MEMORANDUM FOR: JAPANESE GOVERNMENT

SUBJECT: Tokyo Kaiwan Pilot District

1. The Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers deems compulsory pilotage of Non-Japanese vessels in the outer-Tokyo Bay area no longer necessary. Accordingly, Memorandum from the Supreme Commander of the Allied Powers, file AG 548 (10 Nov 47)CTS-W, SCAPIN 4855-A, 10 November 1947, subject, "Tokyo Kaiwan Pilots Association, formation of," is rescinded.

2. It is desired that the Japanese Government take the necessary action to provide the minimum number of qualified pilots for the Yokosuka-Yokohama-Tokyo harbor areas.

3. Charter and operating procedures of the Association authorized by the Maritime Safety Agency, Ministry of Transportation, to furnish pilot services in the Yokosuka-Yokohama-Tokyo Harbors will be submitted within thirty (30) days to the Maritime Safety Agency and shall be subject to approval of the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers.

4. The Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers reserves the right to exclude from employment as pilots on Allied Vessels any pilot of the Association deemed unfit. This is not to be so construed as to affect the rights of the pilot as a member of the Association.

5. Pilot station boat "ARB-870" may be retained in custody of the Maritime Safety Agency, Ministry of Transportation, and utilized as coast patrol for the saving of life and property and enforcement of law in the harbors, bays, sounds and waters adjacent to Japan. It shall not be armed and is subject to recall by the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers within thirty (30) days on order of the Commander, Naval Forces, Far East.

6. Communication and liaison between the Maritime Safety Agency, Ministry of Transportation, and Public Safety Division, G-2, GHQ, SCAP is authorized.

7. Priority of pilotage requests to the Association shall be established, when necessary, by Commander, Fleet Activities for

MEMORANDUM FOR: JAPANESE GOVERNMENT

SUBJECT: Japanese Antarctic Whaling Expedition, 1949-50.

1. Reference is made to Memorandum for the Japanese Government from General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, AG 800.217 (7 Jul 49)NR/F1, SCAPIN 6693-A, subject: "Japanese Whaling Operations in the Antarctic in the 1949-1950 Season", 7 July 1949.

2. The following-named officer of the United States Army and officer of the French Navy will accompany the Japanese whaling fleets on their voyage to the Antarctic as representatives of the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers:

Lieutenant Colonel Chester A. Lee

Lieutenant Commander Francois Bourgois

3. The above-named individuals will accompany the Japanese whaling fleets to insure Japanese compliance with the terms of International Whaling Conventions and directives of the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers relating to the whaling industry.

4. During the period of the voyage, these representatives will be acting under instructions of the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers. They will be given all possible assistance in accomplishing their missions and extended fullest consideration and courtesy.

5. Changes or additions to directives of the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers which are required by exigencies of unforeseen conditions will be referred to the representatives of the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers for decision.

6. All necessary contact with nationals of other countries will be conducted by the representatives of the Supreme Commander.

7. Radio communication facilities aboard the whaling vessels will be available to the representatives of the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers at all times.

MEMORANDUM FOR: JAPANESE GOVERNMENT

SUBJECT: Restitution of Singer Sewing Machines
Removed from French Indo-China

1. Reference is made to the following memoranda for the Japanese Government from General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers:

a. File AG 386.6 (13 Feb 48)CPC/FP, SCAPIN 1858, 13 February 1948, subject, "Responsibilities of the Japanese Government for the Packaging, Transfer, and Delivery of Property being Restored to Claimant Nations under the Restitution Program."

b. File AG 413.8 (25 Mar 49)CPC/PID, SCAPIN 6910-A, 17 October 1949, subject, "Restitution of Singer Sewing Machines Removed from French Indo-China."

2. The Japanese Government is directed to restore to the Government of the Republic of France 62 Singer sewing machines listed in inclosure 1, which were removed from French Indo-China and are now located at the Kizugawa Kanpon Looted Property Warehouse, Osaka. The necessary release forms are inclosed.

