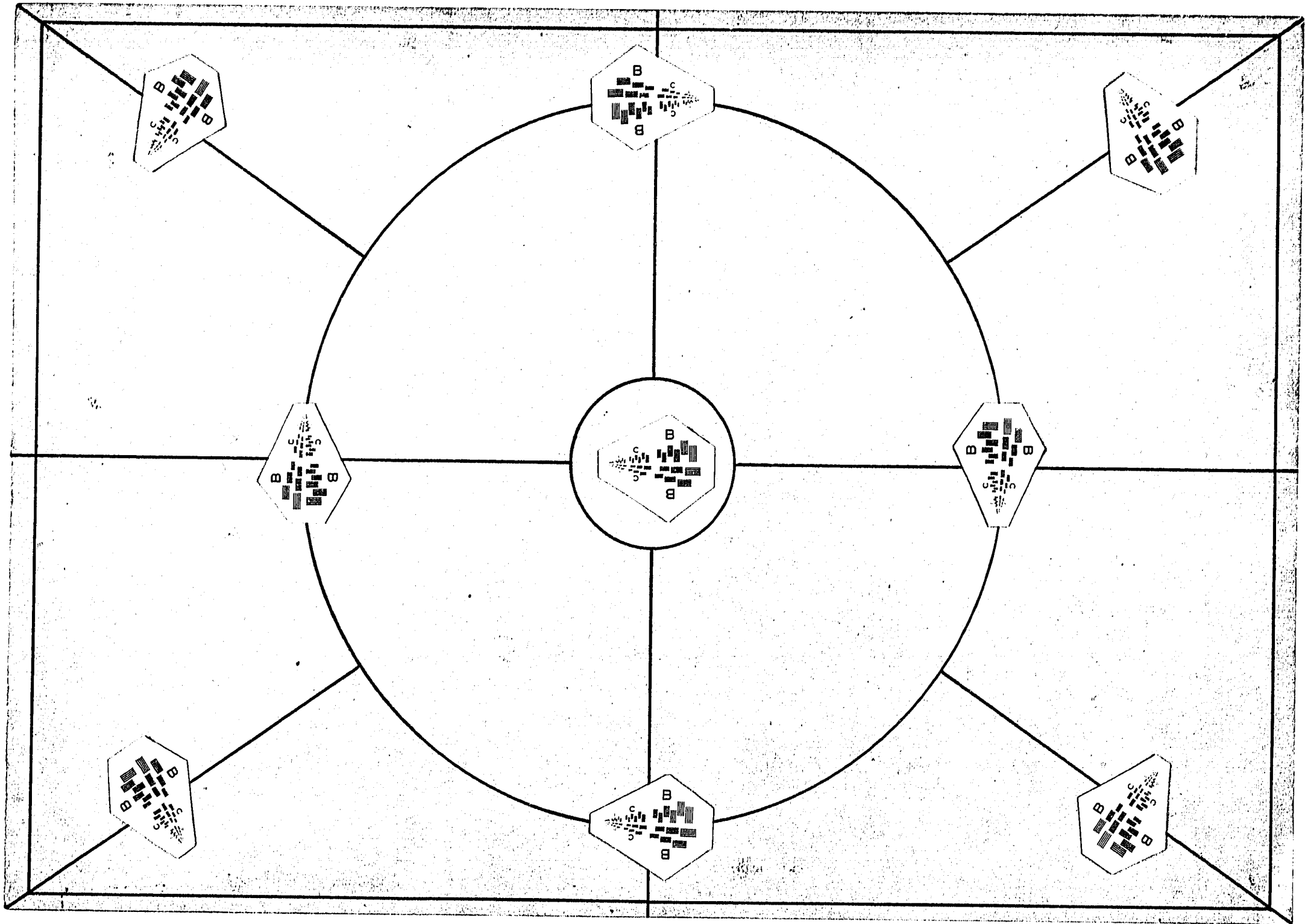

SUBJECT: Status of Former Japanese Embassy at Rome.

TO: Japanese Government

1. Reference is made to the Japanese Government's memorandum CLO No. 5600(AJ), 17 July 1947, subject: "Restitution of Former Japanese Embassy Building in Rome."

