SUBJECT : Shortage of Japanese Laborers

1. Reference your letter, C. I. O. No. 9517 (AG), subject as above, dated 30 December 1947, which forwarded initial report of progress required by paragraph 3, SCAFIS 1832.

2. The labor situation has not yet improved sufficiently, and further vigorous action is necessary, particularly in regard to the distribution of food and clothing rations to laborers. It is desired that such action be taken without delay.

3. An additional report of progress (in duplicate) is desired not later than 10 February 1948 and thereafter at ten day intervals until further advice from General Headquarters.

SUBJECT: Call for Payment of Unpaid Capital Stock of All Financial Institutions in Japan

1. The Japanese Government is directed to issue immediately a call for the payment in full of all unpaid capital stock of all financial institutions in Japan including the Bank of Japan and insurance companies. Actual payment by the Bank of Japan may be suspended until an appropriation of funds has been made by the Diet. Actual payment by a Special Accounting Company will be suspended until the approval of the reorganization plan, and will be paid within thirty days thereafter.

2. The Japanese Government is directed to complete this call within ninety days from the date of this Memorandum. Failure to meet the call will cause the owners of such stock to lose all right, title, interests and benefits pertaining thereto.

3. Notwithstanding any provisions of the Financial Institutions Reconstruction and Reorganization Law, the foregoing procedures will be applicable to owners as of the date hereof, and failure to meet the call will not relieve the liability of owners of record as of 31 August 1945, and owners between that date and 28 November 1947. Owners who acquire the stock on or after the date of this Memorandum will likewise assume liability for payment of the unpaid portion.

4. Paragraphs 2 and 3 will not be applicable to:

- a. Closed institutions
- b. United Nations Nationals
- c. Other non-Japanese Nationals residing outside of Japan.

5. In order to implement the provisions of this Memorandum, direct communication between the Ministry of Finance and interested staff sections of General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, is hereby authorized.

United Nations

1. The Secretary General of the United Nations has furnished a copy of circular note C.L. 36.1947 DOLATED of 20 December 1947 to the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers.

2. Circular note C.L. 36.1947 DOLATED of 20 December 1947 contains the following information:

a. The amendments set forth in the Annex to the Protocol signed at Lake Success, New York on 11 December 1946 amending the Agreements, Conventions and Protocols on Narcotic Drugs concluded at the Signer on 25 January 1917; at Geneva on 11 February 1925, and 19 February 1925, and 13 July 1931; at Bangkok on 27 November 1931; and at Geneva on 26 June 1936; entered into force in respect of each of the following Agreements, Conventions and Protocols on the dates indicated below in accordance with the terms of Article VII, paragraph 2 of the said Protocols:

- (1) On 27 October 1947:  
Agreement concerning the Manufacture of, Internal Trade In, and Use of Prepared Opium, with Protocol and Final Act, signed at Geneva on 11 February 1925.
- (2) On 21 November 1947:  
International Convention for Limiting the Manufacture and Regulating the Distribution of Narcotic Drugs, with Protocol of Signature, signed at Geneva on 13 July 1931.
- (3) On 27 October 1947:  
Agreement for the Control of Opium-smoking in the Far East, with Final Act, signed at Bangkok on 27 November 1931.
- (4) On 10 October 1947:  
International Convention for the Suppression of Illicit Traffic in Dangerous Drugs, signed at Geneva on 26 June 1936.

b. The amendments to the International Convention relating to

dangerous Drugs, with Protocol, signed at Geneva 19 February 1925) have not entered into force since a majority of the parties to this Convention have not become parties to the Protocol of 11 December 1946. Going into force of the amendments is of great importance since, if the amendments do not come into force at the end of the sixth session of the Economic and Social Council which will open in February, it will be impossible to reconstitute the Permanent Central Board and Supervisory Body at this session.

c. Resolution 135 (III) adopted by the General Assembly on 17 November 1947, reads as follows:

"THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY,

DESIRING to complete as soon as possible the transfer from the League of Nations to the United Nations of the powers and functions relating to the control of narcotic drugs;

URGES those States which have signed the Protocol of 11 December 1946 on Narcotic Drugs but have not yet deposited instruments of acceptance, to deposit these instruments with the United Nations at the earliest opportunity so that the amendments to the previous international agreements, conventions and protocols may enter into force by the end of 1947;

DESIRES the invitation of the Economic and Social Council to all Member States and all non-member States which are parties to the international agreements, conventions and protocols on narcotic drugs to become parties to the Protocol of 11 December 1946."

