SUBJECT: Restitution of Tin to the Government of the
United Kingdom

1. The Japanese Government is directed to restore to the Government of the United Kingdom, 398,614 kilograms of Malayan tin as listed on the inclosed release forms, which are at present located at the Kurihama Looted Property Warehouse.

2. The subject tin will be delivered in restitution on 14 July 1949 at its present location. Mr. C. Blyth, of the United Kingdom Reparations and Restitution Delegation, is the authorized representative to sign the receipt forms on behalf of the Government of the United Kingdom.

3. The Japanese Government is directed to designate by name, an authorized representative to sign the receipt forms on its behalf, and inform General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, Civil Property Custodian, of his appointment.

4. The inclosed receipt forms, consisting of the original and five copies, are to be signed by the authorized representatives of the Government of the United Kingdom and the Japanese Government, and distributed as follows:

a. Original and one (1) copy to be returned to General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, Civil Property Custodian, by the representative of the Japanese Government

b. Two (2) copies to be retained by the representative of the Government of the United Kingdom

c. Two (2) copies to be retained by the representative of the Japanese Government.




2. This memorandum modifies reference 1a in so far as it

3. The Japanese Government will forthwith place all such
goods, wares and merchandise in regular channels of distribution
and distribute them in accordance with applicable allocation and
rationing procedures, provided that the money equivalent of such
goods shall be subject to judicial determination in place of the
items.

4. Except as modified in the preceding paragraph, all
provisions of reference 1a shall continue to apply to these and
all other goods.

5. Direct communication between the appropriate agencies
of the Japanese Government and General Headquarters, Supreme
Commander for the Allied Powers, Economic and Scientific Section,
is authorized to implement the provisions of this memorandum.

SUBJECT: Operation of Pacific Coast Refineries and Import of Crude Petroleum

1. The following Memoranda for the Japanese Government from General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, are hereby rescinded:
 - a. AG 463.7(13 Oct 45)ESS, SCAPIN 134, subject: Petroleum Refineries, 13 October 1945.
 - b. AG 463.7(21 Jan 46)GD, SCAPIN 640, subject: Crude Oil Imports, 21 January 1946.
 - c. AG 096(27 Sep 46)ESS/IN, SCAPIN 1236, subject: Pacific Coast Oil Refineries, 27 September 1946.
 - d. AG 004(14 Dec 46)ESS/IN, SCAPIN 1404, subject: Pacific Coast Oil Refineries, 14 December 1946.
2. Repair and rehabilitation of the Pacific Coast Refineries, excluding ex-military refineries, will be permitted subject to approval by the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers. Plans for repair and rehabilitation of each refinery desired by owner and approved by Japanese Government with a consolidation thereof, will be submitted to General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, within 90 days after receipt of this memorandum, and will specify:
 - a. Complete identification of each plant.
 - b. Description of contemplated repairs in detail.
 - c. Amount of materials and additional equipment required.
 - d. Source and availability of such materials and equipment.
 - e. Time required for repairs.
 - f. Cost of repairs, including new materials, equipment and labor.

g. Type of crude petroleum to be refined in each plant and proposed operating capacity.

h. Products proposed to be manufactured, with approximate individual and total percentage.

3. In approving any rehabilitation it should be understood that maximum utilization will be made of materials and equipment available in Japan. Consideration by General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, will be given to applications for imports of materials and equipment only when accompanied by complete justification therefor. Careful consideration should be given by the Japanese Government to pooling existing equipment and facilities for maximum efficiency. The removal, disposal, alteration, or conversion of any equipment in reference refineries is not authorized without prior approval by the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers.


4. Construction of additional refineries will not be considered at this time.

5. Importation of crude petroleum will be considered by the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers dependent upon the merits of individual offers.

6. The provisions of this memorandum do not supersede in any manner existing memoranda to the Japanese Government except those noted in paragraph 1.

7. Direct communication between the Economic and Scientific Section, General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers and the Japanese Government is authorized.

