SUBJECT: Disposition of Remains of Japanese Personnel  
Killed on Okinawa

1. The remains of one hundred ninety-two (192) Japanese personnel killed on Okinawa will be shipped from Okinawa aboard the PEMBINA; the expected time of departure from Okinawa is 29 April 1950; the expected time of arrival in Yokohama is 3 May 1950.

2. The Japanese Government is hereby directed to arrange with the Naval Shipping Control Authority for Japanese Merchant Marine (SCAJAP) to assume custody of the remains upon their arrival in Japan.

SUBJECT: Restitution of Books to the Netherlands Government

1. 2. The Japanese Government is directed to restore to the Netherlands Government three (3) books, CPC Number 717-07, at present located at the National Diet Library, Ueno Branch, Tokyo. The subject property is to be delivered in restitution on 30 April 1950, at 1100 hours, Hattori Building, Room 305, Tokyo. Inclosed are L-4 Forms which authorize the release of the subject property.

3. Mr. M. G. Mout has been designated as the authorized representative of the Netherlands Government to receive and give receipt for the subject property.

4. The Japanese Government is to designate by name an authorized representative to execute receipt forms on its behalf and will notify General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers of his appointment upon receipt of this memorandum.

5. The inclosed receipt forms, consisting of an original and five (5) copies, are to be signed by the authorized representatives of the Netherlands Government and the Japanese Government and are to be distributed as follows:

SUBJECT: Restitution of Lead Removed from Burma

1. The Japanese Government is directed to restore to the Government of the United Kingdom, 117,999 kilograms of lead, CPC numbers as per inclosed release forms, of which 55,060 kilograms are located at present at the Osaka Arsenal and Osaka Kizugawa Looted Property Warehouses and 62,939 kilograms at the Kurihama Arsenal Looted Property Warehouse.

2. The lead which is located at the Kurihama warehouse will be delivered on or about 2 May 1950 aboard the S.S. "City of Chester" at Yokohama while the lead located at the Osaka warehouses will be delivered on or about 4 May 1950 aboard the same vessel at Kobe. Mr. W. E. Williams and Mr. A. E. Tragheim have been designated as the authorized representatives of the Government of the United Kingdom to sign the receipt forms on its behalf at Yokohama and Mr. J. S. Garrett and Mr. R. M. Burns have been designated as the authorized representatives of the Government of the United Kingdom to sign the receipt forms on its behalf at Kobe.

3. The Japanese Government is directed to establish and maintain contact with the Yokohama and Kobe offices of Messrs. Dodwell and Co., Ltd., agents for the ship, to ascertain the exact time for the loading of the property.

4. The Japanese Government is directed to appoint an authorized representative to sign the receipt forms on its behalf and inform Civil Property Custodian, General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, of his appointment.

5. The inclosed two sets of receipt forms consisting each of one original and five copies are to be signed by the authorized representatives of the Government of the United Kingdom and the Japanese Government and are to be distributed as follows:

a. Original and one copy of each to be returned to Civil Property Custodian, General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, by the representative of the Japanese Government

b. Two copies of each to be retained by the representative of the Government of the United Kingdom

1. Reference is made to demand charges payable under the C1 and C2 Rates set forth in the subject schedule.
2. In the C1 and C2 Rates, three methods of determining the demand charge are provided; however, this directive is concerned only with those demand charges which are based on computation.
3. In view of the facts that (1) an indicating or recording demand meter responds to seasonal demands and (2) that the electric rates are predicated on variable demand charges, it is reasonable that computed demands should also be subject to seasonal variation. This is particularly true since the use of computed demands is necessary only when, for the convenience of the utility company, demand meters are not yet in service.

4. It is therefore directed that during the months set forth below and, for the purpose of computing the demand in kilowatts, in those installations where no meters are installed, the contract connected load will be adjusted as follows:

a. Adjustment Factors:

Months	Electric Space Heating Used	Electric Space Heating Not Used
December through March	1.00	1.00
April, May, October and November	.75	.95
June through September	.50	.85

b. After adjusting the contract connected load by the above factors, the total demand in kilowatts will be determined by the increments and percentage factors set forth in the rates.

5. The aforementioned is an interim procedure for use until indicating or recording demand meters can be installed by the utility companies. This action will not be considered as eliminating or reducing the necessity for early installation of demand metering equipment.

SUBJECT: Survey of Tonan Maru No 3 Sunk in Truk Atoll.

