1. Reference is Central Liaison Office Memorandum No. 7250 (18
2202/1217), dated 28 September 1947, subject: Application of Hashida
Cotton Spinning Company, Ltd, for Permission to Repay Loan of
\$22,897,000 for Reconstruction of Its Toyama Mill, forwarding applica-
tion of Hashida Cotton Spinning Company, Ltd, for permission to borrow
\$22,897,000, to rehabilitate its Toyama mill.

2. No objection is offered to that part of the application which
requests permission to borrow \$22,897,000. That part of the application
which requests permission to borrow \$1,200,000, for the repair of ring
spinning frames is not favorably considered. The authority granted to
Memorandum for the Japanese Government from General Headquarters, Supreme
Commander for the Allied Powers, AS OCS (29 Sep 47) 122/AC (SCAPIN 4611-A),
dated 29 September 1947, subject: Action Taken on Central Liaison Office
Memoranda, to borrow funds to rehabilitate cotton and weaving mills should
not be utilized by Hashida Cotton Spinning Company, Ltd, for expenditures
of the Toyama mill without further approval of the Supreme Commander for
the Allied Powers.

3. This memorandum shall not be construed as approval for priority
of raw materials, equipment or facilities to carry out the plans for which
this loan is made. The established regulations, policies, procedures and
priorities instituted by the Japanese Government shall prevail.

4. The Japanese Government shall submit to the Supreme Commander
for the Allied Powers in triplicate the following:

a. Within sixty (60) days from the date of this memorandum, a
progress report on the status of rehabilitation authorized by this memo-
randum. The report shall show the following:

- (1) Complete accounting of the funds authorized for the
project, including amounts paid and incurred, and an
estimate of further expenditures required to complete
the project.

SUBJECT: Vessels Requisitioned by the Japanese Govern-
ment for the Japanese Army and Navy

1. The Central Liaison Office is directed to submit a complete list of vessels requisitioned by the Chief of Staff (the War Ministry and the Ministry of Navy) for use by the Japanese Army and Navy from 1 January 1941 to 1 August 1941.

2. This report is to include the following information:

- (a) Name of vessel;
- (b) Type of vessel (cargo, passenger, or both);
- (c) Owner of vessel;
- (d) Date vessel was requisitioned;
- (e) Location of vessel at the time of requisition order;
- (f) Disposition of cargo aboard vessel.

3. The Central Liaison Office is further directed to submit to the Civil Property Custodian, by 22 October 1947, four photostatic copies of the order issued by the Chief of Staff or the War Ministry and the Ministry of Navy requisitioning vessels for use by the Japanese army and navy, together with a certificate signed by a duly authorized official to the effect that the photostat is a copy of the original order. Four copies of the English translation of the order will also be furnished.

SUBJECT: Destruction of Special Purpose Machinery and Equipment

1. All special purpose industrial machinery and equipment regardless of ownership or location, functionally limited to use in connection with combat equipment products, are to be destroyed by scrapping or other approved manner within six (6) months of this date. All such machinery and equipment under custody for reparations removal are hereby released for destruction.

2. The Japanese Government will:

a. Coordinate action in compliance with this directive with the Commanding General, Eighth Army and the Commander Naval Forces, Far East.

b. Submit to the Commanding General, Eighth Army and Commander Naval Forces, Far East:

- (1) An outline of the overall plan for the accomplishment of this directive.
- (2) Monthly reports indicating the status of the program and the estimated date of completion.
- (3) Detailed reports for each installation showing:
 - (a) By individual inventory code number the machines and equipment scrapped, if under custody for reparations removal; otherwise by plant, location and general description.
 - (b) Cost of scrapping.
 - (c) Tonnage of various grades of ferrous scrap recovered.
 - (d) Weights of non-ferrous scrap recovered (Brass, Bronze, Copper, Lead).

(a) Proceeds from the sale of scrap and the value of useful portion.

3. Component parts and auxiliary equipment not special purpose in nature and having independent reparations value will be removed from special purpose tools and equipment under custody for reparations removal, and held pending further instructions.

4. Special purpose elements will be destroyed in such a manner that they cannot be reconstituted into other machines or equipment.

5. Within seventy-two (72) hours of the time of receipt of this memorandum, the Japanese Government will have qualified representatives report to the Commanding General, Eighth Army and the Commander Naval Forces, Far East to receive instructions in regard to specific plants and facilities affected and measures to be taken to effect this destruction.

STATEMENT BY CPL. KAKAMISHI Tanshiko, formerly of 13 Inf. REGT. of 6 Div., to Capt. J. GIBBS, of M. 8 MB, on 2nd September, 1947, at Rabaul.

