2. The frequencies recommended by the Ministry of Communications for use by the 1947 - 1948 Japanese Whaling Expedition are authorized as listed in Inclosure 1.

3. The Bureau of Fisheries of the Ministry of Agriculture and Forestry hereinafter referred to as the Communications Agent will act as the Communications Agent in Japan for the whaling fleet including the Taiyo Gyogyo (Ocean Fishing Company), the Nippon Kaisha (Marine Products Company), for those observers accompanying the whaling fleet with the authorization of the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, and for private messages exchanged between members of the crew of the whaling fleet ships and their families in Japan.

4. Any communications with the whaling fleet will be transmitted or received by the Japanese coastal radio service only when addressed through the Communications Agent for the whaling fleet. A file copy of all messages sent or received through the Communications Agent will be retained by that Bureau.

5. Communications, including personal messages, to and from authorized Allied observers, will be forwarded to or received from the Natural Resources

6. Communications between Japanese nationals including personal messages, to and from the whaling fleet, will be sent via the Communications Agent, who will relay the message to the company or person addressed subject to all existing rules and requirements of censorship.

7. With respect to the navigation of vessels, meteorological observations and fishing data, the Japanese whaling fleet is authorized radio communication with the following:

- a. Other vessels of the authorized Japanese whaling fleet.
- b. Radio stations of the Japanese coastal radio service.
- c. Whaling vessels of other nations.

8. Messages pertaining to the navigation of Japanese whaling vessels, meteorological observations and fishing data may be sent in the following codes:

- a. Nippon Kaizen's Telegraph code for fishery information.
- b. Teiko Kaizen's telegraph code for fishery information.

Copies of these codes will be deposited with the Bureau of Fisheries of the Ministry of Agriculture and Forestry and the Natural Resources Section, General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers.

9. The Japanese whaling fleet will answer immediately any communications from the United States Navy or Royal vessels of the other Allied Powers.

10. The Japanese whaling fleet will answer interrogations of non-Japanese coastal stations when so interrogated.

11. Communication is permitted with any radio station when authorized by the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers' representatives accompanying the Whaling Expedition.

12. The Japanese whaling vessels may establish contact with other vessels or coastal radio stations to handle distress traffic according to the General Radio Regulations (Geneva Convention 1934).

SUBJECT: Concentration of Currencies and Financial Instruments Surrendered by Repatriates at Ports of Entry in Japan

1. Reference is made to the following memoranda for the Japanese Government from General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers:

a. AS 370.25 (7 May 46)OC, Annex VI to SCAFIN 927, 7 May 1946, subject, "Repatriation," as amended;

b. AS 131 (29 Nov 46)CPC/PP, SCAFIN 1968, 29 November 1946, subject, "Surrender of Foreign Exchange Assets," as amended.

2. The Japanese Government is directed to take immediate and appropriate action in conformance with directions contained herein and require that all currencies and financial instruments surrendered by repatriates at the various ports of entry in Japan under provisions of reference is above, exclusive of those cited in paragraph 3 below, be deposited in the Bank of Japan, Tokyo:

a. Receipt forms similar to CPC/A, CPC/B, and CPC/C as prescribed in reference is above, will be utilized in the concentration program. The Japanese Government is directed to obligate the Bank of Japan to issue to port officials or other depositories of repatriated currencies and financial instruments receipt forms similar to CPC/A and CPC/B. One copy of each receipt will be submitted to General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers;

b. Currencies and financial instruments concentrated under this program will be placed in special custody by the Bank of Japan for ultimate disposition by the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers.

3. Bank of Japan yen, Japanese military notes; Central Reserve Bank of China notes, Federal Reserve Bank of China notes, Southern Regions Development Bank notes, Bank of Mongolia notes, Bank of Manchou notes, and financial instruments expressed in terms of such currencies are excepted from this concentration program.

Items not specified above should be associated to one or the other of the above and handled accordingly.

b. Samples shipped by air express or surface freight, either as cargo or baggage or personal effects from Japan, will be defined as follows:

(1) Textiles

- (a) Cloth - cotton, wool, silk, rayon or other textiles to be cut in strips 4 inches wide, the length to be the original width of the item.
- (b) Manufactured items to be cut or otherwise rendered valueless except as a model to be used in taking orders for merchandise or for examination with a view to reproduction. The words, "Sample, Not for Sale," stamped in large letters on various parts of certain items in brilliant colored ink would serve the purpose.
- (2) Chemicals, Salts and Pigments to be packed in containers not to exceed 4 fluid ounces. The container to be clearly stamped "Sample, Not for Sale" and shipped in lots not exceeding 24 such containers per consignment.

