SUBJECT: Restrictions on Transit Traffic Transmitted over Japanese-European Circuits

1. Effective 1 August 1948, prepaid message traffic from Japan, transmitted over the radiotelegraph circuits terminating at Paris, Geneva, Stockholm and Moscow is restricted to messages destined to France, Switzerland, Sweden and Russia respectively, or to any territories, possessions, or dependencies under the respective administrative control of those countries.
2. Messages from Japan, routed via Paris, Geneva, Stockholm or Moscow, destined to contiguous or other countries may be transmitted on a receiver-to-pay basis, subject to concurrence of the connecting telegraph administration and to prior arrangement between the Japanese Ministry of Communications and the telegraph administration of the country of destination.
3. There are no restrictions applicable to prepaid messages incoming to Japan from contiguous or other countries, received over the subject circuits.
4. Direct communication between Civil Communications Section, General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers and the Ministry of Communications concerning matters within the scope of this memorandum is authorized.

1. Reference is made to Memorandum for the Japanese Government, file AG 400.12 (29 Oct 46) CCS, SCAFIN 1299, dated 29 October 1946, subject as above. This memorandum is issued in accordance with paragraph 2 of the reference memorandum and rescinds SCAPINS 1299/1 through 1299/4 inclusive.

2. It is directed that the Japanese Ministry of Communications provide communications services, facilities, equipment, material and personnel during the period 1 April 1948 to 31 March 1949, as follows:

a. Telephone exchange service and trunks wholly within an exchange area of a city or town, in addition to services being provided at present, which can be furnished by use of existing telephone plant as listed in Appendix I.

b. Construct and/or install communications facilities listed in Appendix II.

c. Long distance lines and telegraph circuits wholly within one Ministry of Communications operating bureau or division as covered in paragraph 5 below.

d. Communications personnel as listed in Appendix III.

e. Bulk materials and equipment required for indigenous supply of the occupation forces will be provided as listed in Appendix V.

f. All other communications services, facilities, equipment, material and personnel not covered above as directed by General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers.

3. Statements of services rendered covering all communications services, facilities, equipment, material and personnel to and/or for the occupation forces throughout Japan will be prepared on GPA Form 5 and submitted to Signal Corps representatives as provided by Appendix IV.

4. Communications services, facilities, equipment, materials, and personnel listed in Appendices I, II, III and V are based on future requirements. Revisions and corrections found necessary will be furnished to the Ministry of Communications by General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers.

5. Exchange service and trunks within the exchange area of a town or city covered by Appendix I will be furnished by local offices in accordance with communications orders placed by the Commanding Officer of the occupation forces therein, or by his authorized representative. A representative of the Japanese Communication System located in the city or town where service is requested will be authorized to furnish such service without approval of the operating bureau of Ministry of Communications.

6. Toll and exchange construction and installation listed in Appendix II, long distance lines and telegraph circuits wholly within one operating bureau or division, and personnel covered by Appendix III will be provided in accordance with communications orders. These orders will be submitted as authorized by Headquarters, Eighth Army. General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers will coordinate with the Ministry of Communications in preparation of schedules and plans for furnishing facilities and personnel covered by Appendices II and III. Upon completion of these plans and schedules, directors of the operating bureaus or divisions will arrange to fulfill the demands without further approval of the Ministry of Communications, citing the communications order as authority.

7. Communications facilities provided in accordance with this memorandum include those required for billets and housing for occupation forces covered by Memorandum for Japanese Government, file AG 411 (6 Mar 40) CE-GD, SCAFIN 799, dated 6 March 1946, subject: Housing Program for Occupation Forces and Their Dependents.

In order to provide a sufficient supply of Japanese yen for sale to United States occupation personnel in Japan, the Japanese Government is instructed to arrange that Boeki Cho deposit to the credit of an account maintained with the Bank of Japan, under the title "Regular Account, Walter K. LeCount, Funding Officer, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers", a sum of one billion (¥1,000,000,000) Japanese yen, on or before 15 August 1948.
2. On or before the fifteenth day following the close of business each month, the Funding Officer, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers will furnish a statement to Boeki Cho showing the total amount of yen sold during the previous month. Within fifteen days after such notice, Boeki Cho will replenish the revolving fund by making a yen deposit to the credit of the Funding Officer's account with the Bank of Japan in an amount equal to the sales evidenced by the afore-mentioned statement.
3. The dollar proceeds of such sales will be available for payment of essential imports into Japan and other approved purposes.

