d. Establishment by the Japanese Government Economic Stabilization Board of priorities in sales between eligible bidders.

6. A separate revenue account will be maintained by the Japanese Government to reflect the proceeds of any sales of the released items mentioned in paragraph 3 above. None of these items will be disposed of without a reasonable compensation to the Japanese Government based on current value; nor shall they be made available for use of any government agency except when a similar reasonable payment is made to the revenue account mentioned above from appropriated funds of the agency concerned.

7. The Japanese Government will submit periodic progress reports to, and as directed by, the Commanding General, Eighth Army, regarding disposition of SPB stocks.

8. Direct communication is authorized between the Commanding General, Eighth Army, and the Japanese Government with respect to release of stocks and between the Economic and Scientific Section, General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, and the Japanese Government with respect to the distribution of supplies, equipment and materials and the funding adjustments covered by this directive.

1. The land and water areas within the boundaries described below are designated as an air-to-ground bombing and gunnery range:

a. All the land within a mile of a point located at 40° 51' 59" north and 141° 23' 15" east, and the water areas of the Takase Gawa River within one mile of the point, except for a small cultivated area on the southwest perimeter of the semi-circular land danger area. Information concerning the exact land danger area boundary bordering on the excluded cultivated area will be forwarded to the Japanese Civil authorities of Aomori Prefecture through Military Government channels.

b. The water danger area is bounded on the north by a line drawn on a true north bearing of 58° from the northern tip of the land danger area; on the south by a line drawn on a true north bearing of 108° from the southern tip of the land danger area; on the east by an arc five miles from a point located at 40° 51' 59" north and 141° 23' 15" east; and on the west by the coastline between the northern and southern boundaries.

2. The inhabitants of Aomori Prefecture and the inhabitants of all ports in Iwate Prefecture will be informed of danger area boundaries and will be notified prior to each actual use of the range. When the range is used for periods in excess of fifteen (15) days, warning reminders will be disseminated to the inhabitants indicated above every fifteen (15) days. This information will be forwarded through Military Government units to local Japanese civil authorities.

SUBJECT: Deviation Report on Employment of Japanese Civilian Guards

1. Reference is made to letter from Central Liaison and Coordination Office, Tokyo, file No. C.L.C.O. Number 4066 (SPB No. 122), subject as above, dated 8 December 1948, and inclosure thereto which pertained to violations of the provisions of SCAPIN 1872 wherein it was stated that 170 guards had been employed in the Oita Prefecture during the period 1 June thru 24 July 1948 without being covered by proper procurement instruments.

2. Investigation discloses that the above mentioned personnel were paid on 28 December 1948. Authority for the payment was substantiated by labor requisition issued to Oita Prefecture, 22 October 1948, by the labor officer, 19th Infantry Regiment, U. S. Army.

3. In the event any personnel are subsequently provided by the Japanese Government to the Occupation Forces without the issuance of proper procurement instruments, it is desired that an immediate report be made to the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers.

SUBJECT: Procedure for Handling Official United States Government Messages Filed at Tokyo for Transmission over Commercial Circuits

1. Reference is made to memoranda for the Japanese Government as follows:

a. File AG 311.3 (2 Aug 46) CCS, SCAPIN 1114, dated 8 August 1946, subject: Revised Procedure for the Handling of Official United States Government Messages Filed at Tokyo Destined to the United States, its Territories or Possessions.

b. File AG 311.23 (5 Apr 48) CCS, SCAPIN 1877, dated 5 April 1948, subject: Revised Procedure for Handling Press and Government Messages from Japan to the United States, Manila, Korea and Okinawa.

2. Effective 1 March 1949 SCAPIN 1114 is rescinded. Concurrently paragraph 2d of SCAPIN 1877 is rescinded and the following instructions will govern the handling of official United States Government messages:

a. United States Government messages, filed in accordance with the procedure prescribed in this memorandum, may be sent from Japan to any point to which service is available via American carrier routes. Incoming United States Government messages will be admitted into Japan over all available routes.

b. United States Government messages will be sent prepaid in both directions.

c. Such messages from Japan will emanate from the General Headquarters Communication Center, Dai Ichi Building, Tokyo and will be filed in duplicate by an authorized messenger from that activity with the Ministry of Communications' main acceptance office near the Central Telegraph Building. Ministry of Communications acceptance clerks will acknowledge receipt of each such message by entering the date, time of receipt, and their signature on the duplicate copy, returning same to the messenger.

d. The indicator "US GOVT" will be placed in the preamble of each such message which will otherwise be handled in accordance with international radiotelegraph regulations.

3. A monthly statement of services rendered will be submitted by the Ministry of Communications, in the same manner as those submitted for other services, covering the Japanese Government's share of the tolls for the transmission of United States Government messages. The Commanding General, Eighth Army will arrange payment of charges accruing to the connecting carriers.

4. The Ministry of Communications will prepare, in duplicate, a monthly statement showing all United States Government messages originating at Tokyo, itemized by filing dates, word count of each message, American carrier through which message was routed, amount of tolls to be credited to the Ministry of Communications, amount of tolls to be credited to the American carrier, including forwarding charges for messages destined to points beyond San Francisco or Manila. The monthly statement will be forwarded to Commanding General, Eighth Army, Yokohama (Attn: Signal Officer). The duplicate copy of the monthly statement will be delivered to General Headquarters, Far East Command, (Attn: Signal Officer).

5. Direct communication between the Civil Communications Section, General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, and the Ministry of Communications, concerning matters within the scope of this memorandum, is authorized.

MEMORANDUM FOR: JAPANESE GOVERNMENT

SUBJECT: Measures to Strengthen the Staple Food Rationing System

1. In order to strengthen the staple food distribution system, the Japanese Government will take all necessary measures to ensure that actual food distribution does not exceed the monthly food allocations to prefectures. Such measures will include but will not necessarily be limited to:

- a. Collection of accurate information concerning the ration population and land under cultivation by individuals classified as general consumers.
- b. Elimination of non-existent or "ghost" ration population.
- c. Definition of the maximum area of land an individual can cultivate and still be classified as a general consumer.
- d. Necessary reclassification of consumers affected by paragraph 1c.
- e. Elimination of unnecessary rationing to self-suppliers.

2. The Japanese Government will submit to the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers within ten days a written report indicating measures which will be taken to comply with this memorandum.

3. Direct communication between the Ministry of Agriculture and Forestry and the Economic and Scientific Section, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers is authorized for the purpose of implementing this memorandum.
