MEMORANDUM FOR: JAPANESE GOVERNMENT

SUBJECT: Report of Joint Investigation Committee on Organizational Matters Within the Ministry of Communications.

1. This refers to letter from the Japanese Ministry of Communications to Civil Communications Section, General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, subject: Request for Report, dated 2 September 1948.
2. Forwarded herewith is one copy of Section One of the joint committee report regarding organizational requirements of the telecommunications system. This section of the report outlines the basic organization which was determined by the joint committee to be that most suitable for the proper functioning of the telecommunications system. It also covers the basis upon which these findings were based. Section Two of the report will be completed about 21 September 1948 and will be forwarded at that time. It will cover the development of the organization, described in Section One, into the subdivisions of organization considered necessary to carry out management and administrative functions.
3. Attention is called to that part of the Introduction to Section One which outlines the qualifications of the committee members and describes how the committee functioned. In view of the qualifications of this personnel, and considering the careful analysis upon which the final plan is based, it is urged that this report be considered carefully by those in the Japanese Government interested in the current reorganization problems associated with the telecommunications activities of the Ministry of Communications.
4. The report of studies of a similarly constituted committee made in connection with the organization of postal activities of the Ministry of Communications is now being compiled and will be forwarded direct to the Ministry of Communications at an early date. Similar careful consideration should be given to this report.
5. Direct communication between Civil Communications Section, General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers and the Ministry of Communications regarding matters within the scope of this memorandum is authorized.

SUBJECT: Application of Directives to Copyrights

1. Reference is made to the following memoranda for the Japanese Government from General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers:

- a. File AG 091.112 (13 Sep 45)MG, SCAPIN 26, 13 September 1945, subject, "Protection of Allied and Axis Property"
- b. File AG 130 (22 Sep 45)ESS, SCAPIN 45, 22 September 1945, subject, "Control of Financial Transactions"
- c. File AG 072 (10 Jun 47)CPC/FP, SCAPIN 1726, 10 June 1947, subject, "Application of Directives to Patents, Utility Models, Trade-marks, Designs and Copyrights."

2. Attention is directed to the fact that proper protection has not been afforded by the Japanese Government to copyrights owned on 7 December 1941 by Allied nationals as required by references 1a and 1c above. Infringements by Japanese publishers since 2 September 1945 of copyrights owned by British publishers and authors listed in Schedule "A" attached hereto have been reported to General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers. Said Schedule also sets forth the number of volumes of each book published, the retail sales catalogue price at which each was sold by the Japanese publishers and the amount of royalties, computed at ten percent (10%) of the total retail sales catalogue price, reputedly assessed and collected by the Japan Publishers Association.

3. The Japanese Government is directed to take all steps necessary to prevent the continuance of the copyright infringements set forth in paragraph 2 above.

4. The Japanese Government is further directed to order the Japan Publishers Association to deposit the royalties collected in the Custody Account of Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers in the Bank of Japan. In the event that the royalties collected do not equal ten percent (10%) of the retail sales catalogue price of the books published or sold, then an amount equal to the difference between ten percent (10%) and the royalties paid shall be collected from the publishers and deposited as aforesaid. Proper evidence of these deposits and a report of the action taken shall be furnished to General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers on or before 1 October 1948. These deposits of royalties

Number 2694 (SPB no. 884) subject as above, dated 26 July 1948, which indicated violations of the provisions of SCAFIN 1872 in that guards and firemen were being provided by the Japanese Government without being covered by proper procurement instruments.
2. Reports from Occupation Force Commands indicate that all guards and firemen employed by them are now covered by procurement instruments.
3. In the event any guards or firemen are subsequently provided by the Japanese government to the occupation forces without the issuance of proper procurement instruments, it is desired that an immediate report be made to the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers.
4. The attention of the Japanese government is directed to SCAFIN 1796 of 8 October 1947 which is not in conflict with SCAFIN 1872 of 31 March 1948, but emphasizes to the Japanese government its responsibility for providing adequate police protection to occupation force houses as well as houses of its nationals. The occupation forces demand that protection as a normal function of government without the issuance of procurement demands.