(3) Earthen, Earthenware and Glassware

- (a) In powder, crushed, granulated or otherwise prepared in the natural state, limestone, magnesite, plaster rock, pumice stones, mica, clay and other earths may be exported as samples in lots up to 100 pounds.
- (b) Manufactured items such as stoneware, pipe, crockery, china or porcelain tableware and vases, bottles, vials and other glassware, etc., made of earthen may be shipped as samples only when the item consists of no more than one of each kind and each article is stamped "Sample, Not for Sale" in some substance not easily removed.

(4) Metals and Manufactures Thereof

- (a) Ore - a sample will not exceed 25 pounds.
- (b) Manufactured items declared as samples must be cut or otherwise rendered valueless as an item to be used or sold.

(5) Food and Manufactures Thereof

- (a) Food and roots of wood and brier in its natural state in pieces weighing no more than 50 pounds may be exported as samples.
- (b) Yarns of wool cut in strips 4 inches wide and not weighing more than 10 pounds may be shipped as samples.
- (c) Casks, barrels, boxes and similar items when knocked down and consist of parts of one whole item may be shipped as a sample.
- (d) Other items manufactured wholly or in part of wood may be shipped as samples when cut or otherwise rendered valueless. Only one of each item may be sent a single consignment per shipment.

(6) Foodstuff and other Agriculture Products

- (a) No item of food in its raw state, may be shipped as sample.
- (b) Tea and other items, dried, smoked, salted or otherwise preserved and not canned, bottled, bottled or put up in glass containers may be shipped as samples in a package weighing not more than one pound and marked "Sample, Not for Sale". Not more than one package of each item will be allowed.
- (c) Canned, bottled, bottled or preserved in other glass containers may be shipped as samples when only one of each item is so declared and each item marked "Free Sample." Miniature cans, pots, bottles or other containers when especially prepared as samples with the words "Free Sample" stamped in the container may be shipped in lots not exceeding 24 of each item.

(7) Spirits, Wine and other Beverages

- (a) Only items put up in miniature containers of not more than 4 fluid ounces will be considered as a sample. Such items may be shipped in lots of not more than 24 such miniature containers.

(8) Fiber, Yarn, Jute and similar fibers and manufactures thereof

- (a) Raw material in a package of not more than one pound may be shipped as a sample of any one item.
- (b) Yarn, twine or cordage of not more than 10 meters in length may be shipped as sample and only 10 meter pieces per item per consignee will be allowed.
- (c) Other items manufactured wholly or in part of flax, hemp, jute and stiffer fibers must be cut or otherwise rendered valueless before it may be shipped as a sample.

(9) Paper and Manufacture thereof

- (a) Only one quarter ream of each paper item may be shipped as a sample to a consignee.
- (b) Only one item of each article manufactured of paper may be shipped as a sample to a consignee. Each item so shipped must be stamped "Free Sample."

(10) Miscellaneous

- (a) Any other item not covered in the foregoing list can only be shipped as a sample when such item is cut or otherwise rendered valueless. Only one of each such item will be permitted to be shipped to a consignee.
- (b) The word consignee as used in these definitions of samples will include any individual who may desire to include samples in his personal baggage and effects or have them shipped separately to himself or others.

3. None of the above definitions will prohibit an individual from purchasing and shipping greater quantities of any article manufactured or produced in Japan to be used as samples abroad, though such samples must not exceed \$500.00 in value. (Special authorization may be granted by SOAF for items of greater value.) In such cases the following procedure shall apply

a. License for the export of samples (not accompanied by an individual leaving Japan) will be requested by supplier or exporter through submission to Soeki Cho of Form IX 201 (Inclosure 1). This application to export samples may be made with or without previous submission of a Form IX 100. Certification by Soeki Cho represents license to export.

b. Samples in usual commercial quantities will be inspected prior to export by the Japanese Government or its official agency.

c. Form IX 201 will act in a dual capacity:

- (1) As a license to export samples in usual commercial quantities.
- (2) Where purchase of samples is involved as a receipt for dollars paid.

(a) When samples are purchased Soeki Cho will render an invoice in dollars or other acceptable currencies, to be paid to the Economic and Scientific Section, Foreign Trade Division for Deposit in SOAF Commercial Account to the credit of the Japanese Government. On the strength of official receipt from General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, Soeki Cho will certify payment on Form 201.