3. A copy of the Protocol of 11 December 1946, for which the Secretary-General requests the Governments which were Parties to the Convention of 19 February 1925 to deposit an instrument of acceptance required by Article VI thereof, is inclosed.

NATIONAL ASSEMBLY THE AGREEMENTS, CONVENTIONS AND PROTOCOLS ON NARCOTIC  
DRUGS CONCLUDED AT THE HAGUE ON 23 JANUARY 1912, AT GENEVA ON 12 FEBRUARY  
1925 AND 19 FEBRUARY 1925, AND 13 JULY 1931, AT BANGKOK ON 27 NOVEMBER 1931  
AND AT GENEVA ON 26 JUNE 1936

The States Parties to the present Protocol, considering that under  
the International Agreements, Conventions and Protocols relating to  
narcotic drugs which were concluded on 23 January 1912, 12 February 1925,  
19 February 1925, 13 July 1931, 27 November 1931 and 26 June 1936, the  
League of Nations was invested with certain duties and functions for  
whose continued performance it is necessary to make provision in conse-  
quence of the dissolution of the League, and considering that it is  
expedient that these duties and functions should be performed henceforth  
by the United Nations and the World Health Organization or its Interim  
Commission, have agreed upon the following provisions:

ARTICLE I

The States Parties to the present Protocol undertake that as between  
themselves they will, each in respect of the instruments to which it is a  
party, and in accordance with the provisions of the present Protocol,  
attribute full legal force and effect to, and duly apply the contents  
to those instruments which are set forth in the Annex to the present  
Protocol.

ARTICLE II

1. It is agreed that, during the period preceding the entry into  
force of the Protocol in respect of the International Convention relating  
to Dangerous Drugs of 19 February 1925, and in respect of the Inter-  
national Convention for Limiting the Manufacture and Regulating the  
Distribution of Narcotic Drugs of 13 July 1931, the Permanent Central  
Board and the Supervisory Body as at present constituted shall continue  
to perform their functions. Vacancies in the membership of the Permanent  
Central Board may during this period be filled by the Economic and Social  
Council.

2. The Secretary-General of the United Nations is authorized to  
perform at once the duties hitherto discharged by the Secretary-General  
of the League of Nations in connection with the agreements, Conventions  
and Protocols mentioned in the Annex to the present Protocol.

3. States which are Parties to any of the instruments which are to  
be amended by the present Protocol are invited to apply the amended texts  
of those instruments as soon as the amendments are in force even if they  
have not yet been able to become Parties to the present Protocol.

4. Should the amendments to the Convention relating to Dangerous  
Drugs of 19 February 1925, or the amendments to the Convention for  
Limiting the Manufacture and Regulating the Distribution of Narcotic  
Drugs of 13 July 1931, come into force before the World Health Organi-  
zation is in a position to assume its functions under these Conventions,  
the functions conferred on that Organization by the amendments shall,  
provisionally, be performed by its Interim Commission.

Article III

The functions conferred upon the Netherlands Government under  
articles 21 and 25 of the International Opium Convention signed at The  
Hague on 23 January 1912, and entrusted to the Secretary-General of the  
League of Nations with the consent of the Netherlands Government, by a  
resolution of the League of Nations Assembly dated 15 December 1930,  
shall henceforward be exercised by the Secretary-General of the United  
Nations.

Article IV

As soon as possible after this Protocol has been opened for signa-  
ture, the Secretary-General shall prepare texts of the Agreements, Con-  
ventions and Protocols revised in accordance with the present Protocol  
and shall send copies for their information to the Government of every  
Member of the United Nations and every non-member State to which this  
Protocol has been communicated by the Secretary-General.

