4. Supplemental allocation notices covering additional allocations will be issued later under separate allocation notice numbers.

SUBJECT: Radio and Ionosphere Observations During Annular  
Solar Eclipse 8-9 May 1948

1. Reference is made to Memorandum for the Japanese Government, file  
AG 876.3 (10 Oct 45) CCS, SCAPIN 118, dated 10 October 1945, subject:  
Continuation of Ionosphere Measurements and Associated Research in Japan.

2. The proposal prepared by the Japanese Ministry of Communications  
as submitted informally to the Civil Communications Section, General Head-  
quarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, covering measurements  
to be made on a single hop oblique incidence radio path during the forth-  
coming annular solar eclipse, is approved.

3. The proposed plan is approved as a joint project which will be  
conducted outside the boundaries of Japa. due to the geographical limi-  
tations of the eclipse, through the cooperation of the United States Army  
and the Radio Wave Research Laboratory, Chungking, China.

4. The responsibilities of the Japanese Ministry of Communications  
in this project, in coordination with the occupation authorities are as  
follows:

a. Preparation of all necessary field strength measuring equipment  
and associated apparatus, exclusive of antennae materials, for the purpose  
of making the required ionospheric measurements.

b. Surveying of equipment site in Okinawa for determination of  
installation requirements.

c. Installation of all necessary equipment, exclusive of antennae.

d. Provision of the necessary qualified technical staff for in-  
stallation and observations.

e. Preparation and correlation of technical data obtained.

5. The occupation authorities will provide for:

a. Transportation to and from Okinawa for personnel and equipment.

b. Logistic support in Okinawa for Japanese personnel.

c. Coordination with the Radio Wave Research Laboratory, Chungking, China, in the matter of transmitting the required radio signals and making the required ionosphere height measurements.

6. A qualified Japanese representative will be made available for air transport to Okinawa on or about 30 March 1948 to conduct a preliminary survey. A staff of five (5) technicians, to be specified by the Ministry of Communications as qualified individuals for this project, will be made available for transportation by air from the Tokyo area to Okinawa on or about 20 April 1948 for the purpose of making, in Okinawa, the necessary installations, and of proceeding with the actual ionospheric measurements during the eclipse. They will be returned to Japan, by the occupation authorities, immediately upon completion of the project.

7. All necessary field strength measuring equipment, with the exception of the antennae or antennae materials, will be made ready for air transport to Okinawa by 15 April. The determination of the exact equipment requirements will be made during the preliminary survey covered in paragraph 6 above.

8. The cost of the project, except for logistic support covered in paragraph 5, is to be borne by the Japanese government and in no way will it be chargeable to termination of war expense or to occupation costs.

9. Direct communication between interested Staff Sections, General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers and the Japanese Ministry of Communications within the scope of this memorandum is authorized.

MEMORANDUM FOR: JAPANESE GOVERNMENT

SUBJECT: Expenditures from Funds Appropriated for Occupation Force Requirements.

1. Rescission. Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers Memorandum for Japanese Government, AG 400.12 (27 Aug 46)GD, SCAPIN 1160, subject "Procurement Demand Procedure", dated 27 August 1946 is rescinded.
2. It is the purpose of this memorandum to define and limit the instruments which constitute authority to expend funds appropriated by the Japanese Government to meet the requirements for support of the Occupation Forces as differentiated from those funds appropriated to meet requirements for compliance with directives issued by the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers for the benefit of the Japanese people, to carry out the terms of surrender, or to otherwise accomplish the purpose of the occupation.
3. Requirements for support of the Occupation Forces are transmitted to the Japanese Government by means of "Procurement Instrument", which, when applicable, include items mutually beneficial to the Japanese people and the Occupation Forces. The term "Procurement Instrument", as used herein refers to any one of the following three instruments only and does not refer to "SCAPINS", "Letter Directives", or "Work Orders":
  - a. Procurement Demand, GFA Form 1. The Eighth United States Army is the only authorized agency to issue these demands. The method of issue is as prescribed by the Commanding General, Eighth Army. Except for limited purposes as defined in sub-paragraphs b and c below, the Procurement Demand, GFA Form 1, is the only instrument authorized for procurement of real estate, construction, rehabilitation, maintenance, equipment, services, supplies, or any other requirement for the support of the Occupation Forces. Acknowledgment of accomplishment of Procurement Demands (GFA Form 1), in whole or in part, is indicated by receipt on GFA Form 2.
  - b. Communications Order, GFA Form 8. This is a special form of Procurement Instrument served on the Japanese Government through the Japanese Bureau or Ministry of Communications through the