3. The Japanese Government is directed to establish immediately a direct reporting system between General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, Civil Property Custodian, and all Japanese and foreign commercial banks and Japanese Government or quasi-government depositories in which funds of German nationals have been on deposit on or after 20 September 1945.

4. In establishing this system the Japanese Government will instruct the banks and depositories to conform to the procedures and to employ the forms described below:

a. Direct Reporting. All reports required hereunder will be submitted DIRECTLY from the reporting institutions to General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, Civil Property Custodian, Attention: Comptroller Division. The Japanese Government may at its discretion require the submission of copies of all reports to itself, but such requirement will not be permitted to interfere with the time schedule established hereunder for the submission of such report

b. Institutions Required to Report.

- (1) All Japanese commercial banks or trust companies in Japan by branches
- (2) All Japanese branches of foreign banks
- (3) All Japanese Government or quasi-government institutions. Such institutions, for example, but not by way of limitation, are the Bank of Japan, Special Property Administration Accounts, Postal Savings Institutions, Depositories for escrowed funds (e.g., patent and copyright royalties), etc.
- (4) In those instances where banks have been closed in liquidation; reports shall be submitted by the official liquidating agency
- (5) No report need be submitted for the Deutsche Bank fuer Ostasien
- (6) No report need be submitted for the Custody Account of the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, maintained in the Bank of Japan, Tokyo Branch

c. Categories of German Nationals Whose Deposits Must be Reported.

- (1) "Objectionable" German nationals who have been repatriated to Germany
- (2) "Non-objectionable" German nationals repatriated to Germany
- (3) German nationals who departed from Japan prior to the termination of the war or those German nationals whose present whereabouts is unknown
- (4) German nationals with former diplomatic status who were repatriated to Germany
- (5) German-owned juridical persons
- (6) German Government and quasi-government organizations
- (7) German religious, cultural and non-profit organizations
- (8) "Non-objectionable" German nationals presently residing in Japan

d. Details of Reports.

- (1) A separate report will be submitted for each individual German national, each juridical person, each government or quasi-government organization, and each religious, cultural or non-profit organization
- (2) A separate report will be submitted for each type of account; i.e., "Free," "Fixed Deposit," "Time Deposit," "No. 1 Restricted," "No. 2 Restricted," etc.
- (3) Reports will begin with the balance on deposit at 20 September 1945 and will disclose complete and detailed information with respect to deposits and withdrawals thereafter. All withdrawals will be detailed as to Japanese Government, Ministry of Finance permit numbers. All deposits of interest paid by the depository will be recorded, together with the rate of interest and the period covered
- (4) All reductions in deposits resulting from the application of Japanese Government legislation will be specifically noted and explained by reference to the legislation involved; i.e., War Indemnity Special Tax, Personal Property Tax, Financial Institutions Reconstruction and Reorganization Law, etc.

e. Report Forms to be Employed and the Reporting Period.

(1) Reports will be submitted on two forms:

- (a) "Consolidated Bank Statement for the Period 20 September 1945 to 30 June 1949"
- (b) "Monthly Bank Statement" to be submitted for each calendar month beginning with July 1949

Samples of the above forms, reproduction of which is authorized, are inclosed herewith

(2) Special instructions for use of the "Consolidated Bank Statement" are stated below:

- (a) All accounts on deposit on or after 20 September 1945 must be reported, even though an account has been closed out by withdrawal or transfer prior to the report termination date, 30 June 1949
- (b) In those instances where an account was opened subsequent to 20 September 1945, the reporting period will commence with the date of the initial deposit. Such initial deposits will be detailed wherever possible to disclose the source; i.e., transfers from another bank, another account, etc.
- (c) In the case of "non-objectionable" German nationals presently residing in Japan, the reporting period will terminate with the date the funds of such nationals were released from impoundment under the provisions of referenced memoranda 1b and 1c

(3) Special instructions for the use of the "Monthly Bank Statement" are stated below:

- (a) The initial (July 1949) monthly bank statement will carry forward the closing balance from the "Consolidated Bank Statement"
- (b) The "Monthly Bank Statement" will be submitted even though there has been no activity in the account during the monthly period
- (c) The "Monthly Bank Statement" will be submitted each month as long as funds remain on deposit.