Article V

The present Protocol shall be opened for signature or acceptance  
by any of the States Parties to the Agreements, Conventions and Protocols  
on narcotic drugs on 23 January 1912, 12 February 1925, 19 February 1925,  
13 July 1931, 27 November 1931 and 26 June 1936, to which the Secretary-  
General of the United Nations has communicated a copy of the present  
Protocol.

Article VI

States may become Parties to the present Protocol by

- (a) Signature without reservation as to approval,
- (b) Signature subject to approval followed by acceptance or
- (c) acceptance.

Acceptance shall be effected by the deposit of a formal instrument  
with the Secretary-General of the United Nations.

Article VII

1. The present Protocol shall come into force in respect of each  
Party on the date upon which it has been signed on behalf of that Party  
without reservation as to approval, or upon which an instrument of ac-  
ceptance has been deposited.

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2. The amendments set forth in the Annex to the present Protocol shall come into force in respect of each Agreement, Convention and Protocol when a majority of the Parties hereto have become Parties to the present Protocol.

Article VIII

In accordance with Article 102 of the Charter of the United Nations, the Secretary-General of the United Nations will register and publish the amendments made in each instrument by the present Protocol on the dates of the entry into force of these amendments.

Article IX

The present Protocol, of which the Chinese, English, French, Russian and Spanish texts are equally authentic, shall be deposited in the archives of the United Nations Secretariat. The agreements, Conventions and Protocols to be amended in accordance with the Annex hereto in the English and French languages only, the English and French texts of the Annex shall equally be the authentic texts and the Chinese, Russian and Spanish texts will be translations. A certified copy of the Protocol, including the Annex, shall be sent by the Secretary-General to each of the States Parties to the Agreements, Conventions and Protocols on narcotic drugs of 23 January 1922, 11 February 1925, 29 February 1925, 13 July 1930, 27 November 1931 and 26 June 1936, as well as to all Members of the United Nations and non-member States mentioned in Article IV.

In faith whereof the undersigned, duly authorized, have signed the present Protocol on behalf of their respective Governments on the dates appearing opposite their respective signatures.

Done at Lake Success, New York, this eleventh day of December one thousand nine hundred and forty-six.

Annex to the Protocol Amending the Agreements, Conventions and Protocols on Narcotic Drugs Concluded at The Hague on 23 January 1922, at Geneva on 11 February 1925 and 29 February 1925, and 13 July 1930, at Bangkok on 27 November 1931 and at Geneva on 26 June 1936.

1. Agreement Concerning the Manufacture of, Internal Trade in, and Use of Prepared Opium, with Protocol and Final Act, Signed at Geneva on 11 February 1925

In articles 10, 13, 14 and 15 of the Agreement, "the Secretary-General of the United Nations" shall be substituted for "the Secretary-General of the League of Nations" and "the Secretariat of the United Nations" shall be substituted for "the Secretariat of the League of Nations".

In articles 3 and 4 of the Protocol, "the Economic and Social Council of the United Nations" shall be substituted for "the Council of the League of Nations".

2. International Convention Relating to Dangerous Drugs, with Protocol, Signed at Geneva on 19 February 1925.

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For article 2, the following article shall be substituted:

In the event of the World Health Organization, on the advice of an expert committee appointed by it, finding that any preparation containing any of the narcotic drugs referred to in the present chapter cannot give rise to the drug habit on account of the sediments with which the said drugs are compounded and which in practice preclude the recovery of the said drugs, the World Health Organization shall communicate this finding to the Economic and Social Council of the United Nations. The Council will communicate this finding to the Contracting Parties, and thereupon the provisions of the present Convention will not be applicable to the preparation concerned.

For Article 10, the following article shall be substituted:

In the event of the World Health Organization, on the advice of an expert committee appointed by it, finding that any narcotic drug to which the present Convention does not apply is liable to similar abuse and production of similar ill-effects as the substances to which this chapter of the Convention applies, the World Health Organization shall inform the Economic and Social Council accordingly and recommend that the provisions of the present Convention shall be applied to such drug.

