2. The Japanese Government is directed to restore to the Government of the Republic of China books, pamphlets and periodicals, CPC Nos. 662 and 663, belonging to the Geological Survey of Kwangtung and Kwangsi, Canton, and now located at the National Library, Tokyo.

3. Subject property is to be packed for shipment as freight, transferred to Nagoya, delivered to the proper pier and stowed aboard the SS "Hai Liao" on or about 30 October 1948. Each box will be marked as indicated in inclosure 1.

4. Mr. Chen Shih-chin has been designated as the authorized representative of the Chinese Government to receive and give receipt for subject property.

5. The Japanese Government will designate by name an authorized representative to execute receipt forms in its behalf and will notify General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers of his appointment prior to 30 October 1948.

6. The inclosed receipt forms, consisting of one (1) original and five (5) copies, are to be signed by the authorized representatives of the Chinese Government and the Japanese Government, and will be distributed as follows:

a. Original and one (1) to be returned to General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers by the representative of the Japanese Government

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1. Reference is made to memorandum to the Japanese Government, file AG 564 (25 Apr 47)CPC/FP, SCAPIN 3688-A, 25 April 1947, subject, "Salvage, Repair and Refitting SS 'Talthybius' ex 'Taruyasu Maru,'" from General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers.

SUBJECT: Exempt Equipment in Reparations Installations

1. Effective 1 November 1948, all equipment from nonreparations sources, brought into a reparations installation subsequent to its evaluation during 1948 or later, will be considered exempt from reparations claim; such equipment may be marked "EX" by the owner without prior submission of documentary evidence to the Military Government for its approval, provided the procedure outlined in paragraph two, below, is followed.

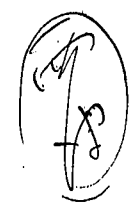

- b. Ameliorate the quality of the ration provided repatriates aboard the repatriation vessels and at the repatriation reception centers so as to provide a good representation of the more popular Japanese dishes.
- c. Insure that food is served repatriates in the most palatable manner possible.
- d. Insure that adequate matting and blankets are provided all repatriates.

5. Upon completion of packaging, the Japanese Government will submit, in sextuplicate, a list giving:

- a. Markings and contents of each box
- b. CPC No. of the property in each box
- c. Cubic measurements of each box
- d. Weight of each box.

6. The Japanese Government will designate by name, a representative to receive further instructions, as necessary, from the Civil Property Custodian and will notify General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers of his appointment within seven days from the date of this memorandum.

7. The subject property will be packaged by 30 December 1948. A memorandum directing movement of this property to designated ports and restitution thereat will be issued at a later date.

MEMORANDUM FOR: JAPANESE GOVERNMENT

SUBJECT: Establishment and Operation of Radiotelegraph Circuit
Between Osaka, Japan and Shanghai, China

1. Reference is made to memorandum for the Japanese Government, file AG 676.3 (27 May 47) CCS, SCAPIN 1707, dated 27 May 1947, subject: Establishment and Operation of Direct Telecommunications Circuits Between Tokyo and Manila, as amended.

2. It is directed that a radiotelegraph circuit be established and operated between Osaka, Japan and Shanghai, China, beginning at 0001 hours, 15 November 1948, in accordance with the provisions herein set forth.

3. The radio terminal in Japan will be operated by the Ministry of Communications on a forked circuit basis using the same transmitting frequencies authorized for use on the radiotelegraph circuit from Osaka to Hong Kong. The radio terminal in China will be under the control of the Chinese Ministry of Communications, which will coordinate the frequencies required for use from China to Japan.

4. Message classifications authorized between Japan and China are:

Full rate	NLT/DMT
CDE	Press
LC	Government

5. Rates for messages exchanged between Japan and China will be established in gold francs which will be converted into U. S. dollar currencies using a ratio of 3,061 gold francs equals one U. S. dollar (\$1.00). Based upon the foregoing, the gold franc rates together with the equivalent U. S. dollar rates per word for the classifications authorized, also the division of revenue between the Japanese Government and the Chinese administration, are shown in inclosure 1.

