2. Application of Taiwan Setto K.K. to lease its
Kobe plant for a period of ten years at an annual rental
of ¥329,742.10 is denied. However, approval is granted
for the release of subject property for rental on a
monthly basis with the following provisions:

a. Monthly rental based on ¥329,742.10 per year
will be paid by deposit thereof in an account in the name
of Taiwan Setto K.K.

b. All maintenance and repair charges will be
paid by the occupants.

c. The occupants will be required to vacate upon
thirty (30) days' notice from General Headquarters, Supreme
Commander for the Allied Powers, and will leave subject
premises in a condition substantially similar to that
existing at the beginning of occupancy.

4. The Japanese Government is further directed to deposit monthly, not later than the fifteenth day of each month, in the Bank of Japan to the credit of the custody account of the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, an amount equal to the royalties due for the previous month's manufacture of photograph records, as indicated in the monthly report required by paragraph 3 above.
5. The Japanese Government is further directed to submit a report in quadruplicate, not later than thirty (30) days from the date of this memorandum, showing the number of records manufactured from RCA manufacturing machines since the date of the last report made to RCA Manufacturing Company, Inc. This report will be prepared in the same manner as the monthly report required by paragraph 3 above.

SUBJECT: Hospital Arrest of Suspected War Criminal

1. ENDO, Keita, Lieutenant, interned in Sugamo Prison pursuant to General Headquarters Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, Memorandum AG 000.5 (24 Jun 47) 1B, subject: Apprehension of Suspected War Criminals, and presently interned for treatment at the 361st Station Hospital, Tokyo, will be removed therefrom and placed in a reliable Japanese hospital for the care of mentally deranged patients. To effect removal, representatives of the Japanese Government will make the necessary arrangements with Legal Section, General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers.

Gold and silver will be obtained from newly-aired stocks held by the Japanese Government. 100 grams of rhodium will be obtained from the Tohoku Electric Company, Tokyo and 512 grams will be released to authorized representatives of the Ministry of Finance from 21,513 Army Vault, Osaka Dist. At the time the rhodium is released, the Japanese Government will deposit with the Custodian Eighth Army Vault, Osaka Dist, 2,599.36 grams of gold. This gold will be in the form of bars of nine or near nine fineness.

 - b. Law No. 46 of 1946 of the Japanese Government, dated 21 October 1946, subject: Gangyo Pakko Koden Bill, as amended by Law No. 57 of 1947 of the Japanese Government, dated 15 April 1947, subject: Gangyo Pakko Koden Bill.
2. Reference 1 a above is revoked.
3. In administering reference 1 b above, the Japanese Government will comply with the following provisions:
 - a. The Industrial Recovery Corporation shall dispose of, with the approval of the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, any interest it holds or may hold in any plant or facility. This paragraph shall not prohibit the holding of any interest acquired under paragraph 3 c below.
 - b. The Industrial Recovery Corporation shall have no direct or indirect control over management or operation of any private enterprise, either by agreement with the company or otherwise. The Japanese Government shall declare invalid and inoperative any agreement or understanding for approval on the part of the Industrial Recovery Corporation, or of any officer or employee thereof, of the appointment of any company official or of any act of the company.
 - c. When existing commercial and financial channels are not adequate to effect a program to rehabilitate or expand

a critical industry, the Japanese Government will request the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers to approve such a program as a designated rehabilitation program. If a program is so approved, the Industrial Recovery Corporation may procure and lease or resell to private industry the equipment and facilities necessary to effect such a designated program. The Industrial Recovery Corporation will in no event be the sole agency for the procuring of such equipment and facilities. The Industrial Recovery Corporation shall not in any event procure facilities and equipment except as provided above.

d. The Economic Stabilization Board may authorize the Industrial Recovery Corporation to acquire and sell the following goods in accordance with the directions and programs of the Economic Stabilization Board:

- (1) any goods acquired by the Japanese Government in accordance with Economic Stabilization Board procedures for confiscation or for the redistribution of excessive inventories which do not come under jurisdiction of any other agency, or goods for which the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers holds the Japanese Government responsible for redistribution within the civilian economy.
- (2) Goods to be distributed under a program of the Economic Stabilization Board for the rehabilitation of Japanese industry, where the goods cannot be distributed pursuant to such program without purchase by the Japanese Government and providing appropriations are made by the Stat for such governmental purchases.

e. The Industrial Recovery Corporation will dispose of no goods under control without complying with the appropriate ordinance relative to allocations, rationing, and/or price control. Consistent with these controls, the Industrial Recovery Corporation shall establish a procedure for fair competitive bidding, auctioning of materials, or sale by lottery, and shall, except where otherwise directed by the Economic Stabilization Board, provide a reasonable time and notice of any sale of goods.

f. Except for the powers specifically enumerated above, the Industrial Recovery Corporation will engage in no activities without the assent of the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers.

g. The salaries of the officers and directors will be made public.

h. Adequate representation of middle-sized and small business will be included on the Board of Directors.

SUBJECT: Applicability of Taxes to Non-Japanese Nationals


1. SCAFPC 1881-A, dated 28 July 1946, subject: "Applicability of Ordinary Taxes to Non-Japanese Nationals" is hereby reinstated.

2. There is no objection to the applicability of local and national taxation to non-Japanese nationals except as specified in paragraph 3 below, provided that such taxes are not discriminatory against non-Japanese nationals. No tax, primarily designed to meet reparations or other charges falling upon the Japanese Government as a result of the war shall be imposed by the Japanese Government upon United Nations nationals or their properties.

3. No tax will be imposed by the Japanese Government on the official salaries of military personnel, of civilians attached to the occupation forces, and of accredited personnel of foreign diplomatic missions, delegations, and other official representation attached to the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers. No tax based upon or measured by income lawfully received in non-yen currencies will be imposed by the Japanese Government. This shall not however be construed to prohibit the taxation of SCAP employees or SCAP licensee employees paid in yen currencies.

4. Direct communication between the Ministry of Finance and interested staff sections of this Headquarters is authorized to implement the provisions of this memorandum.
