d. The names appearing on the various lists and on the labels are for the most part as they appear on the items of property; in some instances, however, the names appearing on the items are incorrect or illegible. In the latter instances, corrections were made and the names appearing on the lists and the labels constitute what are believed to be the correct versions.

e. The addresses appearing on the lists have been taken from United States Government files. In many instances they are not recent addresses, but they may give some proof to the whereabouts of the individuals.

5. There now remains in the custody of the United States no personal or household effects which can be identified as having been left in the United States by non-official Japanese internees repatriated to Japan under exchange agreements. However, certain funds, evidences of indebtedness and other financial instruments left by Japanese repatriates remain in the custody of the United States Government.

6. Upon receipt of this baggage by the Japanese Government the United States considers its obligations under Article 77 of the Geneva Convention relative to the treatment of prisoners of war, signed at Geneva on 27 July 1929, to have been fulfilled.

7. The Japanese Government will:

- a. Submit to Commanding General, Eighth Army a receipt in triplicate for the property when it has been turned over by the port authorities to the Japanese Government,
- b. Make every effort to identify the owners and forward the property to them.

1. The Japanese Government will suggest pilot facilities in Tokyo Bay to provide pilots qualified to bring ships from Kannon Saki to the Harbor area of Yokohama and Tokyo and to the docks at Yokosuka.
2. All pilots shall be qualified and licensed by the General Maritime Bureau, Ministry of Transportation. The Commander Naval Forces, Far East, reserves the right to exclude from employment such pilots as may be deemed unsatisfactory for piloting of Allied shipping in the waters described in paragraph 1 above. The formation of the Tokyo Bay pilot service and the establishment of its operating procedures shall be subject to the supervision of the Commander, Naval Forces, Far East.
3. Suitable pilot stations, pilot boats and small craft shall be made available to the Association by the Maritime Bureau, Ministry of Transportation.
4. Except where in contradiction to this memorandum, the laws of the Japanese Government governing pilotage shall control.

1. Representatives of the Japanese Ministry of Transportation recently made inquiry of Commander Naval Forces Japan regarding the safety of KANITA channel. These representatives were informed that a swept safe-channel to KANITA had been completed and that Japanese vessels were permitted to enter KANITA.

2. Further investigation has revealed that the above information was in error; the KANITA swept channel has not been completed and entry into KANITA by shipping is not safe.

3. It is requested that the Japanese Ministry of Transportation and other interested agencies of the Japanese government be advised that KANITA is not an open port.

The records of the United States Government disclose that KIDO Masayoshi voluntarily departed from the United States on board the American Japanese exchange vessel Yoshida on 2 September 1943 and that he thereafter served in the Japanese Army. Since the subject had Japanese nationality at the time of his service in the Japanese Army, he therefore left, under the provisions of Section 481 (a) of the Nationality Act of 1940, any claim which he might have had to American citizenship.

3. It is requested that you inform Mrs. KIDO Shui that in view of the above circumstances, there is no action which this Government may take regarding her son.

a. Refund of an unused portion of any such prepayment will be made unless such portion amounts to at least fifty cents (50¢) when routed via the United States or Manila, or two shillings (2/-) when routed via Cebu-Colombo.

4. Established procedures for settlement of accounts, division and payment of revenue according to the Ministry of Communications, the United States and British carriers, as defined in reference 1g and 1h, above, will apply.

5. The attention of the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers has been invited to the fact that certain agencies of First and Second Demobilization Bureaus are retaining for their use extensive stocks of petroleum products which are urgently required to expedite the recovery of Japanese civilian economy.

2. Effective immediately, the Japanese Government will:

a. Cause inventories to be made of all petroleum products in the hands of the First and Second Demobilization Bureaus. These inventories will be accomplished jointly by representatives of Petroleum Distribution Kodan and representatives of each Demobilization Bureau.

b. Transfer to Petroleum Distribution Kodan all petroleum products in excess of the approved monthly allocation.

c. All inventories referred to in a above will be submitted in quadruplicate to the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, as they are completed, and in no case later than 30 December 1947.