I deserted from the 13 Inf. Regt. in May 45 on account of lack of food and I lived in the vicinity of LULUAI River with four others who are now in Rabaul, and that place was about three days march from BULL.

During the time I deserted until I was apprehended I walked around most of the country near the LULUAI River but at no stage did I ever see any other Japanese. I have never heard from natives of any other Japanese on MOKAI-VILLI either and am of the opinion that if Japanese troops existed it would have been reported by natives to the Australian authorities by this time.

It would be possible for Japanese to exist on the Island but not in large numbers as the natives are very hostile towards them and their presence would have been reported by this time.

Q. Then you do not know of any other Japanese on MOKAI-VILLI?

A. No, I know nothing.

Q. Have you ever heard of any Japanese of the 13 Inf. Regt. by those names?

List of names is read out to KAKAMISHI Tanshiko.

A. No, I have never heard of those people.

- Q. Do you recall how many other Japanese from the 13 Inf. Regt. remain in BOUGAINVILLE today?
- A. I do not know if there are any.
- Q. Do you know of any other Japanese still on BOUGAINVILLE at present?
- A. I have never seen anyone during the time I deserted the Japanese Army until I was finally apprehended, but it would be possible for Japanese to remain on Bougainville without being located.
- Q. Did you ever hear from the natives that other Japanese were still at large on BOUGAINVILLE Island?
- A. Yes, I heard from natives that others were still there living within the vicinity of TOMKILAT.
- Q. How many in number did they total?
- A. I never did hear the number.
- Q. Did you hear from what unit they belonged?
- A. No.
- Q. Do you know the whereabouts of the following Japanese from the 13 Inf. Regt.?

List of names is read out to YAMAGUCHI.

- A. None of the Japanese whose names were read out, have I ever heard of before.
- Q. Have you heard from the natives of any large Japanese forces still on BOUGAINVILLE?
- A. No, but I heard from the natives that the Japanese there were only in small numbers.
- Q. Is it possible for a large force of Japanese to live all this time on the island without being detected?
- A. Yes, it would be possible if they were near the gardens that the troops had formerly made during the war time.
- Q. After such a long time which has elapsed is it possible that the natives would know of any large Japanese forces?
- A. Yes, I think the natives would have reported it if there were further Japanese on BOUGAINVILLE. The Japanese troops on BOUGAINVILLE from what I have heard from natives were not liked and if their whereabouts were known to the natives they would have reported it to the Australian authorities at once.

- (2) Percent of project completed.
- (3) If not complete, estimated date when project will be completed.

2. The Japanese Government is directed to take immediate steps to repair and refit the SS "Yamona" in order that the vessel may be restored to a condition substantially similar to that at the time she came into the hands of the Japanese.
3. The SS "Yamona" will be repaired and refitted, preparatory to restitution, at the Osaka Shipyards, Nishisaki Shipbuilding Company, Izumiya, Japan.
4. It is directed that the Japanese Government notify General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, Civil Property Custodian, when the vessel has been placed in dry-dock before undertaking the work of repairing and refitting in order that inspection may be made by a qualified marine surveyor and other Allied technical experts to determine the extent of repairs which will be required. Based on the results of such inspection and directives from General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, listing the repairs to be carried out, the Japanese Government will submit immediately thereafter estimates of the costs of repairs as recommended and the quantities of materials in short supply in Japan which will be required for the work.

2. It is directed that the Japanese Government return all property as the attached list, and any additional movables which may be located and identified, to Mr. Harold Francis Vincent at the addresses shown on the attached list of properties on 19 December 1947

under conditions set forth in "Receipt for Restitution to United States National of Wrongfully Transferred Property in Japan", and under the following conditions:

- a. A general and a final report by the Japanese Government as the management of the property from 7 December 1941 to the date of restoration, said report to include statement of all financial transactions, will be attached to each copy of the receipt;
- b. If the property has been leased subsequent to seizure, the Japanese Government will afford the restorer the option either to allow the lease to continue in force or to terminate it at the time of the

restoration of the property. Should the restorer decide to terminate such lease, the Japanese Government will take the action necessary to provide vacant possession;

Title to the property shall be restored to its status prior to wrongful transfer, confiscation or transfer under duress, and the property will be restituted free of all legal encumbrances placed on it subsequently. Transfer of title will be made at the judicial Bureau, or its branch offices, having jurisdiction;
- 5. All funds subject to restitution will be restored to a free yen account status. Funds formerly on deposit in United Nations banking institutions and now on deposit in the Special Property Administration Account in the Bank of Japan are not subject to restitution to individual depositors.
- 6. Four copies of accomplished receipt for the property with documentary evidence of the transfer of title will be submitted to General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers within ten (10) days of completion of delivery. Receipts and evidence of transfer of title will be submitted in both English and Japanese text with the Japanese translation certified as correct.
- 7. One of this memorandum will be attached to each copy of the receipt.