(b) Where samples are not purchased, shipper's certification attests the fact that articles were legally acquired in accordance with existing regulations of General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers.

d. Where requests for samples are received through the mail, Soeki Cho will instruct supplier to execute the Form 201 (where applicable) to clear export of samples through Japanese customs, attaching to the form a copy of the original letter in lieu of shipper's signed declaration.

e. Upon validation, one copy of Form IX 201 will be submitted to General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, Attention: Economic and Scientific Section, Foreign Trade Division for information purposes.

4. Three copies of Form IX 201 must accompany each shipment of samples; one for retention by Soeki Cho, one for clearance through Japanese customs, the third for Eighth Army recording purposes after completion of export. Soeki Cho may arrange for additional copies as required.

In a statement inclosed with reference 1b, the SS "Hain Lee", 1174 gross tons, was reported as captured at Hongkong on 22 September 1942 and sunk on 9 August 1945 at 34° 5' N, 131° 19' E, as the result of striking a mine. The SS "Hain Lee" appears to be the same vessel as the SS "Shun Lee" (Japanese name "Shiori Maru"), reported on list inclosed with reference 1a as a vessel of 1174 gross tons, captured at Hongkong on 22 September 1942, and sunk on 9 August 1945 seven miles from Ube, as a result of striking a mine. The vessel was reported as unsalvageable.

3. Lloyd's Register for 1942-43 lists a vessel of 1532 gross tons under the name "Shun Lee." According to information submitted by the Japanese Government in reference 1d, the SS "Shun Lee" (Japanese name "Junri Go"), 1532 gross tons, was stranded off Koppo, Korea, on 30 July 1942.

1. References.

a. C.L.O. No. 6501(RJ), 7 December 1946, subjects
"Baggage and Currency Left by Japanese Repatriates from Santa
Fe Internment Camp".

b. C.L.O. No. 1227(RJ), 26 February 1947, subjects
"Request Concerning Baggage Left by Japanese Repatriates from
Crystal City Internment Camp".

2. Property of non-official Japanese civilian internees
who were repatriated from the United States is due to arrive in
Yokohama aboard the United States Army Transport GENERAL
ELTINGER on or about 14 November 1947. Forwarded herewith are
three copies of each of six lists of non-official Japanese
civilian repatriates for whom the United States has had in its
custody property withheld at the time of their repatriation to
Japan.

3. The six lists of property are in the following cate-
gories:

a. Property withheld from Japanese nationals repatriated
from the United States to Japan aboard the vessel GRIPSHOLM
on 19 June 1942.

b. Property withheld from Japanese nationals repatriated
from the United States to Japan aboard the GRIPSHOLM on
2 September 1943.

c. Property withheld from Japanese nationals who were
repatriated from the United States to Japan after September
1945 aboard vessels other than the GRIPSHOLM.

d. Property left by Japanese nationals who cannot be
identified.

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e. Property listed in names of Japanese nationals
who cannot be identified.

f. Unidentified property (no names shown on the
items).

4. Further information on this baggage follows:

a. Baggage consists of 211 boxes or similar containers
totaling approximately 3,000 cubic feet.

b. Every effort has been made to identify the persons
with whose names the property is marked. However, as a result
of the poor condition in which some of the property was left,
or the inadequate manner in which it was packed, it has been
difficult and in some instances impossible to make an identifi-
cation.

c. Numbers 1 through 263 and 168 through 215 have been
newly assigned to boxes being shipped. There has been placed on
each container a label showing the new number assigned to it.
Other numbers which may appear on the boxes or containers should
be ignored. Also appearing on each label is the name (or names)
marked on the items contained therein. Beside each name
(preceding or following) a notation will be found which indicates
the list on which the name appears. The notation "OI" signifies
that the name appears on the list of property withheld from
persons who departed aboard the GRIPSHOLM on 19 June 1942 in
connection with the first exchange of American and Japanese
nationals; the notation "OII" means that the name appears on the
list of property withheld from persons who departed aboard the
GRIPSHOLM on 2 September 1943, in connection with the second
exchange of American and Japanese nationals. Other notations
which have been used on the labels follow:

Deceased - (Name will be found on list entitled
"Property Listed in the Names of Deceased
Japanese Nationals")

Unidentified - (Following the name) (Name will be found
on list entitled "Property Withheld from
Japanese Nationals who Cannot be Identified")

Unidentified - (Preceding name of item) (In items shown
on list entitled "Unidentified Property")
