SUBJECT: Application of Directives to Copyrights

1. Reference is made to the following memoranda for the Japanese Government from General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers:

- a. File AG 091.112 (13 Sep 45)MG, SCAPIN 26, 13 September 1945, subject, "Protection of Allied and Axis Property"
- b. File AG 130 (22 Sep 45)ESS, SCAPIN 45, 22 September 1945, subject, "Control of Financial Transactions"
- c. File AG 072 (10 Jun 47)CPC/FP, SCAPIN 1726, 10 June 1947, subject, "Application of Directives to Patents, Utility Models, Trademarks, Designs and Copyrights."

2. Attention is directed to the fact that proper protection has not been afforded by the Japanese Government to copyrights owned on 7 December 1941 by Allied nationals as required by references 1a and 1c above. Infringements by Japanese publishers since 2 September 1945 of copyrights owned by Allied national publishers and authors listed in Schedule "A" attached hereto have been reported to General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers.

3. The Japanese Government is directed to take all steps necessary to prevent the continuance of the copyright infringements set forth in paragraph 2 above.

4. The Japanese Government is further directed to submit on or before 15 October 1948 to General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, complete and accurate records of the number of volumes published and the retail sales catalogue price at which each was sold by the Japanese publishers mentioned in paragraph 2 above. Existing stocks of books listed in Schedule "A" may be sold or disposed of, but hereafter no foreign books shall be published without the prior permission of the copyright owner and General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers.

5. The Japanese Government is further directed to assess and collect from the Japanese publishers listed in Schedule "A" a royalty of not less than ten percent (10%) of the retail sales catalogue price of each book as published without copyright permission, and will deposit said royalties in the Custody Account of the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers in the Bank of Japan. Proper evidence of these deposits, and the method of computing same, shall be furnished to General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, on or before 15 October 1948. These deposits shall constitute tentative payment only, and shall not preclude the copyright owners listed in Schedule "A" from filing claims against the Japanese Government through such channels as may be established now or hereafter.

SUBJECT: Restitution of Paper Manufacturing Equipment Looted from Kwangtung Provincial Government Paper Manufacturing Plant

1. Reference is made to memorandum for the Japanese Government, file AG 004 (22 Jun 48)CPC/LP, SCAPIN 5599-A/1, 22 June 1948, subject, "Packing and Storage of Paper Manufacturing Equipment Looted from Kwangtung Provincial Government Paper Manufacturing Plant," from General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers.

2. The paper manufacturing equipment removed from the Kwangtung Provincial Government Paper Manufacturing Plant, Canton, China, which was installed at the Yufutsu Paper Mill of the Kokusaku Pulp Industry Company, Ltd., Yufutsu, Hokkaido, complete with parts, attachments and replacements, as indicated in the inclosed list, and such other looted items as are not included therein, but which have been identified as Chinese property and have been verified as such by the resident General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers representative during the dismantling and packaging, will be restored to the Government of the Republic of China.

3. The property, described in paragraph 2 above, will be stowed aboard the SS "Hai Lieh" at Muroran, Hokkaido, and restored to the Government of the Republic of China on or about 5 October 1948. Mr. P. Y. Chan has been designated by the Government of the Republic of China as the authorized representative to receive and give receipt for this property.

4. The Japanese Government will designate by name an authorized representative to execute the receipt forms in its behalf and to receive further instructions, as necessary, and will notify General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers of his appointment upon receipt of this memorandum.

5. The responsibilities of the Japanese Government for the dismantling, packaging, transfer, storage and delivery to the designated port in Japan and stowage on board the claimant nation's craft at that port are outlined in memorandum referred to in paragraph 1g of reference above.

2. SUBJECT: Repair and Refitting of the SS "Ming Sang"

1. Reference is made to memorandum to the Japanese Government, file AG 560 (31 Jan 48)CPC/FP, 31 January 1948, SCAPIN 5223-A, subject, "Refloating of the SS 'Ming Sang,'" from General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers.
2. Paragraph 2 of reference memorandum is rescinded, and the following is substituted therefor:

"The Japanese Government is directed to take immediate steps to refloat the British vessel, SS 'Ming Sang,' reported as sunk at 23° 57' 45" N and 130° 44' E, 6000 meters off Shirasu Lighthouse, bearing 251° true. After refloating, the vessel is to be towed to Kure, Honshu, Japan, and placed in drydock at the Harima Dockyard at Kure, where it is to be repaired and refitted in preparation for restitution to the British Government. After drydocking, the vessel is to be prepared for a marine survey, in order to determine the extent of the repairs required to place it in a condition substantially similar to that at the time it was acquired by the Japanese. Upon completion of the marine survey, specifications for the required work are to be drawn up and submitted to General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers."

MEMORANDUM FOR: JAPANESE GOVERNMENT

SUBJECT: "Sagami Maru" ex British Cargo Vessel SS "Josephine Moller"

1. Reference is made to the following:

a. Memorandum to the Japanese Government, file AG 560 (10 Jan 47) CPC/FP, 10 January 1947 (SCAPIN 1457), subject, "SS 'Sagami Maru,' ex British Cargo Vessel, SS 'Josephine Moller,' from General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers

b. Memorandum to the Japanese Government, file AG 560 (13 Jan 48) CPC/FP, 13 January 1948 (SCAPIN 1457/1), subject, same as reference la above, from General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers

c. Memorandum to the Japanese Government, file AG 560 (10 Jan 47) CPC/FP, 29 July 1948 (SCAPIN 1457/2), subject, same as reference la above, from General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers.

2. The "Sagami Maru" is scheduled to arrive at Yokohama from Nagasaki on or about 5 October 1948. The Japanese Government is directed to release the ship on 15 October 1948, from its present service as a cable layer under the supervision of the Ministry of Communications, and to have it moored at Yokohama in the protective custody of the General Maritime Bureau, pending further instructions as to its disposition from General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers. The vessel is to be preserved intact as a cable layer, protected from theft and damage, and maintained in a seaworthy condition.

3. It is further directed that upon arrival of the vessel at Yokohama, only the personal possessions of the crew, food supplies, submarine cables, and certain other used cables, reels and drums transported as cargo on the voyage from Nagasaki to Yokohama are to be removed.

4. It is understood that the Ministry of Communications also desires to remove from the vessel certain technical devices and instruments used in connection with cable laying operations, which are not an integral part of the vessel. A list of such items may be submitted for consideration, but are not to be removed without the specific written authority of General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers.

4. The Japanese Government is in no way relieved of its custodial responsibility to preserve and protect the remaining properties of the Rising Sun Petroleum Co., Ltd. which have not yet been restored.
5. Report of action taken will be submitted to General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers within thirty (30) days of date of this memorandum.

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

4. No films will be removed, transferred or released from this established storage location without the approval of General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers.
5. In accordance with the foregoing, the Japanese Government is directed to take physical custody of all illegally possessed films now stored in the vaults of the Central Motion Picture Exchange, Civil Information and Education Section, Kanosaka Building, Tokyo and remove them to the new place of storage not later than 1 November 1948. Prior to removal, the films will be inventoried and a receipt, in triplicate, furnished the Central Motion Picture
