Effective 8 September 1947, all requests for registration of code addresses for delivery of messages in Japan will be received by the Ministry of Communications or its agents directly from the applicants. The Ministry of Communications, after taking due care to avoid any duplication, will issue such code addresses, together with any special delivery instructions as may be received, to be registered for the delivery of messages in accordance with applications received. Code addresses may be accepted for registration by the Ministry of Communications or its agents in any city in Japan that is listed in the official nomenclature of telegraph offices of the world issued by the Bureau Bureau of the International Telecommunications Union.

9. Code addresses may be registered for a period of six (6) months or for one (1) year. The Ministry of Communications will assess a service charge, payable in advance in Japanese yen, of ¥ 30.00 for each code address registered for each six (6) months period, and ¥ 60.00 for each code address registered for each one (1) year period. All registrations of code addresses not received within thirty (30) days after the end of the period for which they are registered will automatically expire.

4. Charges for the registration of any code address will also entitle the registrant to specific delivery instructions for that particular code address, in accordance with arrangements made between the registrant and the Ministry of Communications, in conformity with the provisions contained in reference 2a.

5. All code addresses now authorized by the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, in accordance with reference 1a to 1c, inclusive, will expire at 0001 hours, 1 November 1947, and must be renewed on or before that date to continue in effect. The Ministry of Communications will take steps to notify all persons or organizations concerned, of the provisions contained in this memorandum, well in advance of the above expiration date.

6. Direct communication between the Civil Communications Section, General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers and the Ministry of Communications, concerning matters within the scope of this memorandum, is authorized.

2. The Japanese Government is directed to assay as to amount and kind, survey and describe the radium now at the Tokyo First Government Hospital, No. 1 Toyama-cho, Shinjuku-ku, Tokyo.
3. The above assay is to be made by Professor Mitsuo Nira of the Tokyo College of Letters and Science.
4. On completion of the assay the Japanese Government is directed to deliver the subject radium to the U. S. Custodian of War Relics, Bank of Japan.
5. The Japanese Government is further directed to complete in triplicate the receipt forms, a copy of which is inclosed. These receipt forms, properly executed, are to be distributed as follows:
 - a. Three (3) copies to be handed to the U. S. Army Custodian of the Bank of Japan at the time of transfer of the radium;
 - b. Two (2) copies to be forwarded to General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, Civil Property Custodian;
 - c. One (1) copy to be retained by the Japanese Government.
6. A report of Professor Nira's findings and report that the actions directed in paragraphs 4 and 5 have been completed are to be submitted to General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, Civil Property Custodian, by 30 September 1947.

SUBJECT: Repair and Refitting of the SS "Yung Yuen"

1. Reference is made to memorandum for the Japanese Government, file AG 56011 Aug 47)CPC/77, SCAPD 4322 A, 11 August 1947, subject, "Repair and Refitting of the SS 'Yung Yuen'", from General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers.
2. The Central Liaison Office is directed to transmit to the Mitsuru Dockyard and Industrial Works, Iino Sangyo Kaisha, Ltd., the enclosed statement of specifications for refitting and repairing the SS "Yung Yuen", submitted by that company, which has been approved by the Civil Property Custodian.
3. In addition to the repairs proposed by the Mitsuru Dockyard and Industrial Works, the following recommendations for repairs were made as a result of a survey of the subject vessel on 12 August 1947:
 - a. The following side shell plates found to have thinned out considerably and should be renewed:

Port Side	RS, RS, and L6
Star Board Side	77-5-9 and 78-30-11;
 - b. Upper and center girders and stern part found considerably eroded and should be reinforced with one inch welded doubler plates as designated. Outgases to be re-treated;
 - c. Main deck plating in way of #s. 2, and 3 holds should be renewed, and steel deck plating installed where same had been removed or wasted;
 - d. Tween deck plating in way of #s. 2, and 3 holds were wasted and holed. These are to be renewed.
 - e. Under space bulkheads together with stiffeners and brackets to be renewed where wasted;
 - f. Bounding pipes to bilges and double bottom tanks to be fitted with steel plate striking pads;
 - g. Machinery: Stern bush securing bolts found wasted and are to be renewed;

b. Boilers:

- (1) The two main boilers were examined internally and externally. The two furnaces of port boiler found distorted and should be heat treated and forced to original shape;
- (2) All broken stays and defective tubes in both boilers to be removed;
- (3) Upon completion of repairs, both boilers to be subjected to a hydrostatic test and proven tight.

4. The Central Liaison Office is directed to see that the above recommendations are complied with, in order that the vessel may be restored to a condition substantially similar to that at the time she was acquired by the Japanese.