Inclosed is a list of nine factories (No. 6 to 14, inclusive) of Nippon Kokushai Koku Kokyo K.K., where part of the subject machinery is reported to be located.

3. Also inclosed is an additional report listing names of the persons having knowledge of the shipment of the machinery, the vessel which transported it to Japan, additional factories where it may be located, and other identifying data to aid in the search.

4. Machine numbers of the equipment, itemized in the list of property forwarded with reference 1d above, are also inclosed. These numbers are on metal plates which are fastened to the locked machines.

5. A search for the equipment as listed in reference 1d will be made in the factories mentioned in the inclosures. If all of the property is not located at the factories so listed, investigation will be continued in other factories and plants in Japan where the property might be located. The Japanese Government will contact the appropriate Military Government Teams for permission to enter these plants designated for reparations.

6. A report of this search, together with a complete list of the equipment found, will be submitted to the Civil Property Custodian by 26 November 1947.

SUBJECT: Instructions for the Registration and Marking of Japanese Fishing Vessels

1. The following program of registering and marking fishing vessels will be put into effect:

a. The Japanese Government will direct that every fishing vessel owned by any individual, group, company, or association for use in fishing in any marine waters will be registered and marked as is instructed in this memorandum.

b. "Fishing vessel" as used in this memorandum means any vessel regardless of size or tonnage, which operates for the capture, collection or propagation of fish, shellfish, marine animals, or aquatic plants for the purpose of selling these products to any firm. Craft used for the exclusive purpose of transporting fish or fishery products and boats used in any type of fishery investigational, patrol, or enforcement activities will also be considered as "fishing vessels".

c. "Marine waters", as used in this memorandum, means the open sea and all waters connected with it wherever the tides are felt.

d. The Japanese Government may extend the rules for registration and marking to every fishing vessel operating in inland waters (inland waters).

e. An owner of a fishing vessel or vessels will file with registration authorities appointed by the Japanese Government an application for the registration and marking of each fishing vessel owned by him. This application will include the following detailed information:

- a. Name of vessel
- b. Gross tonnage
- c. Net capacity
- d. Dimensions of vessel (length, beam, depth)
- e. Type of construction (wood, steel, composite)

- f. Date launched
- g. Name and location of shipyard
- h. Type of engine; horsepower; diameter of cylinder; number of cylinders; kind of fuel.
 1. Type and output of wireless equipment
 2. Name and address of owner and operator of vessel
 3. Main home port
 4. Type of fishery
3. Japanese officials in charge of registration will be responsible for verification of the declarations concerning all listed items on the registration card.
4. Each owner will receive a card showing the registration for each vessel registered in his name and bearing the information in paragraph 2 above. This registration card will be written in Japanese and English, and kept aboard the vessel whenever at sea or away from the home port.
5. Each registration card will bear a registration number composed of:
 - a. Two Roman alphabetical capital letters indicating the prefecture where the registered vessel is based.
 - b. An Arabic number indicating the class of vessel concerned and the serial number of the vessel in its class.
 - c. The following classes of vessels will be differentiated:
 - Class 1 powered ships of 100 tons and over.
 - Class 2 powered ships from 5 to 99 tons.
 - Class 3 powered ships under 5 tons.
 - Class 4 non-powered ships of 5 tons and over.
 - Class 5 non-powered ships under 5 tons.
 - d. The registration serial numbers assigned to vessels operating in non-tidal waters must be different from the serial class numbers of

vessels fishing in marine waters.

4. Delivery of the registration card to the owner will be made on payment of a fee in an amount to be fixed by the Japanese Government, and this fee will be used to cover the expenses of registration and of statistical procedures to keep information on registration up-to-date.
7. The first registration of all powered fishing vessels will be completed by 31 December 1947 and the first registration of all non-powered fishing vessels will be completed by 31 May 1948.
8. The identifying marks on a fishing vessel will be the same as the registration number. The marking will be done in printed block letters not less than thirty (30) cm. in height so as to be easily legible. The marking will be applied in the most conspicuous place on each side of the bridge or wheel-house. If no such superstructure exists, the marking will be on each side of the bow.
9. The owner of a fishing vessel will declare to the registration authorities, as referred to in paragraph 2, any change or modification of any of the items written on the registration card. The operator of the registered vessel will be held responsible for reporting to the owner of said vessel any such change or modifications.
10. In case of immobilization of a registered vessel for transformations or repairs for a period exceeding three months, declaration will be made to the registration authorities by the vessel owner within one week of the date on which the vessel is laid up for transformation or repair. In case of total loss, or of damage of any type having the effect to render a registered vessel temporarily or permanently unseaworthy, declaration will be made to the registration authorities by the vessel owner within one week of the date on which news of the mishap is received.
11. At the time of the declarations prescribed in paragraph 10, the registration card of the vessel concerned will be surrendered to the registration authorities. The registration card will be held by the registration authorities until the repairs or transformations are completed or until the vessel is able to resume operations, at which time the registration card will be returned upon written request from the owner. If the vessel is considered definitely and permanently unseaworthy so that it has to discontinue fishing operations permanently, declaration will be made within one week of the day of such determination by the owner to the registration authorities who will stamp the registration card null and void. The above declaration may be included in the declaration prescribed in paragraph 10 or may be made separately and at a later period.