The Economic and Social Council shall communicate the said recommendation to the Contracting Parties. Any Contracting Party which is prepared to accept the recommendation shall notify the Secretary-General of the United Nations, who will inform the other Contracting Parties.

The provisions of the present Convention shall thereupon apply to the substance in question as between the Contracting Parties who have accepted the recommendation referred to above.

In the third paragraph of article 19, "the Economic and Social Council of the United Nations" shall be substituted for "the Council of the League of Nations."

The fourth paragraph of article 19 shall be deleted.

In articles 20, 24, 27, 30, 32 and 38 (paragraph 1), "the Economic and Social Council of the United Nations" shall be substituted for "the Council of the League of Nations" and "the Secretary-General of the United Nations" shall be substituted for "the Secretary-General of the League of Nations", wherever these words occur.

In article 31, "the International Court of Justice" shall be substituted for "the Permanent Court of International Justice."

Article 34 shall read as follows:

The present Convention is subject to ratification. As from 1 January 1947, the Instruments of ratification shall be deposited with the Secretary-General of the United Nations, who shall notify their receipt to all the Members of the United Nations and the non-member States to which the Secretary-General has communicated a copy of the Convention.

Article 35 shall read as follows:

After the 30th day of September 1945, the present Convention may be

acceded to by any State represented at the Conference at which this Convention was drawn up and which has not signed the Convention, by any Member of the United Nations, or by any non-member State mentioned in article 34.

Accessions shall be effected by an instrument communicated to the Secretary-General of the United Nations to be deposited in the archives of the Secretariat of the United Nations. The Secretary-General shall at once notify such deposit to all the Members of the United Nations signatories of the Convention and to the signatory non-member States mentioned in article 34 as well as to the adherent States.

Article 37 shall read as follows:

A special record shall be kept by the Secretary-General of the United Nations showing which States have signed, ratified, acceded to or denounced the present Convention. This record shall be open to the Contracting Parties and shall be published from time to time as may be directed.

The second paragraph of article 38 shall read as follows:

The Secretary-General of the United Nations shall notify the receipt of any such denunciations to all the Members of the United Nations and to the States mentioned in article 34.

3. International Convention for Limiting the Manufacture and Regulating the Distribution of Narcotic Drugs, with Protocol of Signature, Signed at Geneva on 13 July 1953

In article 5, paragraph 1, the words "to all the Members of the League of Nations and to the non-member States mentioned in article 27" shall be replaced by the words "to all the Members of the United Nations and to the non-member States mentioned in article 28".

For the first sub-paragraph of paragraph 6 of article 5, the following sub-paragraph shall be substituted:

The estimates will be examined by a Supervisory Body consisting of four members. The World Health Organization shall appoint two members and the Commission on Narcotic Drugs of the Economic and Social Council and the Permanent Central Board shall each appoint one member.

The Secretariat of the Supervisory Body shall be provided by the Secretary-General of the United Nations who will ensure close collaboration with the Permanent Central Board.

In article 5, paragraph 7, the words "December 15th in each year" shall be substituted for the words "November 1st in each year", and the words "through the intermediary of the Secretary-General of the United Nations to all the Members of the United Nations and non-member States referred to in article 28" shall be substituted for the words "through the intermediary of the Secretary-General, to all the Members of the League of Nations and non-member States referred to in article 27".

For paragraphs 2, 3, 4 and 5 of article 11, the following paragraphs shall be substituted:

2. Any High Contracting Party permitting trade in or manufacture for trade of any such product to be commenced shall immediately send a notification to that effect to the Secretary-General of the United Nations, who shall advise the other High Contracting Parties and the World Health Organization.

3. The World Health Organization, acting on the advice of the expert committee appointed by it, will thereupon decide whether the product in question is capable of producing addiction (and is in consequence assessable to the drugs mentioned in sub-group (a) of Group I), or whether it is convertible into such a drug (and is in consequence assessable to the drugs mentioned in sub-group (b) of Group 2 or in Group II).

