MEMORANDUM FOR: JAPANESE GOVERNMENT

SUBJECT: Restitution of a 1940 Ford Sedan to
the Government of the United Kingdom

1. Reference is made to memorandum for the Japanese Government, file AG 386.6 (13 Feb 48)CPC/FP, SCAPIN 1858, 13 February 1948, subject, "Responsibilities of the Japanese Government for the Packaging, Transfer, and Delivery of Property being Restored to Claimant Nations under the Restitution Program," from General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers.

2. The Japanese Government is directed to restore to the Government of the United Kingdom a 1940 Ford sedan, engine No. 1A-5716, CPC No. B-3011, now in protective custody in the Setagaya Looted Property Warehouse, Tokyo.

3. The subject vehicle will be restored on 28 September 1949 at the Jeep Club Building, No. 77 RAAF Squadron, Iwakuni, Japan. Flight Lt. B. D. Hawthorne has been designated by the Government of the United Kingdom as the authorized representative to receive and give receipt for the said vehicle. The necessary release forms are inclosed.

4. The Japanese Government will designate by name an authorized representative to execute the receipt forms in its behalf and will notify General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers of his appointment upon receipt of this memorandum. The authorized representative of the Japanese Government will report to General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, Civil Property Custodian, for instructions on or before 21 September 1949.

5. The inclosed receipt forms, consisting of an original and five (5) copies, are to be signed by the authorized representatives of the Government of the United Kingdom and the Japanese Government and are to be distributed as follows:

MEMORANDUM FOR: THE JAPANESE GOVERNMENT

SUBJECT: Area Authorized for Japanese Fishing and Whaling

1. References:

a. Memorandum from General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers to Japanese Government, AG 800.217(22 Jun 46)NR, SCAPIN 1033, subject as above, 22 June 1946.

b. Memorandum from General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers to Japanese Government, AG 800.217(22 Jun 46)NR, SCAPIN 1033/1, subject as above, 23 December 1948.

2. Effective this date the memoranda referred to above are rescinded.

3. Effective this date and until further notice Japanese fishing, whaling and similar operations are authorized within the area bounded as follows: From a point midway between Nosappu Misaki and Kaigara Jima at approximately 43°23'14" North Latitude, 145°50'30" East Longitude; to 43° North Latitude, 146°30' East Longitude; thence to 45° North Latitude, 165° East Longitude; thence south along 165th Meridian to 40° North Latitude, 165° East Longitude; thence east to 180° East Longitude and 40° North Latitude; thence south along the 180th Meridian to 24° North Latitude; thence west along the 24th Parallel to 123° East Longitude; thence north to 26° North Latitude, 123° East Longitude; thence to 32°30' North Latitude, 125° East Longitude; thence to 33° North Latitude, 127°40' East Longitude; thence to 40° North Latitude, 135° East Longitude; to 45°30' North Latitude, 140° East Longitude; thence east to 45°30' North Latitude, 145° East Longitude rounding Soya Misaki at a distance of three (3) miles from shore; south along 145th Meridian to a point three (3) miles off the coast of Hokkaido; thence along a line three (3) miles off the coast of Hokkaido rounding Shiretoko Saki and passing through the Nemuro Kaikyo

to a point 43°26'17" North Latitude, 145°48'03" East Longitude; thence in a southeasterly direction to the starting point midway between Nosappu Misaki and Kaigara Jima.

4. Authorization in paragraph 3 above is subject to the provision that Japanese vessels will not approach closer than three (3) miles to any land area not under the present administration of the Japanese Government within the authorized area. Personnel from such vessels will not land on any such land areas, nor have contact with any inhabitants thereof, except in cases of serious emergency and provided permission to enter is obtained from local authority prior to such emergency entry.

5. The present authorization does not establish a precedent for any further extension of authorized fishing areas.

6. The present authorization is not an expression of allied policy relative to ultimate determination of national jurisdiction, international boundaries or fishing rights in the area concerned or in any other area.

Responsibilities of the Japanese Government for the transfer and delivery of the subject property are defined in reference 1a above. No packing will be required for transportation to the designated location. The necessary release forms are inclosed.

