1. Reference is made to C.L.O. No. 7153(XF) of 11 September 1947, transmitting Death Report No. 155, regarding one Berk Dams (Dapassi Harani) an alleged Netherlands national.

The Swedish Diplomatic Mission in Japan presents its compliments to the Japanese Ministry for Foreign Affairs and has the honour to indicate that the Swedish Legation at Rio de Janeiro, Brazil, has during the period 24th to 30th May, 1947, made an announcement in three Japanese newspapers in Sao Paulo, Brazil, clarifying certain misconceptions regarding issuance of passports to Japanese nationals who desire to repatriate.

The announcement clarifies the present regulations for issuance of a Japanese passport as well as of receiving the necessary entry permit and transit visa, emphasizing the actual difficulties in these respects. Since frauds have occurred with a view to provide Japanese repatriates with travel funds, the attention is also called to the fact that "old yen" bank-notes are no longer valid in Japan and have lost their value.

Four copies of the announcement are herewith enclosed, two in Japanese, one in Portuguese and one in English.

SUBJECT: Repair and Refitting of the "Jessie Keller"

1. Reference is made to memorandum for Japanese Government, file JG 500 (S Nov 46) 010/14, DATED 1326, 6 November 1946, subject, "Repair and refitting of 'Jessie Keller,' ex SS 'Jessie Keller,' JAG No. 2385," from General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers.

2. An inspection of the subject vessel while in drydock at Shimizu, Japan, on 25 August 1947, disclosed that in order that the ship be made seaworthy and restored to a condition substantially similar to that at the time she was acquired by the Japanese Government, as directed in referenced memorandum above, the following additional repairs are necessary:

a. Shell plating should be scoured and sealed from the keel to the main deck, and keel blocks should be secured as required.

b. The following shell plates should be renewed:

(1) Port side:

(a) First, second, and third strakes below sheer strake from bow to approximately 30' aft, as designated.

(b) Sheer, and strake below sheer, from forward end of bridge to counter of poop.

(2) Starboard side:

(a) First and second plates from stem on the second strake below sheer.

(b) Doubling plate should be fitted on landing edge of fourth and fifth strakes below sheer for a distance of approximately 15'.

(c) Sheer, and strake below sheer from the after end of the cargo port to the counter of poop.

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 12 OCT 1947
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- 1. All doors and internal members in way of plate removal should be fitted or part removed as found necessary.
- 2. Deckers (wood) and rails for stowage, same should be refitted.
- 3. Deck cargo ports and perillits should be refitted as req'd.
- 4. Bridge superstructure deck, where scored and holed, should be removed.
- 5. Bridge buildings should be removed, and plates replaced to a true surface.
- 6. After post tank should be cement sealed.
- 7. Open bulk head deck in after hold in way of propeller shafts should have all collars removed to permit construction of floors and other internal members, and defective and wasted members should be removed and space closed.
- 8. Engine and boiler room spaces should be closed to permit construction of open floors, together with other internal members and defective and wasted parts should be removed.
- 9. Decker spaces should be closed and coal removed to permit construction of all floors and internal members to original condition. Defective and wasted parts should be removed.
- 10. Approximately 15 floors of fore and hold, together with engine room, which are characteristically holed and holed, should be removed.
- 11. Forward hold hatch and lower protective plates should be removed.
- 12. Deformed strappings in the forward hold should be fitted.
- 13. After end of the forward hold should be sealed and coated in way of the hull in fresh water tanks.
- 14. All collars in way of forward hold should be repaired and/or removed, as found necessary.
- 15. Fore post tank should be cement sealed.
- 16. Fore post tank top plating should be removed where cement has repair is fitted.