1. Reference is made to memorandum for the Ministry of Transportation, MOT-W No 367 (VB), subject: Disposition of the Former Japanese Flag No 3 Tonan Maru Sunk 30°North Latitude or Southwards; 11 August 1949.

2. Permission to conduct a survey of the former Japanese Flag Tonan Maru No 3 in Truk Atoll to determine salvability is hereby granted.

3. The survey will be conducted under the following conditions:

a. The survey vessel Kimishima Maru, 698 gross tons, will be used for the survey and will be marked and operated in strict conformity with directives from the Administrator, US Naval Shipping Control Authority, for Japanese Merchant Marine.

b. All Japanese personnel in the survey group will comply with Japanese quarantine and immunization regulations, and with quarantine regulations of the Trust Territory.

c. The survey group will be completely provisioned for the voyage and no logistic support will be provided by the High Commissioner for the Trust Territories.

d. All Japanese personnel engaged in the survey will be subject to the Laws of the Trust Territory while in Truk Atoll.

e. No Japanese personnel will land on any of the islands of the Trust Territories, except for liberty parties specifically authorized by the Civil Administrator for Truk Atoll.

4. Direct radio communication between the survey vessel and Japanese coastal radio stations is hereby authorized.

5. Lt Col Chester A. Lee will accompany the survey group as representative of the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers to conduct all negotiations with the Civil Administrator of

SUBJECT: Release of Miscellaneous Coins

1. Reference is made to Memorandum for Japanese Government, file AG 410.2 (26 May 49)CPC/CD, SCAPIN 2009, 26 May 1949, subject, "Acquisition of Precious Metals," from General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers.

2. The Japanese Government, within ten (10) days of the publication of this communication, will receive from the Civil Property Custodian, General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, at the United States Vaults, Bank of Japan, Tokyo, the miscellaneous coins itemized in inclosure titled, "Schedule of Coins to be Released."

3. Upon receipt, the Japanese Government will ascertain the precious metal content of the coins:

a. Using standard coin publications if available

b. Based on the opinion of a competent coin expert in instances where the precious metal content of the coin or coins is not reported in standard publications.

4. A report will be submitted to the Civil Property Custodian, General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, of the computed precious metal content of the coins, ascertained as directed by paragraph 3 above, within sixty (60) days of the receipt of the property. Upon receipt of this report the Japanese Government will be directed to deposit into custody precious metal in standard forms having a value equal to 99.75% of the computed and recorded precious metal content of the coins.

5. United States market prices in effect at the time the Japanese Government receives the property from custody will be used in determining the precious metal content value of the items herein released.

SUBJECT: Release of Precious Metals and Miscellaneous Property

1. Reference is made to Memorandum for Japanese Government, file AG 410.2 (26 May 49)CPC/CD, SCAPIN 2009, 26 May 1949, subject, "Acquisition of Precious Metals," from General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers.

2. The Japanese Government, within thirty (30) days of the publication of this communication, will receive from the Civil Property Custodian, General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, United States Vaults, Osaka Branch, the precious metals and miscellaneous property itemized in inclosure titled "Schedule of Property to Be Released."

3. Upon receipt, the Japanese Government will determine the net fine gram precious metal content of the property itemized in Section I of the cited inclosure, using the following procedures:

a. Precious metal content of items which are melted, refined or otherwise treated, will be computed based on assay samples taken at the time of treatment.

b. Items with precious metal content, which the Japanese Government may elect to retain without treatment, may be examined by two impartial experts. These experts will estimate precious metal content of such items based on the usual content of identical or similar articles.

4. A report will be submitted to the Civil Property Custodian, General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, of the precious metal content of the items listed in Section I of cited inclosure, and computed as directed by paragraph 3 above, within sixty (60) days of the receipt of the property. Upon receipt of this report, the Japanese Government will be directed to deposit into custody:

a. Precious metal in standard forms having a value equal to 99.75% of the computed and reported precious metal content values of the property itemized in Section I of cited inclosure.

b. No deposit will be required for property itemized in Section II or for gems or the pearl contained in jewelry items released.

SUBJECT: Delivery of the Chinese Vessels SS "Rikin" ("Ninoshima Maru"), SS "Hephaestus" ("Rijun Maru"), and "Ferry Boat No. 2 of Shanghai Municipality" ("Takahashi Maru")

1. Reference is made to the following memoranda for the Japanese Government from General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers:

a. File AG 560 (23 Jul 47)CPC/PLD, SCAPIN 6991-A, 2 December 1949, subject, "Repairing and Refitting of the Chinese Tug 'Hephaestus' (Japanese name 'Rijun Maru')"

Upon satisfactory completion of a marine survey and sea trial of the SS "Rikin," scheduled to be conducted at Nagasaki on 26 April 1950, the Japanese Government is directed to sail the SS "Rikin," together with the SS "Hephaestus" and "Ferry Boat No. 2 of Shanghai Municipality" from Japan to Formosa for delivery in restitution to the Government of the Republic of China.

4. The SS "Hephaestus" is to be sailed from Kobe, Honshu, Japan on or about 28 April 1950, "Ferry Boat No. 2 of Shanghai Municipality" from Shimonoseki, Honshu, Japan on or about 29 April 1950, and the

SS "Rikin" from Nagasaki, Kyushu, Japan on or about 30 April 1950 for Kagoshima, Kyushu, Japan. The three ships will rendezvous at Kagoshima on or about 1 May 1950, and will sail together from that port on or about 3 May 1950 for Keelung, Formosa. At Keelung, the SS "Rikin" and SS "Hephaestus" will be delivered in restitution to the Government of the Republic of China. "Ferry Boat No. 2 of Shanghai Municipality" will proceed from Keelung to Kaohsiung, Formosa, where it will be delivered in restitution to the Government of the Republic of China.

5. It will be the responsibility of the Japanese Government to fully man, water and provision the three vessels and to fully fuel the SS "Rikin" and SS "Hephaestus" prior to their departure from Japanese waters. The Chinese Reparations and Restitution Delegation will provide from commercial sources in Japan the fuel oil for "Ferry Boat No. 2 of Shanghai Municipality," as well as other petroleum products required for the delivery voyage of all three vessels, but any expense for the transportation of such petroleum products within Japan will be the responsibility of the Japanese Government.

6. Arrangements will be made for water to be supplied to the SS "Hephaestus" at Naha and for other necessary supplies and harbor, repair and communication facilities to be made available at that port, as well as at Koniya and Ishigaki should it be necessary to enter those ports in case of emergency.

7. The Government of the Republic of China will provide billeting and subsistence for the Japanese crews while at the ports of delivery and will be responsible for their prompt repatriation to Japan.

8. The inclosed three sets of receipt forms, consisting each of one (1) original and five (5) copies, are to be delivered to the captain of each vessel concerned, who will be designated to execute the forms in behalf of the Japanese Government. All copies of the receipt forms are to be signed by the authorized representatives of the Government of the Republic of China and the Japanese Government, and are to be distributed as follows:

SUBJECT: Trade-Marks, Trade Names, and Marking of Merchandise in Japan

1. Reference is made to memorandum for the Japanese Government, file AG 072 (9 Sep 49)CPC/FP, SCAPIN 2042, 9 September 1949, subject as above, from General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers.

2. In this memorandum, the term "Allied National" shall mean a person whose property was treated as enemy property by the Japanese Government or whose property rights lapsed owing to the existence of hostilities between Japan and the country of that national or whose property rights, as a result of conditions growing out of World War II, could not be exercised before the date of the outbreak of hostilities between Japan and the country of the national concerned.

3. The Japanese Government is directed to provide the necessary procedures to apply the provisions of reference paragraph 1 above to trade-mark property of the following categories:

a. Trade-mark rights, or applications therefor, which were owned by Allied Nationals on the date of outbreak of hostilities between Japan and the countries of the nationals concerned, and which, on or after that date, were sequestered or otherwise taken away from such owners without their free consent;

b. Trade-mark rights, or applications therefor, which were owned by Japanese juridical persons

- (1) whose property was treated as enemy property during World War II because of Allied interest therein, or
- (2) if the Allied interest in the juridical person was controlling, and was interfered with, even though there was no interference with the property of the juridical person.

4. The Japanese trade-mark rights specified in paragraph 3b above shall be revalidated and restored on request of the former owners or their successors, without payment of fees, and shall remain in force for a period equivalent to the period of protection to which they were still entitled at the date of custody, control or supervision by the Japanese Government, its agents or appointees.