Acceptance Messages, Rates, Accounting Procedures and Settlement of Accounts for Messages to and from British Commonwealth Merchant Shipping

1. Messages of the following types only will be accepted for transmission:

- a. Estimated time of arrival of shipping.
- b. Control of ship traffic.
- c. Official shipping information.
- d. Navigation or distress messages from shipping, in accordance with General Radio Regulations (Geneva Revision 1928).
- e. Full rate messages from any person on board ships of British Commonwealth registry to any person or organization in Japan.
- f. Full rate messages from any person or organization in Japan authorized to possess and use British Allied Forces Special Vouchers (BAFV) to any person on board ships of British Commonwealth registry.
- g. Messages exchanged between ships of British Commonwealth registry and Japanese coastal stations may be in plain language or in code and will be subject to all applicable censorship rules and regulations.

2. Rates for messages between British Commonwealth merchant shipping and Japan will be expressed in sterling and are as follows:

- a. The land line charge between Japanese coastal radio stations and any point in Japan will be two (2) pence per full rate word.
- b. The Japanese coastal radio station charge will be six (6) pence per full rate word.
- c. The ship station charge will be four and one half (4½) pence per full rate word.

3. Messages originating both on board ship and in Japan will be sent prepaid. Payment will be made in Japan in British Allied Forces Special Vouchers, hereinafter referred to as BAFV's, at rates per word expressed in sterling as set forth in paragraph 2 above.

4. Japan's share in the revenue from the ship-station service will be the sum of the coastal station and land line charges for both incoming and outgoing messages.

5. All BAFV revenues collected by the Japanese Ministry of Communications for messages sent prepaid to ships of British Commonwealth registry will be deposited simultaneously with the "Transfer Agent for British Commonwealth Telecommunications Funds" in accordance with instructions given in Memorandum for the Japanese Government, File AG 311.2 (12 Aug 47)DCS, (SCAFIN 1762), dated 12 August 1947, subject: Cebu-Colombo Radiotelegraph Circuit.

6. Final settlement of the net balance will be effected by the Transfer Agent as set forth in SCAPIN-1762. Such accounts and payments to be kept entirely separate from the London-Colombo accounts and payments in view of the different carriers. The carriers' representative is General Post Office, London, through United Kingdom Liaison Office.

7. Japanese Public Acceptance Offices of the Ministry of Communications where prepaid STN and SO, and telegraph messages may be filed for transmission by British Commonwealth Occupation Force military personnel and by civilians authorized to be in possession of British Armed Forces Special Warrants are those authorized by SCAPIN 1762 and listed in Inclosure 1 to that SCAPIN.

8. The accounting of message bills will be the responsibility of the Transfer Agent for the British Government and the Ministry of Communications for the Japanese Government. Statements of accounts will be submitted by both agencies through General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers.

The Japanese Government is directed to effect the release of such funds which are applied for under the above-mentioned memorandum as are required to pay all expenses listed hereunder, provided there is no deviation from the procedures set forth in the memorandum for the Japanese Government, file AG 36.7 (11 May 47) (SCAFIS 4425-4), 11 May 1947, subject, "Release for Use of Ten Bank Accounts by German Consulate for the Purpose of Paying Salaries and Incidental Expenses", from General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers.

2. The tugboat "Eyesu Maru", now in use as a rescue tug in the Tokushima area under the supervision of the Civilian Merchant Marine Committee, is hereby placed in the protective custody of the Japanese Government, pending determination of legal ownership of the vessel. Meanwhile, continued use of the vessel in the service in which she is now engaged is authorized.

3. The Japanese Government is directed to take necessary steps to protect the vessel from theft and damage and to maintain her in a seaworthy condition.

1. Reference is made to the following memoranda for the Japanese Government from General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers:

a. File AD 00112 (13 Sep 45)NO, STAFF 26, 13 September 1945, subject, "Protection of Allied and Axis Property";

b. File AD 600.3 (30 Nov 45)NO/ST, STAFF 1379, 30 November 1945, subject, "Preservation of Property in Japan Owned by United Nations and Their Nationals";

c. File AD 607 (20 Jun 47)NO/ST, STAFF 1903-a, 20 June 1947, subject, "Restoration of Yokohama General Cemetery".

2. Reports have been received in this office that the Netherlands Cemetery, a section of the Inasa Cemetery in Nagasaki, has also been seriously neglected during the war and that adequate preservation and protection procedures are not being observed at this property of the United Nations.

3. As the Nagasaki Detachment Cemetery, a cemetery of important historical significance to the United Nations, there is need for the replacement of a forged iron gate which was removed during the war days. Since the former gate cannot be located, it will be necessary to manufacture a new one. It is directed that this be done under the supervision and according to the instructions of the Netherlands War Graves Registration Section of which W. L. S. Schenk of Yokohama is the chief.

4. The Central Liaison Office is directed to submit, by 10 October 1947, a report on this situation including action taken to restore this type of property throughout Japan to a respectable status.