5. The Japanese Government will instruct the depositories listed in paragraph 4b above to submit reports within the following time schedule:

a. The "Consolidated Bank Statement for the Period 20 September 1945 to 30 June 1949" will be submitted on or before 30 July 1949

b. The "Monthly Bank Statement" will be submitted on or before the tenth day of the month following the month for which the report is made.

6. Nothing in this subject memorandum will be construed as a release from the provisions of referenced memoranda 1a, 1d and 1f above.

2. The Japanese Government is hereby directed to assemble the funeral urns cited in reference 1a at Sasebo. Separate rosters will be prepared in triplicate for the remains to be shipped to Okinawa and to Amami-Oshima, as indicated in paragraph 4 below. A copy of each roster will accompany each shipment. At least 10 days before shipment is made 2 copies of each roster will be forwarded to the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, with name of each, expected time of departure from Sasebo and expected time of arrival in the Ryukyus.

3. The Japanese Government will arrange with the Naval Shipping Control authority for Japanese Merchant Marine (SCAJAP) for assignment of suitable shipping space on available shipping to the Ryukyus.

4. The funeral urns will be consigned to the Military Governor of Ryukyu Islands and will be delivered to the following ports:

a. Naha, Okinawa, for natives of all the Ryukyu Islands except Amami-Oshima.

b. Naze, Amami-Oshima, for natives of that island.

5. Bills of lading will be prepared and executed as directed in paragraphs 4 and 5, reference 1b.

6. Subject urns and effects shall be carefully packed and shall be properly safeguarded at all times prior to delivery.

1. Reference is made to memorandum for the Japanese Government, file AG 091.12 (21 Sep 45)MG, SCAPIN 39, 22 September 1945, subject, "Protection of Property of Friendly Nations and Their Nationals," from General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers.

2. The Japanese Government is directed to establish a yen account in the Bank of Japan, Tokyo, to be known as "Foreign Creditors' Yen Deposit Account," for the purpose of receiving from debtors in Japan, who are liquidating or dissolving, or from other categories of debtors to be designated by General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers deposits in favor of the following categories of creditors whose claims were not affected by Japanese Law No. 99, "Hostile National's Property Control Law," of 22 December 1941:

a. Non-resident foreigners (including persons of former Japanese colonial or occupied areas)

b. Juridical entities with head offices abroad whose representatives and/or agents or liquidators in Japan have not filed claims for amounts due.

3. The Japanese Government will be responsible for maintenance of the account in accordance with memorandum reference 1 above.

4. The Japanese Government will authorize withdrawals from this account either on direction of General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, or on demand of beneficiaries who appear in Japan or their duly appointed agents.

5. The Japanese Government is directed to cause the establishment and maintenance of such records as will enable it, commencing 1 August 1949 to submit monthly reports to General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers. Sample form for these reports is inclosed herewith.

6. Within fifteen (15) days of date of this memorandum, the Japanese Government will submit to General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, Civil Property Custodian a plan for implementing this directive.

Applications for extension of the 60 day period to visit relatives and friends in Japan will be processed in the following manner:

- a. All applications for extensions be filed with the Japanese Government or any travel agency authorized to operate in Japan.
- b. With the filing of the extension application, the applicant agrees to purchase, for each fifteen day period of fraction thereof, \$50.00 Overseas Supply Store Coupons necessary in obtaining food, and further agrees to exchange into yen currency \$50.00 for each month or fraction thereof. The currency will not be reconvertible to foreign exchange upon departure.
- c. The maximum period of extension will be 60 days.
- d. The period of extension must end sixty days prior to the termination date of Reentry Permit to subject's country of origin, or the lapse date of the passport.
- e. The number of extensions will be limited only by the termination date of the Reentry Permit of subject's country of origin or the lapse date of the passport.
- f. The names of applicants will be submitted to SCAP by the Japanese Government, for final approval of extension.
- g. The applications will be submitted by the Japanese Government once each week to reach SCAP at least 14 days prior to termination date of current visitor permit.
