SUBJECT: Packaging Property of Repatriated German Nationals

1. Reference is made to the following memoranda to the Japanese
Government from General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied
Powers:

a. File AG 014.33 (13 Jan 47)GA, SCAPIN 1462, dated 13 January
1947, subject, "Repatriation of German and Austrian Nationals," in-
closure 3, paragraph 1h

b. File AG 014.33 (21 Jul 47)GA, SCAPIN 1750, dated 21 July
1947, subject, "Repatriation of German and Austrian Nationals," in-
closure 3, section II, paragraph 9

c. File AG 014.33 (10 Mar 48)GA, SCAPIN 1869, dated 10 March
1948, subject, "Repatriation of German Nationals"

d. File AG 014.33 (23 Nov 49)CPC/PLD, SCAPIN 6973-A, dated
23 November 1949, subject, "Construction of Boxes for Packaging Property
of Repatriated German Nationals."

2. The Japanese Government is directed to provide the necessary
labor and materials for the packing, crating, and stencilling of the
property of repatriated German nationals which is presently stored at
the Civil Property Custodian German Property Warehouse at Setagaya-ku,
Tokyo, in boxes built for that purpose under the provisions of reference
1d above. Each box is to be lined with water-proof paper, crated,
properly stencilled, and prepared for overseas shipment. The project
as outlined above will be supervised by the warehouse custodian and
will be completed within fourteen (14) days from the date of receipt
of this memorandum.

3. The Japanese Government is further directed to make the neces-
sary arrangements for transporting the packed boxes from the warehouse
referred to in paragraph 2 above to a designated pier in Yokohama,
Japan. The Japanese Government will be notified at a later date where and
when to transport the boxes but are to be prepared to move the boxes
within forty-eight (48) hours after such notification.

4. All expenses incurred will be borne by the Japanese Government.
Such expenses will be charged by the Japanese Government to the cost of
impounding German property and will not be charged to the cost of pre-
servation and maintenance of such property.

5. A representative of the Japanese Government will report to the Civil Property Custodian representative at the Setagaya Warehouse prior to the actual commencement of the project.

6. A report of completion of the work directed in paragraph 2 above will be made to General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers within thirty (30) days from the date of this memorandum.

2. The sale of the subject vessels to Mr. Bruce Aitchison has been cancelled, and the three ships have been resold to Mr. B. S. Lintag of the Philippine Reparations and Restitution Delegation. Under the terms of the sale, Mr. Lintag agreed to take delivery on or about 6 March 1950 and to assume, on that date, all responsibility for storage charges.

3. Mr. Aitchison, the original purchaser, has assumed the custody costs from 5 November 1949 to 5 December 1949; however, in view of the cancellation of the original sale, the custodial expense from the latter date through 5 March 1950 will be the responsibility of the Japanese Government.

5. Upon receipt, the Japanese Government will determine the computed net fine gram precious metals content of the articles and coins released as authorized by paragraph 2 above, and will report this ascertained content to Civil Property Custodian, General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, in a form similar to or the same as the form submitted subsequent to the release authorized by reference 1b above. Values and fine gram content will be determined as follows:

The Japanese Government is directed to restore to the Government of the United Kingdom, 505,457 kilograms of tin of which 222,625 kilograms are located at the Osaka Arsenal and Osaka Kizugawa Looted Property Warehouses and 282,832 kilograms at the Kurihama Looted Property Warehouse. The CPC numbers of the lots involved are shown on the inclosed warehouse release forms.

2. The tin which is located at the Osaka warehouses will be delivered on or about 9 April 1950 aboard the S.S. "Flying Cloud" at Kobe while the tin located at Kurihama will be delivered on or about 14 April 1950 aboard the same vessel at Yokohama. The Japanese Government is directed to establish and maintain contact with the Yokohama and Kobe offices of the A. P. Pattison & Co., Inc., agents for the ship, to ascertain the exact time for the loading of the property.

3. Mr. A. J. Bell of the United Kingdom Consulate at Kobe has been designated as the authorized representative of the Government of the United Kingdom to sign the receipt forms on its behalf at Kobe while Mr. E. A. D. Smith of the United Kingdom Reparations and Restitution Delegation has been designated as authorized representative of the Government of the United Kingdom to sign the receipt forms on its behalf at Yokohama.

4. The Japanese Government is directed to appoint an authorized representative to sign the receipt forms on its behalf and inform Civil Property Custodian, General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, of his appointment.

