Outline of the 48th SSEAYP

1. History and Purpose

The Ship for Southeast Asian and Japanese Youth Program (SSEAYP) was launched in 1974 as a joint project between Japan and ASEAN member countries, based on the respective Joint Statements issued between Japan and respective ASEAN member countries. The aims of the Program are to promote friendship and mutual understanding among the youths of Japan and the Southeast Asian countries, to broaden their perspectives on the world, and furthermore, to strengthen their spirit of international cooperation and practical skills for international cooperation. As a result, it is expected to cultivate the leaders of the next generation who are capable to exercise their leadership skills in various fields in the globalizing society. This year, the ship program will resume for the first time since 2019 and conduct various exchange activities onboard and in the countries to be visited.

- 2. Activities
- a. On board activities: Discussion program, cultural exchange, post-program activity session, etc.
- b. Activities in countries to be visited: Courtesy calls, home stay, field study, interaction with local youths, etc.

Themes: Under the program theme of "Youth Participation ", following 6 Discussion Themes are set.

- 1. Soft Power and Youth People to People Diplomacy 2. Economic Growth and Sustainable Community 3. Global Environment and Climate Change
- 4. Disaster Risk Reduction and Recovery 5. Good Health and Well-being 6. Digital Society
- 3. Organization
- a. 1 Administrator, 1 Deputy Administrator, Administrative staff (approx. 20)
- b. 158 Participating Youths (PYs)
- c. 20 Japanese PYs, 135 Southeast Asian PYs (15PYs \times 9 countries) + 3 observers (10 National Leaders (NLs), etc. are excluded)



Discussion Themes are selected from the "Implementation Plan of the Joint Vision Statement on **ASEAN-Japan Friendship** and Cooperation Trusted Partners" adopted in the **Commemorative Summit for** the 50th Year of **ASEAN-Japan Friendship** and Cooperation (17 December 2023, Tokyo)

DG	Discussion Theme	No.	Contents
1	Soft Power and Youth People to People Diplomacy	1	PYs will discuss how youth can contribute to the international society by discovering the strength and attraction of their own countries' culture or value, and to take part with their soft power.
2	Economic Growth and Sustainable Community	2.1	PYs will discuss how youth can contribute to developing economic growth while achieving sustainable society that maintains the livelihood for current generations and allows future generations to continue to live safely on the planet.
3	Global Environment and Climate Change		PYs will recognize the current environmental situation and acknowledge the issues of climate change and biodiversity in ASEAN member countries and Japan. On that basis, PYs will discuss how youth can contribute to balancing developments, urbanization and the establishment of sustainable society.
4	Disaster Risk Reduction and Recovery	2.7	PYs will discuss how youth can contribute and maximize the achievement of disaster risk reduction and post-disaster recovery in the fields of politics, society, education and others. Subsequently, PYs will discuss current disaster situation from different perspectives and recognize the challenges and opportunities held among ASEAN member countries and Japan.
5	Good Health and Well-being	2.8	PYs will consider youth's health from physical, mental and social perspectives, the situations and challenges of youth mental health will be also discussed. At the same time, they consider defining what an ideal well-being is for youth and methods to achieve it.
6	Digital Society	2.9	PYs will understand the best practices from around the world where digital technology is used, and the current situation and issues in ASEAN member countries and Japan. On that bases, PYs will discuss how youth can contribute to promote digital society.