SUBJECT: British Armed Forces Special Vouchers

1. Reference Memorandum for the Japanese Government from General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, AG 123.7(5 May 47)ESS/FI, (SCAPIN 1656), 5 May 1947, subject: British Armed Forces Special Vouchers.
2. A second series of British Armed Forces Special Vouchers, in denominations of two shillings and sixpence (2/6), is now in circulation in areas and among personnel authorized to be in possession of such vouchers.
3. These new British Armed Forces Special Vouchers are mainly plum colored with some green and orange. Both the front and back sides are similarly colored. The vouchers all have a vertical line running the complete depth of the note visible only when held to the light. This line is approximately one inch from the left edge viewed through the face.

designated Signal representative of the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers or Commanding General, Eighth Army, for the procurement of communications services, materials, equipment, technical personnel and construction incident to installation, maintenance or operation of communications equipment. It will not be used for construction, maintenance or acquisition of buildings, real estate (except cable or wire right of ways), water, heat, power or sewage, as such. Acknowledgment of accomplishment of Communications Orders (GPA Form 8), in whole or in part, is indicated by receipt on GPA Form 5.

c. Labor Requisition, Labor Form 1. This is a special form of Procurement Instrument for labor required by the Occupation Forces, but not included in requirements stated in Procurement Instruments, GPA Forms 1 and 8. The Eighth United States Army is the only authorized agency to issue these requisitions. The method of issue is as prescribed by the Commanding General, Eighth Army. Acknowledgment of accomplishment of Labor Requisition (Labor Form 1), in whole or in part, is indicated by certification of Unit Labor Officer.

4. Procurement of utilities, services, and maintenance, and plant or operating facilities necessary to provide utilities or services as demanded will be accomplished as follows:

a. Utilities and Services.

- (1) Procurement Instrument and receipts for utilities or services, including public carrier and communications services, will be executed for only the utility or service.
- (2) The acquisition of special or additional plant, equipment, and real estate, and the construction or rehabilitation and maintenance of structure and equipment as may be required in connection with a service or utility furnished by the Japanese Government to meet a requirement for the Occupation Forces will be covered by separate and specific procurement instruments. (See sub-paragraph (3) below).
- (3) Procurement instruments issued under the provisions of paragraph 4a (2) above are only issued to the extent that the existing facilities, which are available to the agent of the Japanese Government, are inadequate to provide the utilities or services required.

b. Maintenance.

All maintenance of equipment, structure, roads and other facilities performed by the Japanese Government in response to an Occupation Force requirement will be covered by a specific procurement instrument (GPA Form #1 or GPA Form 8) or by properly executed work orders issued against an appropriate procurement instrument, approved and issued for a specific facility, area or service. Acknowledgment of accomplishment of maintenance will be made on GPA Form 2 or GPA Form 5, as appropriate.

5. Instructions which are not to be considered "Procurement Instruments", though relating to procurement for support of the Occupation Forces, include the following:

a. MEMORANDUM FOR JAPANESE GOVERNMENT (SCAPIN). In those cases where SCAPINS direct procurement for the support of the Occupation Forces, they are followed by procurement instruments covering such procurement. For those cases where SCAPINS do not direct procurement for the support of the Occupation Forces, see paragraph 8 below.

b. LETTER DIRECTIVES issued by Commanding General, Eighth United States Army. Such letters are applicatory to procurement instruments issued, or to be issued, and include the following:

- (1) Directions for advance procurement of materials and equipment required for all maintenance and for the construction of dependent housing projects.
- (2) Authorization for advance payments to contractors up to 30% of total estimated cost of contract price.
- (3) Acknowledgment of accomplishment of directions or authorizations included in 5b (1) and (2) above, will be as directed by the Commanding General, Eighth United States Army.

c. WORK ORDERS. Work orders are applicatory to a specific procurement instrument. Receipts for work orders are accomplished by full receipts or partial receipts on GPA Form 2, GPA Form 5 or labor form which covers the procurement instrument under which the work order was issued.