5. The inclosed two sets of receipt forms consisting each of one original and five copies are to be signed by the authorized representatives of the Government of the United Kingdom and the Japanese Government and are to be distributed as follows:

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

SUBJECT: Restitution of Machinery of the Chinese Vessel "Shinko Maru"

1. Reference is made to the following memoranda for the Japanese Government from General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers;

a. File AG 387.6 (22 Jul 47)REP, SCAPIN 1751, 22 July 1947, subject, "Responsibilities of the Japanese Government for the Packaging, Transfer and Delivery of Equipment and Records Allocated to Claimant Nations Under the Reparations Program"

b. File AG 386.6 (13 Feb 48)CPC/FP, SCAPIN 1858, 13 February 1948, subject, "Responsibility of the Japanese Government for the Packaging, Transfer and Delivery of Property being Restored to Claimant Nations under the Restitution Program"

c. File AG 560 (23 Aug 48)CPC/PLD, SCAPIN 6497-A/3, 21 February 1950, subject, "Chinese Vessel 'Shinko Maru.'"

2. Upon completion of the repairs and tests directed in reference 1c, the Japanese Government is directed to package for overseas shipment and to restore to the Government of the Republic of China the machinery removed from the Chinese vessel "Shinko Maru." Necessary L-4 form authorizing the release of this property by the Chikko Factory of the Hitachi Shipbuilding Company at Osaka, Honshu, Japan, is inclosed.

3. The procedures and specifications outlined in Annexes 4, 5, 6 and 7 to reference 1a are to be carefully followed in preparing this machinery for shipment. Particular attention is directed to paragraph 4b of Annex 5, pertaining to "Diesel Engines." Petroleum products required for the preservation of the machinery are to be supplied from indigenous sources. The responsibilities of the Japanese Government for the packaging and delivery of the subject property are defined in reference 1b. Specific instructions for marking the containers are attached. The Japanese Government will submit as soon as possible a list in sextuplicate giving the markings, contents, cubic measurements and weight of each box.

5. The Japanese Government will designate by name an authorized representative to execute the receipt in its behalf and will notify Civil Property Custodian, General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers of his appointment prior to 10 April 1950.

1. This memorandum supersedes Memorandum for the Japanese Government, File AG 400.12 (29 Oct 46)CCS, SCAPIN 1299/7, dated 8 April 1949, subject as above.

2. It is directed that the Japanese Ministry of Telecommunications provide communications services, facilities, equipment, material and personnel as follows:

a. Telephone exchange service wholly within an exchange area of a city or town, which can be furnished by use of existing telephone plant as covered in paragraph 4 below.

b. Long distance lines and telegraph circuits wholly within one Ministry of Telecommunications operating bureau or division which can be furnished by use of existing facilities, as covered in paragraph 5 below.

c. Communications personnel as covered by paragraph 5 below.

d. Long distance telephone and telegraph lines extending beyond the boundaries of any one operating bureau, bulk materials, construction and all other communications services, facilities, equipment, material and personnel not covered above as directed by General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers.

3. Statements of services rendered covering all communications services, facilities, equipment, material and personnel to be furnished to and/or for the occupation forces throughout Japan will be prepared on GPA Form 5 and submitted as provided by Appendix I.

4. Exchange service within the exchange area of a city or town, which can be furnished by use of existing facilities will be furnished by local offices in accordance with communications orders placed by Commanding General, Eighth Army or by his authorized representative. A representative of the Japanese Telecommunications system located in the city or town where service is requested will be authorized to furnish such service without approval of the operating bureau of the Ministry of Telecommunications.

SUBJECT: Rationalization of Japan's Maritime Mobile Telecommunications Services

1. Rescission.

a. AG 676,3 (5 Apr 47) CCS, SCAFIN 1603, dated 5 April 1947, subject: Reactivation of the Coastal Radio Service of the Japanese Ministry of Communications to Handle Ship-Shore Traffic for Allied Merchant Shipping, as amended.

2. Coincidentally with rescission of the memorandum listed in paragraph 1 above, the Japanese Government, Ministry of Telecommunications, is authorized to continue the subject telecommunications services on the basis of the conditions heretofore applicable to such services until such time as traffic and other agreements with foreign administrations or private foreign operating companies governing existing maritime mobile telecommunications services are made effective.

3. The Japanese Government, Ministry of Telecommunications in conformity with the provisions of the General Radio Regulations (Cairo Revision, 1938) annexed to the International Telecommunications Convention (Madrid, 1932) and the Radio Regulations, annexed to the International Telecommunications Convention (Atlantic City, 1947) with respect to Japanese maritime mobile telecommunications services presently in operation and which may be established in the future, is authorized to:

a. Renegotiate, with foreign administrations or private operating agencies, tariffs covering all maritime mobile telecommunications with Japan. Such tariffs to reflect rates expressed in gold francs between Japan and all countries served.

b. Re-establish land station, ship station and land line rates expressed in gold francs.

c. Negotiate, or renegotiate where necessary, service agreements with foreign administrations or private operating agencies. Such agreements to cover details of establishment and settlement of accounts, procedures, acceptance of traffic, and other related matters essential to the conduct of maritime mobile telecommunications services.

4. All traffic agreements and tariffs covering maritime mobile telecommunications services, negotiated between the Ministry of Telecommunications and foreign administrations or private operating agencies will be subject to

approval by the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers prior to implementation.