3. In accordance with instructions promulgated in paragraph 1c of memorandum referred to in 1 above, as amplified by memoranda AO 303.3 (18 Oct 45) JO (SOCPIN 151), subject: Materials, Supplies and Equipment to be Turned Over to the Japanese Government by the Allied Forces, and AO 463.7 (13 Oct 45) JO (SOCPIN 115), subject: Japanese Petroleum Products, the Japanese Government will:

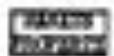

2. It is directed that the Japanese Government return all property on the attached list, and any additional movables which may be located and identified, to Emily Hoyt Cunningham at 27 Sakurayama-cho, Nakano-ku, Tokyo on 15 December 1947 at 1000 hours

under conditions set forth in 'Receipt for Restitution to United Nations Nationals of Wrongfully Transferred Property in Japan', and under the following conditions:

- a. A general and a final report by the Japanese Government on the management of the property from 7 December 1941 to the date of restoration, said report to include statement of all financial transactions, will be attached to each copy of the receipt;
- b. If the property has been leased subsequent to seizure, the Japanese Government will afford the restorer the option either to allow the lease to continue in force or to terminate it at the time of the

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restoration of the property. Should the restorer decide to terminate such lease, the Japanese Government will take the action necessary to provide vacant possession:

c. All inventories included in the receipt will contain a statement as to the condition of the property at the time of restoration;

d. Title to the property shall be restored to its status prior to wrongful transfer, confiscation or transfer under duress, and the property will be restituted free of all legal encumbrances placed on it subsequently. Transfer of title will be made at the Judicial Bureau, or its branch offices, having jurisdiction;

e. All funds subject to restitution will be restored to a free yen account status. Funds formerly on deposit in United Nations banking institutions and now on deposit in the Special Property Administration Account in the Bank of Japan are not subject to restitution to individual depositors.

3. Four copies of accomplished receipt for the property with documentary evidence of the transfer of title will be submitted to General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers within ten (10) days of completion of delivery. Receipts and evidence of transfer of title will be submitted in both English and Japanese text with the Japanese translation certified as correct.

2. Hours for use of the range will be from 0700 hours to 1700 hours, local time, Mondays through Fridays. The inhabitants of the Izu Islands and the coastal inhabitants from Manchuria to Chosen will be notified prior to any period during which the range will be used. When the range is used for periods in excess of fifteen (15) days, warning reminders will be disseminated to the inhabitants concerned. This information will be forwarded through Military Government units to local Japanese civil authorities.

Information is desired as to the fate of this vessel subsequent to the occupation of Hong Kong by the Japanese. It is known that just before the outbreak of hostilities between the Japanese and the Allied Powers the SS "Taiping" and the other four subject vessels were transferred to the British authorities at Hong Kong, and at the time of the occupation of that port by the Japanese the vessels were scuttled. It is, therefore, believed that the subject vessels may have been salvaged and taken to Japanese waters.

3. The SS "Hainui" was reported in paragraph 2c of reference 1e as a vessel of 700 tons displacement, seized by the Japanese on 9 January 1943, but no information was furnished as to the present location and condition of the vessel. Paragraph 2b(2) of reference 1f stated that the correct name of the SS "Hainui" was considered to be the SS "Haitung," a vessel of 1187 gross tons. Lloyd's Register for 1942-43 lists the SS "Haitung" as a vessel of 1187 gross tons, built in 1926, length 234' 2".

3. Of said MATSUMI, no other particulars are available at this Mission but that at the time of his marriage, he was employed - after the surrender - in the office of above-mentioned Major Haining and that he was probably repatriated to Japan shortly after June 10th, 1946.

4. As it appears that said marriage was probably a faked one, on which fact MATSUMI could give essential information, it would be highly appreciated if Diplomatic Section could possibly make the contact requested.

FROM: Central Liaison Office, Tokyo.

TO: Japanese Government.