3. Responsibilities of the Japanese Government for the packaging, transfer, and delivery of the subject property are defined in reference 1a above. The subject sewing machines will be packed in accordance with the following instructions:

a. Remove dust thoroughly from all unpacked heads and tables.

b. Pack all unpacked heads in wooden cases, one head to the case.

c. Remove all heads now in tables and pack in single unit cases. Pack each assembled table and stand as a unit in wooden crate with top and bottom section to allow for high storage.

d. Bundle loose tables or parts in lots of 2, 4 or 6, whichever is most convenient for easy handling; each article such as tables, drawers, legs, bandwheels, etc., to be in separate lots.

e. Sort and pack in separate cases all loose small parts, clearly marking the quantities and contents therein on the outside of each case.

f. Mark clearly on the outside of each case containing sewing machine heads, the serial and CPC numbers of the machine. Verification of serial numbers will be made during the packing.

g. Deliver all stands and tables first. When this has been completed, deliver the heads.

4. The subject sewing machines will be restored at the Singer Sewing Machine Company Warehouse, No. 15, 4-chome, Hama-dori, Dojima, Fukushima-ku, Osaka, on 31 October 1949 at 1100 hours.

5. Mr. M. Mornand has been designated by the Government of the Republic of France to receive and give receipt for the subject sewing machines.

6. The Japanese Government will designate by name an authorized representative to execute the receipt forms in its behalf and will notify General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers of his appointment upon receipt of this memorandum.

7. The inclosed receipt forms, consisting of an original and five (5) copies, are to be signed by the authorized representatives of the Government of the Republic of France and the Japanese Government, and are to be distributed as follows:

a. Original and one (1) copy to be returned to General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers.

b. Two (2) copies to be retained by the Government of the Republic of France.

3. The numbers described above, representing existing rights are for the additional purpose of identification but, if for any reason these numbers are not available for installation, numbers may be substituted therefor provided the services afforded are identical to those provided under the rights indicated.

4. If for any reason, services cannot be installed as directed herein, the Japanese Government will immediately verbally so notify General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, Civil Property Custodian, immediately to be confirmed in writing at a subsequent date, stating the reason in each case.

5. Installation shall be made in the name and on behalf of the Tripartite Trustee Account. Said installations shall be made without charges of any kind, and shall be exempt from the provisions of any

Japanese Government law, ordinance, or regulation which may require deposits, purchase of bonds or similar financial requirements. Such exemption does not apply to subsequent transfer of these services.

6. Immediately upon completion of installation of the services directed herein, transfer of the services shall be made to the designated transferees at the addresses indicated in paragraph 2 preceding.

7. Transfers directed by paragraph 6 above, shall be made in conformity with existing Japanese Government laws, ordinances or any regulations pertaining to such.

8. Reference paragraph 1c above, directs the Japanese Government to install telephone service under the following vested German telephone right:

1. Reference is made to memorandum for the Japanese Government, file AG 386.3 (22 Apr 48)CPC/FP, SCAPIN 1880, 22 April 1948, subject, "Procedures for Restoration of Property in Japan to Nationals of the United Nations," from General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers.

2. Effective 1 November 1949, the following paragraphs of memorandum referenced in paragraph 1 above are revised to read:

a. Paragraph 9:

"Restoration will be made in accordance with the following provisions:

a. The Civil Property Custodian, General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers will issue a restoration memorandum in each case of restoration to the appropriate Japanese Government agency, with an information copy to the Secretariat of the Cabinet, Japanese Government. Such memorandum will contain necessary detailed instructions which apply to the particular property concerned.

b. Upon receipt of the restoration memorandum, the appropriate agency of the Japanese Government will effect transfer of title in accordance with instructions contained in such memorandum. Such appropriate agency will furnish documentary evidence of such transfer of title, together with a complete inventory of property being restored and an official final report on the administration of the property from the date of wrongful transfer or seizure, to date of restoration, such report to include a statement of financial transactions and, in case of industrial or commercial concerns, a closing balance sheet. Copies of documentary evidence of transfer of title, inventory and report on administration will be attached to each copy of the receipt referred to in paragraph d hereof.

c. An agreed statement as to the extent and condition of the property being returned will be drawn up at the time of restoration and will be signed by both the restorer and an authorized

representative of the Japanese Government. A copy of this statement will be attached to each copy of the receipt referred to in paragraph d hereof.

d. Receipt in the form of the "Receipt for Restoration to United Nations National of Property in Japan" attached hereto and containing all provisions therein, will be executed in original and seven copies and will be distributed in accordance with distribution indicated on the receipt form. All copies will be signed by the restoree and an authorized representative of the Japanese Government. Additional provisions may be included if circumstances require. Distribution of accomplished receipts will be made within ten days from date of signing of the receipt. The signing of the receipt will take place at such location as may be mutually agreeable to the restoree and the Japanese Government agency concerned.

e. All documents and reports referred to in these instructions will be in the English language and those which are translations into English will bear a certification as to correctness and authenticity."

b. Paragraph 10:

"Direct communication between the Civil Property Custodian, General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers and appropriate agencies of the Japanese Government is hereby authorized in the implementation of the instructions herein contained. Copies of all such communications will be furnished to the Secretariat of the Cabinet, Japanese Government."

