The United States Government has heretofore
determined the Lidocain Hydrochloride is of medical
value, particularly marked in the treatment of
cancer patients for relief of chronic pain
associated with these malignancies. It has also
been determined that Lidocain Hydrochloride is
capable of producing addiction. The new drug is
not only subject to control under the national laws
applicable to narcotics but is subject to the further
restriction, under government patent license, that
it may be sold by a designated pharmaceutical
manufacturer directly to those qualified physicians
only who have cancer patients under treatment, for
use for chronic pain relief in such cases.

There are enclosed two copies of a report
by United States Government Pharmacologists on
Lidocain Hydrochloride which was published in the
Journal of the American Medical Association of
May 17, 1947, describing the nature and action of
the new drug, the dosage and administration, and
the method of distribution.

It is requested that the Secretary-General
transmit to the World Health Organization for
consideration the recommendation of the United
States Government that Lidocain Hydrochloride is
a drug capable of producing addiction, and is,
therefore, susceptible to the drug controls in
sub-group (a) of group 1, under Article 1 of the
Convention of 1953 for Limiting the Manufacture

This report has been forwarded to the

SUBJECT: Rural Land Reform

1. Reference is made to:

- a. Memorandum for Japanese Government, file AG 001.0 (9 Dec 44) CEX, (SCAPIN 411), subject as above, dated 9 December 1944.
- b. Owner-Farmer Establishment and Special Measures Law, Law No. 43, 21 October 1944.
- c. Agricultural Land Adjustment Law, Law No. 67, 2 April 1945, as revised by Law No. 84, 10 December 1944, and by Law No. 42, 21 October 1944.

2. The Owner-Farmer Establishment and Special Measures Law and the Agricultural Land Adjustment Law were enacted in accordance with the reference memorandum, in order to eliminate the feudal system of land tenure and remove economic obstacles to the redistribution of the land on an equitable and democratic basis. Since the enactment of these land reform laws, however, efforts have been made by certain adversely affected interests to obstruct the accomplishment of the rural land reform program.

3. The firm implementation of the Land Reform Program is essential to the creation in Japan of a society which is truly free and democratic and, as a consequence, it has become one of the foremost objectives of the Japanese people as well as of the Allied occupation. Therefore, the strict, vigorous and fearless enforcement of the above-mentioned laws is both imperative and indispensible.

4. Accordingly, it is directed that:

- a. The Ministry of Agriculture and Forestry will instruct prefectural and local agricultural land commissions to purchase without delay all land subject to Land Reform Law in accordance with existing procedures and without regard to unauthorized action by pressure organizations seeking to impede the objectives of the

b. The Japanese Government will take prompt and vigorous action against any and all persons who, by bribery, intimidation or other unlawful means, obstruct the implementation of land reform measures. Reports of such action will be submitted to this headquarters.

- (1) Complete accounting of the funds authorized for the project, including amounts paid and incurred, and an estimate of further expenditures required to complete the project.
- (2) Percent of project completed.
- (3) If not complete, estimated date when project will be completed.