1. The secretary-general of the United Nations requested that the Japanese Government be informed of a resolution adopted on 19 March 1947 by the Economic and Social Council of the United Nations approving in principle the proposal for a special world-wide appeal for non-governmental contributions to meet emergency relief needs of children, adolescents, and war-torn and war-affected nations. Copy of the secretary-general's letter describing the resolution is inclosed for the information of the Japanese Government.

2. There is also inclosed copy of a reply to the United Nations acknowledging the letter from the United Nations and expressing regret that at the present time the Japanese nation is not in position to contribute to any relief agency outside its own borders. The reply points out that, despite using every legal resource, Japan has to depend upon imported foodstuffs, textiles, and medicines in an effort to attain a minimum health standard, and that Japanese national organizations for voluntary contributions are cited as evidence of the regardance of the Japanese Government of the value of such programs. Until a treaty of peace is concluded, and the economic condition of Japan becomes reasonably stabilized, it is therefore felt that action by the Japanese Government out of necessity is not in question.

3. This letter and signature has been delivered to the Japanese Government.

MEMORANDUM ON THE "ONE DAY'S PAY" COLLECTION

The Economic and Social Council of the United Nations on 28 March 1947 during its fourth session, gave its approval to a new approach to the problem of world relief.

It adopted unanimously a resolution authorizing the Secretary-General to initiate "a special world-wide appeal for non-governmental voluntary contributions to meet emergency relief needs of children, adolescents, expectant and nursing mothers . . . by way of a "One Day's Pay" collection of some alternative form of collection better adapted to each particular country."

The project stems from the General Assembly's instruction to the Secretary-General to study the practicability of such a plan and to report his conclusions to the Economic and Social Council. The above-mentioned resolution was passed on the basis of this report.

SECRETARY-GENERAL'S REPORT

The Secretary-General in his report on the subject describes how, after the liberation of European countries, people from all walks of life, in occupied and non-occupied countries alike, took the initiative in assisting their suffering fellow-citizens by organizing relief drives, which were frequently based on the equivalent of the earnings of one day's work as the principal method of collection.

The opinion was expressed that if a similar collection on an international scale were undertaken such an effort would materially help in furnishing funds for urgent relief needs. The report tentatively estimated that even on the assumption of a full execution of current and projected relief programs, both governmental and voluntary, a sum amounting to several hundred million dollars* would still remain, without attempting to judge the potential yield of the "One Day's Pay" collection. The report states that on the theoretical assumption of a 100 per cent collection on the part of the organized workers alone, it should be possible to collect an equivalent of 175 million dollars. The appeal is not however intended to be limited to wage earners only. It should be all-inclusive and the slogan of "One Day's Pay" should be adopted to all the different groups.

It was further suggested that a united and concerted effort of this kind at the same time and for the same purpose all over the world would exercise a powerful moral and psychological effect. From this angle the active participation also of countries which have themselves suffered was held to be essential to the whole project in order to get away from the concept of "one way traffic" in relief. At the same time the report emphasized that the collection should be linked with an equitable system for the allocation and disposal of funds. In particular it was considered important to safeguard the interests of those countries which, while participating in the collection, face difficulties in matters of production and foreign exchange.

* All figures are given in U.S. dollars.

As regards the utilization of contributions, the report recommends that the collection be made available for the alleviation of distress among the world's children, adolescents, expectant and nursing mothers, without discrimination because of race, creed, nationality status, or political belief. For this purpose it was suggested that the International Children's Emergency Fund, recently established by the General Assembly, should be the main recipient of the proceeds of the collection.*

The Secretary-General's report was thoroughly discussed at the fourth session of the Economic and Social Council, both in plenary session and in committee. A number of suggestions were made in the light of which the final text of the resolution was drafted.

On the basis of this resolution and the discussion in the Council, the Secretariat drafted the following observations and proposals.

The General Idea

The general idea of the collection is to enable men and women everywhere in the world to express their faith in the words of the Charter of the United Nations, that men can "live together in peace with one another as good neighbors." The cause of International Children's Relief in particular will give to all an opportunity, which many of them are now seeking, of expressing in a concrete manner their sincere desire that this principle of the United Nations should be made fully effective.