6. Effective as specified below, no payments may be made from Japanese Government funds appropriated to meet the requirements for support of the Occupation Forces, except when those requirements are covered by one of the three procurement instruments specified in paragraph 3 above, or by one of the letter directives described

in paragraph 5b (1) and 5b (2) above, and then only to the extent that accomplishment of such procurement has been acknowledged, as provided in paragraph 3a, 3b, 3c and 5b (3) above, for those instruments.

a. Effective 15 April 1948 provisions of this paragraph are applicable to all procurement accomplished after that date, but do not apply to procurement previously accomplished for which payment has not yet been made.

b. Effective 1 July 1948 provisions of this paragraph are applicable to all procurement, regardless of date of accomplishment.

c. Nothing included herein will be interpreted as affecting yen funding arrangements.

7. In all cases of deviation from the above procedures, immediate report will be rendered to the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers. A full report, listing all pertinent details, will be rendered as soon as the facts are available. A copy of each immediate report and each full report will be rendered the Commanding General, Eighth United States Army.

8. Directives issued by the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers for accomplishment of work or projects which are for the benefit of the Japanese people, or to carry out the terms of surrender, or to otherwise accomplish the purposes of the Occupation, are or will be issued in the form of memoranda to the Japanese Government (SCAPINS). The implementation of these directives will be under the surveillance of Occupation Forces and Military Government agencies charged with such surveillance by the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers. No form of procurement instrument will be issued to cover these requirements and receipts will not be given for supplies or services necessary for their accomplishment. Payments will not be made from Japanese Government funds pursuant to directives from the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, unless such payments are fully justified by the provisions of the original SCAPIN, by implementing instructions issued by those Occupation Force agencies charged with surveillance or by a plan submitted by the Japanese Government and approved by the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers.

9. The Commanding General, Eighth United States Army, or his designated representative, has been designated as the Occupation Force agency to make periodic examination of Japanese expenditures to ensure compliance with the provisions of this memorandum.

1. Reference is made to memoranda for the Japanese Government as follows:
  - a. File AG 311.23 (10 Aug 47)CCS SCAFIN 1759, dated 10 August 1947, subject: Expansion of Radiotelegraph Service via the United States, as amended.
  - b. File AG 311.22 (29 Sep 47)CCS SCAFIN 1786, dated 29 September 1947, subject: Provision of Payment for International Messages Filed by Boeki Cho (Japanese Board of Trade).
  - c. File AG 311.23 (12 Nov 47)CCS SCAFIN 1818, dated 12 November 1947, subject: Expansion of Radiotelegraph Prepaid Reply (RP) Service.
2. Effective 5 April 1948 the Japanese Government is authorized to expand radiotelegraph service via the United States to include private, press, and government messages between Japan and the points listed in inclosure 1.
3. Prepaid reply (RP) message service applicable to messages exchanged between Japan and the United States, as amended by SCAFIN 1818, is authorized between Japan and any point listed in inclosure 1 accepting this type of service.
4. Press messages and government messages, except United States Government messages from Japan to the points listed in inclosure 1, will be sent from Japan on a receiver-to-pay basis. The concurrence of the connecting telegraph administration must be obtained prior to the transmission of such messages. Press messages and government messages, including United States Government messages from the points listed in inclosure 1 to Japan, must be prepaid.
5. United States Government messages from Japan to the points listed in inclosure 1 will be handled in the same manner as United States Government messages from Japan to the United States. Revenue accruing to the Japanese Administration derived from exchange of government messages, except United States Government messages, between Japan and the points listed in inclosure 1 will be the same as for private messages of the classifications in which such government messages are handled.
6. Classifications of private messages authorized between Japan and the points listed in inclosure 1 admitting these classes are Full Rate, LC, CDE, and NLT or DLT.

7. Messages from Japan circulating via the United States to any of the points listed in inclosure 1 will be handled in accordance with existing traffic distribution practices.
8. Private messages in any of the classifications shown in paragraph 6 above may be sent from Japan to any organization or person in the points listed in inclosure 1, by any organization or person authorized to possess and use United States Military Payment Certificates or Foreign Trade Payment Certificates, by the organization or person in Japan specifically named in a prepaid reply (RP) voucher, and by Boeki Cho, under the special arrangements set forth in SCAFIN 1786.
9. Private messages from any organization or person in the points listed in inclosure 1 may be sent to any organization or person in Japan.
10. Private messages between the points listed in inclosure 1 and Japan will be subject to all applicable censorship rules and regulations. Exceptions will be as specifically provided for by General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers.
11. Table of charges showing through rates and division of revenue between the Japanese Government and the American carriers for full rate messages is shown in inclosure 1. Rates for CDE, LC and NLT/DLT classifications are proportionate and will be 60%, 50% and 33-1/3% respectively, of the charges per full rate word.
12. Direct communication between the Civil Communications Section, General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, and the Ministry of Communications, regarding operating and accounting procedures within the scope of this memorandum is authorized.

