944, in the International Hospital, Kobe; no information regarding his burial.

8) MINUTOLO Giovanni, seaman, who died July 20th, 1945, from injuries caused by bombing, while a P.O.W. in Camp No. 2 at Kawasaki (Kikend Seaman Camp).

9) SACCHINI Antonio, seaman, who died November 20th 1942, in Kobe, from disease; no information regarding his burial.

10) SAKIDA Ernesto, a former technical Officer of the former Italian auxiliary cruiser "Galileo", who was a prisoner of war at Shinagawa (Tokyo) and who died in the camp's hospital July 7th, 1945. Sakida's case is the subject of the Mission's note verbale dated October 27th, 1947.

The Mission thanks in advance the Section for its kind assistance in securing the desired information.

1. Reference is made to memorandum for the Japanese Government, File AD 880 (22 Oct 47) JPC/VP, SCAPIN 4788-A, 22 October 1947, subject, "Repair and Refitting of the SS "Banana.""

2. During an inspection of the SS "Banana," 9 November 1947, by Mr. Burns, surveyor to the American Bureau of Shipping, and Mr. Krieger, Civil Property Custodian Section, the specifications for the repairing and refitting of the subject vessel, as prepared by the Inosukita Shipyard, Hitachi Shipbuilding Company, were examined and on the whole considered satisfactory. However, during the inspection additional repairs were found to be necessary.

3. In order that the vessel may be restored to a condition substantially similar to that at the time acquired by the Japanese, as is directed in reference memorandum, the Central Liaison Office is directed to have the following repairs made to the vessel in addition to those outlined by the shipyard.

a. Hull

- (1) The vessel is to be placed upon dry dock and examined; rudder gudgeon bushings are to be renewed;
- (2) Shell plates are to be drilled in the way of the fore-peak tank; #1, 2, 3, and 4 holds; and the engine and boiler rooms. The following plates, which are thinned out and wasted, are to be renewed:
 - (a) Fore peak tank, strakes B, C, and H on starboard side; strake B on port side;
 - (b) No. 1 hold, strakes L, S, and F on starboard side; strakes S and F on port side;
 - (c) No. 2 hold, strake L on starboard side;
 - (d) No. 4 hold, strakes F and S on starboard side; strakes F, S, and H on port side;

- (3) The deck plates on the foremast deck are thinned out and wasted, and are to be renewed;

- (4) Line shafting and bearings and thrust blocks are to be cleaned;
- (5) Lagging on all piping is to be renewed, and pipes are to be examined and renewed where distorted or wasted;

- (7) Electrical installation is to be renewed entirely as submitted in specifications;
- (8) Upon completion of repairs, all surfaces of vessel are to have at least two coats of paint.

Acceptance of Messages, Rates, Accounting Procedures and
Settlement of Accounts for Messages to and from Norwegian
Merchant Shipping

1. Messages of the following types only will be accepted for transmission:

- a. Estimated time of arrival of shipping.
- b. Control of ship traffic.
- c. Official shipping information.
- d. Navigation or distress messages from shipping, in accordance with General Radio Regulations (Geneva Revision 1934).
- e. Full rate messages from any person on board ships of Norwegian registry to any person or organization in Japan.
- f. Full rate messages from any person or organization in Japan to any person on board ships of Norwegian registry.
- g. Messages exchanged between ships of Norwegian registry and Japanese coastal stations may be in plain language or in code and will be subject to all applicable censorship rules and regulations.

2. Rates for messages between Norwegian merchant shipping and Japan will be expressed in International Communications Gold Francs and are as follows:

- a. The land line charge between Japanese coastal radio stations and any point in Japan will be fifteen (15) centimes per full rate word.
- b. The Japanese coastal radio station charge will be sixty (60) centimes per full rate word.
- c. The ship station charge will be sixty (60) centimes per full rate word.

3. Messages originating both on board ship and in Japan will be sent prepaid. Payment will be made in Japan in Japanese Yen, at the authorized current rate of exchange between the International Communications Gold Franc and the Japanese Yen in Japan.