The collection should accordingly achieve the highest possible degree of universality and that so far as possible, all the people in all countries should devote their effort simultaneously to the cause of international children's relief under the aegis of the United Nations.

A NATIONAL CO-OPERATIVE CAMPAIGN

The collection is a voluntary non-governmental effort. It is therefore contemplated that an international committee will be set up, which in co-operation with the Secretary-General, shall appeal to the public and sponsor the collection.

It is moreover agreed that the responsibility for the collection in each country should be borne by locally representative national committees organized in the manner best suited to the circumstances of each country. In collaboration with the Secretary-General and the International Secretariat, executive these national committees would organize the campaign in each country, fix the national targets, and co-operate with their Government in the agreement to be reached with the Secretary-General as to the disposal of the national collection and as to the purchase of supplies within the country for use elsewhere.

* A draft agreement on the Children's Emergency Fund is attached on the next to this memorandum.

DETAILS OF CAMPAIGN

It is fully recognized that the fund-raising should be sufficiently flexible to fit varying national patterns. The slogan of "One Day's Pay" is not in any way mandatory. In the course of the discussion in the Council several suggestions were made as to how the slogan of "One Day's Pay" could be adapted to the different professional groups. Even in industrial areas the measurement of the money to be collected may vary. In some countries the employers may be prepared to match the total amount contributed by the employees in their firms. Among farmers other concerns will have to be met. On a dairy farm the income of one day's milk production might be the basis. In other cases it might be the average. In still others a bushel of wheat, a bush of potatoes or a bush of rice might be the measure. One delegate suggested that national committees based on the "One Day's Pay" formula, might be fixed and national committees given the task of raising the money in the most effective way for the country concerned.

It has already been pointed out one of the purposes of the plan is to put an end to the notion of a "one day traffic" in relief. For this purpose the resolution will request of the special difficulties of certain countries and provide for agreement with each country concerning the manner in which the proceeds of the national collection are to be distributed. Such agreements should cover the question of the distribution of the proceeds of the national collection as between the needs of the children in the country itself and the International children's relief program and, where applicable, the most suitable mode of transfer of funds, taking into account the foreign exchange position of the country concerned. It is hoped that this provision will safeguard both the interests of the national committee and at the same time allow the funds of governments that their countries enter into international financial relations as a result of the collection.

Inasmuch as the resolution takes note of the need of the International Children's Emergency Fund for contributions, the Council intended that the proceeds of the national collection be transferred to the I.C.E.F. and its principal international beneficiary of the proceeds of the collection. However, the resolution makes no definite ruling in the matter. It is open to the Secretary-General and the International Committee to frize recommendations regarding the disposal of the funds collected, while the national committee in consultation with their governments may make the final decision.

It is recognized that the campaign cannot succeed without the help of governments which can assist and facilitate the work of the national committee in a number of ways. This is particularly the case when it comes to the question of the transfer of funds collected and their collection, or that of exemption from taxation of contributions to the collection.

TIME OF CAMPAIGN

It stands to reason that considerable time will be required for the adequate preparation of such a large-scale campaign. In view of this and having regard

to the need for the most suitable timing of the collection itself, it was agreed that it take place not earlier than some time towards the end of 1947, the Secretary-General, after due consultation, having the authority to fix the actual date.

The following stages are accordingly contemplated:

- (a) The establishment of machinery on the international as well as national and local levels. This work will commence forthwith and is expected to continue from now on until late summer.
- (b) The detailed preparation of the actual campaigning through the machinery thus established. This detailed preparation will probably last from late summer until the end of October.
- (c) The actual campaign and collection itself which might start at the end of October and should reach its climax and be completed on the date to be fixed by the Secretary-General.

The Secretary-General is now taking steps to prepare the establishment of an international committee. It is hoped that national committees can be brought into existence as soon as possible. Simultaneously the Secretary-General will communicate with the governments of all members of the United Nations and ask for their co-operation and suggestion.