4. In the event of the World Health Organization, on the advice of the expert Committee appointed by it, deciding that the product is not itself a drug capable of producing addiction but is convertible into such a drug, the question whether the drug in question shall fall under sub-group (a) of Group I or under Group II shall be referred for decision to a body of three experts competent to deal with the scientific and technical aspects of the matter, of whom one member shall be selected by the Government concerned, one by the Commission on Narcotic Drugs of the Economic and Social Council, and the third by the two members so selected.

5. Any decision arrived at in accordance with the two preceding paragraphs shall be notified to the Secretary-General of the United Nations, who will communicate it to all Member States of the United Nations and the non-member States mentioned in article 28.

In paragraphs 6 and 7 of article 11, "the Secretary-General of the United Nations" shall be substituted for "the Secretary-General".

In articles 14, 20, 21, 23, 26, 28, 32 and 33, "the Secretary-General of the United Nations" shall be substituted for "the Secretary-General of the League of Nations".

In article 21 for the words "by the Advisory Committee on Traffic in Opium and Other Dangerous Drugs" shall be substituted the words "by the Commission on Narcotic Drugs of the Economic and Social Council".

For the second paragraph of article 23, the following paragraph shall be substituted:

In case there is no such agreement in force between the Parties, the dispute shall be referred to arbitration or judicial settlement. In the absence of agreement on the choice of another tribunal, the dispute shall, at the request of any one of the Parties, be referred to the International Court of Justice, if all the Parties to the dispute are Parties to the Statute, and, if any of the Parties to the dispute is not a Party to the Statute, to an arbitral tribunal constituted in accordance with the Hague Convention of 18 October 1907 for the Pacific Settlement of International Disputes.

For the last paragraph of article 26, the following paragraph shall be substituted:

The Secretary-General shall communicate to all Members of the United Nations or non-member States mentioned in article 28 all declarations and notices received in virtue of the present article.

Article 24 shall read as follows:

The present Convention is subject to ratification. As from 1 January 1947, the instruments of ratification shall be deposited with the Secretary-General of the United Nations, who shall notify their receipt to all the Members of the United Nations and to the non-member States to which the Secretary-General has communicated a copy of the Convention.

Article 25 shall read as follows:

The present Convention may be acceded to on behalf of any Member of the United Nations or any non-member State mentioned in article 28. The instruments of accession shall be deposited with the Secretary-General of the United Nations, who shall notify their receipt to all the Members of the United Nations and to the non-member States mentioned in article 28.

In the first paragraph of article 26, the last sentence shall read as follows:

Each denunciation shall operate only as regards the High Contracting Party on whose behalf it has been deposited.

The second paragraph of article 26 shall read as follows:

The Secretary-General shall notify all the Members of the United Nations and non-member States mentioned in article 28 of any denunciation received.

In the third paragraph of article 26, the words "High Contracting Parties" shall replace the words "Members of the League and non-member States bound by the present Convention".

In article 27, the words "High Contracting Party" and "High Contracting Parties" shall replace the words "Member of the League of Nations or non-member State bound by this Convention" and "Members of the League of Nations or non-member States bound by this Convention".

4. Agreement for the Control of Opium-Smoking in the Far East, with Final Act, Signed at Bangkok on 27 November 1931

In articles V and VII, "the Secretary-General of the United Nations" shall be substituted for "the Secretary-General of the League of Nations".

5. International Convention for the Suppression of Illicit Traffic in Dangerous Drugs, Signed at Geneva on 26 June 1936

In articles 15, 16, 21, 23 and 24, "the Secretary-General of the United Nations" shall be substituted for "the Secretary-General of the League of Nations".

For article 17, second paragraph, the following paragraph shall be substituted:

In case there is no such agreement between the Parties, the dispute shall be referred to arbitration or judicial settlement. In the absence of agreement as to the choice of another tribunal, the dispute shall, at the request of any one of the Parties, be referred to the International Court of Justice, if all the Parties to the dispute are Parties to the Statute, and, if any of the Parties to the dispute is not a Party to the Statute to an arbitral tribunal constituted in accordance with the Hague Convention of 18 October 1907 for the Pacific Settlement of International Disputes.

Paragraph 1 of article 18 shall read as follows:

The Secretary-General shall communicate to all the Members of the United Nations and to the non-member States mentioned in article 20 all declarations and notices received in virtue of this article.