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- 17. All accommodation spaces should have wood lining in way of perillits removed to permit construction of plating, and any defective plates should be removed. All accommodation spaces should be coated.
- 18. Wood planking in port side alley in way of engine and boiler casing should be removed, steel deck repaired or replaced as found necessary, and wood planking should be refitted.
- 19. Deck plating on the fore deck should be removed and given flat.
- 20. Ladders on hatch openings for escaping torpedoes should be fitted or removed, as found necessary.
- 21. Hatch torpedoes, cleats, bottoms, wedges, should be supplied to meet classification requirements.
- 22. Lifting and stowage and all other apparatus attached thereto should be overhauled.
- 23. Forward casing should be removed and a new casing installed as req'd.
- 24. Work on the bridge and wheelhouse and fittings attached thereto should be repaired and/or removed where found defective.
- 25. Lifeline should be re-rigged, together with all equipment, and installed on the port side in lieu of the same as present installed.
- 26. Steering gear chain should be checked and all rods and buffers scaled and oiled.
- 27. Upon completion of repairs, hull should be coated from keel to main deck with two coats of anticorrosive and under-water portions with anti-fouling paint; superstructure and accommodation should be coated as per instructions.
- 28. Starboard main engine, I.P. crank web, forward side, should be removed.
- 29. Port main engine I.P. crank web, after end, should be removed.
- 30. Port and starboard thrust shafts should be removed, rollers modified to a true surface, and shafts re-mounted.
- 31. All crank pin bearings on the port and starboard main engines should be re-mounted and refitted to satisfactory clearances.

- 10. Piston rings on the air pumps of the port and starboard main engines should be checked.
- 11. General service pump, liquid air cylinders, should be tested out to a test surface and new pistons and rings fitted.
- 12. Wirelocking pump main piston rod should be checked.
- 13. Starboard mainshaft liners should be machined to a true surface and bearings re-cooled.
- 14. All boiler mountings should be checked and overhauled, and valves on the boiler shell checked.
- 15. Boiler should be checked and cleaned internally. Flange of water leg should be examined further after cooling to see whether it is grooving, but not in.
- 16. Boiler, water leg and main steam, feed, and blow down lines, should be subjected to a hydrostatic test of one and one-half times the working pressure.
- 17. Decky boiler should be opened up and cleaned, any defective tubes and stays removed, and all stresses subjected to a hydrostatic test of one and one-half times the working pressure and proven tight.
- 18. Main and decky boilers should have insulation re-installed, together with necessary electric and plumbing.

1. Reference is made to paragraph 2 of Memorandum for Japanese Government from General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, file AS 404.6 (20 June 47) (SOP/77) (SOP/77 1776) dated 20 June 1947, subject: Angkor Therapeutic Project.

2. The following additional instructions will be complied with:

a. The Japanese Government will immediately increase the Japanese Police Force at Angkor from 100 to 1000 (10) uniformed police.

b. A new survey of the study area will be made immediately which will positively eliminate any encroachment upon native agricultural areas by additional water ditches. New survey monuments will be installed in concrete or other permanent material to clearly define all corners of the study area. Suitable intermediate markers will be established to reestablish the actual boundary line on the ground and clearly define the entire perimeter of the study area.

c. A new site plan will be developed after the field work has been completed, showing new rising perimeters and other installations presently at Angkor, including housing, utilities, roads, drying, conveying, and storage installations. Two copies of this site plan will be presented to the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers and other agencies for their use.

d. Arrange a continued flow of (1) barrier goods to Angkor to be used in obtaining fresh fish, vegetables and fruit under the supervision of the local Military Government and Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers Liaison Officer, and (2) such fresh foods as are required.

e. Deliver to Japanese Angkor Superintendent by the Kayal-dara sufficient fishing boats and gear so that the Japanese workers can

SUBJECT: Emergency Expenditures by Restricted Concerns as Result of Flood

1. Memorandum from the Minister of Finance, dated 26 September 1947, subject: Regulations Affecting Restricted Concerns in Connection with Rehabilitation of Flood Damaged Areas, requests that restricted concerns be given authority to make emergency expenditures for repair of flood damage without prior approval as required by Memorandum for the Japanese Government from General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, AG 200.6 (8 Dec 46) EAS/AG (SCAFIN 400), dated 8 December 1946, subject: Regulations Affecting Restricted Concerns.

2. Restricted concerns may make expenditures for the following items of repair or rehabilitation of flood damage, without prior approval of the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers:

a. Construction of levees and embankments; construction of drainage channels; operation of water pumps; transfer of raw materials, machinery and finished goods to places of safety; clearing away rubble, refuse, silt, etc., left by flood waters; emergency measures for prevention of rust damage to machinery; prevention of collapse of buildings; and leveling land.

b. The above items of emergency work may be financed by either withdrawals from bank accounts or negotiation of bank loans.