SUBJECT: Reorganization of Postal Activities in the Ministry of Communications

1. Reference is made to the following:

a. Letter from the Japanese Ministry of Communications to Civil Communications Section, General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, dated 2 September 1948, subject: Request for Report.

b. Memorandum for the Japanese Government, file AG 311.1 (2 Sep 48)CCS, SCAPIN 5985-A, dated 9 September 1948, subject: Report of Joint Investigation Committee on Organizational Matters Within the Ministry of Communications.

2. The memorandum cited in paragraph 1 b above, although pertaining primarily to the telecommunications system, indicates in its paragraph 4 that a report of studies in connection with postal activities would be forwarded at an early date. This memorandum is issued in lieu of such a report.

3. There has been no protracted joint committee investigation into the proposed reorganization of postal activities, such as has been under way in connection with the telecommunications activities of the Ministry of Communications. A committee was formed by this Ministry on 27 February 1947 to study the matter. Members of this committee met from time to time with authorized representatives of General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, and the problems of reorganization were discussed at length. It was found that whereas the organizational structure of the postal services in the main was considered to be sound, there had been a considerable departure during the war from procedures legally established before the war and still in effect today. Administrative responsibility, apparently assumed very largely by field bureau directors during the war emergency, should be returned to Ministry levels where such responsibility and authority still belong under law and regulations based thereon.

4. However, the two major unsolved problems affecting organization at Ministry levels which should be considered carefully and acted upon promptly are:

a. Separation of postal activities from all other activities now the responsibility of the Ministry of Communications, and the development of an organizational structure for handling the Postal, Postal Savings and Postal Life Insurance activities, as separate and distinct enterprises.

b. The formation of an independent Postal Inspection Department, directly under and reporting directly to the Minister of Postal Services, to handle service, criminal, and miscellaneous investigations. Its personnel would be obtained by transfer from the various postal enterprises, bureaus and other agencies each now carrying on a separate inspection service for its own activities. This matter will be discussed in more detail later in this memorandum.

5. The Ministry of Communications recently formed a committee to plan the reorganization called for by the contemplated separation of the postal and telecommunications enterprises of the present Ministry of Communications. As in all such matters, personnel of General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers have been available for advice and consultation. There have been several conferences between representatives of General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, and the Chairman of the committee of the Ministry of Communications concerning a suitable organization at Ministry level. The following represents the consensus of opinion of the conferees and is developed around the thought, expressed by high Ministry of Communications officials, that the postal services should be organized under a separate Ministry.

6. Separate Postal Service Ministry: The attached chart sets out the organizational structure considered essential at Ministry level for efficient operation of the postal services. The Chairman of the Ministry of Communications committee, referred to previously, advises that it meets with general agreement by the committee.

7. The Administrative Vice-Minister or Director General, should be a classified Government official and a postal career man. All personnel in the Ministry below that level should also be in the classified service.

8. Separation of administrative and operational functions of the postal services from other related activities under the present Ministry of Communications, and the formation of an independent Postal Inspection Department under the contemplated Postal Service Ministry, are, in actuality, the only major changes involved in the reorganization proposed herein for Postal Services. Such a reorganization can be accomplished under this plan with a minimum of dislocation of current

activities. Detailed comment on the Postal Inspection Department will be found under the succeeding sub-title.

9. Postal Inspection Department: A most urgently needed change in the interest of efficient, economical and dependable postal services is the formation of an independent inspection service responsible directly to the Minister through the Administrative Vice-Minister or Director General.

10. The present system of conducting inspections does not meet even minimum needs for (1) placing responsibility for theft and rifling of mail, or for other crimes committed by employees, (2) providing effective control over the use of personnel, and (3) keeping the Minister advised as to general conditions and needs of the service through a medium not under the influence of intermediate operating and administrative agencies.

11. By the formation of an independent inspection service, the Minister, through the Administrative Vice-Minister or Director General would be kept informed of conditions throughout the service and would be in a position to proceed in an orderly manner to eliminate any waste, extravagance and inefficiency, including the replacement of any incompetent officials or those who are unwilling to adopt progressive ideas in the interest of economy and efficiency. While extravagance must be eliminated in the interest of overall economy in Government, it should be borne in mind that the postal services are operated for service to the people and not for profit.