12. Each registration will be made in triplicate with one card submitted to the person registering the vessel, a second card to be kept in the file of the prefectural office and the third to be forwarded to the Japanese Bureau of Fisheries, Ministry of Agriculture and Forestry.

13. Each prefectural government will prepare the following statistical tables of the registered vessels of its prefecture:

a. Every three months, a table of the powered vessels of 5 gross tons and over.

b. Every twelve months, a table of all other registered vessels including powered and non-powered vessels under five gross tons. The first three-month period will end on 31 March, and the twelve-month period will end on 31 December of each year.

c. The statistical tables of registered vessels for non-tidal waters must be separated in all cases from those for marine waters.

d. A copy of the above statistical tables will be submitted to the Military Government of the prefecture, and to the Japanese Bureau of Fisheries, Ministry of Agriculture and Forestry, who will check them against the registration cards filed in its office.

14. The Japanese Bureau of Fisheries, Ministry of Agriculture and Forestry, will prepare statistical tables for all the registered vessels of Japan:

a. Every three months, a table of powered vessels of 5 gross tons and over.

b. Every twelve months a table of all other registered vessels including powered and all non-powered vessels under 5 gross tons. Each three-month and twelve-month period will end as instructed in paragraph 13b.

c. The statistical tables of registered vessels for non-tidal waters must be separated in all cases from those for marine waters.

15. A copy of the statistical tables prepared by the Japanese Bureau of Fisheries, Ministry of Agriculture and Forestry, will be submitted, as soon as completed, to General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers.

16. The periodical statistical tables will show as separate listings within the tables those vessels which are immobilized because of repairs or permanently withdrawn from fishing as referred to in paragraphs 10 and 11.

17. All registration records will be kept up to date at all times and readily available for inspection by officials of General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers.

18. Any false declaration, false record, withholding of information, negligence in keeping prescribed records and tables, alteration of ship marks, and violation of any section of the instructions contained herein by captain, crew members, ship owners or persons responsible for the operation and registration of the vessel, including Japanese officials, will be cause for punishment in accordance with penalties for the violation of directives of General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers.

Upon the receipt of reference 1.b., this Headquarters telegraphically requested information from the United States Government concerning the status of repatriation arrangements for Japanese nationals remaining in Switzerland, Sweden, and Vatican City. A reply dated 23 October has been received in which it is stated that according to Japanese journalist KIU Shinzou in Bern there now exists a possibility that the entire group of Japanese nationals in Vatican City and Switzerland may be repatriated on an American President Lines vessel which departs in November from Marseilles for Yokohama via Panama. b. Return to Japan all Japanese personnel and cargo upon completion of this operation.

c. Instruct Boski Cho to accept delivery of this cargo at point or points to be designated later, and after transfer of all petroleum products to Petroleum Distribution Noden, to submit a report to General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, showing the total quantity of each product recovered. No portion of petroleum products recovered under this directive will be released without the approval of the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers.

3. Quantitative receipts in triplicate (3 copies) showing both the total quantity of petroleum products manifested and received from the Marshall Islands will be signed and sealed by the officially designated agency of Boski Cho in the proper space provided for in the receipt. 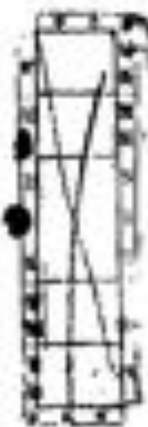

2. The SS "Dai Ju" was reported on the list enclosed with the reference memorandum as having been sunk on 11 May 1946, 4,000 meters from Pohnpei, as the result of striking a mine, and was stated to be unavailible.

3. The Central Liaison Office is directed to submit a report to the Civil Property Custodian by 30 November 1947 stating in detail the basis for the conclusion that the SS "Dai Ju" is unavailible. Such report should include the following information:

- Exact location of the sunken vessel (latitude and longitude);
- Sea depth at the position of sinking;
- Other marine conditions which might have a bearing on the feasibility of salvage;
- Extent of damage to the vessel, if known.