MEMORANDUM FOR: JAPANESE GOVERNMENT

SUBJECT: Amendments to the International Convention for the Regulation of Whaling, signed at Washington, D. C., 2 December 1946

1. Reference is made to Memorandum for the Japanese Government from General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, AG 800.217(23 Nov 48)NR/F1, SCAPIN 1942, subject: Whaling Industry, 23 November 1948.

2. The attention of the Japanese Government is invited to the following resolutions passed by the International Whaling Commission at its first meeting in London during the period 30 May 1949 to 10 June 1949:

Resolution 10

"That paragraph 7 (a) of the Schedule to the Convention of 1946 be amended by deleting '15th December' and '1st April' and substituting '22nd December' and '7th April' respectively."

Resolution 11

"That the regulation forbidding the taking of humpback whales by Factory Ships south of 40° South Latitude be amended so that a maximum of 1,250 humpback whales may be taken in this region during each of the pelagic whaling seasons 1949/1950 and 1950/1951."

Resolution 12

"That in pursuance of the provisions of Article VII of the Convention, notification of data on the number of humpbacks taken shall be reported directly from the expeditions to the Bureau of International Whaling Statistics, Sandefjord, Norway, within two days after the end of each calendar week. The Bureau of International Whaling Statistics shall determine on the basis of the data provided, the date on which the maximum catch of humpbacks shall be deemed to have been reached. The

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expeditions shall be notified directly four days before the closing date. Simultaneous notification shall be sent to the Contracting Governments and to the Commission."

Resolution 13

"That for clarification purposes, the following new para. 10 be substituted for the existing para. 10 in the Schedule to the 1946 Convention:

"10.(a) It is forbidden to use a land station under the jurisdiction of a Contracting Government, and whale catchers attached to such land stations, for the purpose of taking or treating baleen whales except as permitted by the Contracting Government in accordance with sub-paragraph (b) of this paragraph.

"(b) Each Contracting Government shall declare for all land stations under its jurisdiction, and whale catchers attached to such land stations, one open season during which the taking or treating of baleen whales shall be permitted. Such open season shall be for a period of not more than six consecutive months in any period of twelve months and shall apply to all land stations under the jurisdiction of a Contracting Government; provided that a separate open season may be declared for any land station used for the taking or treating of baleen whales which is more than 1,000 miles from the nearest land station used for the taking or treating of baleen whales under the jurisdiction of the same Contracting Government.

"(c) Notwithstanding the prohibition in sub-paragraph (a) of this paragraph, the treatment of whales which have been taken during an open season may be completed after the end of such open season.

"(d) The prohibitions contained in this paragraph shall apply to all land stations as defined in Article II of the Whaling Convention of 1946 and to all factory ships which are subject to the regulations governing the operation of land stations under the provisions of paragraph 17 of this Schedule."

3. The Japanese Government is hereby notified that the provisions of Article V of the Convention of 1946 having been met on 10 October 1949 in regard to the amendments proposed in Resolutions 10, 11, 12, and 13, those amendments have come into effect as of that date. The Japanese Government will take

2. The memorandum for the Japanese Government, reference paragraph 1a above is hereby rescinded.

3. Confirming previous verbal instructions, effective 15 October 1949 all Japanese Government deposits of funds owned or controlled by the United States, United Kingdom and France under the provisions of the memorandum for the Japanese Government, reference paragraph 1b above, will be made to the "Tripartite Trustee Account (Yen)," in the National City Bank of New York, Tokyo Branch.

