MEMORANDUM FOR: JAPANESE GOVERNMENT

SUBJECT: Interpretation and Implementation of Policy Concerning the Elimination of Control Associations

1. Reference the following memoranda for the Japanese Government from General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers:

a. AG 080 (6 Aug 46) ESS/AC, (SCAPIN 1108), 6 August 1946, subject: Dissolution of Control Associations (Tosei Kai) and Authorization to Establish Government Allocation Agency together with Necessary Control Organs within Specific Industries.

b. AG 400 (11 Dec 46) ESS/AC, (SCAPIN 1394), 11 December 1946, subject: Methods of Control under the Temporary Demand and Supply Adjustment Act.

2. In the implementation of reference memoranda paragraph 1a and 1b, above, the Japanese Government is directed to conform to the following interpretations:

a. The term "control association" shall be construed to mean any company, association or other type of organization (whether or not the name of such organization contains the words "tosei kai," "tosei kumiai," "tosei kaisha" or any other words indicating control) which exercises any of the following control functions:

- (1) Compelling, by any means, other individuals or companies in a given industry or trade to:
  - (a) Be members of its organization.
  - (b) Pay dues or fees.
  - (c) Adhere to a given set of rules of trade.
- (2) Controlling the distribution or sale of any materials or product (other than its own) by means of any of the following:
  - (a) Exclusive right of purchase or sale.
  - (b) Mandatory inspection.

- (c) Preparation of schedules of allocation, rationing or other distribution.
- (d) Extension of credit or credit guarantees to its members.

3. In the implementation of reference memoranda paragraph 1a and b, above, the following procedure will be used:

a. The Japanese Government will issue instructions to the Prefectural Governors of the substance and interpretation of these directives and instruct each Prefectural Governor to take steps immediately to prepare two (2) lists (in Romaji and English) of control associations operating in his prefecture as follows:

- (1) All control associations which perform operating functions such as warehousing, manufacturing or processing.
- (2) All other control associations.

b. These lists will include, but not be limited to, the following organizations:

- (1) Organizations originally formed under the "Important Industrial Enterprises Organization Law" (Juyo Sangyo Ontai Rei); "Controlling Company Ordinances" (Tosei Kaisha Rei); and the "Commercial and Industrial Organization Law" (Shoko Kumiai Ho), where such organizations include the word "control" (tosei) in their name. This applies whether or not the organization has since been reorganized.

c. Agencies or corporations wholly-owned by the Japanese Government should be excepted from the lists.

d. These lists will be submitted to the Prefectural Military Government Team within sixty (60) days of the date of this memorandum.

4. The Japanese Government is hereby informed that after appropriate review these lists will be returned to the Japanese Government with instructions for dissolution or other action re each organization on the list.

5. The Prefectural Governors will be instructed to furnish the Prefectural Military Government Team, upon request, information regarding the progress of actions taken in accordance with this memorandum.

3. The subject property will be properly dismantled and packed for shipment as directed in reference 1e above and will be transferred from the Omuta Works of the Toyo High Pressure Industry K.K. to adequate warehouses at Miiki Port, Omuta City. The transfer of the subject property to Miiki Port, Omuta City, will be completed by 10 March 1948.

4. The responsibilities of the Japanese Government for the dismantling, packaging, transfer, storage and delivery to the designated port in Japan and stowage on board the claimant nation's craft at that port are outlined in reference 1h above.

5. Mr. Allan Po Lu has been designated by the Government of the Republic of China as the authorized representative to receive and give receipt for the subject property.

6. The Japanese Government will designate by name an authorized representative to execute the receipt forms in its behalf and will notify General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, Civil Property Custodian of his appointment. This representative will report to the Civil Property Custodian for instructions on or before 5 March 1948.

7. The subject property will be restored to the Government of the Republic of China in various installments as shipping space becomes available. The representative of the Japanese Government will be informed of the items which will comprise each shipment and the date of restitution thereof, and will receive the necessary receipt forms from the Civil Property Custodian. Seperate receipt forms will be signed for each shipment.

To: Japanese Government

1. The French Mission in Japan has requested the  
Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers to transmit an  
invitation from the French Government to the Japanese  
Government to participate in the Seventh International  
Congress of Agricultural Industries which will be held  
in Paris from July 12-18, 1948. The Congress is organ-  
ized by the French Ministry of Agriculture, according  
to a technical program agreed upon by the International  
Commission of Agricultural Industries. The French  
Mission has also requested that the Supreme Commander  
forward the technical program for the Congress. A copy  
is therefore attached to this letter.

2. The request that the invitation be conveyed to  
the Japanese Government has been carefully considered.  
However, in view of the fact that the Far Eastern Com-  
mission has not adopted an agreed policy on the question  
of participation by the Japanese Government in interna-  
tional conferences, it would appear that this Headquarters  
is not in a position to permit the Japanese Government to  
accept an invitation of the kind under discussion.

1. The Secretary-General of the United Nations has requested that the following matter be brought to the attention of the appropriate authorities in Japan.