TO: Japanese Government.

1. The Secretary of State has forwarded to the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers a note from the Secretary General of the United Nations together with a certified true copy of the Final Act of the United Nations Conference on Trade and Employment held at Habana on March 28, 1948 and its annexes consisting of the Habana Charter for the International Trade Organization and the Resolutions adopted at the Conference.

2. The Secretary General of the United Nations has requested that these certified true copies in English, French, Chinese, Russian and Spanish be transmitted to the Japanese Government. They are therefore enclosed with this memorandum.

3. The Secretary General indicates that this action was taken in accordance with that provision of the Final Act which directs that certified copies thereof be furnished to "each of the Governments represented at the Conference". It will be recalled that by a resolution adopted August 1, 1947 the Economic and Social Council of the United Nations invited the control authorities in Germany, Japan, and Korea to send representatives to the Conference in a consultative capacity. With respect to Article 103 of the Habana Charter, to which the Secretary General refers, acceptance of the Charter by Japan is obviously not a matter for consideration at the present time.

The Japanese Government is directed to take immediate action to make available until further notice all serviceable Japanese ocean tankers, fully manned, adequately fitted and provisioned for service between Japan and the Persian Gulf for the lifting of petroleum products (Navy Special and/or Diesel Fuel Oil) from Caltex Oil Company refineries at Bahrain Island, Persian Gulf and Ras Tanura, Saudi Arabia.
2. Detailed pertinent instructions covering these lifts are incorporated in the letter from Commander Naval Forces, Far East, to the Ministry of Transportation, dated 29 July 1948, file CNPE/AA/US, Serial (2467).
3. The master of each vessel will be authorized to receipt for and accept the cargo in the name of Boeki Cho (Board of Trade) at point of loading for transfer of the same to the Petroleum Distribution Kodan upon return to Japan. A report shall be submitted to General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers within ten (10) days after discharge showing the total quantity receipted for and discharged.
4. Contracts for export will not be approved and export licenses will not be validated by the Japanese Government until that Government is assured that, in exchange for the goods exported, there will be paid into a SCAP Commercial Account the fair value of the merchandise in acceptable foreign exchange, at established prices, or such other compensation as may be specified in Trade Agreements duly approved by the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers.

6. The Japanese Government will cause the Seller to be paid in yen the fair value of the merchandise exported plus necessary expenses incidental thereto. The Japanese Government shall be responsible for determining that applicable price control laws and regulations are complied with.

7. Responsibility rests with the Seller to fulfill the terms of the export contract. Buyer and Seller may negotiate for the settlement of claims arising out of the contract, provided, however, that any settlement shall be subject to approval by the Japanese Government and the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers.

8. The Japanese Government will safeguard material designated by it as available for export until determination by Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers as to whether or not material shall be exported.

9. The Japanese Government will eliminate functions of Governmental Foreign Trade Kodans and reduce personnel of such Kodans to the extent that functions previously performed by them are restored to private Sellers and Buyers under this memorandum. On or before 31 August 1948, the Japanese Government will submit a plan to General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, for the abolition of the four existing Foreign Trade Kodans and the establishment in their place of two Foreign Trade Kodans, one for the purpose of handling imports by the Japanese Government and one for the purpose of handling exports by the Japanese Government.

MEMORANDUM FOR: JAPANESE GOVERNMENT

SUBJECT: Request for Location of Property of Elizabeth L. Alsberg

1. The Japanese Government is directed to investigate the whereabouts of subject personal property which was left in Japan in 1941.

2. Subject property was left in Japan when Elizabeth Alsberg (Mrs. Julius P. Alsberg) emigrated from Germany to the United States via Russia and Japan. The trunks were left in storage with K. K. Gebrueder Helm Shokai, 24 Yamashita-cho, Yokohama, Japan. In 1941 they were shipped aboard the Asama Maru for the United States, but this ship returned to Japan before docking in the United States. The property of Mrs. Alsberg was thereupon returned to storage in Yokohama.

3. A report of the findings will be made to General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers within thirty (30) days after receipt of this memorandum.