4. Major General G. Dollé has been designated by the French Government as the authorized representative to receive and give receipt for the subject property.

 - c. Remove all heads now in tables and pack in single unit cases. Pack each assembled table and stand as a unit in wooden crate with top and bottom section to allow for high storage
 - d. Bundle loose tables or parts in lots of 2, 4 or 6, whichever is most convenient for easy handling; each article such as tables, drawers, legs, bandwheels, etc., to be in separate lots

Consumption in 4th Quarter of 1949," and inclosures thereto.

2. Allocations of precious metals for use in the fourth quarter
of 1949 are approved as follows:

a. To maintain a minimum civilian standard of economy:

- (1) For mining industries: 181,230 grams silver, 4,588 grams gold, 1,435 grams platinum and 12 grams rhodium, will be released for use and consumption in implementing program approved by General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, Economic and Scientific Section.
- (2) For machinery and automotive industries: 607,613 grams silver, 756 grams gold, 2,536 grams platinum, 7 grams iridium and 142 grams rhodium, will be released for use and consumption in implementing program approved by General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, Economic and Scientific Section.
- (3) For printing and publishing industries: 995,374 grams silver will be released for use and consumption. Toyo Kagaku Kogyo K.K. and Hashimoto Kikinzoku Kogyo K.K. will process approved amounts of silver into silver nitrate for use by stated industries.
- (4) For other industries: 9,444,801 grams silver, 108 grams gold, 7,301 grams platinum, 22 grams rhodium, 100 grams iridium and 143 grams palladium, will be released for use and consumption in implementing program approved by General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, Economic and Scientific Section.

b. To conduct scientific research: 4,400 grams silver, .75 grams gold, 1,135 grams platinum, 2 grams osmium, 13 grams palladium, 2 grams

rhodium, 1 gram iridium, 22 grams gold foil and 100 grams gold liquid containing 5 grams gold will be released for use and consumption in implementing program approved by General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, Economic and Scientific Section.

c. To maintain communications and to manufacture products incident thereto: 514,733 grams silver, 18,989 grams gold, 2,972 grams platinum, 36 grams rhodium, 308 grams osmium and 106 grams iridium, will be released for use and consumption in implementing program approved by General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, Civil Communications Section.

d. To manufacture articles for religious uses: 10,152.5 grams gold in the form of gold foil, 257.5 grams gold dust. Released commercial forms will be used and consumed in the articles in shrines and temples and in the manufacture and decoration of home shrines or other articles of religious use or significance.

e. To maintain a minimum standard of dental health: 300,000 grams gold, 175,000 grams silver and 600 grams platinum will be released. Releases will be made only for use and consumption in implementing the program, reference 1 above, submitted to and approved by General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers.

f. To maintain a minimum standard of health and for use in the manufacture of medicines for possible export: 42,985 grams silver, 72 grams gold, 341.8 grams platinum, 10 grams palladium and 25,500 grams silver foil will be released for use and consumption in implementing program reference 1 above submitted to and approved by General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers. No more than 505 grams silver will be released to Dozaka Seisakusho K.K.

3. Processors itemized in reference 1 above may be licensed by the Japanese Government without further approval.

4. All precious metals herein authorized for use and consumption will be taken from Japanese Government stockpile, except 16,229.7 grams platinum, which will be released from custody of the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers. Prior to the release of this platinum, the Japanese Government is directed to deliver into custody at the U. S. Vaults, Bank of Japan, Tokyo, 31,996 grams gold in the form of ingots of mint or near mint fineness. Following such delivery, platinum in the amount above stated will be released to authorized Japanese Government representatives against signed receipts.

SUBJECT: Delivery of the Chinese Vessel SS "Chien Tai"

1. Reference is made to memorandum for the Japanese Government, file AG 560 (17 Sep 47)CPC/PLD, SCAPIN 6515-A, 12 April 1949, subject, "Repairing and Refitting of the SS 'Chien Tai' (Japanese name 'Kentai Maru')," from General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers.