2. According to a communication from the Peruvian Government dated 23 October 1947, cocaine hydrochloride, which has hitherto been manufactured in Peru for domestic consumption only, will be manufactured for export in 1948. The manufacture is intended to be carried out through the Ministry of Public Health or an authorized government agency.

3. In July 1946 the XVth General Assembly of the International Institute of Agriculture decided the dissolution of the Institute set up by the International Convention of June 7, 1905 and of its subordinate organization the International Forestry Centre. These two institutions have been taken over by the Food and Agriculture Organization of the United Nations (F.A.O.).

A liquidation commission was instructed to collect the sums due to the two Institutions and to pay the personnel the amounts allocated by the last General Assembly.

The assets consist solely of the contributions paid by the Member States, and these in some cases have not yet been fully paid up.

Japan is one of the countries which are still debtors of the Institute.

The following is the statement of the amount owed by Japan:

- (1) Quota due to the International Institute of Agriculture, 1943 to 1946.....Swiss francs 370,816

I would be most grateful if you would kindly let me know if you think it will be possible to have this sum paid into the account of the International Institute of Agriculture at the Credit Suisse in Zurich.

I take the liberty of stressing the urgent necessity of settling the debt at the earliest possible moment. In effect, the liquidation commission has been sitting for practically a year and is awaiting the final payments of the back quotas in order to wind up its affairs.

Since these monies are required primarily to assure a pension to the many members of the personnel of the I.I.A. retired after long years of loyal service, I feel sure that you will give special attention to the matter.

Your letter of July 4, 1947 addressed to the "Chief of the Allied Control Commission" requesting payment of 370,816 Swiss francs due from Japan to the International Institute of Agriculture for the years 1943 to 1946 has been received by this office.

While appreciating the cogency of the reasons for liquidation of sums due to the Institute in connection with its approaching incorporation into the Food and Agriculture Organization of the United Nations, it is regretted that Japan has no foreign exchange assets available for making the payment requested, nor can external assets be utilized to satisfy any claims pending general decision as to their disposition. In the circumstances the settlement of the claim must necessarily be held in abeyance until such time as payment becomes possible.

2. The Japanese Government will be prepared to submit to the Supreme Commander upon request, the following data:

- a. A list including statistical details of economic control plans and measures taken
- b. A list of industrial plants, other than war materials plants as defined in General Directive No. 1, showing location, ownership, products being or to be produced, condition of plant, present and planned capacity, capital equipment and stocks of raw materials, finished goods and goods in process
- c. Quantities of industrial and agricultural products available in each prefecture for civilian consumption with a compilation by month for twelve months of future estimated needs, matched against the planned productivity of the commodities
- d. Estimates of raw materials available per month over a twelve month period

3. The Japanese Government will initiate, maintain and enforce production and other economic programs that serve the following purposes:

- a. The avoidance of acute economic distress;
- b. The assurance of a just and impartial distribution of available supplies;
- c. Compliance with the requirements of reparations and deliveries agreed upon by the Allied Governments;

  - b. The manufacture of soap, insecticides, fungicides, medical, dental and sanitation supplies;
  - c. The production of coal, charcoal and other solid fuels and crude petroleum;
  - d. The production of fertilizer;
  - e. The production of clothing, footwear and other textiles for domestic consumption;
  - f. The production of cement, timber, asphalt and ceramics required for emergency constructions and repair;
  - g. The production of items required for the operation, maintenance and repair of rail and road transportation and of coastal water transportation within the limitation of directives from the Supreme Commander;
  - h. The production of items required for the operation, maintenance and repair of public utilities and communications facilities within Japan; and,

SUBJECT: Gold Necklace Removed from the Netherlands East Indies

1. The Japanese Government is directed to plan and execute a program for reorganization of work schedules of Railway Mail Service employees assigned to duty on railroad trains in order to accomplish the following objectives:

a. Assignment of employees to regular duty on one line and in one set of trains, except for helper assignments and in cases where train runs are less than two hours in length.

b. Designation of terminals of train runs as official domiciles of employees, except for those assigned to duty on intermediate sections of trunk lines.

c. Reduction of personnel and fixed personnel quotas in amounts equal to savings made by discontinuance of dead-heading between domiciles and terminals of runs. Reduction is to be made by attrition and not by discharge of employees.

d. Elimination of excessive lay-over time at outer terminals of runs by returning employees to initial terminals on first trains available after suitable rest periods.

2. This directive is issued for the purpose of increasing the efficiency of the Railway Mail Service by eliminating rotation of employees on different lines and trains, and effecting economies by eliminating excessive dead-heading of employees while on duty and reducing amount of travel allowances paid. It is not to be construed as authorizing action beyond the scope of these general purposes.

3. Progress on the program is to be reported monthly by the Minister of Communications to the Civil Communications Section, General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers and the program is to be completed by 1 August 1948.

4. Direct communication between the Civil Communications Section, General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers and the Ministry of Communications is authorized concerning technical matters within the scope of this memorandum.
