MEMORANDUM FOR: JAPANESE GOVERNMENT

SUBJECT: Restitution of a 1939 Studebaker Sedan, Engine No. 8152,
to the Government of the United Kingdom

1. Reference is made to memorandum for the Japanese Government, file AG 386.6 (13 Feb 48)CPC/FP, SCAPIN 1858, 13 February 1948, subject, "Responsibilities of the Japanese Government for the Packaging, Transfer, and Delivery of Property being Restored to Claimant Nations under the Restitution Program," from General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers.

2. The Japanese Government is directed to restore to the Government of the United Kingdom a 1939 Studebaker sedan, engine No. 8152, CPC No. 2754, now in protective custody in the Setagaya Looted Property Warehouse, Tokyo. Necessary release forms are inclosed.

3. The subject vehicle will be restored on 3 June 1949 at the Jeep Club Building, No. 77 RAAF Squadron, Iwakuni, Japan. Flight Lieutenant C. Taplin, RAAF, has been designated by the Government of the United Kingdom as the authorized representative to receive and give receipt for the said vehicle.

4. The Japanese Government will designate by name an authorized representative to execute the receipt forms in its behalf and will notify General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, of his appointment upon receipt of this memorandum. The authorized representative of the Japanese Government will report to General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, Civil Property Custodian, for instructions on or before 26 May 1949.

5. The inclosed receipt forms, consisting of an original and five (5) copies, are to be signed by the authorized representatives of the Government of the United Kingdom and the Japanese Government, respectively, and are to be distributed as follows:

1. The Commanding General, Eighth Army, has been instructed to release to accredited representatives of the Japanese Government, Ministry of Foreign Affairs, certain personal effects belonging to former Japanese diplomatic personnel repatriated to Japan via "Tsukushi Maru," 26 March 1946.

2. Upon receipt the Japanese Government, Ministry of Foreign Affairs, will retain the subject items in safekeeping in conformance with existing pertinent directives issued by the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers.

3. The Japanese Government will submit to General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, within thirty (30) days after date of this memorandum, a report of all properties received in accordance with this directive. All items will be held in safekeeping by the Japanese Government pending receipt of further directions from the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers concerning ultimate disposition of properties falling within this category.

A copy of inclosure number 1, properly completed and signed, will be given to the pool member by the manufacturer. Only amount required will be requested and released, and proper action under Japanese statutes, will be taken in all instances of improper requests or releases. Pool members will maintain proper and adequate records, and the Japanese Government will maintain control accounts of such records, verifying them by periodic examinations.

b. Where a contract has not been signed, when the kind of precious metal required is not available in the pool of commercial products, and where amounts of precious metal forms equal or exceed the value stated in paragraph 4a (2) above, copies of completed inclosure number 1 will be forwarded with other designated documents for validation. This inclosure will show that the Ministry of Finance, Japanese Government, approves the use of the precious metals itemized, that examination has determined that the request is proper, and that the approval of General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers is requested. This request will be forwarded to the appropriate agency of General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers for approval, as an inclosure to other forms directed to be submitted."

1. The Japanese Government is directed to restore to the British Government, the following quantities of lead, CPC numbers as per inclosed release forms:

a. 168,279 kilograms, now located at the Kurihama Looted Property Warehouse, to be delivered in restitution aboard the S.S. "Shillong" on or about 31 May 1949, at Yokohama

b. 257,073 kilograms, now located at the Osaka Arsenal Looted Property Warehouse, to be delivered in restitution aboard the same vessel, on or about 4 June 1949 at Kobe.

2. Mr. R. J. Bray and Mr. A. J. Bell are the authorized representatives of the United Kingdom Reparations and Restitution Delegation who will sign the receipt forms on behalf of the British Government at Yokohama and Kobe, respectively. The Japanese Government will contact the shipping agents, Messrs. Mackinnon, Mackenzie & Co., who have offices in Yokohama and Kobe to ascertain the exact time of arrival of the ship. Their telephone numbers are: Yokohama 2-7625 and 2-1705 and Kobe 4-5163.

3. The Japanese Government is further directed to appoint an authorized representative to sign the receipt forms on its behalf, and to notify General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, Civil Property Custodian, of his appointment.

4. The inclosed two sets of receipt forms, each consisting of one original and five copies, are to be signed by the authorized representatives of the British Government and the Japanese Government, and distributed as follows:

2. References 1a, 1b, 1c and 1d above, and direct communications relating thereto, are hereby rescinded and superseded by this memorandum.

3. The Japanese Government, through its agent, the Bank of Japan, is directed to purchase all newly-mined precious metals, precious metals produced as by-products of, or from slimes remaining, from ores produced in Japan. Official approved prices will be paid in such transactions, and metals will be purchased by the last day of the month following that in which they were processed.

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

4. As determined proper, other precious metals may be purchased from Japanese persons, juridical or natural, upon the payment of official prices.

5. The Japanese Government may also retain precious metals, title to which has been acquired by the Japanese Government pursuant to Japanese law.

6. Precious metals, acquired as authorized by paragraphs 3, 4 and 5 above, will be held in safe storage and custody by the Bank of Japan, in vaults in Tokyo and Osaka, or in such other locations as are specifically authorized by General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers. A minimum amount of processing and other actions incident to the acquisition and proper storage of acquired property is authorized. Other transactions involving precious metals will be as directed by reference 1e above.

SUBJECT: International Postal Service

1. Reference is made to Memorandum for the Japanese Government, file AG 311.1 (28 May 48)CCS, SCAPIN 1900, dated 28 May 1948, subject same as above, as amended.

2. Effective 1 June 1949, paragraph 7 of the reference memorandum is amended to read as follows:

"7. Parcel Post. a. Mailing is permitted by parcel post of trade samples weighing more than eighteen (18) ounces, and ordinary commercial items of merchandise, to and from Japan, subject to the following regulatory provisions:

- (1) Weight limit will be in accordance with limitations provided by the Universal Postal Union Parcel Post Agreement and/or applicable bilateral agreements, but not exceeding twenty-two (22) pounds per parcel.
- (2) Parcels containing trade samples to and from Japan must have Customs Declaration tags attached indorsed "Trade Samples Only."
- (3) Parcels containing ordinary items of merchandise in commercial quantities, to and from Japan, must be accompanied by a certified or photostatic copy of a license validated by the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers permitting such importation or exportation. The words "Import License Inclosed" or "Export License Inclosed," whichever is applicable, must be indorsed on the wrapper as well as the words, "This Parcel may be Opened for Customs Inspection."
- (4) Parcels containing personal or household articles, professional instruments and tools of trade, in non-commercial quantities, for the personal use of the recipient, will be mailable to and from Japan and will not require a license. Such parcels will be subject to customs examination and clearance in accordance with Japanese laws.

b. The mailing of relief parcels, to Japan only, is permitted subject to a weight limit of twenty-two (22) pounds. The contents of parcels are restricted to non-perishable foods, clothing and mailable medicines, in non-commercial quantities, for the personal use of the recipient and his immediate family, or for the use of bona fide orphan asylums, asylums for the aged and charity hospitals. The wrappers of such parcels must be indorsed "Gift Parcel" or "Relief Parcel." Such parcels will be subject to a customs clearance fee on delivery but will be admitted duty free.

c. Parcels inscribed as "Gift Parcel" or "Relief Parcel" and found to contain clothing in commercial quantities will not be permitted entry duty free. Such parcels will be impounded, addressees notified and afforded sixty (60) days to obtain import licenses and pay all import duties and other applicable taxes and penalties. In the event of failure of addressees to take the required actions within the time limit, the parcels will be treated as undeliverable.

d. Parcels inscribed as "Gift Parcel" or "Relief Parcel" found to contain mailable medicines in commercial quantities will be treated as undeliverable.

e. Parcels containing food items weighing up to twenty-two (22) pounds will not be considered as being in commercial quantities.

f. Gift articles, as distinguished from relief items, such as watches, fountain pens, tobacco products, etc., will be subject to customs duty. Parcels inscribed as "Gift Parcel" or "Relief Parcel" found to contain such articles will be delivered only on payment of customs duties and other applicable taxes or penalties. If addressees fail to pay duties and other taxes or penalties, such parcels will be treated as undeliverable.

g. Undeliverable parcels will be treated in accordance with the provisions of the Universal Postal Union Parcel Post Agreement, or applicable bilateral agreements.

h. Each parcel post package must have securely attached thereto a "Customs Declaration" on which must be shown full and precise details.

i. Neither insurance, registry or C.O.D. service is included.

j. Prohibited articles:

- (1) Items included under Article 16, Universal Postal Union Parcel Post Agreement.
- (2) Articles prohibited in Japan's international regular-mails.

- (3) Any book, pamphlet, paper, writing, advertisement, circular, printing or drawing containing any matter advocating or urging treason or insurrection against any government.
- (4) Articles prohibited under terms of bilateral parcel post agreements between Japan and other countries.
- (5) Articles prohibited under paragraph 2, Section I, Annex II, SCAPIN 1966, dated 18 January 1949, subject: Property Individuals are Authorized to Carry On Entering and Leaving Japan.

k. All parcels entering Japan will be subject to examination by the Japanese Customs Service. All parcel post packages (including relief parcels), samples, small packets and other articles entering Japan through International mail channels and submitted to Customs examination are subject to a customs clearance fee to be collected from the addressee upon delivery. The fee to be collected will not exceed the amounts specified by the Universal Postal Union Convention or applicable bilateral parcel post agreements. Importation of dutiable articles will be subject to prevailing laws and regulations governing examination, appraisal and assessment of duty, except that items permitted in bona fide relief parcels and inscribed as "Gift Parcel" or "Relief Parcel" will not be subject to appraisal or assessment of duty."

1. a. Rescissions:

- (1) Memorandum for the Japanese Government from General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, AG 091.3(25 May 46)ESS/ST, SCAPIN 984, 25 May 1946, subject: Amendment of SCAPIN 47, (Directive No. 3).
- (2) Memorandum for the Japanese Government from General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, AG 315(14 Sep 46)ESS/ST, SCAPIN 1203, 14 September 1946, subject: Form of Report for Research Agencies.

b. Reference is Directive Number 3, SCAPIN 47, for the Japanese Government from General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, 22 September 1945.

You will direct agencies, as described in paragraph 8a above, to render an annual report as of the first day of April of each year to General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, through the Central Liaison and Coordination Office. The report will cover the period 1 April through 31 March and will be rendered on or before 1 May of each year. It will adhere to the form and content prescribed in the sample form and set of instructions inclosed herewith."

3. Paragraph 8 of the referenced directive is further amended by the following additions:

The Japanese Government will not submit any applications for approval unless the invention concerned was made subsequent to 1 January 1946 and is one which it recommends as having definite potentialities of being worked or imported into the country to which the patent application is to be sent. Provided that if the applicant can establish that a person, legally entitled to hold the appropriate currency of payment, will pay the necessary fees and charges for obtaining the patent, then the potential value of the subject invention need not be taken into consideration.

4. On written approval being given by the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers to the forwarding of a patent application to a foreign country, such approval may be presented to a bank licensed by the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, together with a request to remit the necessary fees in dollars or sterling to a designated addressee in the country in which the application is to be filed. After the Foreign Exchange Control Board has commenced operation, the request for remittance will be accompanied by certification by the Board as to availability of the necessary foreign exchange.

5. The term "necessary fees" in paragraph 4 above means reasonable fees and charges payable in respect of the acquirement of a patent when no substantial ex parte dispute or third-party hearing is involved.

6. Actions likely to involve costs or charges other than "necessary fees" as defined in paragraph 5 above, must be approved by the Japanese Government and by the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers before such actions are instigated.

7. Remittances to pay reasonable costs and charges for such actions as have been approved by the Japanese Government and by General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, may be obtained in the same manner as remittances to pay necessary fees.

8. All requests for remittances in dollars or sterling as in paragraphs 4 and 7 above will be accompanied by an amount in yen, equivalent to the dollars or pounds sterling to be remitted, at the official foreign exchange rate.

9. The Japanese Government is notified that any transactions, by way of assignment, license or otherwise, concerning the patent granted or to be granted on an application filed in a foreign country in the name of a Japanese National, must be approved by the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers prior to finalization. Also, the instrument must be filed with the Fair Trade Commission in accordance with the terms of article 6 of the Law relating to the Prohibition of Private Monopoly and Methods of Preserving Fair Trade.

10. The Japanese Government is further notified that approval will be given to the finalization of such transactions only if the instrument contains a provision that any foreign currency to be paid as consideration, will be remitted, for the account of the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers to a bank licensed by the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers which will pay the patentee or applicant in yen.

11. Any patents obtained in foreign countries by Japanese will be subject to the domestic laws of those foreign countries.

12. Direct communication between the Japanese Patent Agency and the interested agencies of General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers is authorized.

SUBJECT: Impoundment, Transfer, and Assay of Radium

1. Reference is made to memorandum for the Japanese Government, file AG 386.3 (19 Apr 46)CPC, SCAPIN 885, subject, "Impounding and Reporting of Looted Property," from General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, dated 19 April 1946.

2. In accordance with the provisions of the above reference, the Japanese Government is directed to impound and transfer to the U.S. Vaults, Bank of Japan, Tokyo, approximately ten (10) milligrams of radium, in seven (7) containers, at present in the Takenogawa Hospital, near Oji Arsenal, Tokyo. In the transfer to the U.S. Vaults, Bank of Japan, the Custodian is to be contacted by telephone (26-7843) at least 48 hours prior to the contemplated delivery. The above radium has been assigned IBM number CPC 10057. The required Form L-2 is to be submitted to General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, Civil Property Custodian, in accordance with existing procedure.

3. The radium impounded by this directive is to be assayed by Professor Mitsuo Miwa of the Tokyo College of Letters and Sciences, or by another competent radiologist. The report of the assay will include the specifications of the radium, a complete description of the containers, and all markings appearing thereon.

4. The Japanese Government is further directed to investigate and report on the source, origin, and circumstances of acquisition by the Takenogawa Hospital of the above radium, tracing the movements from the country of origin to its present custody in Japan.

5. Further, the Japanese Government is directed to instruct the radiologist conducting the assay in compliance with paragraph 3 above to conduct a similar assay of an amount of radium now in the Bank of Japan Vaults described as Item No. 1, in Lot 5352. The report of this separate assay will include the same information as required in paragraph 3 above.

SUBJECT: Prevention and Control of the Typhus Fever Group of Diseases in Japan.

1. Resciations:

a. Memorandum for the Japanese Government from General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, file AG 710(12 Feb 47)PH SCAPIN 1523, dated 12 February 1947, subject, "Prevention and Control of Typhus Fever in Japan."

b. Memorandum for Ministry of Welfare, Japanese Government from Public Health and Welfare Section, General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, PHMJG 3, dated 13 December 1946, subject, "Rickettsicidal (Typhus Control) Spray Program."

2. References:

a. Memorandum for the Japanese Government from General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, file AG 370.05 (7 May 46)GC SCAPIN 927, dated 7 May 1946, (revised 9 Mar 49), subject, "Repatriation."

b. Memorandum for the Japanese Government from General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, file AG 710(22 Sep 45)MG, SCAPIN 48, dated 22 September 1945, subject, "Public Health Measures."

3. The threat of typhus fever in Japan is still existent. The comparatively low incidence of epidemic typhus, the relative increase in the incidence of murine typhus, the presence of an unidentified type of typhus, the continued existence of Tsutsugamushi Fever (scrub typhus) areas, and the discovery of new or hitherto unreported scrub typhus areas necessitates a modification of the existing program.

4. It is desired that the Ministry of Welfare continue to carefully execute the following measures for the prevention and control of the diseases of the typhus fever group enumerated above:

a. Year-round preventive measures against the typhus fever group of diseases in all cities, towns, villages and other specified areas, including:

- (1) Surveys of louse, flea and rodent population densities.
- (2) Dissemination of accurate information to the public concerning the typhus fevers.

- (3) Effective utilization of measures directed against the vectors and rodent reservoirs of the typhus fevers.
 - (a) Disinfestation with 10% DDT powder and immunization of all repatriate persons embarking from Japanese ports.
 - (b) Disinfestation with 10% DDT powder and immunization of all repatriate Japanese Nationals and/or illegal entrants debarking at Japanese ports or elsewhere in Japan, as covered by basic memorandum, SCAPIN 927, (ref. par 2a above) and other existing memoranda concerned with medical processing of repatriate Japanese Nationals and illegal entrants into Japan.
 - (c) Disinfestation with 10% DDT powder and immunization of all vagrants, street waifs, etc.
 - (d) Disinfestation and disinfection of public and private transportation utilities, public and penal institutions, places of public entertainment, public baths, etc.
 - (e) Disinfestation by use of insecticide spray, 5% DDT, residual effect, or its equivalent, at 30-day intervals of:
 1. All railway coaches and railway stations used by or assigned for the use of all United Nations Nationals, military or civilian, including dependents.
 2. All vessels, including ferries, used by or assigned for the use of all United Nations Nationals, military and civilian, including dependents.
 3. Such other public conveyances used by or assigned for the use of all United Nations Nationals, military and civilian, including dependents.

(After disinfestation all conveyances will be plainly and uniformly marked as directed by the Military Government command concerned to show date and place of treatment).

b. Appropriate control measures against the typhus fever group of diseases in cities, towns, villages and other specified areas, when suspect, clinically recognized, or serologically confirmed cases of any

of the diseases of the typhus fever group occur. And, in addition, disinfestation with 10% DDT powder, when the incidence of epidemic typhus fever indicates, of all persons entering Honshu from Hokkaido and all persons entering Hokkaido from Honshu. (Present disinfestation stations to stand by in readiness for operation upon proper notification).

5. The Japanese Government will continue to provide necessary supplies, equipment and personnel for the proper execution of the measures outlined above.