2. The Japanese Government is directed to sail the SS "Chien Tai" from Tokyo, Honshu, Japan to Kaohsiung (Takao), Formosa, via Nagasaki, Kyushu, Japan. At Nagasaki, on or about 30 September 1949, the vessel will rendezvous with the SS "Chung Hsing" and will then proceed in the company of that vessel to Kaohsiung, where both vessels are to be delivered in restitution to the Chinese Government. The SS "Chien Tai" is to be towed during part of the voyage by the SS "Chung Hsing."

3. It will be the responsibility of the Japanese Government to fully man, fuel, water and provision the SS "Chien Tai" prior to its departure from Japanese waters. Arrangements have been made by the Chinese Government for the vessel to be supplied with additional fuel at Keelung, Formosa, if necessary, before continuing to the port of delivery.

4. The inclosed receipt forms, one (1) original and five (5) copies, are to be delivered to the captain of the SS "Chien Tai," who has been designated the authorized representative of the Japanese Government to execute the receipt forms in its behalf. 2. In accordance with the directives referred to in paragraph 1
above, the Japanese Government will include as a part of the report en-
titled "Proposed Allocations By Detailed End Uses by SCAP Section" (See
paragraph 5b of the Memorandum referred to in paragraph 1b above), the
quantity and types of petroleum products required by Japanese contractors
in fulfillment of procurement demands and communication orders issued by
the occupation forces.

3. The Japanese Government will effect a consolidation of two re-
ports prepared by the Special Procurement Board and the Ministry of
Telecommunication, respectively. These reports will be consolidated by
the Economic Stabilization Board, who will assign to each line item an
appropriate "end use" classification number in accordance with the pro-
cedure currently in force.

4. In preparation of this summation of requirements, the Japanese
Government should consider the points discussed below:

a. Supply Procurement Demands.

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under this "end use" should be carefully screened to insure that they are within the quantity approved by the Special Procurement Board at the time the procurement demand was initially approved. Procurement demands in this category will not include petroleum products to be used in the transportation of either raw materials or finished goods. It is considered that the requirements for transportation are provided for in the overall allocation of petroleum under the jurisdiction of the Ministry of Transportation.

b. Service Procurement Demands.

The quantity and types of petroleum products to be allocated under this "end use" shall be restricted to services in which the transportation of persons is the end item procured. Care should be exercised to insure that the quantity of petroleum products requested is within the amount prescribed by the Special Procurement Board at the time the procurement demand was initially approved. Allocation of petroleum products required for this purpose will not include petroleum products to be used for the transport of goods, since these requirements have been provided for in the overall allocation of petroleum for vehicles under the jurisdiction of the Ministry of Transportation.

c. Construction Procurement Demands.

The quantity and types of petroleum products to be allocated under this "end use" should be screened to insure that there is no duplication between the requirements for transportation as provided for in the overall allocation under the jurisdiction of the Ministry of Transportation and the quantity required for the accomplishment of the project. In explanation of the foregoing statement it is recognized that the Ministry of Transportation is responsible for all automotive requirements, and that the Special Procurement Board is responsible for the allocation of petroleum to other than automotive uses. Thus, the vehicles used in transporting material to the job-site, and on the project itself should receive their allocation of petroleum from the Ministry of Transportation, but the requirements for gasoline engine powered cement mixers, air compressors, or other similar equipment should be provided for by the Special Procurement Board. It is obvious that the maintenance of close coordination between the agencies referred to herein is essential.

d. The Japanese Government will utilize indigenously produced substitute fuels wherever possible. In the event that procurement demand receiving officers insist upon petroleum consuming equipment being furnished, the Japanese Government will submit the facts to General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, for decision.

5. The provisions of this directive will be incorporated in the proposed allocation for the month of December 1949.

The report will include affirmative findings supporting Japanese ownership or will identify any interest held subsequent to 7 December 1941 by any non-Japanese national or firm owned or controlled by non-Japanese interests.

4. Following acceptance of report directed by paragraph 3 above, items received, containing or composed of precious metals, may be melted, refined or retained in their present form for use by the Japanese Government as authorized by present directives. No such item or items will be released to industry for use or consumption except as authorized by approved pro-cedures. However, as required to maintain approved quantities of stocks, the commercial forms may be released to the members of the pool of commercial products under the supervision of the Ministry of Finance, Japanese Government.

2. The radio frequencies for use by the 1949-1950 Japanese Whaling Expedition will be as authorized in Inclosure 1.
3. The Board of Fisheries of the Ministry of Agriculture and Forestry will act as the Communication Agent in Japan for all official messages to and from the whaling fleet, including the Taiyo Gyogyo K. K. (Ocean Fishing Company), the Nippon Suisan K. K. (Marine Products Company), and those observers accompanying the whaling fleet with the authorization of the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers.
4. Any communications between Japan and the whaling fleet, except personal messages, will be transmitted or received by the Japanese coastal radio service only when addressed through the Communications Agent for the whaling fleet named in paragraph 3. A file copy of all messages sent or received through the Communications Agent will be retained in a readily accessible file by that Board.
5. Personal messages are authorized to and from members of the crews of the Japanese whaling fleet ships and their families in Japan. Copies of these messages will be retained in separately maintained files at the coastal station receiving such messages.

6. a. Personal messages addressed to any crew member of the whaling fleet ships will be accepted at any regularly designated filing point in the Japanese Domestic Telegraph system and dispatched via the Japanese coastal radio service.

b. Personal messages from crew members of the whaling ships to addresses in Japan will be accepted by the ship of origin and transmitted to

8. Communications including personal messages, between Japanese nationals, to and from the whaling fleet, will be subject to all existing rules and requirements of censorship.

9. Messages pertaining to the navigation of Japanese whaling vessels, meteorological observations, and fishing data, may be sent in the following codes:

a. Telegraph code of the Board of Fisheries, Ministry of Agriculture and Forestry.

b. The Nippon Suisan's telegraph code for fishery information.

c. The Taiyo Gyogyo's telegraph code for fishery information. Correct copies of these codes will be deposited with the Civil Censorship Detachment, G-2 Section, General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers and with the Board of Fisheries, Ministry of Agriculture and Forestry.

10. With respect to the navigation of vessels, meteorological observations, and fishing data, the Japanese whaling fleet is authorized radio communication with the following:

a. Other vessels of the authorized Japanese whaling fleet.

b. Radio stations of the Japanese coastal radio service.

c. Whaling vessels of other nations.

1. Rescission. Memorandum for the Japanese Government, AG 000.92 (27 Dec 1948) GC-0, SCAPIN 1957, 6 January 1949, subject, "Earthquake Reports and Tidal Wave Forecasts," is rescinded.

2. Effective upon receipt of this memorandum the Japanese Government will:

a. Organize an efficient and expeditious system of disseminating tidal wave warnings to the indigenous population.

b. Concurrently, furnish to the Occupation Forces geophysical reporting and forecasting services as hereinafter specified.

3. In organizing the warning system for the indigenous population the Japanese Government should:

a. Make maximum use of existing geophysical reporting and forecasting installations.

b. Make maximum use of existing communication systems, including telephone and telegraph both public and exclusive, and radio.

c. Adopt procedures similar to those required (paragraphs 5 and 6, below) for the Occupation Forces.

d. Make provision for periodic tests of the communications system.

e. Adapt the system to the provisions of the National Disaster Law.

f. Arrange for handling traffic as supervisory operational, or as a service matter without billing between agencies and without treating the service as a special expense item.

4. The warning system specified in paragraph 2a, above, should be organized within sixty days of receipt of this memorandum. Within the following thirty-day period one practical test of the warning system should be

completed. Prior to the conduct of the first periodic test the Civil Communications Section, General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers will be notified.

5. a. In each instance that an earthquake of intensity 3, or greater, is recorded by the instruments of the Central Meteorological Observatory or its subordinate reporting stations, an immediate report will be made to the Occupation Forces. This report will contain the following information:

- (1) The intensity of the earthquake.
- (2) The location of the epicenter of the earthquake.
- (3) The time the earthquake occurred, expressed in Greenwich Mean Time.
- (4) Whether or not a tidal wave will result from the reported disturbance.
- (5) If a tidal wave is forecast to result from the quake, the estimated size of the wave and a forecast of what areas will be affected by the wave.

b. The required report will be prepared with the utmost speed consistent with technical accuracy, and will be transmitted by telephone to the Haneda Weather Central, Haneda Airport, telephone number Cargo 391. The telephone report will be confirmed in writing in English.

c. The Central Meteorological Observatory will be prepared to render the above required telephone report at any hour of the day or night. It is required that the telephone report be transmitted with minimum delay, and that the data necessary to make the report be assembled with the greatest urgency.

6. The written confirmation of the telephone report will be prepared in duplicate and will be delivered to the Central Liaison and Coordination Office at such time that it will be delivered to General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers not later than the day following the day in which the earthquake occurred.

7. Since the warning system herein is primarily a function of government for benefit of the indigenous population, the services specified will not be covered by procurement instrument.



is not in the possession, custody, or control of the United Nations national owner. Costs of preservation and protection of such property and custodial administrative expenses are the obligation of the Japanese Government. The term "property" is defined to include money and bank deposits.

4. The custodians appointed by the Japanese Government will not be permitted to withdraw funds from accounts of nationals of the United Nations except in cases where the funds will be used to pay long-range obligations incurred by the United Nations national prior to 7 December 1941, or to pay house or land taxes to which the national is subject under existing regulations of the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers.

5. The Japanese Government is hereby authorized to approve, without prior submission to General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, routine applications for withdrawals from accounts of nationals of the United Nations of the following types only:

a. Applications to withdraw funds to pay rental obligations made prior to 7 December 1941

b. Applications to withdraw funds to pay house or land taxes.

The authority granted herein shall be applicable only where title to the property concerned still remains in the name of the United Nations national. The withdrawal will be made only from the account representing current income from the property and will not be taken from funds representing pre-war bank deposits or proceeds from the sale and income from other properties. In any instance where the income from the property is not sufficient to pay taxes or other approved charges, the application will be submitted to General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, Civil Property Custodian.

6. Any applications which fall in the categories listed in paragraph 5 above, but which are unusual in amount of money involved, in terms of agreement, or the like, or any other applications which the Japanese Government considers should be paid, will be submitted to General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, Civil Property Custodian. Every application submitted to General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, Civil Property Custodian for approval will include a statement explaining in detail the purpose for which the withdrawal will be made.


7. The Japanese Government is further directed to submit a monthly report of all applications for withdrawal of funds from accounts which are approved on the basis of this directive. This report will indicate the following:

MEMORANDUM FOR: JAPANESE GOVERNMENT

SUBJECT: Restoration of Motor Vehicles and Automotive Parts to Standard-Vacuum Oil Company

1. Reference is made to the following:

a. Memorandum for the Japanese Government, file AG 386.3 (22 Apr 48)CPC/FP, SCAPIN 1880, 22 April 1948, subject, "Procedures for Restoration of Property in Japan to Nationals of the United Nations," from General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers

b. Memorandum for the Ministry of Finance, file 095 (10 Dec 48)CPC/FP, 10 December 1948, subject, "Property in Japan Owned on 7 December 1941 by Standard-Vacuum Oil Company," from General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, Civil Property Custodian

c. LO 1014/49 (AD/FP), 31 March 1949, subject, "Report on the Property of Standard Vacuum Oil Company."

2. The Japanese Government is directed to return to Standard-Vacuum Oil Company, in accordance with the provisions of reference 1a above, all available motor vehicles owned on 7 December 1941 by Standard-Vacuum Oil Company, the locations of which are indicated in the report referred to in paragraph 1c above. Property to be returned will include motor vehicles, automotive equipment, and parts which are at the locations referred to above, as well as any such properties belonging to subject company which are not now at these locations and which have been or may subsequently be found. Restoration of subject property will proceed in the following manner:

a. Motor vehicles Nos. 144, 156, 162, 166, 167, 170, 175, 180, 181, 189, 191, 194, 200, 208, and 209, together with automotive equipment and parts, will be returned to Standard-Vacuum Oil Company at their present locations.

b. All other motor vehicles, together with automotive equipment and parts, regardless of condition, will be delivered to the Standard-Vacuum Oil Company installation located nearest to the present location of such vehicles and/or automotive equipment and parts.

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
