# **Outline of the Program**



# Purpose

Leaders of the next generation who are capable of leading and guiding people are required in this international society and local society. From this aspect, the Ship for World Youth Program (SWY) will focus on implementing programs where Participating Youths (PYs) from various backgrounds will gain abilities to deal with different cultures, communication skills, leadership skills and management skills through having discussions, cultural exchanges and workshops that are organized by the PYs themselves. In addition, SWY aims to establish a globally

strong human network beyond national borders.

Due to the global spread of COVID-19, online programs were conducted for two consecutive years since 2020. This year, a hybrid format program, combining a one-month online exchange and two-week face-to-face exchange including discussions, seminars and cultural exchanges, that makes the most of the conventional SWY's characteristics was implemented by taking thorough infectious disease measures and making use of the benefits of online that conforms to the information society.

#### [Delegation of Japan]

One National Leader (NL), One Sub-National Leader (SNL) and 51 Participating Youths (PYs)

#### [10 Delegations other than Japan]

One NL and eight PYs per Delegation

# Organization

#### (1) Administration (ADM)

The ADM is engaged in the duties regarding the administrative affairs of this program.

#### (2) Facilitator

Eight Facilitators (one per discussion theme) are expected to coordinate and manage the assigned discussion group of multinational PYs.

# (3) National Leader (NL), Sub-National Leader (SNL)

One NL shall be appointed for each delegation. One SNL shall be appointed only for the delegation of Japan. NLs/SNL shall represent their own delegations and take

the leadership of PYs. NL meeting shall consist of 12 members (11 NLs and one SNL), and discuss and decide the fundamental matters concerning life and activities during the program under the request from the ADM.

#### (4) Participating Youth (PY)

PYs shall act according to the schedule and orderly as a group except during free time.

#### a. Youth Leader (YL)

Each delegation shall appoint one YL among their PYs. (The delegation of Japan shall appoint two YLs.) YLs shall be in charge of liaison and coordination of activities of the PYs of their respective delegations.

#### b. Group Leader (GL)

As a fundamental activity unit for discussion activity and local program, eight discussion groups shall be organized with the members from respective delegations. Each group will have one GL.

GL of each discussion group shall be appointed by Facilitator with the consent of the PYs in each group. (GLs may hold concurrent posts as YLs or members of one of the committees.)

GL of each discussion group shall support the Facilitator, take the role of liaison between the Facilitator and PYs, and carry out the duties of consolidating each group.

#### c. Committee

Various activities and events shall be organized and conducted in order to facilitate exchanges among PYs and to promote mutual understanding and friendship building. To plan and manage these activities, every PY shall be a member of one of the following committees:

#### (a) Event Committee

Event Committee takes initiative to organize events in the virtual space (oVice) to encourage active interaction among PYs. The committee will also plan events during the program in Japan and support Voluntary Activities by organizing venue reservation/allocation and work with the Press Committee to publicize the event to all PYs.

#### (b) Presentation Committee

While National Presentation contents are planned by each delegation, Presentation Committee takes initiative

to support those delegation by assisting sound system, lighting system, time keeping, MCing as well as set up of the venue and equipment. The Committee is also expected to design Summary Forum in collaboration with GLs in order to maximize the chance to exhibit the learning outcomes of the program.

#### (c) Press Committee

Press Committee is expected to support ADM by keeping / creating materials which will be used for official report as well as other forms of advertisement of the program. Committee members are:

- to take photos of the events during the program
- to write articles of events and activities for official report

The Committee is also expected to provide support for announcements of Voluntary Activities in collaboration with the Events Committee.

#### (d) Seminar Committee

Seminar Committee takes initiative in venue allocation, time allocation, assistance of set up and equipment, and other necessary support for organizers of the Peer-Learning Seminar.

#### (e) Youth Leader (YL) Committee

YL Committee is composed of YLs from each delegation. In collaboration with NLs of respective delegations, YL Committee takes initiative of establishment / implementation of rules under the instruction of NLs and ADM staff.

# Preparation for the Program

#### Meeting for Representatives of Participating Countries

Thu., August 25, 2022

The government officials in charge of SWY and the representatives of the SWY alumni associations of the participating countries attended the online meeting with the Cabinet Office and shared opinions for the smooth and effective operation of the program, including the selection and nomination of PYs and NLs. After this meeting, the Cabinet Office authorized the selection of the OPYs and their Course Discussion group assignments.