4. Japan's share in the revenue from the ship-shore service will be the sum of the coastal station and land line charges for both incoming and outgoing messages.

5. The accounting of message tolls will be the responsibility of the Norwegian Telegraph Board (Telegrafstyret) and the Japanese Ministry of Communications. Monthly statements of accounts will be submitted by both agencies through General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, by calendar month beginning 1 March 1946.

6. No settlement of accounts will be made until authorized by General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers.

TITLE: Central Liaison Office, Tokyo

SUBJECT: Reduction of Governmental Expenditures

1. Reference area

a. Memorandum from the Japanese Government, GLO 7737, 7 December 1947, subject: Request in regard to the Memorandum on Reduction of Governmental Expenditures.

b. Memorandum for the Japanese Government, File AG 130.01 (12 Sep 47) (222/91), SCAFIN 1775, 12 September 1947, subject: Reduction of Governmental Expenditures.

c. Memorandum for the Japanese Government, File AG 001.06 (19 Dec 47) (222/91), SCAFIN 1630, 19 December 1947, subject: Shortage of Japanese Laborers.

2. The steps taken or to be taken, as outlined in section 2 of the Enclosure to reference 1 a. above to insure compliance with the memorandum on reduction of governmental expenditures (SCAFIN 1775) referred to above are generally satisfactory with the exceptions noted below:

a. The general use of special supplemental rations, over and above the rations allowed to all workers of the types concerned, to obtain labor for construction on Occupation Force projects is not authorized.

b. In addition to establishing and publicizing prevailing rates of wages, official prices must be established for all items possible and such prices must be publicized to the fullest extent.

c. Specific procedures for the prompt audit of vouchers, without undue delay in processing legitimate claims for payment, to prevent the payment of accounts in excess of those permitted by SCAFIN 1775 must be developed and promulgated by the Japanese Government.

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SCAFIN 1775 to 21, Old 13 Jan 48, subj: Reduction of Governmental Expenditures. (SCAFIN 1775/3)

1. The provisions of SCAFIN 1775 have been called to the attention of all units of the Occupation Forces. While it may be true that conformance with the memorandum will make it more difficult for the Japanese Government to obtain materials not in stocks, the requirement for obtaining goods only at legal prices cannot be accepted as an excuse for failure to obtain the materials required by the Occupation Forces. The Japanese Government is required to meet Occupation Force requirements even though obtaining the required materials may upon occasion require the seizure, with compensation at legal prices, by the Japanese Government of materials not otherwise available at legal prices as has previously been provided under Imperial Ordinance No. 22, 27 February 1946, and Ministry of Commerce and Industry Ordinance No. 49, 23 November 1946.

2. Every effort has been made and is continuing to be made by General Headquarters to keep Occupation Force demands to a minimum. Through establishment of forecasting procedures of estimated requirements, establishment of the Special Procurement Board and expansion of its functions and by other means, estimates of requirements, including the furnishing of specifications in advance of contracts and establishment of realistic completion dates for construction projects, have been and will continue to be furnished. In addition, Procurement Demands for construction have over an appreciable time been accompanied by engineering estimates indicating the scope of the project. However, there can be no complaint for the Occupation Forces to give three months' advance notice of construction programs or materials requirements or not to make changes in specifications and plans for these relatively few instances where emergency or changed conditions dictate last notice or such changes.

3. Direct communication between the Ministry of Finance, the Economic Stabilization Board, and the Special Procurement Board and interested staff sections of General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, for the implementation of this memorandum is hereby authorized.

Transfer of title will be made at the Judicial Bureau, or its branch offices, having jurisdiction;

4. All funds subject to restitution will be restored to a free yen account status. Funds so early on deposit in United States banks, instituted as and now on deposit in the Special Property Administration Account in the Bank of Japan are not subject to restitution to individual depositors.

5. Four copies of accomplished receipt for the property with documentary evidence of the transfer of title will be submitted to General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers within ten (10) days of completion of delivery. Receipts and evidence of transfer of title will be submitted in both English and Japan as list with the Japanese translation certified as correct.