It is customary for electric utility suppliers to require prospective customers to make advances or contributions in aid of construction, or to provide and install a portion of the facilities needed, where the cost of facilities for supplying electric service to such customers requires an expenditure out of proportion to the revenue obtainable therefrom. The Japanese electric utility practice in this matter is covered by Power Bureau Instruction No. 960, subject: General Formula for Division of Sums to be Borne By Consumers in Construction Expense, issued under date of 28 November 1947 by the Chief of the Electric Power Bureau, Ministry of Commerce and Industry, to the electric utility suppliers and to the Special Procurement Board on 11 December 1947.

3. In conformity with the policy stated in reference 1b above, Power Bureau Instruction No. 960 as amended, is applicable, where appropriate, to Occupation Forces installations.

4. It is immaterial whether the costs for Occupation Forces installations were financed through Termination of War Funds or other funds, as long as the amounts are fair and reasonable and the facilities are necessary for rendering adequate service to the Occupation Forces.

SUBJECT: Payments for Reserve Seamen

1. In addition to any other payments presently provided by law or regulations, the Japanese Government may pay to the owner of any vessel over 800 gross tons, an amount equal to the authorized reduced wages of the crew normally employed on that vessel while in operation but not employed while the vessel is accruing standby subsidy. Such payments shall amount to only the authorized reduced wages actually paid the seamen and will not include any amount for the account of the owners.

2. Direct communication in the implementation of this directive is authorized between Economic and Scientific Section, General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers and the Japanese Government.

SUBJECT: Mothership-Type Tuna Fishing Operations

1. Authorization is hereby granted for the operation of mothership-type tuna fishing expeditions in the area extending south from the authorized fishing area and bounded by a line extending from 24 degrees north latitude, 180 degrees longitude south to 5 degrees north latitude; thence west to 5 degrees north latitude, 170 degrees east longitude; thence south to the Equator; thence west to 140 degrees east longitude; thence northwesterly to 5 degrees north latitude, 130 degrees east longitude; thence north to 20 degrees north latitude; thence west to 123 degrees east longitude; thence north to 24 degrees north latitude, 123 degrees east longitude.

2. The expeditions authorized in para 1 above will operate under the following conditions:

a. No vessel of the expedition will approach closer than three (3) miles to any land not under the administrative control of the Japanese Government.

b. Each participating vessel will be marked and operated in conformity with directives from the Administrator, US Naval Shipping Control Authority for Japanese Merchant Marine.

c. The master of each participating mothership will forward a daily radiogram to the Fisheries Agency, Tokyo, containing the position of his ship at 1200 hours local time on the day the radiogram is dispatched.

d. The master of each participating catcher boat will, while in the fishing area authorized in para 1 above, report daily to the mothership of his fleet the position of his ship at 1200 hours local time.

e. The master of each participating catcher boat will, during fishing operations, maintain a navigation and fishing log showing daily catch by number of fish and species, location of catch, type and amount of gear used, number of sets, and other data of fishing and navigational nature which may be specified by the High Commissioner for the Trust Territories of the Pacific Islands. Within thirty days after the return of the expedition to Japan, the Japanese Government will submit copies of these logs in the English language to General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers.

Representatives of the High Commissioner for the Trust Territories of the Pacific Islands, who will be agents of the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, may periodically board vessels of the expedition to conduct inspections within his area of responsibility. These representatives will be given all possible assistance and accommodation.

4. A representative of the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers will accompany each fleet to insure compliance with the provisions of this Memorandum and other applicable Memoranda and instructions from General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers.

5. Direct radio communications between the motherships of the expedition and Japanese coastal radio stations is authorized.

6. Direct communication between Natural Resources Section, General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers and the Ministry of Agriculture and Forestry, concerning matters within the scope of this memorandum is authorized.

7. The Japanese Government will submit a report to General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, by 1 June 1950 containing the names and gross tonnages of all vessels which will participate in the expedition, and full details of operation and methods of compilation of statistics.





SUBJECT: Instruction on Surrender of Arms by Japanese  
Civilians

1. Reference is made to following memoranda for the Japanese Government  
from General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers:

- c. Explosives required for industrial or exhibition purposes.
- d. Firearms, swords, bayonets, daggers, and other weapons or the  
component parts thereof in possession of recognized museums, exhibitions,  
collections, authorized manufacturers and dealers, repairmen or theatrical  
and motion picture companies for use as stage properties.
- e. Firearms, swords, bayonets, daggers and other weapons or compon-  
ent parts thereof which are objects of art, antiques, or family heirlooms.