3. The authority granted in paragraph 2, above, shall be subject to compliance with the following:

a. Expenditures shall be made only to the minimum extent necessary to prevent irreparable damage to plant facilities or to permit resumption of production.

b. Expenditures shall not be made under this authority for the purchase of new machinery.

c. Within thirty (30) days from the date of this memorandum all restricted concerns having made emergency expenditures, under the authority granted herein, shall submit applications covering such expenditures with full explanation and justification.

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NOTE: Memo for Japanese Government from GHO, SCAP, AG 096 (2 Oct 47) EAS/AG, (SCAFIN 1700), subject: Emergency Expenditures by Restricted Concerns as Result of Flood, dated 2 October 1947

d. A report shall be made within forty-five (45) days from the date of this memorandum of all machinery or machine parts and all other plant equipment removed to places of safety and which have not been returned to original installations, together with an explanation of such action.

4. This memorandum shall not be construed as authorizing permanent change in physical plant facilities without prior approval of the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, or the disposition of raw materials except in the normal course of business.

5. The provisions of the memorandum shall remain in effect for a period of thirty (30) days from the date thereof and are applicable to only the current emergency. Action taken thereafter must be in accord with established regulations and procedures.

1. The Japanese Government is directed to transfer the First Demobilization Bureau (including all local agencies under its operational control, such as Home Depot Bureau, Demobilization Liaison Offices and their branches) intact to the jurisdiction and control of the Welfare Ministry, the transfer to be completed on or before 15 October 1947. Upon completion of the transfer, the Welfare Ministry will be responsible for the operation of the First Demobilization Bureau and all activities currently being carried out by such Bureau. After such transfer, demobilization will continue to be carried out in consonance with the program and processes of demobilization provided for in the memorandum for the Japanese Government, AG 388.3 (10 Oct 45) DCSO, subject, "Demobilization, Japanese Armed Forces," memorandum AG 388.3 (1 June 46) DCS (SCAFIN 793), subject, "Establishment of Demobilization Board," and memorandum AG 091.1 (24 Jan 47) 02 (SCAFIN 1481), subject, "Personnel Reduction Demobilization Board." In accomplishing this transfer the Japanese Government is authorized to transfer to the Welfare Ministry personnel, records, accounts, and other matters now used by or assigned to the First Demobilization Bureau and local agencies under its operational control. Transfer of personnel will not be construed as requiring any additional screening or further application of SCAFIN 550 beyond requirements already imposed by existing directives and instructions of the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers.

2. The Japanese Government is further directed to undertake a complete and comprehensive study and survey of the organization, personnel, functions, and operating procedures of all boards, bureaus, and agencies of the Japanese Government now engaged in or charged with responsibility for demobilization, repatriation, investigation, or research of matters pertaining to the war or personnel serving in the Japanese armed forces or in any manner connected with former Japanese military organizations and to submit not later than 1 January 1948 to the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers for approval, a detailed plan for the effective ultimate elimination of separate demobilization agencies and the efficient and gradual absorption of all necessary remaining functions and operations

connected with demobilization and demilitarization into the permanent administrative structure of the Japanese Government. Implementation of such plan shall in no event be undertaken until the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers has given final written approval but such plan will be so devised as to initiate such elimination and absorption within four months after the date of submission. Such plan will insure the continued efficient execution of existing directives and instructions of the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers relating to demobilization and demilitarization. Such plan will provide for the control of the policies of agencies thereafter engaged in demilitarization and demobilization by persons not subject to the provisions of SCAFIN 550 and will insure the speedy elimination of remaining ex-military officers subject to SCAFIN 550, approval for whose retention has not been specifically granted in each individual case by the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers.

3. The Japanese Government is further directed to accomplish by 1 January 1948, unless otherwise directed by the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, the complete elimination of the Second Demobilization Bureau. Minesweeping and other operational responsibilities of the Second Demobilization Bureau will continue to be discharged under the direct supervision and control of Commander, United States Naval Forces Far East until such time. Necessary remaining functions and personnel will be transferred on or before such date to the jurisdiction of and will become a part of the responsibility of the Welfare Ministry or to such other agency as the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers shall designate, but only such functions and personnel shall be transferred as the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers shall approve.

4. Direct liaison between the demobilization agencies on the one hand and the agencies of the Occupation Forces primarily concerned with the operations of the demobilization agencies on the other hand, will continue to be maintained, and nothing in this directive will be construed as disrupting such existing direct relationships.

5. The Japanese Government is advised that nothing contained in this directive will be construed as authorizing any delay or interruption of the discharge of the responsibilities of the Japanese Government in carrying out the directives and instructions of the Supreme Commander, with especial reference to the continued smooth functions of demobilization, repatriation, demilitarization, minesweeping, and other and related activities. Nothing contained in this memorandum shall be construed to authorize the retention or employment of any personnel not now employed by the First Demobilization Bureau without the specific prior approval of the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers under the terms and conditions of SCAFIN 550.

6. The Japanese Government is further directed to report on or before 25 October 1947 the steps which it plans to take in order to accomplish the transfer of the First Demobilization Bureau and related activities to the Welfare Ministry as herein directed but no approval by the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers of such plans shall be required in advance.

7. Inquiries concerning this directive shall be submitted to the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers only in writing and through the Central Liaison Office.

SUBJECT: Provision and Procurement of Japanese Communication Services, Facilities, Equipment, Material and Personnel

1. Reference is made to Memorandum for the Japanese Government, file AG 400.12 (20 Oct 46) (CC) (SCAFIN 1298), dated 29 October 1946, subject as above. This memorandum is issued in accordance with paragraph 2 of the reference memorandum.

2. It is directed that the Japanese Ministry of Communications, in addition to services being furnished at present, provide communications services, facilities, equipment, material and personnel as follows:

a. Telephone exchange service and trunks wholly within an exchange area of a city or town which can be furnished by use of existing telephone plant as listed in Appendix I.

b. Construct and install communications facilities listed in Appendix II.

c. Long distance lines and telegraph circuits wholly within one Ministry of Communications operating bureau or division as covered in paragraph 5 below.

d. Communications personnel as listed in Appendix III.

e. Bulk materials and equipment required for indigenous supply of the Occupation Forces will be provided as listed in Appendix V.

f. All other communications services, facilities, equipment, material and personnel not covered above as directed by General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers.

g. Statements of services rendered covering all communications services, facilities, equipment, material and personnel furnished to the Occupation Forces throughout Japan will be prepared, consolidated and forwarded by the Ministry of Communications as provided by Appendix IV.

INSTR: Memo to JO (SCAFIN-1298/a)

3. Communications services, facilities, equipment, materials, and personnel listed in Appendices I, II, III and V are based on estimates of future requirements and will be subject to change. Deviations and corrections found necessary will be furnished to the Ministry of Communications by General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers.

4. Exchange service and trunks within the exchange area of a town or city covered by Appendix I will be furnished by local offices in accordance with communications orders placed by the Commanding Officer of the Occupation Forces therein, or by his authorized representative. A representative of the Japanese Communication System located in the city or town where service is requested will be authorized to furnish such service without approval of the operating bureau of Ministry of Communications.

5. Toll and exchange construction and installation listed in Appendix II, long distance lines and telegraph circuits wholly within one operating bureau or division (para 1c), and personnel covered by Appendix III will be provided in accordance with communications orders. These orders will be submitted direct to the operating bureau within which services desired are to be furnished, as authorized by Headquarters, Eighth Army, General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers will coordinate with the Ministry of Communications in preparation of schedules and plans for furnishing facilities and personnel covered by Appendices II and III. Upon completion of these plans and schedules, directors of the operating bureaus or divisions will arrange to fulfill the demands without further approval of the Ministry of Communications, sitting the communications order as authority.

6. Communications facilities provided in accordance with this memorandum do not include those required for billets and housing for Occupational Forces covered by Memorandum for Japanese Government, file AG 411 (8 Mar 46) (CC) (SCAFIN 799), dated 6 March 1946, subject: Housing Program for Occupation Forces and Their Dependents. Communications material and services covered by (SCAFIN 799) and supplemental correspondence are in addition to those covered by this memorandum. Statements of service rendered will refer to this memorandum for accounting purposes.