4. In making deposits to the "Tripartite Trustee Account (Yen)," in the National City Bank of New York, Tokyo Branch, the Japanese Government will follow the procedure outlined below:

a. The inclosed sample form "Schedule of Japanese Government Deposits" will be completed in quadruplicate by a representative of the Japanese Government each time a deposit is made. Reproduction of this form is authorized in pre-numbered quadruplicate sets. Each set will consist of:

- (1) The original or "CPC" copy
- (2) A second or "NCB" copy
- (3) A third or "NCB-CPC" copy
- (4) A fourth or "JG" copy

b. Signed deposit slips (the bank's ordinary deposit slips) in quadruplicate will be secured from the bank covering each deposit

c. The "CPC" copy of the completed "Schedule of Japanese Government Deposits" together with one copy of the bank's signed deposit slip, will be delivered by a representative of the Japanese Government to General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, Civil Property Custodian, Accounts Division, immediately (same day) after deposits have been made

d. The "NCB" and the "NCB-CPC" copies, with the bank's deposit slips attached, will remain with the bank

e. The Japanese Government will retain the "JG" copy with a bank deposit slip for its own files

f. The "Schedule of Japanese Government Deposits" form will serve as the official Japanese Government report which has been or will be directed to be filed in connection with deposits. No other report need be prepared, unless there is some variance between the deposit actually made, and the deposit directed to be made.

5. The Japanese Government, Ministry of Finance, is further directed within ten (10) days of receipt of this memorandum to send representatives to General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, Civil Property Custodian, to coordinate the procedures outlined in the preceding paragraphs.

6. Concerning funds other than those to be deposited in the "Tripartite Trustee Account (Yen)," (i.e., funds of Japanese Dissolved Organizations, Korean Repatriates, Puppet Governments), the Japanese Government will continue, as directed, to deposit such funds in the "Custody Account for the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers," in the Bank of Japan.

7. Direct communication is authorized among the General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, Civil Property Custodian, the National City Bank of New York, Tokyo Branch, and the Japanese Government, Ministry of Finance, in all matters relating to the subject vested funds account.

MEMORANDUM FOR: JAPANESE GOVERNMENT

SUBJECT: Residual Proceeds from Special Liquidation Activities with Respect to Certain Closed Institutions

1. References are:

- a. Imperial Ordinance No. 74 of 8 March 1947 as amended by Cabinet Order 251 of 21 August 1948 and related implementations.
- b. SCAPIN No. 74, 30 September 1945, Closing of Colonial and Foreign Banks and Special Wartime Institutions.

2. The Japanese Government is directed to set up accounts in the Bank of Japan for the purpose of sequestering and holding residual proceeds, if any, of closed institutions whose head offices and/or principal activities were located outside the area now known as Japan. These residual proceeds represent assets remaining after the payment or provision for payment of specific claims above the level of debenture and stockholder interests against the offices, branches or agencies in Japan and such proceeds will be held intact in the Bank of Japan accounts until instructions from this headquarters designate further action.

3. Direct communication between Ministry of Finance, Bank of Japan and interested Staff Sections of General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers is authorized to implement this memorandum.

MEMORANDUM FOR: JAPANESE GOVERNMENT

SUBJECT: Restitution of Typewriters and Stuffed Birds to the Government of the Republic of the Philippines

1. Reference is made to memorandum for the Japanese Government, file AG 386.6 (13 Feb 48) CPC/FP, SCAPIN 1858, 13 February 1948, subject, "Responsibilities of the Japanese Government for the Packaging, Transfer and Delivery of Property being Restored to Claimant Nations under the Restitution Program," from General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers.

2. The Japanese Government is directed to restore to the Government of the Republic of the Philippines one hundred and one (101) typewriters listed in inclosure 1 and twelve (12) stuffed birds. These properties were removed from the Philippines and are now located at the Hakozaki Looted Property Warehouse, Tokyo.

3. The subject machines are to be packed for shipment as freight and the stuffed birds are to be packed for shipment in a box suitable for transport under tropical conditions and stowed aboard the claimant nation's vessel, the S. S. "Susana," which is scheduled to dock at Osaka on or about 15 November 1949. I-4 forms for the release of subject property are inclosed.

4. Major C. R. Velasco has been designated by the Government of the Republic of the Philippines to receive and give receipt for the subject property in its behalf.

5. The Japanese Government will designate by name an authorized representative to execute the receipt forms in its behalf and to receive further instructions as necessary and will notify General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, of his appointment upon receipt of this memorandum.

6. The inclosed receipt forms, consisting of an original and five (5) copies, are to be signed by the authorized representatives of the Government of the Republic of the Philippines and the Japanese Government, and are to be distributed as follows:

a. Original and one (1) copy to be returned to General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers
