4. In addition to the above stations, the CMO may select the locations, and determine the additional services to be rendered, to complete this network. A report showing the stations to be operated, with services rendered, will be submitted to the Commanding Officer 2143d Air Weather Wing. Corrections to this report will be submitted when any change is made in the location or service rendered by any station.

5. Since the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers has committed the Japanese Government to subscribe to the International Meteorological Organization, the services rendered by the weather stations listed in paragraphs 3 and 4 above will not be covered by procurement instrument.

6. The Central Meteorological Observatory is authorized the use of the following ships for supply and maintenance transportation to weather stations upon the approval of the Commanding Officer, 2143d Air Weather Wing.

7. Request for changes in service rendered or change in location of any station listed in paragraph 3, will be submitted, through the Commanding Officer, 2143d Air Weather Wing, to the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers for final authorization.

8. The four weather stations now being operated in the Ryukyu Islands will continue to be operated by CMO until such time as relieved of that responsibility by the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers.

SUBJECT: Packing of Machinery and Equipment Looted from China

1. Reference is made to the following memoranda to the Japanese Government from General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers:
 - a. File AG 387.6 (22 Jul 47)REP, SCAPIN 1751, 22 July 1947, subject, "Responsibilities of the Japanese Government for the Packaging, Transfer and Delivery of Equipment and Records Allocated to Claimant Nations Under the Reparations Program"
 - b. File AG 386.6 (13 Feb 48)CPC/FP, SCAPIN 1858, 13 February 1948, subject, "Responsibilities of the Japanese Government for the Packaging, Transfer, and Delivery of Property being Restored to Claimant Nations under the Restitution Program."
2. The Japanese Government is directed to pack the machinery and equipment listed in inclosure 1, preparatory to restitution to the Government of the Republic of China. The locations of the subject property are also listed in inclosure 1. The procedures outlined and specifications used in Annexes 4, 5, 6, and 7 of reference 1a above will be followed when dismantling, disassembling, cleaning, preserving, inner-packaging, constructing exterior wooden shipping containers and preparing of packing lists. The responsibilities of the Japanese Government for the packaging, transfer and delivery of the subject property are defined in reference 1b above. Instructions for marking of containers are outlined in inclosure 2.
3. Immediately upon receipt of this memorandum, the Japanese Government will submit L-1 or L-2 Inventory Forms on all property listed in inclosure 1 where such forms have not been previously submitted. CPC numbers as obtained from General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, Civil Property Custodian, will be marked on each machine where that has not been done. The Japanese Government will return one copy of inclosure 1 to General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, Civil Property Custodian within fifteen (15) days from date of this memorandum, listing the L-1 or L-2 Inventory Form number on which each machine was reported as well as the CPC number assigned to each machine. Discrepancies such as incorrect nomenclature, CPC number, location, etc., will also be indicated on the list to be returned.

4. Upon completion of packaging, the Japanese Government will submit in sextuplicate, a list giving:

- a. Markings and contents of each box
- b. CFC numbers of the property in each box
- c. Cubic measurements of each box
- d. Weight of each box.

5. A separate report will also be submitted upon completion of packaging, listing the petroleum products actually used in packaging the subject property.

6. The Japanese Government will designate by name a representative to receive further instructions as necessary and will notify General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers of his appointment within seven (7) days from date of this memorandum.

7. The subject property will be packaged within sixty (60) days from date of this memorandum. A memorandum directing movement to a port and restitution thereat will be issued at a later date.

SUBJECT: Establishment of Immigration Service

1. References:

a. Circular 19, General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, 23 June 1948, subject, "Control of Entry and Exit of Individuals, Aircraft and Surface Vessels into and from Japan."

b. Circular 1, General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, 1 January 1949, subject, "Private Commercial Entrants."

c. Memorandum for the Japanese Government, AG 321 (8 Apr 46) ESS/IE, SCAPIN 941-A, 8 April 1946, subject, "Japanese Customs Organization."

d. Memorandum for the Japanese Government, AG 095 (22 May 48) GA, SCAPIN 1971, 11 February 1949, subject, "Entry of Personnel into Japan to Visit Relatives."

2. a. Effective 1 November 1949 and subject to the supervision of the Commanding General, Eighth Army, the Japanese Government will be responsible for the immigration surveillance of all individuals authorized by the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers to enter into or depart from Japan (except occupation force personnel travelling under official orders).

b. Currently the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers authorizes entry into Japan for individuals in the following categories:

- (1) Compassionate entries
- (2) Correspondents
- (3) Commercial entrants
- (4) Cultural entrants
- (5) Dependents of mission members

- (6) Dependents of commercial entrants
- (7) Foreign diplomatic officials not assigned to Japan
- (8) Government officials or employees
- (9) Intransit personnel
- (10) Members of staff, Allied Council for Japan
- (11) Members of foreign missions accredited to the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers
- (12) Military attaches of foreign missions in Japan
- (13) Missionaries
- (14) House-guests
- (15) Tourists
- (16) Miscellaneous

3. The Japanese Government will immediately take the necessary action to:

a. Assign the necessary immigration officials to the Customs Detachment currently operating under the supervision of the Commanding General, Eighth Army, at each port of entry designated by Circular 19, General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, 1948, and amendments and supersedures thereto. The immigration officials will be under the direct supervision of the Commanding General, Eighth Army.

b. The Japanese Government will establish a central office of record for all clearances granted by the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers to individuals entering or departing Japan, except occupation force personnel traveling under official orders. This office of record will be known as the "Central Locator Files" and will serve to inform the immigration officials of the Japanese Government working under the supervision of the Commanding General, Eighth Army, of all clearances granted by the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers. The Central Locator Files will be maintained with sufficient English-speaking personnel on a twenty-four hour basis to receive information from the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers concerning individuals authorized by him to enter or depart Japan. Upon receipt of such information, the Central Locator Files will notify the immigration officials of the Japanese Government of the clearances granted by the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers.

4. In order that the Central Locator Files may receive information of clearances granted by the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, it is desired that a messenger visit the General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, promptly at 1200 each Tuesday, Thursday and Saturday to receive a list of clearances.

5. Effective 1 November 1949, the Japanese Government will be responsible for the prevention of the illegal entry of any individual into Japan. It is desired that particular emphasis be placed on entry of individuals through those ports not recognized by the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers as official ports of entry. Necessary action will be taken by the Japanese Government to deport individuals apprehended as illegal entrants, or individuals who are otherwise in Japan without authority.

SUBJECT: Purchase of Foreign Exchange Credits for the Purpose
of Stimulating Exports

1. Reference is Memorandum for the Japanese Government from
General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, AG 386.7
(2 Feb 49) ESS/FIN, SCAPIN 1968, 2 February 1949, subject: Foreign
Exchange Controls.

2. It is desired that the Japanese Government submit plans and
procedures not later than 27 June 1949, to permit purchase of foreign
exchange credits by exporters of Japanese goods in accordance with the
principles outlined herein.

3. Exporters of Japanese goods (other than government agencies)
will be permitted to purchase with yen foreign exchange credits resulting
from any private export transaction in accordance with the following
allowable percentages and commodity categories:

- a. Category I (see Incl 1) - 3%
- b. Category II (see Incl 2) - 6%
- c. Category III (see Incl 3) - 10%

In cases where a commodity is not listed under categories indicated
above, separate prior approval of the Supreme Commander for the Allied
Powers will be obtained for the right to purchase an appropriate per-
centage of foreign exchange credit resulting from the export thereof.

4. Foreign exchange retention credits may be available only as a
result of transactions financed by Letters of Credit or remittances re-
ceived from outside of Japan. Transactions financed through open accounts
may be a source of such credits only if relative foreign government's
concurrence is obtained and to the extent of such concurrence. Such
retention credits as do result from open account transactions will be
available only for and/or in the country with which the contract has
been made.

a. Travel and living expenses abroad of Japanese or foreign

c. No foreign currencies or instruments negotiable within Japan
will be made available to any person.

d. Such other safeguards as may be prescribed by the Supreme
Commander for the Allied Powers.

7. Appropriate Japanese Government agencies will be designated to
submit to the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers for approval names
of Japanese nationals requesting travel abroad under provisions of this
memorandum subject to the following limitations:

a. The travel requested must be demonstrated to be confined to
trade activities.

b. The individual concerned will not be acting as sole sales
or purchasing agents for the Ministry of International Trade and Industry
or for Japanese trade associations.

8. Direct communication among the Ministry of International Trade and Industry, designated agencies of the Japanese Government and interested staff sections of the General Headquarters of the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers is hereby authorized to implement the instructions contained in the memorandum.

2. It is directed that a report be made to the occupation authorities in the locality where a fireworks display is scheduled at least three days prior to the display giving the amount, date, time and place display is to be conducted.
3. This authority is not to be used as a basis for the indiscriminate use of fireworks by individuals.

Keagey, in accordance with the provisions of reference 1a above.

3. The receipt for restoration will be signed by Mr. Alfred R. Stone, agent, at the office of the Tokyo Military Government Headquarters, Tokyo, on 6 July 1949 at 1000 hours.

As of this date, the trust relationship existing between the Yokohama Specie Bank (a closed institution in the process of liquidation) and the Bank of Tokyo, involving those domestic assets which remained in the old account of the Yokohama Specie Bank, and which were transferred in trust to the Bank of Tokyo, may be terminated, and the remaining domestic assets held in trust may be returned to the Yokohama Specie Bank and may be liquidated according to the Closed Institutions Ordinance (Imperial Ordinance No. 74, 1947).

MEMORANDUM FOR: JAPANESE GOVERNMENT

SUBJECT: Entry of Personnel into Japan to Visit Relatives or Friends

1. Reference is made to memorandum from General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, AG 095 (22 May 48)GA, SCAPIN 1971, subject, "Entry of Personnel into Japan to Visit Relatives," 11 February 1949, as amended.

2. The subject of reference memorandum is amended to read, "Entry of Personnel into Japan to Visit Relatives or Friends."

3. Paragraph 1 of SCAPIN 1971 is rescinded and the following substituted therefor:

1. The Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers hereby authorizes individuals to enter Japan for the purpose of visiting relatives or friends who are Japanese nationals or who are foreign nationals and were permanent residents of Japan prior to December 1941. Period of stay in Japan is limited to sixty days.

4. Paragraph 3b of SCAPIN 1971 is amended to read:

b. The respective host desires to have his relatives or friends visit him.

5. This program will be under constant surveillance to insure that the terms under which it is authorized will not be violated. Violations will lead to immediate scrutiny with a view to revocation of the program.

6. Pages 1 of Inclosure 1 and 1 and 2 of Inclosure 2 of SCAPIN 1971 are rescinded, and the attached new pages 1 of Inclosure 1 and 1 and 2 of Inclosure 2 are substituted therefor.
