SUBJECT: Release of Imported Foods for Distribution in April 1948

1. References are:

c. To act on behalf of Schmidt Shoten Ltd. and effect a rescission of the lease by mutual consent of the parties;

d. Notify the petitioners referred to in 1a and 1b, and all occupants of the building of the action directed by this memorandum.

MEMORANDUM FOR: JAPANESE GOVERNMENT

SUBJECT: Radioteletype Tests on International Radiotelegraph Circuits

1. Informal discussions between Ministry of Communications officials and the Civil Communications Section, General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, have indicated the desirability of conducting radioteletype transmission and reception tests on existing commercial circuits. Willingness to conduct tests of this nature has been expressed by the Ministry of Communications.

2. Tests of the nature stated in paragraph 1 above are authorized under the following stipulations:

a. The tests are authorized with the object of determining whether present Japanese radio terminal and associated equipment are adequate for overseas radioteletype operations.

b. The Ministry of Communications will prepare a complete plan of the tests and will submit same to the Civil Communications Section, General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers for approval and for coordination with designated circuit terminals in foreign countries.

c. The United States Army will make available a certain amount of teletype equipment to be used under the general supervision of United States Army personnel to insure safekeeping and protection thereof. The period of use of this equipment may not exceed six (6) months from the date these tests begin.

d. Some technical assistance from United States Army communications personnel may be available to aid in an expeditious and efficient handling of the project.

e. Installation, operation, and maintenance of the equipment involved in the tests are the responsibilities of the Ministry of Communications with such assistance from the Eighth Army as the latter may consider practicable and necessary.

f. These tests will be conducted during such periods when the circuits are clear of paid traffic. Under no circumstances will paid traffic be handled on the equipment used for the tests. Care will be exercised to insure that the movement of paid traffic on the regular traffic circuits is neither impeded nor interrupted.

g. The expenses involved in the tests will be borne by the Ministry of Communications and will not be chargeable to termination of war expenses or otherwise to the occupation forces.

h. At the completion of the tests the United States Army equipment will be returned immediately to the issuing authority.

i. A complete report of the results of the tests will be submitted to Civil Communications Section, General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers within ten (10) days after completion.

3. Direct communication between the Civil Communications Section, General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers and the Ministry of Communications within the scope of this memorandum is authorized.

4. The procedures outlined and specifications used in Annex 4, 5, 6, and 7 of reference 1f above will be followed when dismantling, disassembling, cleaning, preserving, inner packaging, constructing exterior wooden shipping containers, marking, and preparing of packing lists. The responsibilities of the Japanese Government for packaging, transfer and delivery of the subject property, are defined in reference 1g above.

5. The dismantling and packaging of the equipment will be done simultaneously by four groups working in the following departments:

- a. Power plant;
- b. Paper machine department;
- c. Digester and acid department;
- d. Other departments.

6. A resident engineer of the recipient nation will be present to observe the removal operations in an advisory capacity. Preparations will be made immediately for the preserving, dismantling, disassembling and packaging of the subject equipment; however, preserving and other operations will not begin until the resident engineer has arrived at the plant site. Coordinating functions will be performed by the local Civil Property Custodian representative.

7. The Japanese Government will designate by name a representative to receive further instructions, as necessary, from the Civil Property Custodian, and will notify General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, Civil Property Custodian, of his appointment within five days from date of this memorandum.

8. The subject property will be restored to the Government of the Republic of China at Muroran, Hokkaido. After the equipment has been dismantled and packaged it will be stored in adequate warehousing at Muroran.

9. The property will be packaged and ready for restitution by 30 September 1948. A memorandum directing restitution will be issued at a later date.

2. In order to effect closer cooperation and coordination between Japanese Governmental agencies and Occupation agencies involved in the removal of reparations equipment, it is desired that the following division of responsibilities be as indicated:

a. The Reparations Board will be responsible for the overall coordination and planning for the Japanese Government of all removals of reparations equipment and for the establishment of policies relating to such removals.

b. The Special Procurement Board will be responsible for the contracting of services necessary to effect removals of reparations equipment, for the furnishing of adequate materials and special equipment to successful contractors, and for the payment of all expenditures incurred in such removals. This responsibility will include the issuance of bid invitations, prequalification of contractors within established standards, awarding of contracts, issuance of bid abstracts and execution of contracts. The Special Procurement Board will be further responsible for the processing of special reports as required pertaining to the status of reparation removals.

c. The Japanese Government ministry directly concerned with the removal of any specific reparations plant or equipment will be responsible for maintaining and effecting custody of such plants and equipment; reviewing and making recommendations on issued bid invitations, issued bid abstracts and executed contracts; supervising the physical execution of the contract; and certifying for the Japanese Government the correctness of quantity and quality of materials, labor, and equipment shown on contrac-

The Japanese Government is directed to transfer from monies deposited in reference 1 above, the amount of ¥8,149.93 from the "Custody Account for the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers" in the Bank of Japan, Head Office, Tokyo, to an account in the Tokyo Branch of the National City Bank of New York, held in the name of the Canadian Liaison Mission in Japan.

3. The Japanese Government is further directed to furnish General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, Civil Property Custodian, a report of the action taken within thirty (30) days from the date of this directive.