SUBJECT: Establishment and Operation of a Direct Radiotelegraph Circuit Between Tokyo, Japan, and Batavia, Netherlands East Indies

1. Reference is made to:
  - a. Memorandum for the Japanese Government, file AG 676.3 (31 Mar 47) CCS SCAPIN 1591, dated 31 March 1947, subject same as above, as amended.
  - b. Memorandum for the Japanese Government, file AG 311.22 (29 Sep 47) CCS SCAPIN 1786, dated 29 September 1947, subject: Provision of Payment for International Messages Filed by Boeki Cho (Japanese Board of Trade).
2. Effective 5 April 1948 radiotelegraph service between Japan and the Netherlands East Indies will include Government, press and private messages.
3. Press and private messages will be handled at sender's risk.
4. Private messages with prepaid reply will be admitted between Japan and the Netherlands East Indies and the particulars thereof will be handled in accordance with the provisions of the International Telegraph Regulations (Cairc 1938), Article 56, paragraphs 462 to 469 inclusive, except that:
  - a. No refund of an unused portion of a prepayment will be made unless such portion amounts to at least fifty cents (\$.50).
  - b. Prepaid reply amounts will be expressed and signalled in gold francs in both directions. Conversion of prepaid reply amounts on inward messages from gold francs into dollar amounts and prepaid reply dollar amounts on outward messages into gold francs will be accomplished by using a conversion ratio of three (3) gold francs equals one (1) dollar. Conversion of gold francs into dollar amounts and vice versa will be the responsibility of the Ministry of Communications.
5. All classifications of messages from the Netherlands East Indies to Japan will be prepaid.
6. All classifications of messages from Japan to the Netherlands East Indies will be sent prepaid with the following exception:

- a. Private messages may be sent from Japan on a receiver to pay basis in cases where arrangements for such handling have been specifically approved by the Netherlands East Indies telegraph administration.
7. The Ministry of Communications will receive applications for receiver to pay privileges directly from the applicants thereof.
8. The Ministry of Communications will supply all necessary information required by the Netherlands East Indies telegraph administration in connection with the handling of receiver to pay messages and obtain the approval of the Netherlands East Indies telegraph administration prior to transmission of such messages.
9. Only United States Military Payment Certificates, Foreign Trade Payment Certificates or prepaid reply vouchers will be accepted in payment of the charges for prepaid messages from Japan to the Netherlands East Indies.
10. Message classifications, rates and division of revenue between the Japanese Government, Ministry of Communications and the Netherlands East Indies telegraph administration are shown in inclosure 1.
11. Messages exchanged between Japan and the Netherlands East Indies will be subject to all applicable censorship rules and regulations. Exceptions thereto will be specifically provided for by General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers.
12. The Ministry of Communications and the Netherlands East Indies telegraph administration will keep full and complete records of all telegrams sent and received between Japan and the Netherlands East Indies, in the same manner as those required to be kept for other international radiotelegraph circuits and will exchange such statements, or telegrams in lieu thereof, on a monthly basis, through the Netherlands Transfer Agent, Tokyo, showing revenue due to the Japanese administration and to the Netherlands East Indies telegraph administration. Such statements for the period beginning 1 April 1947 and ending 31 December 1947 will be submitted within sixty (60) days from the effective date of this memorandum. Payment of balances due either administration will be accomplished on a quarterly basis and will reflect the net amount due either administration for the preceding quarter including any necessary adjustments.
13. The Ministry of Communications will submit traffic revenue reports to Civil Communications Section, General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, covering message traffic exchanged between Japan and the Netherlands East Indies, similar to those required for other international radiotelegraph circuits from Japan.

17. Paragraphs 3, 4 and 5 of SCAPIN 1591 are rescinded as of the effective date of this memorandum.

18. Direct communication between the Civil Communications Section, General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers and the Ministry of Communications regarding operating, accounting and settlement procedures within the scope of this memorandum, is authorized.
