2. Funds will be released and withdrawn in accordance with Emergency Financial Measures of the Japanese Government and amendments thereto.

3. This memorandum shall not be construed as approval for priority of raw materials, equipment or facilities to carry out the plans for which this loan or release of funds is made. The established regulations, policies, procedures and priorities instituted by the Japanese Government shall prevail.

4. The Japanese Government shall submit to the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, in triplicate, the following:

a. Within forty-five (45) days from the end of the period covered in this memorandum, a progress report on the status of construction, reconstruction or rehabilitation authorized by this memorandum. The report shall show the following:

- (1) Complete accounting of all previous funds authorized for the project, including amount authorized for the period covered by this memorandum, amount paid and incurred, and an estimate of further expenditures required to complete the project.
- (2) Percent of project completed.
- (3) If not completed, estimated date when project will be completed.

b. Upon completion of the project, or upon request at any time prior to completion, a report on complete accounting of funds stating that the materials and equipment used in the construction, reconstruction or rehabilitation were purchased at or below official prices.

- Included is a complete list of the important machinery and equipment removed from the South China Iron Works, Hankow, by Japanese occupation officials between December 1941 and 1945.
- Questioning of Tetsuo Eishi, 16 March 1946, engineer in charge of the subject factory at Tsun Shan under the Japanese occupation, revealed that approximately two-thirds of the machinery and equipment of the subject plant had been removed to Japan for possible use in Sakurajima Ammunition plant at Osaka through Higasa Tatsuzaburo Kikyo K. K., now known as Nishida Kikyo K. K., whose office is located in Room 507, Harasumi Building. Mr. Higayama Mitsuo was the man responsible for the shipment of the machinery to Japan.
- The above information is forwarded to aid in the required investigation of subject property.

SUBJECT: Repair and Refitting of the SS "Garnet" boiler

1. Reference is made to memorandum for the Japanese Government, file no 360(19 Dec 46)CWC/JP, COMJAP Ltr, 19 December 1946, subject, "Repair and Refitting SS 'Garnet' boiler of 'U.S. No. 1 Asahi Maru'", from General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers.

2. Specifications for repairing and refitting the SS "Garnet" boiler, which were submitted by kind to a representative of the Civil Property Custodian at Otsu on 3 August 1947, are hereby approved. However, an inspection of the subject vessel in drydock at Otsu on 3 August 1947 disclosed that the following additional repairs are necessary in order to make the vessel seaworthy and to restore her to a condition substantially similar to that at the time she was acquired by the Japanese:

a. Side shell plating in the way of bumper spaces, port, and starboard sides found set in approximately 3", from deck to side stringer; plating should be released, internal members faired, riveted, and after-wards hose tested and proven tight;

b. Integrities on the port bow in way of the forepeak tank should be faired;

c. Chain locker was examined and stiffeners on after bulkhead were eroded. Defective stiffeners should be removed;

d. Locker empty and accumulated rubbish to be removed from lower forward hold and defective reverse frames removed;

e. Open floors in boiler room should be cleared of accumulated dirt and water to permit examination, and defective frames should be renewed;

f. Several reverse frames and portions of the fore and aft and side bumper bulkheads and side ribs are eroded and should be cropped out and renewed;

g. Six shell frames on the starboard side of space below after accommodation in way of bulkheads found defective; these frames to be cropped and partly renewed;

h. Bulwark plating where indented should be faired;

i. Engine room casing in way of the sliding panel should be repaired;

j. Forward hold steel hatch cover should be renewed;

k. Sliding masties, eye-bolts and other parts of same should be overhauled and coated;

l. Port and starboard propeller shafts were drawn out for examination. Shafts in way of bearings should be rusted to a smooth surface and strut bearings renewed and stern bearing reinstalled (alive shafts);

m. Boilers: Repair to center furnace of the after boiler not considered satisfactory. Insert piece fitted at forward end of furnace found improperly fitted at bottom side. This insert piece should be removed and refitted to form a fair butt joint. Insert piece at after end of furnace found improperly fitted. This insert should be removed and refitted. Directed section of this repair to be made tight without resorting to welding. Upon completion of this repair boiler to be further examined. Main steam pipe, 18" dia. down piping should be exposed for examination and afterwards hydrostatically tested.

3. The Central Liaison Office is directed to see that the above recommendations are carried out by the shipyard.

2. Report will include all the facts and circumstances surrounding the seizure of three of the trucks, the disappearance of two others, together with their contents, and subsequent developments in the case of the two trucks alleged to have disappeared.
3. Required report will be addressed to the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, Civil Property Custodian, Attention of Comptroller, and will be submitted by 8 October 1947.

Private messages authorized by this memorandum may be sent from Japan by any organization or person authorized to post and use British Armed Forces Special Vouchers (BAFV's) and by the organization or person in Japan specifically named in a reply paid voucher, to any organization or person in Canada.

6. All private messages originating in Japan for transmission to Canada, payments for which are provided for in reply paid vouchers, will contain in the preamble the indicator "ANSWER" (Answer to reply paid message) which will be written in by the accepting office.

7. Private messages between Canada and Japan will be subject to all applicable censorship rules and regulations. Exceptions will be specifically provided for by General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Forces.

8. Messages authorized by this memorandum will be filed at those post or telegraph offices which are presently, or which may be in the future, designated for the acceptance of GCM messages to British Commonwealth areas.

9. Private messages authorized by this memorandum, other than those utilizing reply paid vouchers in payment of the charges, will be prepaid in Japan in British Armed Forces Special Vouchers (BAFV's).

10. Private message classifications authorized are Full Rate, GCM, 20 and 100, and the rates per word are proportional and will be 60¢, 30¢ and 15-1/3¢, respectively, of the charges per full rate word shown in Enclosure 1. The total charges for such messages authorized by this memorandum will be rounded up to the nearest whole pence (1d).

11. Established procedures for settlement of accounts and payment of revenue according to the Ministry of Communications and the British carrier for messages circulating between Japan and all countries in the British Commonwealth will apply to messages authorized by this memorandum.

- An inspection by representatives of General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, of the Looted Property warehouse at the College of Agriculture, Setagaya, Tokyo, disclosed that looted vehicles stored therein had been stripped of tires and other parts without proper authority.
- No person, regardless of rank or position, will enter any Looted Property warehouse without a pass signed by the Chief of the Civil Property Custodian Section or his Deputy Custodian, and countersigned by a Civil Property Custodian representative in the area of each Looted Property warehouse. This pass will be taken up by the guard upon entry of the visitor to the warehouse. The guard will record his observations of the actions of the visitor, as directed in the pass, and will forward the pass, along with his written report of his observations to the Home Ministry for translation and submission to General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, Civil Property Custodian.
- The Japanese Government will provide an adequate number of responsible guards to safeguard the property in custody. Permanent passes for these guards will be issued by the Civil Property Custodian upon the presentation of identification of each individual by the Home Ministry. Upon the termination of employment of any guard, the pass of that guard will be surrendered to the Civil Property Custodian on the day of termination.
- No person, regardless of rank or position, will remove any equipment, machinery, materials, or other property which has been classified as looted, from the premises of any Looted Property warehouse or other storage place of

Mr. Okada is reported to have sold the land, house and movables.
4. The Central Liaison Office is directed to investigate and report, by 31 October 1947, the disposition made of Mr. Kuraba's estate to determine whether or not Mr. Kuraba's wishes have been complied with, and to deposit proceeds from the estate due United Nations nationals in the Special Property Administration Account in the Bank of Japan in their names.
