

- c. Thirdly, collaboration. Learn how to embrace diversity and work with people who are different from you.
- d. Fourth, care. Contribute back to society, use your talents and skills to help and guide others along.

Here in Singapore, we started the SG Youth Action Plan this year as a platform for our youths to share their vision for the future of Singapore, and to translate their ideas into concrete actions. All of you are leaders in your own right, and you have the capacity to create positive impact in your own communities and beyond. Through the SSEAYP, you will gain newfound knowledge and build relationships. I encourage all of you to be active global citizens. Step up and lead initiatives in areas that you are passionate about, and help make a difference in ASEAN, Japan and the rest of the world. This is my hope for you.

I would like to thank the Cabinet Office of Japan for the continued support and sponsorship of the SSEAYP. The longevity and success of this programme is testament to the long term vision that Japan has in promoting regional friendships and cooperation.