12. Importance of Postal Enterprises: The postal enterprises - Postal, Postal Savings and Postal Life Insurance - affect, directly or indirectly, the daily lives of all of the people of Japan. Failure to provide efficient and reliable postal facilities would contribute toward unrest, hamper the economic and social welfare of the people and encourage the development of undemocratic influences. It is definitely the Government's responsibility to provide such service and the people would inevitably hold their representatives in Government answerable for failure to do so. To illustrate briefly and in round figures the importance of the Postal Services, some 14,000 post offices provide the varied postal facilities so essential to the commercial and social welfare of the people; 90 million insurance policies totaling 70 billion yen protect the security and future of the masses; and 164 million savings accounts - more than 2 accounts for every man, woman and child - totaling 56 billion yen, serve as a curb to inflation and as a bulwark against want and disaster. No governmental activity is more important than these enterprises in meeting the needs of the people. The postal enterprises currently employ approximately 250,000 persons.

SUBJECT: Discussion of Highway Practice in the United States of America.

TO: Japanese Government

For the information of the Japanese Government there are attached two copies each of four lectures given at the American Road Builders Association "Road Show" held in Chicago, July 16-24, 1948. These lectures cover present day practices in the design, construction, and maintenance of highways and how the practices were developed. Historical trends and the evolution of highway systems and administrative organizations from early colonial times to the present day are presented as a background for a course in the construction and maintenance of highways. The importance of motor vehicle transportation to the economy of the United States is emphasized in the lectures and obvious parallels in the development of other countries are discussed.

The first lecture outlines the importance of the motor vehicle to the standard of living in the United States, both as a necessity and as a luxury, and the part that mechanical equipment has played in developing highway transport. It includes a summary of the development of transportation facilities in relation to growth of the country. The history of Federal aid for highway construction is developed, as is the growth of highway administrative organizations, including Federal, State, local and non-governmental bodies of present day importance in American highway practice. The development and present-day trends in highway financing are also presented. The objective is to give a general picture of highways in the United States as a background for the lectures to follow.

The second lecture deals with the planning of highway systems and improvement programs. Included is a brief history of the State-wide Highway Planning Surveys, what they include and why they are so essential as a tool for the highway administrator. The uses of planning information in the selection of highway systems and the development of standards for the design of highways are outlined as well as the methods used in the United States for determining

long-range programs of highway improvements to best provide for transportation needs.

The third lecture covers highway location and the structural design of the various elements of a complete highway. Subjects, such as aerial surveys, highway alignment, bridge location, plans, specifications for materials, design of pavements, soils stabilization and many others are considered.

The final lecture is devoted to the construction and maintenance of highways in the United States. Topics discussed include responsibility and authority of the engineer, the contract method of accomplishing work, selection of proper equipment by contractors for different kinds of work, efficient use of equipment and operations on various types of construction.

The discussion of highway maintenance covers the importance and magnitude of such work in the United States, the various agencies responsible for maintenance of different systems of highways and their organization, the extent of mechanization in this field, and methods used.

S.S. Kutsang, scheduled to arrive in Osaka on or about 10 October 1948. The "Kutsang" is owned by Messrs. Jardine, Matheson & Co., and their agents in Osaka are the Sugimura Soko. The Japanese Government will contact the agents one week before the scheduled arrival of the vessel, and make all arrangements necessary for the loading of the subject property, and to receive information as to the person designated to sign the receipt forms on behalf of the British Government.

4. The Japanese Government will designate the name of a representative authorized to execute the receipt forms in its behalf, and will notify General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, of his appointment.

5. The inclosed receipt forms, consisting of one original and five copies, are to be completed as to weights delivered, and are to be signed by the representatives of the British Government and the Japanese Government, and distributed as follows:

a. The original and one copy to be returned to General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, by the representative of the Japanese Government

b. Two copies to be retained by the British Government

c. Two copies to be retained by the Japanese Government