#### Facilitators Meeting

Sat., September 3 / Sat., September 10, 2022

For the smooth and effective implementation of the program, eight Facilitators in charge of the Course Discussions attended the online meeting with the Cabinet Office. The attendees focused their dialogue on the program's objectives and operation to ensure that all parties held a common understanding. The Facilitators also joined the Pre-Program Training of JPYs virtually from September 16, to provide JPYs with discussion sessions by each course.

#### Preparatory Training Session for Japanese PYs

Fri., September 16 – Tue., September 20, 2022

The Preparatory Training Session for JPYs were held overnight at National Olympics Memorial Youth Center in Tokyo, Japan, in order to ensure that the JPYs fully understand the aim and objectives of the program, to mentally prepare them as Japanese representatives, and to help them grasp the fundamentals of what large group activities involve.

#### Meeting for Representatives of Local Prefectures and City

Fri., September 30, 2022 / Wed., January 11, 2023

Local Program in February 2023 was hosted by the governments of seven prefectures (Aomori, Miyagi, Kanagawa, Tottori, Okayama, Kochi, Oita) and one city (Hakodate). The representatives of the respective local governments and international youth exchange organizations attended two meetings (one in-person in Tokyo and the other online) with the Cabinet Office to prepare for the courtesy calls, institutional visits related to the respective discussion themes, or cultural experiences. In response, each prefecture and city submitted their own schedule outlines for the Local Program. In November and December 2022, the staff of the Cabinet Office and the Center for International Youth Exchange, the organization commissioned to coordinate the activities for the SWY program, visited each prefecture and city to finalize the itinerary.

#### National Leaders Meeting

Sat., October 15 / Sat., October 22, 2022

To ensure the smooth operation of the program and PYs activities, NLs of each delegation attended the meeting with the Cabinet Office prior to the program. During this meeting, the Cabinet Office gave an overview of the aims and objectives of the program, activities of the Online Exchange and the Program in Japan, basic rules, and preparations for the program, etc. This was followed by discussions among the NLs to determine the schedules and rules, pre-program preparations, and other matters related to the program.

Participating countries were divided into two (Western side region (Africa, Europe, and Middle East) and Eastern side region (North America, Latin America, and Oceania) to have the Online Exchange, including online Course Discussions, for three days respectively. In the Opening Ceremony on the first day, Mr. OGURA Masanobu, Minister of State for Youth Affairs, Cabinet Office gave a video message. The aim of the Online Exchange and Exchange in a Virtual Space is to allow JPYs and OPYs to develop mutual understanding and friendship before they meet face-to-face, so that they could start the Program in Japan more smoothly. During this period, PYs could plan and organize activities spontaneously from their creative ideas, and a strong bond was formed among PYs through preparing together for the Program in Japan.

# Program in Japan Tue., February 7 – Mon., February 20, 2023

Overseas NLs and PYs arrived in Japan on February 7, 2023. Face-to-face activities with all NLs and PYs were started on the afternoon of February 8. Programs including Course Discussion, Field Study, Peer-Learning Seminar, National Presentation, and Voluntary Activity were conducted in ANA Crowne Plaza Narita until February 14. The Audience with H.I.H. Princess Kako of Akishino and the Courtesy Call on the Prime Minister by NLs and PY representatives were also conducted during this period. Local Program by Course Discussion group was conducted from February 15 until 18. Then, the Summary Forum and its preparation were held in Toshi Center Hotel Tokyo from February 19 until 20. The Summary Forum was broadcasted online via Zoom, and lots of audience witnessed the results of the program. The Closing Ceremony was held on February 20, with an address by Mr. OGURA Masanobu, Minister of State for Youth Affairs, Cabinet Office, gift exchanges between the Minister of State and NLs of the respective delegations, and a photo session. On completion of all the programs, Overseas NLs and PYs departed from Japan on February 21, 2023.

#### Post-Program Training Session for Japanese PYs

Tue., February 21 – Wed., February 22, 2023

After the Program in Japan, JPYs attended the Post-Program Training Session at Toshi Center Hotel Tokyo. Under the initiative of Japanese NL and SNL, JPYs reflected experiences gained during the program and had better image of how they could start post-program activities after the program.
