ASEAN, together with its dialogue partners, are also looking at ways to increase the mobility of students – with scholarships that would allow the youth of ASEAN to study abroad, with exchanges for teachers and trainers towards capacity-building, e-learning, among others.

My generation received the news through television or newspapers. We listened to music through radio and cassette tapes in walkmans. We would book vacations through a travel agent whom you contacted on a landline telephone.

Your generation has been raised in this highly-connected and high-tech world. Hearing the news,

booking trips and paying bills are all done with a push of a button. Tablets take the place of textbooks. Certainly, the convenience that living in a high-tech world affords us has been tremendous, saving us so much time. We are attached to gadgets and other innovations that allow us to shorten processes that used to take days, even weeks to accomplish. The significance of these developments serve as background to the theme of Singapore's 2018 ASEAN Chairmanship: Resilience and Innovation, the highlight of which is the recently held 33rd ASEAN Leaders Summit from which I only arrived from yesterday.

As future leaders of your own countries, and perhaps, of this region, experiences like SSEAYAP become an important tool in focusing on people-to-people relations amidst the rapid technological breakthroughs that are taking place in the world. In cooperation with Japan, one of ASEAN's stalwart Dialogue Partners, this program provides you with opportunities to engage with regional brothers and sisters, and to foster deeper understanding of each other's points of view through culture.

It is my desire that, as each of you makes your way into this world to carve out your individual paths in life, you will keep in mind the memories and experiences from SSEAYP that allowed you to expand your horizons and get to know and understand your neighbors, and beyond. A world of peace, equity and stability.