6. All classes of messages will be prepaid at the point of origin. Prepaid reply (RP) messages will not be admitted for the present. The provisions of SCAPIN 1707, pertaining to acceptance of and settlement for United States Government messages from Japan to the Philippines, will apply equally to the acceptance of and settlement for United States Government messages from Japan to China.

7. Currencies to be used for payment of charges for messages from Japan to China via the Osaka-Shanghai circuit will be United States Military Payment Certificates or Foreign Trade Payment Certificates.

8. Messages exchanged between Japan and China will be subject to all applicable censorship rules and regulations of General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers. Exceptions thereto will be only as specifically provided for by General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers.

9. Plain language messages from Japan to China are restricted to the following languages: Chinese, English, French, Japanese, Korean, Portuguese, Russian, Spanish.

10. The Chinese Mission in Japan agrees to designate a transfer agent in Japan to act for the Chinese Ministry of Communications in the manner indicated below.

11. The Japanese Ministry of Communications and the Chinese administration will keep full and complete records of all telegrams sent and received between Japan and China via the Osaka-Shanghai circuit, in the same manner as for other international radiotelegraph circuits. Monthly traffic and accounting statements for telegrams sent and received between Japan and China via the direct Osaka-Shanghai circuit may be exchanged directly between the Japanese Ministry of Communications and the Chinese transfer agent in Japan. The Japanese Government, Ministry of Communications, will submit traffic and accounting records pertaining to this circuit to General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, in the same manner required in the case of other international radiotelegraph circuits from Japan.

12. The Japanese Government, Ministry of Communications, will deposit monthly, not later than fifteen (15) days after the close of each calendar month, in an appropriate account designated by the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, all funds collected in Japan in payment of the charges for prepaid messages sent over this circuit from Japan, under authority contained in this memorandum.

13. Payment of balances due either administration will be accomplished on a quarterly basis and will consist of the United States dollar equivalent of the gold franc net amount, including any necessary adjustments, due either administration for the preceding quarter.

14. In the event revenue due to the Chinese administration is not offset by revenue accruing to Japan from charges collected in China, balances due to the Chinese administration will be paid to the Chinese administration through the Chinese transfer agent by General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers from deposits made in accordance with paragraph 12 above.

Balances in favor of the Japanese Government, Ministry of Communications will be deposited by the Chinese administration or its representative in an appropriate account to be designated by the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers.

15. Direct communication between the Civil Communications Section, and other Staff sections of General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers and the Ministry of Communications, regarding operating, accounting, and settlement procedures within the scope of this memorandum, is authorized.

SUBJECT: Operation of Great Northern Telegraph Company Cable Station and Facilities at Nagasaki

1. Reference is made to:

a. Memorandum for Japanese Government, file AG 676.3 (3 Nov 47) CCS, SCAPIN 1811, dated 3 November 1947, subject same as above.

b. Memorandum for Japanese Government, file AG 311 (9 Sep 47) CCS, SCAPIN 1771, dated 9 September 1947, subject: Relaxation of International Telecommunications Restrictions, as amended.

c. Memorandum from Japanese Government, file C.L.C.O. No. 3593 (2p), dated 18 October 1948, subject: Application for Approval of Agreement between the Ministry of Communications and the Great Northern Telegraph Company.

2. The agreement accompanying memorandum of reference 1c above is approved.

3. Effective upon receipt of this memorandum, the Ministry of Communications is authorized to send traffic originating in Japan and to receive traffic terminal to Japan, between Japan and the service areas of the Great Northern Telegraph Company shown in inclosure 1. Such traffic will circulate over the Great Northern Telegraph Company's submarine cables connecting Nagasaki with Vladivostok and will consist of the following classifications:

- a. Full rate (Ordinary).
- b. LC (Deferred).
- c. NLT or DLT (Letter Telegrams).
- d. CDE (Code).
- e. Press.
- f. Government.

Administrative routine service messages and paid service notices concerning traffic sent and received over the Great Northern Telegraph Company cables also are authorized.
