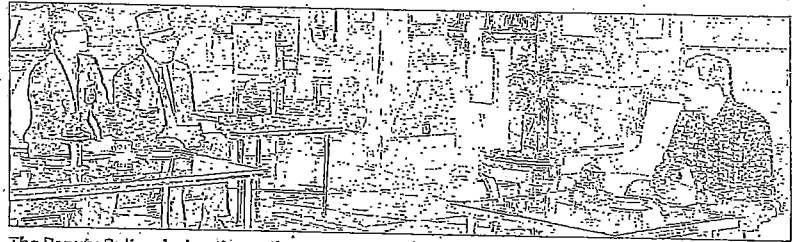

Brunei Darussalam is one of the destinations visited by the participants of

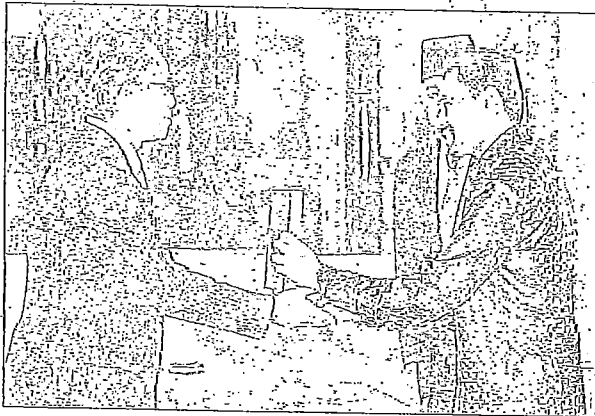
the Ship for Southeast Asia Youth Program (SSEAYP) 2011, which is in the country until Nov 19.

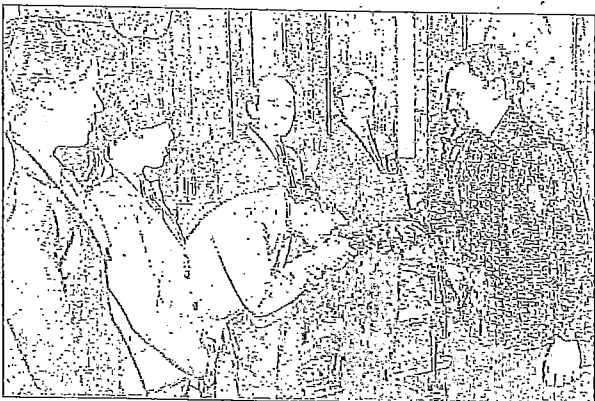
The audience ceremony took place at Qashr Al-Meezaan.

New Tutong Sixth Form Centre

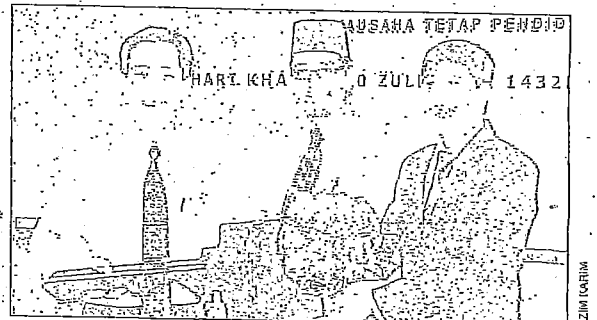

THE Tutong District will soon be able to accommodate its increasing number of A-Level students within close proximity following a key handing over ceremony for the multi-million dollar Tutong Sixth Form Centre yesterday in Kg Bukit Beruang.

The new centre has a classroom block, science block (including science labs), art block, library and computer room, administration block, lecture hall, multi-purpose hall, canteen, a football field and running track on a 15-hectare piece of land. It cost \$21,353,448.15 and was completed after 20-month-long construction work since June 3, 2009.

The key was handed to the Principal of the Tutong Sixth Form Centre, Cikgu Hadion Lim Beng Guan, by Awang Hj Mahrub bin Hj Murni, the Permanent Secretary (Core Education) at the Ministry of Education.

The realisation of the project was in line with the role and responsibility of the Ministry of Education through the National Development Plan 2007-2012, that aspires to provide a conducive and comfortable learning

environment, particularly with the ever-increasing number of students enrolling every year.

The main consultant of the project was Arkitek Idris, with BCP Partnership as quantity surveyor consultant, HAH Engineering & Associates as civil and structural consultant, Jurutera Perunding LCE as mechanical and electrical consultant, and LCY Development Sdn Bhd as the main contractor.

The Ministry of Education has entrusted the management of the project to the Public Works Department through the services of selected consultants.

New school building for Rimba II

A PRESENTATION of key ceremony was held yesterday at the new building of the Rimba II Secondary School at Perpindahan Kampong Rimba.

Haji Mahrub bin Haji Murni, the Permanent Secretary (Core Education) at the Ministry of Education, handed over the mock key.

The construction of the new school is in line with the long-term plan by Ministry of Education in providing schools and colleges to accommodate the rapid development of Sixth Form students in the country. The project is included under 2007-2012 National Development Plan.

The total cost of the project is \$16,823,199.19. Construction began on January 2007 and took four years and eight months. During the construction period, Ministry of Education had entrusted the Public Works Department (JKR) to manage the construction of the project through several consultants. Booty Edwards Architect & Partners was appointed as the prime consultant.

LAH Consultant was appointed as material surveyors consultant, Sepakat Setia Perunding was appointed as the civil and structural consultant, Jurutera Perunding RCS was the mechanical and electrical consultant. Galfar Pembinaan dan Perusahaan Sdn Bhd was the prime contractor appointed for the school construction.

The Rimba II Secondary School has classrooms; administration block and library, science block, art & homes science block, multi-purpose hall, a canteen, a surau, football field, running track including a grandstand.

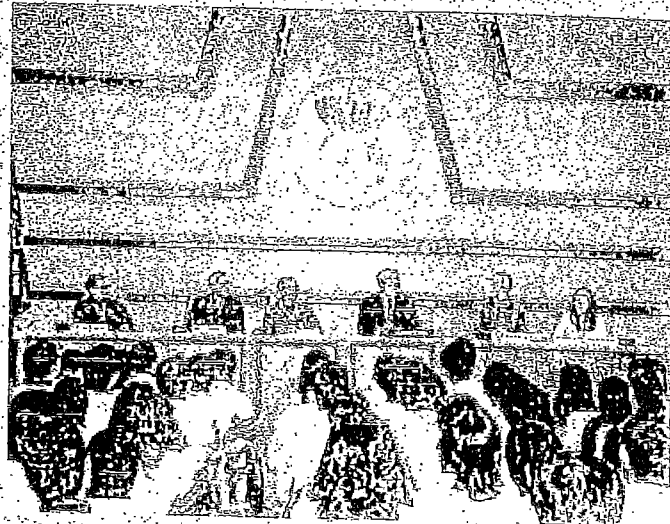
SSEAYP Youths Visits ASEAN Secretariat