5. Simultaneous with effective date of implementation of the tariff and traffic agreements referred to in paragraph 4 above, the Ministry of Telecommunications is further authorized to establish rate schedules expressed in indigenous currency and collect all maritime mobile telecommunications charges in such currency.

6. The rate schedules, for collection of telecommunications charges in Japan, to be established in accordance with paragraph 5 above will be based upon the authorized yen/dollar conversion rate.

7. Within a period of not to exceed thirty (30) days from the date on which all charges for maritime mobile telecommunications services are paid in indigenous currency, the Ministry of Telecommunications will dispose of all non-indigenous currencies withheld for maritime mobile telecommunications change-making purposes and otherwise in possession of the Ministry of Telecommunications, by depositing the same with the appropriate transfer agent in exchange for an equivalent amount of indigenous currency computed at the authorized conversion rates.

8. In settlement of accounts agreements concluded with foreign administrations or private operating agencies, the Ministry of Telecommunications will reserve the right to pay or receive payment of net balances in terms of either U.S. dollars or English pounds sterling.

9. Sufficient foreign exchange funds will be made available to the Ministry of Telecommunications for payment of net balances due foreign administrations or private operating agencies. However, it will be the responsibility of the Ministry of Telecommunications to make known to the appropriate Japanese Government authorities, as may be required, its closest requirement estimate for inclusion in the foreign exchange budget. Dollar or sterling reimbursements, received by the Ministry of Telecommunications in settlement of favorable balances, will be disposed of in accordance with the provisions of the Foreign Exchange and Foreign Trade Control Law (1949).

10. Incoming and outgoing maritime mobile telecommunications will be made available for review in accordance with instructions issued by the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers.

11. No telecommunications are authorized which are in conflict with the Japanese Foreign Trade Control Law of 1949, orders, ordinances and regulations issued thereunder, or SCAP directives.

SUBJECT: Restitution of Copper and Brass Ingots and Copper Coins to the Government of the Republic of China

1. The Japanese Government is directed to restore to the Government of the Republic of China, 466,643 kilograms of copper and brass ingots now stored at the Osaka Arsenal Looted Property Warehouse and 329,451 kilograms of copper coins now stored at the Osaka Kizugawa Looted Property Warehouse. CPC numbers of the above-mentioned quantities are shown on the inclosed copies of the warehouse release forms.

2. The delivery of the subject property is to be made aboard the S.S. "Sir John Franklin" at Osaka on or about 24 April 1950. The Japanese Government is directed to contact the Osaka office of the A. P. Pattison Company, agents for the ship, to ascertain the exact time for the loading of the property.

3. Receipt forms pertaining to the above restitution will be signed at 1000 hours, 19 April 1950, at the office of the Civil Property Custodian, General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers. Mr. Woo Yeh of the Chinese Reparations and Restitution Delegation has been designated as authorized representative to sign the receipt forms on behalf of the Government of the Republic of China. The Japanese Government is directed to designate an authorized representative to sign the receipt forms on its behalf and inform Civil Property Custodian, General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, of his appointment.

4. The subject property will be released from the warehouses to an authorized representative of the Chinese Reparations and Restitution Delegation, upon presentation of three copies of the standard warehouse release forms.

5. The receipt forms pertaining to the above restitution will be available at the office of the Civil Property Custodian, General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, at the time of the signing. Inclosed is a copy of each of the warehouse release forms, indicating the lots to be restituted.

SUBJECT: Restitution of Curios and Household Effects Removed
from China

1. Reference is made to memorandum to the Japanese Government, file AG 386.6 (13 Feb 48)CPC/FP, SCAPIN 1858, 13 February 1948, subject, "Responsibilities of the Japanese Government for the Packaging, Transfer and Delivery of Property being Restored to Claimant Nations Under the Restitution Program," from General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers.

2. The Japanese Government is directed to restore to the Government of the Republic of China, curios and household effects designated by the Japanese Government as having been removed from China and now located at Hakozaki Looted Property Warehouse, Tokyo. Inclosed is a list of the items to be restituted.

3. Subject property will be boxed for overseas shipment and wrapped to protect the property from the harmful effects of moisture. Each box will be marked as indicated in inclosure two. Subject property is to be stowed aboard ship at Yokohama; the Japanese Government will be advised of the name of the ship and the date of its arrival as soon as this information is available. Inclosed are L-4 Forms which authorize the release of the subject property.

4. Mr. L. S. Liu and/or Mr. C. C. Lu have been designated as the authorized representatives of the Government of the Republic of China to receive and give receipt for the subject property.

5. The Japanese Government is to designate by name an authorized representative to execute receipt forms and will notify Civil Property Custodian, General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers of his appointment prior to 21 April 1950.

6. The inclosed receipt forms, consisting of an original and five (5) copies, are to be signed by the authorized representatives of the Government of the Republic of China and the Japanese Government and are to be distributed as follows:

a. Original and one (1) copy to be returned to Civil Property Custodian, General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers by representatives of the Japanese Government
