SUBJECT: Action Taken on Central Liaison Office Memoranda

1. No objection is offered to the following Central Liaison Office Memoranda:

a. No. 7243 (LO 2032/2034) of Dai Electric Company, Ltd. for permission to withdraw additional funds in the amount of ¥728,881. from its First Restricted Deposit Account for the construction of twenty-three (23) dormitory buildings in Itanagawa, Tokyo.

b. No. 6806 (LO 2658/2040) of Hitachi Mining Company, Ltd. for permission to borrow ¥208,500. to reconstruct its Tachihara No. 2 mine.

c. No. 6831 (LO 2682/2038) of Hitachi Chemical Industry, Ltd. for permission to borrow ¥2,728,000. for repair of dry ice plant at its Fuzusaki factory.

d. No. 7249 (LO 2204/2134) of Oji Paper Manufacturing Company, Ltd. for permission to expend \$4,685,850. from its Free Yen Account to construct employees houses at its Itanagawa, Yashiro and Itanagawa mills.

e. No. 6481 (LO 2803/1972) of Hitachi Chemical Industry Company, Ltd. for permission to borrow ¥1,880,000. for restoration of a coke oven and belt conveyor at its Hitachi works.

2. Funds will be released and withdrawn in accordance with Emergency Financial Measures of the Japanese Government and amendments thereto.

3. This memorandum shall not be construed as approval for priority of raw materials, equipment or facilities to carry out the plans for which these loans or releases of funds are made. The established regulations, policies, procedures and priorities instituted by the Japanese Government shall prevail.

4. The Japanese Government shall submit to the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers in triplicate the following:

a. Within sixty (60) days from the date of this memorandum, a progress report on the status of construction, reconstruction or rehabilitation authorized by this memorandum. The report shall show the following:

- (1) Complete accounting of the funds authorized for the project, including amounts paid and incurred, and an estimate of further expenditures required to complete the project.
- (2) Percent of project completed.
- (3) If not complete, estimated date when project will be completed.

b. Upon completion of the project, or upon request at any time prior to completion, a report on complete accounting of funds stating that the materials and equipment used in the construction, reconstruction or rehabilitation were purchased at or below official prices.

REFERENCE: Transfer of Looted Chinese Coins and Ingots to the Joint Looted Property Warehouse

1. The Japanese Government is directed to transfer 3,500 kg of silver coins and 2,500 kg of nickel ingots recently located at the residence of Yoshio Shimizu, 302-2 Etchujima, Futatabi-cho, Koto-ku, Tokyo, and at present in the custody of the Tokyo Police Department, to the Joint Looted Property Warehouse.

2. The Japanese Government is further directed to prepare an inventory of the above coins which is to include the following information:

- a. Country of issue;
- b. Metal content;
- c. Denomination, except in the case of Chinese coins;
- d. Quantity.

SUBJECT: Fossil Bones of the so-called "Peking Man"

1. The Central Liaison Office is directed to investigate and report on the disposition made of approximately 147 fossil bones of the so-called "Peking Man" belonging to the Geomorph Research Branch of the Peiping Union Medical College, China.
2. The Peiping Union Medical College created these fossil remains, together with other materials belonging to the Geomorph Research Branch and turned them over to the United States Marine Corps at Peiping early in December 1941 for shipment in its baggage train. From the information available, it is believed this baggage train was confiscated by the Japanese at Taiwangtao. Pieces of this baggage have since been found in godowns in various cities in North China.
3. If the subject fossils cannot be found in Japan, the following information and reports are to be submitted to the Civil Property Custodian:
 - a. The name of the specific Japanese unit responsible for the confiscation of the baggage;
 - b. Report of interrogation of Japanese officers belonging to the unit regarding the disposition made of the Marine Corps baggage which was seized at Taiwangtao;
 - c. Results of a check of Japanese quartermaster records as to the names and location of the godowns used for the storage of property in North China.
4. The required reports are to be submitted to the Civil Property Custodian by 15 November 1947.

3. Except as indicated later there is no objection to the proposed plan of distribution of subject supplies as outlined in above mentioned letter of the Central Liaison Office.

a. Selection of schools to receive the supplies will be a joint responsibility of prefectural welfare and education sections and local Japanese Red Cross chapters.

b. The basis of distribution will be as follows:

- (1) Stationery (1 pencil, 1 eraser and 1 tablet); one set to each 5th and 6th grade pupil of grammar schools selected to receive a distribution.
- (2) Gift box (soap, tooth paste, tooth brush, thread, needle and other goods); one box to each of three (3) children of 1st through 4th grade of grammar schools selected to receive a distribution.

c. Local governors will submit reports on distribution to the Ministry of Welfare and the Japanese Red Cross. The Ministry of Welfare will furnish a report of distribution to Public Health and Welfare Section, General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers.

d. Report on distribution of American Junior Red Cross Supplies will include information as to the number of school children receiving a distribution of supplies. Instructions concerning routing of this report will be accorded to conform to the provisions of paragraph 2, c, above.

2. Effective immediately the reference memoranda are modified as follows: The Ministry of Communications may accept and honor requests from filers of messages from Japan to the United States for routing of their messages via a specific American carrier. 3. Such routed messages will not be considered as a part of apportioned traffic divided equally between the three American carriers, but will be deducted from the total volume, with the remainder being equally divided.

The protection of allied personnel and their property from the degradation of criminals is a function of the Japanese Government.

2. It is requested that the Japanese Government take adequate measures to provide proper security for the houses assigned to Allied personnel.

SUBJECT: Monitoring of International Distress Frequencies for Allied Occupation Forces.

1. Effective 10 October 1947 the Japanese Ministry of Communications will, through the action of the Japanese coastal radio station system, furnish immediately by the most expeditious means to the Commander Naval Forces, Far East, Tokyo, the Commanding General, Eighth Army, Yokohama and the Commanding General, Far East Air Forces, Tokyo, any information received from ships or aircraft at sea concerning:

- a. Vessels or aircraft in distress.
- b. Vessels in need of medical aid.
- c. Changes to navigation.

2. To secure this information the Ministry of Communications will cause the Japanese coastal radio station system to maintain at all times an alert, continuous watch on the international distress frequencies so far as is accordance with the International General Radio Regulations (Geneva Revision 1936).

3. All distress information received by the coastal radio system will be transmitted by radio to the Choshi coastal radio station which will serve as a collecting point. That station will then retransmit the information by wire (teletype or telegraph) to the Central Telegraph Office in Tokyo. That office will notify by telegraph the Naval Communications Center, Headquarters, Commander Naval Forces, Far East, in the Yokohama Special Base Building in Tokyo, telephone 26-7336, and the Headquarters, Far East Air Forces, A-3, Duty Officer in the Meiji Building in Tokyo (dial 3675, unit for cable dial base, then dial 3677). A confirmation copy will be immediately dispatched by special messenger both to Naval Communications Center and to the Far East Air Forces, Signal Center at the same respective addresses. Simultaneously, the Central Telegraph Office, Tokyo, will transmit the same information by telegraph over the direct wire to the Yokohama Central Telegraph Office, which office will without delay, forward the information by

The special teletype circuit to the Signal Center, Headquarters, Eighth Army, Customs Building, Yokohama. The above distress information will be forwarded by all channels immediately upon receipt. It will receive urgent classification over all other traffic.

4. In the event of a breakdown of the channels prescribed in paragraph 3, all communication facilities at the disposal of the Ministry of Communications will be used to the extent necessary to insure immediate delivery of the above distress information to the Naval Forces, Far East, to the Signal Center, Far East Air Forces and to the Signal Center, Headquarters, Eighth Army.

5. Direct communication between the Civil Communications Section, General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Forces and the Ministry of Communications, regarding matters within the scope of this memorandum, is authorized.

SUBJECT: Extension of Radiotelegraph Service to Egypt via India-
Ceylon Circuit.

1. Extension of radiotelegraph service to include private, press
and government messages between Japan and Egypt, via the India-Ceylon
circuit, is authorized effective 20 October 1947.

2. Message classifications authorized between Japan and Egypt are
as follows:

Full Rate	100
CR	Press
LC	Government

3. Rates per word, terminal charges applicable and the division of
revenue between the Japanese Ministry of Communications and the British
operator, for full rate, press and government messages authorized in this
message are listed in Enclosure 1. Rates for CR, LC and 100 classifications
are proportionate and will be 50%, 50% and 50-1/2% respectively,
of the charges per full rate word. The total charges on each message will
be rounded out to the nearest three pence (24) or multiple thereof.

4. Private messages may be sent by any organization or person in
Egypt to any organization or person in Japan and will be prepaid at the point
of origin. Private messages may be sent from Japan by any organization or
person authorized to possess and use British Aerial Voucher Special Vouchers
and by the organization or person in Japan specifically named in a reply
paid voucher, to any organization or person in Egypt.

5. Private messages with prepaid reply (RP) from Egypt addressed to
non-accredited organizations or persons in Japan, including Japanese
nationals, and private messages filed by non-accredited organizations or
persons in Japan including Japanese nationals, utilizing reply paid vouchers
in payment of the charges for such messages to Egypt are authorized.

6. Private messages with prepaid reply (RP) between Egypt and Japan
and vice versa are not authorized for accredited organizations or persons,
nor for military personnel.

Radio: same to JG (SCDP: 1803)

7. All private messages originating in Japan for transmission to Egypt, payments for which are provided for in reply paid vouchers, will contain in the preamble the indicator AWTGCP (anterior to reply paid word) which will be written in by the receiving office.

8. Private messages originating in Japan destined for Egypt will be filed at the same post, or telegraph office which are presently, or which may in the future, be designated for the acceptance of radio-telegraph messages circulating via the Cairo-Colombo circuit.

9. Private messages between Egypt and Japan will be subject to all applicable censorship rules and regulations. Exceptions will be specifically provided for by General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers.

10. All press, news and government messages for other than the United States Government, will be sent either prepaid or collect to Egypt and arrangements for collection of charges must be made prior to the acceptance of such messages. All such messages from Egypt to Japan will be prepaid.

11. Established procedures for settlement of accounts and payment of revenue according to the Ministry of Communications and to the British Consul for radio-telegraph messages circulating via the Cairo-Colombo circuit will apply to private messages authorized by this memorandum.

12. Direct communication within the scope of this memorandum is authorized between the Civil Communications Section, General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, the General Accounting Section, General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers or the British Consul Agent and the Ministry of Communications.