Article 20 shall read as follows:

The present Convention is subject to ratification. As from 1 January 1947, the instruments of ratification shall be deposited with the Secretary-General of the United Nations, who shall notify their receipt to all the Members of the United Nations and the non-member States to which the Secretary-General has communicated a copy of the Convention.

Paragraph 1 of article 21 shall read as follows:

The present Convention shall be open to accession on behalf of any Member of the United Nations or non-member State mentioned in article 20.

In paragraph 1 of article 24, the words "High Contracting Party" shall be substituted for the words "Member of the League of non-member State".

The second paragraph of article 24 shall read as follows:

The Secretary-General shall notify all the Members of the United Nations and non-member States mentioned in article 20 of any denunciation received.

In paragraph 3 of article 24, the words "High Contracting Parties" shall replace the words "Members of the League or non-member States bound by the present Convention".

Article 25 shall read as follows:

Request for the revision of the present Convention may be made at any time by any High Contracting Party by means of a notice addressed to the Secretary-General of the United Nations. Such notice shall be communicated by the Secretary-General to the other High Contracting Parties, and, if endorsed by not less than one-third of them, the High Contracting Parties agree to meet for the purpose of revising the Convention.

Applicants desiring to utilize this plan will deposit with the Ministry of Communications at the Tokyo Central Telegraph Office a sum in Military Payment Certificates, Foreign Trade Payment Certificates, British Armed Forces Special Warrants or Japanese Yen, deemed sufficient to offset the charges for their international telegrams for one month.

b. The Ministry of Communications will supply to each depositor a deposit book for each kind of currency deposited and will enter in the credit column of each book the amount and kind of currency on deposit to the credit of the depositor.

c. The Ministry of Communications will maintain suitable deposit ledger or ledgers at the Tokyo Central Telegraph Office upon which will be entered the filing date, number, office of destination and the charges for each international telegram filed under this plan and which will reflect the balance on deposit to the credit of each depositor after deduction of the charges for all telegrams filed during each calendar day.

d. All telegrams filed under this payment plan will be accompanied by the appropriate deposit book in which the accepting office will enter the date, number, office of destination, charges and balance on deposit after deducting the charges for the message or messages filed.

e. The Ministry of Communications will maintain a separate depository for the sums deposited under this plan and will withdraw from this depository at the close of each day the necessary funds to cover the charges for messages filed by depositors during the day.

3. The Central Liaison Office is directed to conduct a thorough search in each of the 400 plants listed in the inclosures and submit a complete report on the looted machinery and United Nations machinery located therein. The Central Liaison Office will obtain permission from the appropriate Military Government Teams to enter the plants concerned.

4. In those plants where looted machinery or United Nations machinery is found, the report will contain a certifying statement, signed by a responsible official of the plant concerned and the Japanese Government official responsible for conducting the search of that plant, as follows:

"We certify as responsible officials of the (insert name of plant) and (insert name of Japanese Government agency conducting the search of that plant) that a thorough search has been made of the (insert name of plant) and the only property in the (insert name of plant) that can be considered looted or purchased by fraud or under duress from an area occupied by the former Japanese armed forces or within Japan from United Nations nationals, is as follows: (list such machines that can be considered looted or purchased by fraud or under duress, giving complete information on such machine as obtained from the reparations inventory sheets)."

5. In those plants where no looted machinery is found, the report will contain a certifying statement, signed by a responsible official of the plant concerned and the Japanese Government official responsible for conducting the search of that plant, as follows:

"We certify as responsible officials of the (insert name of plant) and (insert name of Japanese Government agency conducting the search of that plant) that a thorough search has been made of the (insert name of plant) and no property that can be considered looted or purchased by fraud or under duress from an area occupied by the former Japanese armed forces or within Japan from United Nations nationals is located in the (insert name of plant)."