1. Effective immediately the following steps will be taken to reduce governmental expenditures:
- a. Only prices legally established by the Japanese Government for any product will be recognized, approved, or used in:
 - (1) Computing and establishing legal prices for any other product.
 - (2) Determining and making payments for goods, work done, or services rendered whether paid directly by the Japanese Government or indirectly as reimbursements or payments to contractors or manufacturers.
 - b. Legal prices for materials used in projects or activities demanded by the Occupation Forces will be the same as for similar materials used in other projects or activities.
 - c. Expenditures, payments and reimbursements by the Japanese Government on account of labor costs, whether the labor be employed directly by the Japanese Government or engaged by contractors, manufacturers, private companies, or public agencies in the accomplishment of any project, goods, or services for the Japanese Government or the Occupation Forces, shall not exceed in amount the actual wage payments directly received by the workers, plus prior deductions authorized by law.
 - d. In the following categories of labor, actual wage payments shall, as a rule, equal, and in no case shall exceed, prevailing wages for comparable employment in the locality as determined by the Japanese Government in accordance with methods which shall be subject to the review of the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers:
 - (1) Labor employed by the Japanese Government in response to "Labor Requisitions" by the Occupation Forces.

- (2) Labor engaged as the result of "Requisition Demands" by the Occupation Forces or Requisitions to the Japanese Government for the accomplishment of construction, building maintenance and associated services, and operation of Occupation Forces installations. Wage rates in this category shall not exceed those in category (1).
- (3) Labor engaged in the accomplishment of public works projects financed in whole or in part by the Japanese Government.

e. Adequate inspection and supervisory systems will be established over all activities involving expenditures by the Japanese Government to eliminate waste of labor or materials and to secure against the payment of padded or false cost claims.

f. Direct communication between the Ministry of Finance and interested Staff Sections of General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, is hereby authorized to implement this memorandum.

a. Receive and deliver to private, business or code addresses, unless otherwise directed by the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, messages from all countries addressed to private, business or code addresses in Japan.

4. Paragraph 1c of reference is above is rescinded.

5. Paragraph 3 of reference is above is rescinded and the following substituted therefor:

4. Incoming messages will be delivered in accordance with the address of such messages. Messages addressed to registered code addresses will be delivered in accordance with instructions received by the Ministry of Communications directly from the registrants of such code addresses or from instructions received from General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers.

6. The regularly established procedures for handling "transferred accounts" will remain unchanged except as follows:

- a. Application for Transferred Account privileges may be made by any organization or person in Japan including Japanese nationals.
- b. Hereafter application for Transferred Account privileges will be made by the applicant directly to the Ministry of Communications.
- c. All classes of messages may be included in Transferred Account arrangements.

4. Before establishing Transferred Account arrangements the Ministry of Communications through normal service message procedure will direct inquiries to connecting telegraph administrations or companies to ascertain whether or not recipients of Transferred Account messages are agreeable to paying the charges for such messages.

e. The Ministry of Communications will secure from the applicant for Transferred Account privileges the complete name and address, including code address if any, of the private company, organization, or person from whom the charges for Transferred Account messages are to be collected

and show this information in the "MIF Section" of the monthly traffic statements, in accordance with present procedures.

2. Charges for all "MIF" messages handled from Japan on a Transferred Account basis will include the applicable Japanese terminal charges.

3. The Transferred Account arrangements authorized by references 2b, 2c, 2d, 2e, 2f, and 2g, above, will remain in force. Any future changes desired in these arrangements will be communicated directly to the Ministry of Communications by the appropriate.

4. Direct communication between the Civil Communications Section, or other staff sections of General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers and the Ministry of Communications, concerning matters within the scope of this memorandum is authorized.

Memorandum to the Japanese Government, wherein the Japanese Government was directed to deliver the following-named Japanese to the Commanding General, Eighth Army at Sugamo Prison (Tokyo Detention Camp) at the earliest possible date, are amended to delete the said Japanese names for the reason that they are no longer required.

1. The Japanese Government will issue necessary directives to insure that petroleum products issued for use by Japanese vessels under control of Shipping Control Administration, Japan (SCAMP) are included as imported commodity.
2. The Civilian Merchant Marine Commission will prepare their estimate of requirements for a period four (4) months prior to the period for which required, and submit to Shipping Control Administration, Japan, not later than the fifteenth (15th) of each month.
3. The Petroleum Distribution Kodan, as sole agent for Bunkai-cho, will, as of 1 September 1947, be prepared to service Japanese vessels referred to in 1 above at their facilities in Fuzumi and Nagasaki. The Petroleum Distribution Kodan will receipt to United States Government agencies for all petroleum products assigned to Japanese vessels under SCAMP control, regardless of where such vessels are serviced, and will include all such quantities received under a separate heading in their monthly report of consumption.

The Japanese Government is directed to pack the ammonia oxidation equipment looted from the Yang Li Chemical Works, Weiking, China, now installed at the China Works of the Toyo High Pressure Industry L.L., Shikama-Machi, Osaka City, Fukuoka Prefecture, Kyushu, preparatory to the restitution of this equipment to the Government of the Republic of China. Inclosed are a list of the items to be packed and instructions as to the method to be used in packing this equipment.

3. A memorandum directing the restitution of subject equipment will be issued at a later date.

4. Report of the action taken in compliance with paragraph 2 above will be submitted to General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied
