2. In accordance with the provisions of reference paragraph 1, the Japanese Government is directed to install immediately telephone services due under the following vested German telephone rights at the address indicated:

5. Installations shall be made in the name and on behalf of the German External Property Commission. Said installations shall be made without charges of any kind, and shall be exempt from the provisions of any Japanese Government law, ordinance, or regulation which may require deposits, purchase of bonds or similar financial requirements. Such exemption does not apply to subsequent transfer of these services.

6. Immediately upon completion of installation of those services directed herein, transfer of the services shall be made to the following designated transferees at that address indicated in paragraph 2 above:

SUBJECT: Japanese Fishery Inspection System

1. Reference:

a. Memorandum for Japanese Government from General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, AG 800.217(22 Jun 46)NR, SCAPIN 1033, subject, "Area Authorized for Japanese Fishing and Whaling," 22 June 1946, and SCAPIN 1033/1, 23 December 1948.

b. Memorandum to General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, from the Japanese Government, C.L.C.O. No 2852 (2P), subject, "Measures to Prevent Japanese Fishing Boats from Trespassing Upon Area Outside Boundary of Authorized Area," 11 August 1948.

2. The Japanese Government is authorized to establish a fisheries inspection system as proposed by Memorandum referred to in paragraph 1 b above, subject to the modifications listed below:

a. The purpose of the inspection system authorized by this Memorandum is to enforce the provisions of Memorandum for the Japanese Government, SCAPIN 1033, and any subsequent amendments or modifications thereof, as well as other pertinent fisheries regulations. Inspection vessels will be responsible for assisting in the enforcement of instructions issued by the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers and of laws and regulations of the Japanese Government in regard to Japanese fishery operations.

b. Available vessels of the type and size suitable for conducting inspection duties will be put into immediate operation and provisions will be made to increase the number of vessels used if the need for such is demonstrated to be necessary to insure effective enforcement.

c. Inspection vessels are authorized to operate within the area bounded as follows: From a point midway between Nosappu Misaki and Kaigara Jima at approximately

43°23'14" North Latitude, 145°50'30" East Longitude; to 43°North Latitude, 146°30' East Longitude; thence to 45°North Latitude, 165°East Longitude; thence east along the 45° parallel to the 180th meridian; thence south along the 180th meridian to 10°North Latitude; thence west along the 10°North parallel to 132° East Longitude; thence to 22°North Latitude, 126°East Longitude; thence to 24° North Latitude, 122°30' East Longitude; thence north to 34°North Latitude, 122°30' East Longitude; thence east to 34°North Latitude, 128°40'East Longitude; thence to 40°North Latitude, 135°East Longitude; thence 45°30' North Latitude, 140° East Longitude; thence east to 45°30' North Latitude, 145°East Longitude rounding Soya Misaki at a distance of three (3) miles from shore; south along the 145th meridian to a point three (3) miles off the coast of Hokkaido; thence along a line three (3) miles off the coast of Hokkaido rounding Shiretoko Saki and following a mid-channel course through the Nemuro Kaikyo to a point 43°26'17" North Latitude, 145°48'03" East Longitude; thence in a south-easterly direction to the starting point midway between Nosappu Misaki and Kaigara Jima.

d. Japanese inspection vessels shall not approach closer than ten (10) miles to the coast of any foreign country or its island possessions within the area defined in the preceding paragraph.

e. The modified International E instead of the Japanese flag shall be used to mark inspection vessels.

f. Inspection vessels will not engage in fishing operations of any kind.

g. Inspection vessels shall obtain authorization for each voyage from Commander, United States Naval Activities, Japan.

h. Inspection vessels will not be vested with police powers.

3. The Japanese Government shall take immediate action to carry out all phases of proposed plan as modified in paragraph 2, above.

4. Direct communication between Natural Resources Section, General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers and the Ministry of Agriculture and Forestry,

concerning matters within the scope of this memorandum, is authorized.

5. This authorization does not establish a precedent for the operation of inspection vessels in any other area for any subsequent period of time; nor is it an expression of Allied policy relative to the ultimate determination of national jurisdiction, international boundaries, or fishing rights in the area concerned or in any other area.

SUBJECT: Japanese Whaling Operations in the Antarctic in the 1949-1950 Season.

1. Reference is made to:

a. Memorandum for the Japanese Government from General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, AG 800.217 (23 Nov 48)NR/FI SCAPIN 1942, 23 November 1948, Subject, "Whaling Industry."

b. Memorandum from the Japanese Government to General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, MAF No. 76'49, dated 13 May 1949.

2. Japanese whaling operations in the Antarctic are hereby authorized for the 1949-1950 season. Such operations will be conducted in accordance with the provisions of reference memorandum, 1 a, above.

3. Within thirty days of the receipt of this memorandum the Japanese Government will submit to the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers for approval a plan for the organization and operation of an Antarctic whaling expedition consisting of two fleets. The plan will include a list of the names and gross tonnages of the factory ships, catchers, and auxiliaries to be used and the names of the personnel who will manage each fleet. Subsequent to the approval of the plan or modification thereof, any substitution of vessels or personnel for those named must be approved by the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers.

4. Vessels participating in the whaling expedition will comply with the following:

a. Each vessel will be marked and operated in conformity with directives from the Administrator, Naval Shipping Control Authority.

b. The master of each of the participating factory ships will maintain a duplicate of the ship's log which will be available for inspection at all times and upon completion of the expedition will be submitted, properly certified, to the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers.

c. During the voyage to and from the whaling area no vessel will approach land nearer than 12 miles. The route to be followed by each vessel

8. The Japanese Government will conduct a complete survey of each vessel destined to carry liquid cargo to insure the absence of any structural deficiencies prior to its departure from Japan. Each of such vessels to which modifications or repairs have been made will be surveyed upon completion of those modifications or repairs. Each of such vessels which have been used for purposes other than whaling since the end of the 1948-49 Antarctic whaling expedition will be surveyed within thirty days prior to its departure from Japan. The cargo space of all vessels surveyed will be empty at the time of survey. A report of the survey will be submitted to General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers ten days prior to the departure of each surveyed vessel from Japan.

9. The Japanese Government will verify the cargo of each vessel arriving in Japan from the whaling area, and within ten days of the discharging of cargo will notify the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers of the exact cargo of each vessel and the condition of the cargo.

10. The attention of the Japanese Government is directed to the memorandum referred to in paragraph 1 a above. Reports required by the referenced memorandum will be submitted to the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers prior to 1 June 1950.

11. This authorization does not establish precedent for whaling operations in any area for any subsequent period of time; nor is it an expression of Allied policy relative to ultimate determination of national jurisdiction, international boundaries, or fishing or whaling operations in any area.

f. The senior Japanese Government Inspector aboard each of the two participating factory ships will personally verify all information forwarded to the Fisheries Agency in Tokyo by radiogram as required in paragraphs d and e above.

g. The master of each of the two factory ships will upon conclusion of whaling operations, dispatch a radiogram to the Fisheries Agency in Tokyo stating the date of departure of his ship from the whaling area.

5. Applications for frequencies for radio communications by the whaling fleets will be made to Civil Communications Section, General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers.

6. The Fisheries Agency will maintain at its office in Tokyo a file of all communications between the whaling fleets and Japan for reference by the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers when desired.

7. Thirty days prior to the departure of the first units of the expedition the Japanese Government will notify the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers of the allocation of petroleum products to the participating companies. SUBJECT: Overseas Supply Store Operation

1. In order to facilitate the placing of the responsibility and risk for operation of the Overseas Supply Store in private hands, it is desired that the Japanese Government take the following steps:

a. Rescission of contract between the Board of Trade (Boeki-Cho) and Meidi-Ya Co., Ltd., dated 14 December 1947.

b. Establishment of appropriate agreement and any amendments thereto between Ministry of International Trade and Meidi-Ya Co., Ltd., subject to the approval of the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, including provisions for the following:

- (1) Meidi-Ya Co., Ltd., will be charged the U.S. dollar cost of all Overseas Supply Store merchandise on hand on 30 June 1949, originally purchased through Boeki-Cho or the Ministry of International Trade and Industry, and such additional charges as the Japanese Government considers appropriate to require. The dollar value of the merchandise on hand on 30 June 1949 referred to in paragraph 1b(1) will be established on a basis of a physical inventory taken at the close of business, 30 June 1949, under the supervision of General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, and priced at cost delivered in Japan shipside on a "first-in, first-out" basis.
- (2) Meidi-Ya Co., Ltd. will repay to the Japanese Government the cost of such merchandise in monthly credits from the proceeds of Overseas Supply Store sales. Minimum monthly payments of \$25,000 or 10 percent of gross sales shall be credited, whichever is the greater, but in any one month a larger amount may be credited from sales proceeds if agreed upon by both parties to the agreement.

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- (3) Effective 1 July 1949, Meidi-Ya Co., Ltd. will be permitted to purchase imported and indigenous merchandise, supplies, services, or equipment necessary to maintain service for its authorized Overseas Supply Store customers, and payment in foreign exchange for such purchases will be made from proceeds of Overseas Supply Store sales.
- (4) Title to all stocks in the Overseas Supply Store of every kind and nature, including stocks acquired subsequent to 1 July 1949, shall remain with the Ministry until the cost referred to in paragraph 1b(1) above shall be paid in full.
- (5) Upon retirement of the said cost specified in paragraph 1b(1) above, title of all Overseas Supply Store merchandise shall pass to Meidi-Ya Co., Ltd. In the event that such amortization is not completed within a period of three (3) years from the effective date of agreement, Meidi-Ya Co., Ltd. shall be assessed penalty interest charges at the rate of two (2) percent per annum on the outstanding debit balance until such charge is completely retired.
- (6) All proceeds from the sales of the Overseas Supply Stores shall be deposited in an account specified by the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers. The residual balance of the said sales proceeds for each month which are not used for the payment of the following charges (a) and (b) below, or expended for other items as approved by the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, shall be converted into yen at the then applicable existing exchange rate and paid over to Meidi-Ya Co., Ltd. to meet operating expenses and to permit Meidi-Ya Co., Ltd. to realize a profit from its Overseas Supply Store operations. Such exchange shall be accomplished in accordance with existing rules and regulations.
  - (a) A deduction will be made from the sale proceeds for each month to provide for the monthly installment on the unpaid balance as provided for in paragraph 1b(2) thereof.

- (b) A deduction will be made from said monthly sales proceeds to provide for the payment of all goods purchased during said month.
- (7) Meidi-Ya Co., Ltd. shall be held pecuniarily responsible and liable to the Japanese Government for all Overseas Supply Store merchandise, pending completion of amortization, up to but not in excess of the value of the current outstanding unpaid balance for merchandise acquired from the Japanese Government as outlined in paragraph 1b(1). They will maintain ample insurance coverage against damages or losses for the protection of said equity of the Japanese Government in said property.
- (8) Meidi-Ya Co., Ltd. will sell merchandise only to such persons in such quantities, at such prices, and for such currencies or media of exchange as are authorized by rules and regulations made applicable by General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, to the conduct of business by the Overseas Supply Store. They will strive to maintain adequate quantities and proper selection of merchandise to meet fully the requirement of their customers.
- (9) Import of merchandise for resale through Overseas Supply Store shall be subject to applicable customs laws and regulations of the Japanese Government.
- (10) The books and records of the Meidi-Ya Co., Ltd. and of its various operating units shall be maintained in such form and shall be subject to such periodic audits as may be specified by the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers.
- (11) The Meidi-Ya Co., Ltd. will assume responsibility for all commitments in connection with merchandise in transit and unfilled orders as of 30 June 1949. Unpaid claims of vendors in connection with goods received prior to and included in the inventory of 30 June 1949 will be paid from funds on deposit in SCAP Special Account-Trade Services Fund on 30 June 1949.

SUBJECT: Transfer of Proceeds of Imported Petroleum Products to the Counterpart Fund

1. References:

a. Ministry of International Trade and Industry L.O. No. 4 to General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, 7 June 1949, subject: Transfer of Proceeds of Imported Petroleum Products to the Counterpart Fund.

b. Ministry of Foreign Affairs F.O.M. No. 52 (TIM) to General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, 8 June 1949, subject: Transfer of Proceeds of Imported Petroleum Products to the Counterpart Fund.

2. With regard to the request contained in paragraph 3 of letter referred to in paragraph 1a above, the following instructions apply:

a. The Japanese Government will be furnished an estimate of proposed imports of petroleum products considered necessary to sustain the approved economic programs. As requested, this estimate will be furnished quarterly for the quarter of year commencing with January, April, June and September of each year. It is expressly stipulated that the information as to quantity and type of any petroleum product included in this quarterly estimate is furnished to the Japanese Government for planning purposes only, and is subject to change without notice at the discretion of the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers.

b. It is not considered necessary to issue to the Japanese Government a delivery order for each specific delivery of petroleum products. However, arrangements have been made for advance notice on individual imports of petroleum products to be furnished by the Sub-Area Petroleum Officer, Japan, Headquarters, Eighth Army, or his representative at ports of discharge to the Japanese Government

representative at the port of discharge. This advance notice will specify name of the vessel, expected time of arrival, type and quantity of products aboard, and port of discharge. Further, the Japanese Government representative at port of discharge will be advised of any changes in advance notices subsequent to their issuance. It must be clearly understood that this advance notice does not constitute authority for representatives of the Japanese Government to make any arrangements for discharge of cargoes with the ship's captain or chief mate. Such arrangements will be made with the appropriate United States Army representative at each port of discharge.

c. The request that the Japanese Government be furnished a copy of the ship's manifest or similar document has been evaluated and is approved in principle. The Japanese Government will be furnished, within ten (10) days after completion of discharging cargo, an authenticated copy of a "shipping document" covering the products discharged from each individual vessel. The appropriate agency of the Japanese Government will contact the Sub-Area Petroleum Officer, Japan, Headquarters, Eighth Army, for coordination of this matter.

d. It is considered that the procedure outlined above will preclude the necessity for the submission of any claim as distinguished from adjustment. It is recognized that, for cogent reasons, adjustments will have to be made between the records of the Japanese Government and those of the United States Government. It is expressly stipulated that any adjustment of records will normally be limited to changes in nomenclature only. Any reconciliation of records must be accomplished between the Japanese Government and the Sub-Area Petroleum Officer, Japan, Headquarters, Eighth Army. In the event of failure to arrive at a mutual reconciliation, the decision of the Sub-Area Petroleum Officer, Japan, will be final.

3. With reference to paragraph 3e of reference 1a, under present pricing criteria as established by the Japanese Government Price Board, allowance is made to cover landing costs of petroleum products. Therefore, the International Trade Bureau of the Japanese Government will be