It is proposed to keep all parties concerned in the plan informed of its progress at regular intervals.

MEMORANDUM OF THE INTERNATIONAL CHILDREN'S EMERGENCY FUND

The General Assembly of the United Nations on 11 December 1949, unanimously adopted a resolution establishing the International Children's Emergency Fund. The Fund is administered by an Executive Director, J.F. Lawrence Felt, under a twenty-six member Executive Board.

At least thirty million undernourished children in Europe alone are now existing on standards considerably lower than those prior to World War II. An equal or greater number of children in Asia are in need of supplementary food. The Executive Board of the Fund realizes that it cannot hope to meet this gigantic need at the outset of its operations and therefore proposes to give one supplementary meal a day to a total of twenty million children under eighteen years of age and nursing and pregnant mothers.

The International Children's Emergency Fund recognizes that primary responsibility for child welfare lies with national governments. The purpose of the ICIEF is to provide supplementary assistance where needed.

To facilitate this supplementary program, the Secretary-General of the United Nations has requested donor surplus governments to contribute a minimum of \$200,000,000. It is estimated that this amount aided contributions from recipient governments themselves in the form of local foodstuffs, warehousing, transportation, and other services, if necessary to set the machinery in motion. Once this machinery has been established however, it is hoped that this supplementary program will be in part continued on the basis of voluntary contributions from non-governmental sources.

The resolution of the General Assembly creating the Fund requires it to ensure that all supplies or other assistance under the program will be

equitably

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equitably dispensed or distributed on the basis of need, without discrimination because of race, creed, nationality status, or political belief. Governments requesting assistance will submit to the ICIEF proposals containing full information as to needs and plans of operation. Experienced representatives of the Fund will be sent to the applicant countries to confirm the needs, and, in close and friendly co-operation with each Government, to insure that the purposes of the Fund and the conditions of the General Assembly's resolution are diligently carried out in all countries receiving aid.

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I have the honor to request you, provided there is no objection on the part of the Supreme Commander for Allied Powers, to draw the attention of the Government of Japan to a resolution adopted on 29 March 1947 by the Economic and Social Council of the United Nations which approved "in principle the proposal for a special worldwide appeal for non-governmental voluntary contributions to such emergency relief work of children, widows, orphans, aged, and war-disabled persons, without discrimination because of race, creed, nationality status, or political belief, by way of a 'Red Cross Day' collection of such alternative form or collection better adapted to each particular country."

For purposes of illustration of your statement, I am transmitting herewith, in addition to the full text of the resolution itself (document E/100), a memorandum on the background and purpose of this resolution. This memorandum has been prepared by J. A. G. Smith, whom I have requested to assume direction of the work of the secretariat in connection with the project.

In pursuance of the decision of the Economic and Social Council and as explained in the memorandum, I am now endeavoring to arrange for the creation of the necessary international machinery for the initiation and coordination of the campaign. It is my hope that at the same time work will be started to establish national and local bodies for the promotion of the appeal in all countries.

As you will note, the resolution urges governments to facilitate this voluntary effort, and I personally feel that the Japanese government could be of assistance in furthering the campaign. At a later stage, any necessary agreement will have to be reached as to the disposal of the national collection and as to the purchase of supplies within the country for use elsewhere, taking into account the circumstances prevailing in Japan, including the foreign exchange position.

I am deeply convinced that the plan if successful will help to create better understanding among nations, and I accordingly trust that this letter may be given sympathetic consideration. Whereas this campaign is under the auspices of the United Nations, it is dedicated to the children of all nations, and accordingly, addresses all nations in its fulfillment. I am looking forward to any observations or suggestions which you or the Government of Japan may care to make on the subject and I would ask you to be so good as to inform me in due course of the steps which it may be possible to take to assist the

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United Nations in the realization of this plan. I, for my part, shall keep you informed about the progress of the scheme, particularly insofar as it affects Japan.

4. The Japanese Government will be furnished the names of those non-Japanese nationals, not part of the Occupation Forces, granted permission to enter Japan, in accordance with the provisions of reference in above.