2. Inquiries made through the Department of State and the American Embassy at Rome have elicited the following information with regard to the disposition of the former Japanese Embassy building at Rome:

a. The former Japanese Embassy at Rome (Villa Berlingieri) was, with the exception of the top floor, restored to the owner by August 1, 1946 following consultation between the four Allied Embassies in Rome. This restoration was effected after full payment of accrued rent from 1 January 1946 to 1 August 1946, and after the premises had been thoroughly cleaned. The question of the retroactive rent increase claimed by the landlord under Italian rental laws was deferred by a decision of the Allied Embassies for eventual settlement between the landlord and the Japanese Government through the Italian Foreign Ministry.

b. Since the archives, effects of Japanese diplomats, and certain other articles had to be stored until instructions had been received as to their ultimate disposition, it was decided to move these items to the top floor of the villa and to retain physical possession thereof for an indefinite period against a monthly rental of 10,000 lire. The top floor of the building was restored to the owner on 3 November 1947.

c. When the major portion of the former Japanese Embassy was restored to the owner in 1946, Baron Berlingieri attempted to present to the Embassies of the Four Allied

Powers a claim for damages suffered by the property during Japanese occupancy. The Embassies refused to accept a claim of an Italian citizen against the Japanese Government and suggested at that time that any such claim should properly be made through the Italian Government. The four Embassies have no knowledge of any claim for damages filed through the Italian Government at that time or subsequently.

MEMORANDUM FOR: JAPANESE GOVERNMENT

SUBJECT: Responsibilities of the Japanese Government for the Packaging, Transfer, and Delivery of Property Being Restored to Claimant Nations under the Restitution Program

1. The Japanese Government is informed that in restoring property which was looted or purchased under fraud or duress from United Nations areas occupied by former Japanese armed forces, the principles and procedures outlined in this memorandum, will be applicable.
2. The Japanese Government will bear all costs and perform all operations relative to the packaging, transfer, storage, delivery to a port in Japan for water-borne or air-borne craft, handling, and stowage on board the claimant nation's craft at that port of all looted property which is being restored in restitution.
3. The Japanese Government is responsible for performing the following operations or actions:
  - a. Dismantling, cleaning, preservation, and packaging of property to standards which will insure its stowage aboard the craft of the claimant nation in good order;
  - b. Supplying all materials and equipment required for dismantling, disassembly, cleaning and preservation, packaging, transportation to a port in Japan, storage in Japan, and loading and stowing with proper dunnage and bracing aboard the craft of the claimant nation;
  - c. Marking of containers and preparing packing lists;
  - d. Transporting property to ports in Japan, designated by the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, for water-borne or air-borne craft according to shipping schedules established by the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers;
  - e. Storing property whenever necessary prior to stowage aboard the claimant nation's craft;
  - f. Handling and loading of property up to and including stowage with proper dunnage and bracing in the claimant nation's craft. Stowage operations will be performed under the direction of the craft's officers;

- g. Guarding the property while enroute and in storage in Japan;
- h. Making good any damage or shortage resulting from carelessness or negligence in the processes of dismantling, packaging, transporting, handling, storing, and stowing on board carrier, if such damage or shortage occurred prior to final acceptance by the claimant nation aboard the carrier;
- i. Making good any damage sustained by the carrier, resulting from loading, stowing and bracing cargo therein in a careless or negligent manner;
- j. Other necessary operations, not listed above, relative to the packaging, transfer, and delivery in restitution of property looted or purchased under fraud or duress from areas under the control of former Japanese armed forces.
- 4. Damage which is the result of faulty gear of the recipient nation's carrier, sustained by the equipment or carrier in the process of loading and stowing, will be the responsibility of the recipient nation.
- 5. Injury to Japanese personnel engaged in the loading and stowage of the recipient nation's carrier will be the responsibility of the Japanese Government.
- 6. Receipt for property restored in restitution to claimant nations will be given by the claimant nation upon the completion of the proper stowage of the property aboard the claimant nation's craft, or upon acceptance of the property at the point designated by the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers. After the delivery receipt has been executed, the property will become the entire responsibility of the claimant nation.
- 7. Other detailed instructions to the Japanese Government regarding the dismantling, cleaning, preservation, packaging, transfer, and delivery of property to be restored in restitution will be transmitted as necessary.

Matters which would require stockholders' consideration are to be submitted for decision to General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, Civil Property Custodian.