The Swedish Diplomatic Mission in Japan presents its compliments to the Japanese Ministry for Foreign Affairs and has the honor to indicate that the Swedish Legation at Lima, in charge of Japanese interests in Peru, has been approached by four prominent members of the Japanese colony there, Messrs. Masaki JIICHI, Ichitaro KUBOYAMA, Gontoku MATSUDA and Masahiro MATSU. These gentlemen administer large estates in Peru belonging to the Japanese Senator Dr. Hajime MATSU, Tokyo, and have requested that the enclosed report dated 20th October, 1947, regarding the administration of the estates, be, if possible, forwarded to Dr. MATSU. The assistance of the Swedish Legation was requested in consideration of the fact that registered mail cannot be dispatched from Peru to Japan. A translation of the report into Spanish is also herewith forwarded together with a memorandum prepared by the interpreter of the Swedish Legation at Lima, showing some discrepancies between the original report and the Spanish translation.

The Jewish Diplomatic Mission in Japan presents its compliments to the Japanese Ministry for Foreign Affairs and has the honor to inform that the Jewish Consulate at Sao Paulo, Brazil, No. 44 Rua November, 1347, received from the Japanese Relief Committee there through Mr. Nelson Yamada and Mr. Shigeo Miyama, a sum of \$2,500.00 intended for the relief of the sufferings of Japanese people in Japan.

The amount will be increased as the collection is going ahead. The money has been deposited in a special account which the Consulate has opened with The National City Bank of New York at Sao Paulo, Brazil, possibilities to transfer the money to San Francisco where the Relief Committee has its head organization. According to what the aforementioned two gentlemen informed, quite some money should have been previously transferred.

The exchange situation is, however, of such a nature that a transfer of the money will be difficult unless the Brazilian Red Cross in Rio de Janeiro will render assistance. The Japanese themselves seem to work on this line and have not asked the Consulate for

assistance in regards to the transfer of the money, but only asked that the Consulate safe-keep the collection until it can be transferred.

SUBJECT: Distribution of American Tobacco as Incentive Goods

1. The Japanese Government is authorized to:

a. Distribute cigarettes from American tobacco products in the custody of the Japanese Government as incentive goods to encourage coal production and the delivery of rice to the official collection system.

b. Offer 250,000 packages (2 Oz.) of pipe tobacco as incentive goods to coal miners.

c. Utilize not to exceed 1,000 pounds of pipe tobacco and cigars to conduct operating tests as to the feasibility of utilizing these products in the manufacture of cigarettes for distribution as incentive goods.

d. Release all chewing tobacco for use as raw material in the manufacture of insecticides for farmers.

2. Each package of cigarettes and pipe tobacco will be clearly and distinctively marked to indicate that these products are authorized for legal release and to distinguish them from American tobacco used by Occupation Forces.

3. The Japanese Government will take all necessary action to assure that this tobacco and any products manufactured therefrom, are distributed only through official channels and do not appear in public, unauthorized sales.

4. Detailed distribution plans and prices to be charged for these commodities will be submitted to General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers for approval prior to actual distribution.

SUBJECT: Refloating of the SS "King Lear"

1. Reference is made to memorandum for the Japanese Government, file AG 560 (6 Nov 47)CPC/FP, SCAFIN 4841-A, 6 November 1947, subject, "Preservation of the SS "King Lear," from General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers.

2. The Japanese Government is directed to take immediate steps to refloat the British vessel SS "King Lear," reported as sunk at 23° 57' 45" N and 150° 44' E, 6000 meters off Shirasu Lighthouse, bearing 251° true. After refloating, the vessel is to be placed in dry dock at the Misano-eki Dockyard, Mitsubishi Heavy Industries Company, Misano-eki, Japan, where a marine survey will be conducted in order to determine the extent of repairs required to place the vessel in a condition substantially similar to that at the time acquired by the Japanese. In order to facilitate the work of refloating the vessel, copies of the plans of the SS "King Lear" are inclosed.

3. It is further directed that an accurate record be kept of the amounts of critically scarce materials, particularly petroleum products, used in raising the sunken vessel, including amounts used by salvage boats in traveling to and from and at the scene of operations.

4. Upon completion of the marine survey, an additional directive will be issued directing the repair and refitting of the vessel in preparation for restitution to the British Government.
